LIVERPOOL, Governor. [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by section thirty of the Public Works Act, 1908, that if it is found that any \mathbf{V} Public Works Act, 1908, that if it is found that any land held, taken, purchased, or acquired at any time under this or any other Act or Provincial Ordinance, or otherwise howsoever, for any public work is not required for such public work, the Governor may, by an Order in Council publicly notified and gazetted, cause the same to be sold under the conditions therein mentioned: And whereas it is further provided by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, that in the case of any land so taken purchased or acquired for a Government

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the fourteenth W day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and gazetted on the seventeenth idem, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pur-suance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Land Settlement Finance Act, 1909, and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of JULY 15.]

(f.) In respect of every debenture for which coupons are issued under this clause the holder of the debenture shall pay to the Public Trustee a fee computed as follow

(i.) Where the amount of the debenture is less than £500, a fee of 5s.

(ii.) Where the amount of the debenture is not less than £500 and is less than £1,000, a fee of 10s.
 (iii.) Where the amount of the debenture is not

less than $\pounds 1,000$ and is less than $\pounds 3,000$, a fee of $\pounds 1$ ls.

(iv.) Where the amount of the debenture is not less than $\pm 3,000$, a fee of ± 2 2s. And every such fee shall be paid into the Public Trust Office Account.

Bringing certain Provisions of the Mining Act into Force within certain Parts of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by section two of the Mining Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that the Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time declare that any of the in Council, may from time to time declare that any of the provisions of the Mining Act, 1908, shall apply to prospect-ing and mining for and the storage of petroleum and other mineral oils and of natural gas, and also define the district within which any such Order in Council shall take effect: And whereas by section seventy-five of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1912, it is further provided that any public reserve, endow-ment, or Native reserve within the meaning of the Mining Act, 1908, whether or not the same is situated within a mining district, may be included in any district as so defined: Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Mining Amendment Act, 1911, and of every other power and authority enabling

Act, 1911, and of every other power and authority enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Do-minion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that the provisions of the Mining Act, 1908, set out in the First Schedule hereto, and including all amend-ments. ments thereof, shall apply to prospecting and mining for and the storage of petroleum and other mineral oils and of natural gas within the districts described in the Second Schedule hereto.

Empowering Maori Land Board to dispose of Land by way of Sale under the Native Land Act, 1909.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the tenth day of W May and the fourteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nine, the blocks or parcels of

land named in the Schedule hereto were declared to be subject to Part I of the Native Land Settlement Act, 1907, and which by section two hundred and thirty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909, became subject to Part XIV of that Act :

And whereas by subsection three of section two hundred and thirty-nine of the Native Land Act, 1909, it is provided that, notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained in this section, the Governor may by Order in Council, on the recommendation of the Board in whose district the land is situated, in any case in which he is of opinion that an equal division of that land in manner aforesaid would be impracticable or inexpedient in the public interests would be impac-tion of the owners, authorize the division of that land in any other proportion, or authorize the whole of that land to be disposed

Declaring Land to be no longer subject to Part XIV of the Native Land Act, 1909.

LIVERPOOL, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twelfth day of July, 1915.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section ninety-six of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, it is enacted that the Gover-nor in Council may from time to time by Order in Council declare that any land subject to Part XIV or XV of the Native Land Act, 1909, and vested in a Mori Land Board, shall no longer be subject to such Parts of that Act, and shall be revested in the Native owners thereof :

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto, and known as Otutahuna No. 2 Block, is now, by virtue of an Order in Council made on the fourteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and by virtue of the provisions of section two hundred and thirty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909, subject to Part XIV of the said Act, and vested in the Tokerau District Maori Land Board accordingly :

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the said land is not subject to any lease, license, contract for sale, or other alienation, and that no moneys are charged on the said land or on the revenue thereof in accordance with the said Act or under any other authority :

HEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amend-W ment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, place, put up, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued by the Governor in Council under that Act:

And whereas the New Zealand Coal and Oil Company (Limited) (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect lines along the route defined in the Schedule hereto, and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect

and it is expectent accordingly to issue a nearest in respect thereof under the said section : Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers con-ferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Deminion doth subject to the conditions set forth in the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforcsaid Act and published in the New Zealand Gazette dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and hereinafter referred to as "the regulations," hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating pur-poses, the route of such electric lines being indicated by means of a red line shown on the plans marked P.W.D. 37613 and 38110 and deposited in the office of the Minister of and 38110, and deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District.

 ${\tt The}$ route of the electric lines hereby authorized commences at the generator-house in McDonald Street, and proceeds in a north-easterly direction generally through coal reserve and Section 17, Block LXXVI; across Exmouth Street and Sec-tion 5, Block 75; across Wangaloa Road, Section 5, Block 79; across Wyre Street, Section 10, Block 80; all in the Township of Kaitangata: then across Section 14, road, and Section 12, Block 9, Kaitangata Survey District, to the air-shaft of the Castle Hill mines in the said Section 12: a total distance of seventy chains, more or less. As indicated by a line coloured red on P.W.D. 37613 and 38110, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (c) of clause 2 of the regulations. The generating voltage shall be approximately 440 volts

between the phases.

3. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 22 degrees Fahrenheit.

4. NOTICES re EXTENSIONS, ETC.

Records of results of tests (Regulation 37), and notices re commencement of work (Regulation 44) and re extensions and alterations (Regulation 49), should be sent to the Public Works Engineer at present stationed at Dunedin and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at Dunedin.

5. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

Special Order made by the Mount Wellington Road Board making By-laws.

Department of Internal Affairs,

THE following special order, made by the Mount Wellington Road Board is published in according with the L Road Board, is published in accordance with the pro-visions of the Road Boards Act, 1908.

F. H. D. BELL, Minister of Internal Affairs.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the Road Boards Act, 1908, and its amendments, the Public Works Act, 1908, and its amendments, and all or any other statutes it hereunto enabling, the Road Board of the Mount Wellington Road District doth hereby by special order ordain and enact as follows.

HEAVY TRAFFIC BY-LAW.

1. The by-law relating to heavy traffic passed by the said Board on the 15th day of December, 1914, and confirmed on the 2nd day of February, 1915, and published in the *New* Zealand Gazette on the 18th day of February, 1915, at page 612, is (from and immediately after the date on which these by-laws shall come into operation) repealed, but shall, not-withstanding, remain in full force so far only as relates to any offence committed, penalty incurred, prosecution or pro-ceeding commenced, or license issued under or against any of the provisions thereof before the coming into force of these by-laws, and in substitution and lieu thereof the following is enacted.

 2. In these by-laws, if not inconsistent with the context,—

 (a.) "Heavy traffic " shall mean the transport of any vehicle, engine, or machine which shall itself, or together with any thing or things being transported thereon, weigh more than one and a half tons avoirdupois to each pair of wheels.
 (b.) "The owner " of any vehicle shall include a bailee or hirer entitled to the possession and use or profit thereof.

3. The owner of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic upon any of the roads within the Mount Wellington Road District shall, before using such vehicle upon any such road or roads, apply to the Mount Wellington Road Board for a license therefor, and shall pay for such license an annual fee as follows

on application by the owner or driver of any vehicle engaged in carting earth, stone, or scoria-ash, may permit the owner or driver of such a vehicle to use such vehicle for the purpose of carting earth, stone, or scoria ash upon any of the roads in the district without having paid such license fee, upon payment to the said Board of the following charges :---

For every load carried on any one day upon or over any such road : One shilling. If more than three loads are carried in any one vehicle

in any one day upon or over any such road, then for

any one day upon or over any such road, then for that day: Three shillings.
4. Any person who at any time after the coming into operation of this by-law shall use any vehicle for heavy traffic within the Mount Wellington Road District without having first paid such license fee for such vehicle, and obtained a license which shall then be in force, or without having the permission provided for in the proceeding change or who shall permission provided for in the preceding clause, or who shall do or cause to be done or be concerned in doing anything contrary to any of these by-laws, or who shall omit to do anything required to be done by him by any such provision, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these by-laws, and on conviction thereof shall be liable for each offence

to a penalty not exceeding five pounds. 5. Any constable, or officer of the Board duly authorized in that behalf, may stop and detain any vehicle which in his opinion infringes any of these by laws, and inspect and examine the weight of such vehicle and the contents thereof, examine the weight of such vehicle and the contents thereof, and the driver or person for the time being in charge of the vehicle shall permit such inspection, examination, and weighing to be made accordingly, and shall, if so required by any such constable or officer, take such vehicle (together with the contents thereof) to the nearest public weighbridge, and then and there weigh the same, or permit and allow the same to be weighed thereon; and no person shall obstruct any such officer or accordingle in or about the making of such importion officer or constable in or about the making of such inspection,

examination, or weighing. 6. Application for licenses under clause 3 hereof shall be made in writing to the Clerk of the Board. Such licenses shall expire twelve calendar months from the date of the issue thereof.

7. The Clerk of the Board shall keep a register of all licenses issued under this by-law. Such register shall be open to public inspection without fee.

8. Every license issued under section 3 of these by-laws shall be numbered, and the owner of the vehicle shall cause the number of such license (when issued by the Board) and the letters "M.W." to be legibly painted or marked on the off side of such vehicle.

928. Cash Deposits.—(a.) Cash deposits may be required from any person or persons whose indebtedness to the Post-master-General is not immediately discharged at the time it is incurred, the amount to be deposited to be fixed by the Postmaster-General.

Cash deposits may be accepted from persons whose residence or place of business is not less than two miles from the nearest post or telegraph office, to meet any charges leviable on cable messages or on such telegrams, bureau communications, requests for special messenger service, &c., as may be sent or arranged for through the depositor's telephone-exchange connection or private wire. Such deposits must be attested by a letter of application addressed to a Postmaster and by the Postmaster's written reply. Deposits under this paragraph must be for £1 or a multiple thereof, except in the case of large deposits, when a cheque may be accepted for the exact sum required to restore the original amount deposited. amount deposited.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

### Director : Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught.to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity) :---

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- 3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
