Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulation numbered eight under the heading "Private Lines" in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulation set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth declare that the regulation hereby made shall be read with and form part of the above-recited regulations, and shall have effect on and after the date of publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

8. PRIVATE lines intended to be connected with a telephone bureau must be equipped with bridging-bell telephones supplied by the Department, the cost of which, including battery, is £3 each. The number of telephones on any one line must not exceed ten. Regulations for the Payment of Subsidies on Voluntary Contributions.

LIVERPOOL, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the

following regulations for the payment of subsidies on voluntary contributions; and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

PAYMENT OF SUBSIDIES ON VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS.

1. For the purposes of section 159 of the Act, a voluntary contribution shall not be directly or indirectly derived from public funds or from ordinary sources of revenue, or be a consideration directly or indirectly for the use of public property of any kind, or for services rendered or to be rendered, or be of the nature of discount, rebate, or refund; or be derived directly or indirectly from subsidies previously granted or from moneys on which subsidies have been previously granted.

2. The moneys, land, buildings, &c., constituting any voluntary contributions upon which subsidy is paid and the subsidies thereon shall be utilized solely and without deduction for the purposes of the school or classes as defined by the immediately succeeding clause hereof.

3. In the case of voluntary contributions in money, subsidies shall be payable only on condition that these contributions are made available for one or more of the following purposes:—

(a.) In the case of public schools, including district high schools,—

(i.) The purpose of supplementing allowances for the incidental expenses of School Committees as defined by regulations, provided that the expenditure shall be confined strictly to such objects as are specifically set forth in the said regulations:

(ii.) The extension and improvement of school grounds:

(iii.) The provision of special furniture, apparatus, and appliances (including pictures and works of art for school decoration) for school use:

(iv.) The provision of apparatus and material for elementary handwork or manual instruction, and the payment of instructors in such subjects who are not on the regular staffs of the schools:

(v.) The provision of apparatus and equipment of a more or less permanent character for the promotion of organized games and physical education:

(vi.) The establishment and maintenance of school and class libraries:

(vii.) The provision of school flagstaffs and the purchase of New Zealand ensigns to be flown thereon.

(b.) In the case of secondary schools,—

(i.) The purposes specified under the foregoing subclause (a) with the exception of paragraph (i):

(ii.) The provision of school sites and buildings as approved by the Minister, and the maintenance thereof:

(iii.) The provision of necessary equipment and material.

(c.) In the case of technical schools or classes,—

(i.) The purposes specified under the foregoing subclause (b):

(ii.) The establishment of scholarships:

(iii.) The payment of teachers.

(d.) Such other similar purposes as the Minister may approve.

4. No subsidy shall be payable in respect of a contribution for any purpose unless the Minister is satisfied that the contribution is necessary or warranted in the general interests of the school.

5. No part of any contribution upon which subsidy is paid, nor any part of the subsidy thereon, shall be utilized for school prizes, for school outings or entertainments, or for other similar purposes.

6. On voluntary contributions given for the purpose of establishing or increasing the utility of school or class libraries subsidies shall be payable only on the condition that the requirements of the regulations in respect of school and class libraries issued from time to time are complied with.

7. Subsidy shall not be payable on any voluntary contribution upon which a claim is not rendered to the Department within twelve months of the receipt of such contribution by the School Committee of a public school, or by the Education Board, or the governing body of a secondary school, technical classes, or technical school, as the case may be.

8. All contributions upon which subsidy is paid and the subsidies thereon must be immediately available for the several purposes enumerated in the form of claim in so far as the same are in accordance with these regulations.

9. In the case of contributions derived from concerts, bazaars, exhibitions, or other similar sources, subsidies shall be payable only on the net proceeds. In each case a statement in the form provided by the

Department of the receipts and expenditure in connection with such concert, &c., duly certified, must be attached to the form of claim for a subsidy.

10. Every claim for subsidy on a voluntary contribution must be accompanied by a statement showing the name of the donor and the amount, or the value assessed at current market rates, of the voluntary contribution.

11. A claim for subsidy on a bequest must be accompanied by a statement setting forth the amount and purpose of the bequest, the name of the benefactor, and the date of probate of the will, and by an undertaking that the total amount of the bequest has been actually received by the beneficiary body, and that the total amount, together with the subsidy thereon, will, without any deduction, be applied by the said body to the purpose for which the bequest was made.

12. Before a subsidy is payable on voluntary contributions in money the amount of such contribution must be lodged in the bank to the credit of the body by which the claim is made.

13. Before any subsidy is payable on any voluntary contributions in land, buildings, &c., the contributions must be legally transferred to the body concerned.

14. Applications for subsidies on voluntary contributions must be made on forms provided by the Department; and all supporting documents must as far as possible be the original documents, and not copies thereof.

Approving the Canterbury Poor of Great Britain, Ireland, and Belgium Relief Fund under the War Contributions Validation Act, 1914 (No. 2).

(a.) For the relief of distress occasioned by the war in which His Majesty is at present engaged, whether such distress exists in New Zealand or elsewhere in the British Dominions, or in any country allied to His Majesty ;

(b.) For any patriotic objects approved for the purposes of this Act by the Governor :

Provided that every such contribution is paid either—

(i.) Into a public fund established by the Government, or by any local authority, for the purposes of such relief of distress, or patriotic objects ; or

(ii.) Into a fund established by persons other than the Government or a local authority, where such fund and the conditions of control and expenditure thereof are approved for the purposes of this Act by the Governor :

And whereas certain persons in the Provincial District of Canterbury have formed themselves into a society known as the Poor of Great Britain, Ireland, and Belgium Relief Fund (Incorporated), for the following purposes, namely :—

(a.) To take over the whole of the funds in the hands of a committee styled "The Poor of Great Britain, Ireland, and Belgium Relief Fund Committee," and which committee was recently formed for the purpose of raising money for the relief of the poor of Great Britain, Ireland, and Belgium during the war in which His Majesty is at present engaged, and during the continuance of the distress occasioned thereby ;

(b.) To establish, organize, manage, and control a fund for the purpose of the relief of the poor of Great Britain, Ireland, Belgium, and of any of His Majesty's allies in the present war ;

(c.) To apply for the approval of His Excellency the Governor of New Zealand of such fund for the purposes and under the provisions of the War Contributions Validation Act, 1914 (No. 2) ;

(d.) To accept subscriptions and donations in money and kind, and whether of real or personal estate, and devise and bequests for the purposes aforesaid ;

(e.) To promote or join with any other public or private body, association, persons, or person in promoting any scheme, function, or method for raising money or obtaining gifts in kind for the purposes aforesaid, and to give the patronage and approval of the society to any public or private scheme for the same purpose ;

(f.) To sell and dispose of any real and personal estate coming into the possession of the society, or to mortgage, let, or manage the same ;

(g.) To charter any ship or enter into any contract of affreightment for the carriage of any goods to Europe or elsewhere ;

(h.) To pay over or donate moneys to any fund established in Great Britain, Ireland, Belgium, or elsewhere for the purpose aforesaid, or to any Minister of State for the like purposes, and to consign goods or gifts in kind, food, or other produce to any officer, official, or person to be used for the purpose aforesaid ;

(i.) To purchase any goods or produce and to expend any moneys in the hands of the society in so doing ;

(j.) To do all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of any of the above objects :

And whereas the said society has established a fund for the promotion of the objects hereinbefore expressed, and has submitted the said fund and the conditions of control and the expenditure thereof for approval, as required by the hereinbefore-quoted provisions of the said Act :

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby approve for the purposes of the said Act—

Regulation No. 178, as amended on the 1st April, 1914, is hereby further amended by adding, after the subject "English" in Group I, the subject "(1A.) Dictation and Handwriting (including the copying of manuscript): Maximum marks, 100."

Regulation No. 181, as amended on the 1st April, 1914, is hereby further amended by deleting the words "Special consideration will in all cases be given to handwriting and to the formation of figures," and inserting in lieu thereof the words "The legibility of handwriting and the setting-out of matter will in all cases be taken into account when assigning marks to papers in the various subjects."

The regulation is hereby still further amended by inserting, after the syllabus of examination in the subject (1) *English* in Group I, the words "(1A.) *Dictation and Handwriting*.—The writing from dictation of a passage from some newspaper or standard author, special consideration being given to punctuation and penmanship. The copying from print or manuscript of prose, poetry, business letters, tabulated matter, and commercial papers. In the assessment of marks for handwriting consideration will be given chiefly to legibility, regularity, neatness, and speed. Handwriting will be taken into account in all subjects tested by written examination."

Regulation No. 200H is hereby amended by adding the following proviso to the first paragraph thereof:—

"Provided that a candidate who has gained partial success towards the examination shall be deemed to have passed the examination if at an examination not later than July, 1916, he has passed in such of the subjects enumerated in Regulation No. 200F hereof, and in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained, as would, under the regulations for the Senior Examination previously in force, have satisfied the requirements for officers of his Department."

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Director: Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
