And whereas the purchase of the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the said Act :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three hundred and seventy-four of the said Act, and by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the land set out in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land.

At the Government House at Wellington, this nineteenth day of July, 1915.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section two hundred and thirty of the Native Land Act, 1909, it is provided that no instrument of alienation of Native land by way of mortgage or charge, other than a mortgage or charge in favour of a State Loan Department, shall be confirmed by a Board or the Court without the precedent consent of the Governor in Council:

And whereas application has been made for the consent of the Governor in Council to a mortgage of the block or parcel of land mentioned in the Schedule hereto: And whereas it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor in Council should issue:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby consent to the confirmation of an alienation by way of mortgage of the block or parcel of land set out in the Schedule hereto. And it is hereby declared that this Order in Council is made under the provisions in that behalf of the Native Land Act, 1909, and shall operate accordingly as a consent of the Governor in Council to the proceedings hereby authorized.

ON the recommendation of the Native Land Purchase Board, referred to in section three hundred and sixty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909, and section one hundred and eleven of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, and

in exercise of the power in this behalf conferred upon him by those sections, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby extend the period of an Order in Council made the third day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, for a further period of twelve months, prohibiting all alienations of the Native land specified in the Schedule hereto other than alienations in favour of the Crown.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke an Order in Council dated the fourteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and published in the *Gazette* of the sixteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and nine, appointing the Remuera Road Board to have control of the Mount Hobson Domain, and doth hereby appoint

Regulations for Payments to Members of the General Council of Education and District Advisory Committees.—Section 12, Education Act, 1914.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this nineteenth day of July, 1915.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the payment of travelling-expenses and sums for

attendance at meetings to members of the General Council of Education and to members of District Advisory Committees; and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

To members of the General Council of Education and of any District Advisory Committee constituted under section 11 of the Education Act, 1914, who are not officers of the Public Service, there shall be payable sums for attendance at meetings of the Council or Committee and travelling-expenses as follows:—

1. To every such member—

(a.) The actual expenses of transit by land or sea reasonably incurred in going to and returning from meetings of the Council or Committee, or in making any official visit when appointed by the Council or Committee to make such visit:

(b.) A travelling-allowance of 15s. per day for personal expenses while the member is necessarily absent from home in order to attend meetings of the Council or Committee or to make official visits.

2. To every such member who is not at the same time in receipt of salary in respect of education service as defined by the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Amendment Act, 1908, a sum of 40s. for every day of actual attendance at a meeting of the Council, and a sum of 20s. for every day of actual attendance at a meeting of the Committee; and for every other member who is not an officer of the Public Service, a sum of 20s. in respect of every such day of attendance whether at a meeting of the Council or of the Committee.

Validating Irregular Notification of Time and Place fixed for Confirmation of Special Order and of Resolution making Special Order.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS at a special meeting of the Awakino County Council on the fourth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, a resolution was passed in pursuance and exercise of the powers in the said Council vested by section sixteen of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, making a special order authorizing the raising of a special loan of four thousand pounds to form, widen, metal, and culvert the roads in the Pomarangi Special-rating Area: And whereas such resolution so making a special order was duly confirmed at a meeting of the said Council on the eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen:

And whereas public notice of the time and place fixed for the meeting at which such resolution was to be confirmed and of such resolution was not given in accordance with the provisions of section ninety-seven, paragraph (c) of the Counties Act, 1908, in that the said Council omitted to give such public notification in the first week of the four preceding the date fixed for the meeting at which it was proposed to confirm such resolution, but gave two such notifications in the second week preceding such date as aforesaid: And whereas it appears that the ratepayers have not been misled by such irregularity, and it is expedient to validate the same:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section one hundred and eleven of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby validate such omission to advertise during such first week as aforesaid in particular, and such special order so made as aforesaid in general, to the intent that the same shall be as valid and effectual as though the resolution making a special order had been duly passed, notified, and confirmed, and the time and place fixed for the meeting confirming such resolution published, in strict compliance with the provisions in that behalf of the Counties Act, 1908, and doth declare that the proceedings relative to such loan shall not be called in question by reason only of the irregularity aforesaid.

Modification of Order in Council under Section 33 of the Copyright Act, 1913, in so far as it relates to Italy.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this nineteenth day of July, 1915.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting under the authority conferred on him by section thirty-three of the Copyright Act, 1913 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), has extended the said Act, *inter alia*,

- (a.) To works first published in Italy, in like manner as if they had been first published within New Zealand;
 - (b.) To literary, dramatic, musical, and artistic works the authors whereof were at the time of the making of the works subjects or citizens of Italy, in like manner as if the authors had been British subjects;
 - (c.) In respect of residence in Italy, in like manner as if such residence had been residence in New Zealand,—
- subject to the provisions set out in the said Order: And whereas it is desired to vary the provisions set out in the said Order in manner hereinafter set forth :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section twenty-nine of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby vary the said Order in Council in the manner hereinafter set forth, and doth hereby declare that—

(1.) The provisions of subparagraph (a) of paragraph (iii) of the proviso to clause (2) of the said Order shall apply as if Italy were included amongst the foreign countries named in the said subparagraph.

(2.) The provisions of subparagraphs (b), (c), and (e) of the said paragraph (iii) are hereby revoked so far as they relate to works of which the country of origin is Italy, and the authors of such works shall enjoy the same rights as if the provisions had never related thereto.

(3.) Where any person has, before the commencement of this Order, taken any action whereby he has incurred any expenditure or liability in connection with the reproduction or performance of any work in a manner which at the time was lawful, or for the purpose of or with a view to the reproduction or performance of a work at a time when such reproduction or performance would, but for the making of this Order, have been lawful, nothing in this Order shall diminish or prejudice any rights or interest arising from or in connection with such action which are subsisting or valuable at the said date, unless the person who by virtue of this Order becomes entitled to restrain such reproduction or performance agrees to pay such compensation as, failing agreement, may be determined in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

(4.) This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, which day is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

Appointing Public Trustee to be Administrator of an Estate under the Reformatory Institutions Act, 1909.

WHEREAS by section thirty-seven of the Reformatory Institutions Act, 1909, it is enacted that when an order has been made against any person (whether before or after the commencement of that Act) for his detention in an institution, the Public Trustee may be appointed as the Administrator or interim curator of his estate, in accordance with Part III of the Prisons Act, 1908, and all the provisions of sections fifty-five to seventy-five of that Act shall, so long as the order of detention remains in force, apply to that person accordingly in the same manner in which those provisions apply to persons imprisoned :

And whereas on the seventeenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, an order was made by the Stipendiary Magistrate at Christchurch for the detention of Quinton Campbell Manson, of Teddington, in the certified inebriates home situate at Rotoroa Island :

And whereas it is expedient to appoint the Public Trustee as the Administrator of the estate of the said Quinton Campbell Manson :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the before-mentioned powers and authorities, doth hereby appoint

THE PUBLIC TRUSTEE

to be the Administrator of the estate of the said Quinton Campbell Manson during the Governor's pleasure.

Notice exempting Crown Lands from the Operation of Part II of the Coal-mines Act, 1908.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in me by the Coal-mines Act, 1908, and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby exempt the lands referred to and described in the Schedule hereto from the operation of Part II of the Coal-mines Act, 1908; and I do also direct that the lands referred to and described in the Schedule hereto shall be dealt with under section one hundred and thirty-five of the Land Act, 1908, and any amendment thereof.

In the above table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally and for each city with its suburban towns.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs lowers the rates at Auckland and Dunedin, but raises it at Christchurch, while the rate at Wellington remains the same.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 559, against 636 in May—a decrease of 77. The deaths in June were 237—a decrease of 53 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 122, females 115. Forty-six of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 19.4 per cent. of the whole number; 36 of these were under one year of age.

There were 92 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 104 in May. The following table shows the classification:—

Special Regulations as to killing Native Game on Lake Wainono, Waimate District.

LIVERPOOL, Governor.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations with respect to the killing of native game on Lake Wainono, in the Waitaki-Waimate Acclimatization District.

REGULATIONS.

1. No device or structure made of rushes or other material shall be used as a mai-mai or other cover for the purpose of taking or killing feathered game on that portion of Lake Wainono, in the Waitaki-Waimate Acclimatization District, marked by posts numbered one to eight (1-8), and being an area of 150 acres or thereabout.

2. No boat dressed or covered in any way shall be used on the above area.

As witness the hand of His Excellency the Governor, this sixteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER,
CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION
DEPARTMENT.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity) :—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
