WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and one, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 53,

of the thirtieth day of May following, the Northern Steamship Company (Limited), of Auckland (hereinafter called "the company"), was licensed to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark in Hohoura Harbour, as shown on plan marked M.D. 2417, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in order to erect thereon a wharf, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for a term of fourteen years, computed from the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and one :

And whereas, the said license having expired, the company has made application for a fresh license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a term of fourteen years, computed from the expiry of the term of the above-mentioned license, and it is expedient to grant the same for the term and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed, and to prescribe the dues and rates to be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore, and land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto, which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of using the aforesaid wharf in connection therewith, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby prescribe that all the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall, as from the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark occupied by the said wharf, as shown on plan marked M.D. 2417.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1 in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the company and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known registered office of the company in New Zealand.

12. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

13. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

SHIPPING WHARFAGE.

EVERY person who shall use the wharf with any vessel shall pay for the use thereof as follows, that is to say: For every vessel, a sum of 1d. per ton on the gross tonnage of such vessel per day for each day or part of a day a vessel shall occupy a berth alongside any vessel lying at the wharf undergoing repairs, or fitting out only, or shall lie off the said wharf with a line attached thereto.

GOODS WHARFAGE.

Every person who shall use the wharf for landing or shipping any goods shall, before using the same, pay dues as follows, that is to say:—

WHEREAS it is enacted by the fifth section of the Fisheries Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations, which shall have force and effect throughout New Zealand, or only in any waters or places specified therein, for, amongst other things, imposing conditions and restrictions on the taking of fish, and for prohibiting the use of any particular engines, tackles, or apparatus for taking any fish: And whereas it is desirable to prohibit the taking of fish by trawling and the use of trawl-nets in Le Bon's Bay, Banks Peninsula:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall haul or use a trawl-net for the purpose of taking fish in Le Bon's Bay, Banks Peninsula, inside a right line drawn from the outermost point of Steep Head to the outermost point of Islet Head.

2. Any person committing a breach of clause (1) of these regulations is liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

Special Order made by the Mount Wellington Road Board making By-laws.

Department of Internal Affairs,
Wellington, 9th July, 1915.

THE following special order, made by the Mount Wellington Road Board, is published in accordance with the provisions of the Road Boards Act, 1908.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Road Boards Act, 1908, and its amendments, the Public Works Act, 1908, and its amendments, and all or any other statutes it hereunto enabling, the Road Board of the Mount Wellington Road District doth hereby by special order ordain and enact as follows.

HEAVY TRAFFIC BY-LAW.

1. The by-law relating to heavy traffic passed by the said Board on the 15th day of December, 1914, and confirmed on the 2nd day of February, 1915, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on the 18th day of February, 1915, at page 612, is (from and immediately after the date on which these by-laws shall come into operation) repealed, but shall, notwithstanding, remain in full force so far only as relates to any offence committed, penalty incurred, prosecution or proceeding commenced, or license issued under or against any of the provisions thereof before the coming into force of these by-laws, and in substitution and lieu thereof the following is enacted.

2. In these by-laws, if not inconsistent with the context,—

(a) "Heavy traffic" shall mean the transport of any vehicle, engine, or machine which shall itself, or together with any thing or things being transported thereon, weigh more than one and a half tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels.

(b) "The owner" of any vehicle shall include a bailee or hirer entitled to the possession and use or profit thereof.

3. The owner of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic upon any of the roads within the Mount Wellington Road District shall, before using such vehicle upon any such road or roads, apply to the Mount Wellington Road Board for a license therefor, and shall pay for such license an annual fee as follows:—

(a) In respect of any horse-drawn two-wheeled vehicle having tires of a less width than 4 inches	£	s.	d.

(b) In respect of any horse-drawn four-wheeled vehicle	5	0	0

(c.) In respect of any mechanically propelled vehicle whose carrying-capacity exceeds 3 tons

(d.) In respect of any other horse-drawn or mechanically propelled vehicle

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Provided, nevertheless, that the Board, at its discretion, and on application by the owner or driver of any vehicle engaged in carting earth, stone, or scoria-ash, may permit the owner or driver of such a vehicle to use such vehicle for the purpose of carting earth, stone, or scoria-ash upon any of the roads in the district without having paid such license fee, upon payment to the said Board of the following charges:—

For every load carried on any one day upon or over any such road: One shilling.

If more than three loads are carried in any one vehicle in any one day upon or over any such road, then for that day: Three shillings.

4. Any person who at any time after the coming into operation of this by-law shall use any vehicle for heavy traffic within the Mount Wellington Road District without having first paid such license fee for such vehicle, and obtained a license which shall then be in force, or without having the permission provided for in the preceding clause, or who shall do or cause to be done or be concerned in doing anything contrary to any of these by-laws, or who shall omit to do anything required to be done by him by any such provision, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these by-laws, and on conviction thereof shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

5. Any constable, or officer of the Board duly authorized in that behalf, may stop and detain any vehicle which in his opinion infringes any of these by-laws, and inspect and examine the weight of such vehicle and the contents thereof, and the driver or person for the time being in charge of the vehicle shall permit such inspection, examination, and weighing to be made accordingly, and shall, if so required by any such constable or officer, take such vehicle (together with the contents thereof) to the nearest public weighbridge, and then and there weigh the same, or permit and allow the same to be weighed thereon; and no person shall obstruct any such officer or constable in or about the making of such inspection, examination, or weighing.

6. Application for licenses under clause 3 hereof shall be made in writing to the Clerk of the Board. Such licenses shall expire twelve calendar months from the date of the issue thereof.

7. The Clerk of the Board shall keep a register of all licenses issued under this by-law. Such register shall be open to public inspection without fee.

8. Every license issued under section 3 of these by-laws shall be numbered, and the owner of the vehicle shall cause the number of such license (when issued by the Board) and the letters "M.W." to be legibly painted or marked on the off side of such vehicle.

The common seal of the body corporate the Inhabitants of the Mount Wellington Road District was affixed to the foregoing by-laws in pursuance of a resolution of the said Board passed at a meeting of the Board held on Thursday, the 24th day of June, 1915, in the presence of—

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the third day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, regulations were made, under the authority of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), *inter alia* prescribing the conditions under which cash deposits are received from the public to meet charges on cable messages, telegrams, &c.: And whereas it is desirable to amend such regulations in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke paragraphs (a) and (b) of Regulation 928 in the Schedule to the above-recited Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulation set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth order that the regulation hereby made shall form part of and be read together with the said Regulation 928, and shall have effect on and after the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

928. *Cash Deposits*.—(a.) Cash deposits may be required from any person or persons whose indebtedness to the Postmaster-General is not immediately discharged at the time it is incurred, the amount to be deposited to be fixed by the Postmaster-General.

(b.) Cash deposits may be accepted from persons whose residence or place of business is not less than two miles from the nearest post or telegraph office, to meet any charges leviable on cable messages or on such telegrams, bureau communications, requests for special messenger service, &c., as may be sent or arranged for through the depositor's telephone-exchange connection or private wire. Such deposits must be attested by a letter of application addressed to a Postmaster and by the Postmaster's written reply. Deposits under this paragraph must be for £1 or a multiple thereof, except in the case of large deposits, when a cheque may be accepted for the exact sum required to restore the original amount deposited.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulation made by the above-mentioned Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulation set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth order that the regulation hereby made shall form part of and be read together with the regulations made by Order in Council of the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and shall have effect from the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

WHERE a private line is connected with the telephone office in charge of a non-permanent telephonist, a fee of £2 per annum shall be charged every private-wire owner to cover the service of switching one private line to another private line, or switching a private line to a departmental line, or *vice versa*. Where there is more than one telephone on a private line, the fee to be charged shall be £1 per annum per telephone for the like service. SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Director: Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
