8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulation made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in

made thereuniter, and entering and privileges conferred by this force. 9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such rights, powers, or privileges without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

2. Every application for registration shall contain an exact description of the subject of the application, and the regis-tration officer may require a description to be exemplified by a specimen or a drawing, and may refuse to accept any description that is, in his opinion, not sufficiently exact.

3. Every application for registration shall be accompanied by a bank receipt for the payment of $\pounds I$ sterling to the Public Account at some branch of the Bank of New Zealand.

4. From time to time the registration officer shall publish in the Gazette a list of claims for registration, and if within forty days of such publication he receives no objection to any claim so published, he may register the claim and furnish to the applicant a certificate thereof.

5. If objection is made to any claim the matter in dispute shall, if it cannot otherwise be settled, be determined by a Board consisting of the registration officer, or some person appointed by the Minister for the purpose, and a represen-tative of each of the contending parties. The registration officer, or other person appointed as aforesaid, shall be chair-man and convener of the Board, and the decision of the Board shall be final. Each party shall pay its own expenses.

6. The registration officer shall from time to time publish in the Gazette a list of the colours, badges, or monograms in respect of which he has issued certificates of registration.

The grant shall be utilized for the purpose of providing supplementary continuous readers sufficient in number for class reading by pupils in classes P to S6 inclusive, and also for the purpose of supplying free class-books in necessitous cases and in cases where newly entered pupils have already purchased elsewhere class-books different from those in use in the school.

3. Supplementary readers and other class-books so provided shall be such only as are approved or sanctioned in accordance with subsection (5) of section 56 of the said Act. Requests for the approval of class-books other than those already on the approved list should be accompanied by copies of the books.

4. After provision has been made for the supply of the books mentioned in clause 2 hereof the balance of the grant, if any, shall be spent on books approved by the Senior Inspector for the district as suitable for individual reading by the pupils in school or at home.

5. No portion of the capitation grant shall be spent for any purposes other than those specified.

6. Capitation grants will be paid on the receipt of applications from the Board on forms provided by the Department.

7. Where a School Committee has received a sum of money or other voluntary contribution for the purpose of establishing, maintaining, or increasing the utility of a school or class library, and where in accordance with subsection (2) of section 37 or subsection (1) of section 159 of the said Act, and of regulations prescribed thereunder, a subsidy is payable on such contribution, the manner of expending both the original contribution and the subsidy or subsidies thereon shall be subject to the approval of the Board.

8. All contributions for school and class libraries received by a Board or School Committee on which subsidies are payable, and the subsidies payable thereon by the Minister or the Board, together with any additional grants from its General Fund that the Board may make for such libraries under the provisions of subsections (2) and (4) of section 37 of the said Act, shall be available for expenditure for the following purposes only:—

- (a.) The establishment, maintenance, and improvement of school and class libraries.
- (b.) The provision of such shelves, cupboards, and other appliances as are considered necessary for the safe custody and care of the books in such library.
- (c.) The payment in whole or in part of the cost of the conveyance of books under such schemes of exchange as are indicated in clauses 10 and 11 of these regulations.

9. All books provided for school and class libraries in accordance with these regulations shall be suitable and available for the individual reading of the pupils at home or at school, or books of reference for use by such pupils. They shall be subject to the approval of the Senior Inspector for the district, and shall not be selected by reason of their suitability for use by adults.

10. To give wider utility to school libraries and to afford pupils greater variety of reading-matter the Board may arrange for the interchange of books in the school libraries of adjacent schools or schools between which communication is easy.

11. The Board or the School Committee, with the concurrence of the Board, may also arrange for the loan of books for the school library from the children's section of a public library or other similar institution approved by the Senior Inspector of the district.

12. School and class libraries for the benefit of which subsidies are paid out of public funds under the said Act shall be in the charge of the head teacher of the school or some other responsible person approved by the Board.

13. When a public library is kept in a school the public library and the school library shall in all respects be kept distinct.

29th June, 1915. Memorandum for Exporters and Shippers to New Zealand. 1. YOUR attention is directed to Order in Council dated 26th January, 1915, and appearing in the New Zealand Gazette of same date.

2. In order to minimize any inconvenience in the matter the following rules of procedure have been laid down and

will become operative on and after 7th July, 1915. They have received the approval of Imperial Government Depart-ments in the United Kingdom in so far as they are concerned in dealing with goods imported from the countries mentioned.

GOODS SHIPPED DIRECT.

3. These goods will be dealt with entirely by the Authorities in New Zealand in accordance with the provisions of Order in Council before referred to.

GOODS IN TRANSIT THROUGH UNITED KINGDOM.

4. The goods here referred to may be as follows :

(a.) On through Bill of Lading.
(b.) Shipped under Customs Transhipment Regulations, and for which a Bill of Lading will be taken out in United Kingdom.

For both these classes of goods the British Consular Cer-ficates will not be required to be produced in United Kingdom. The goods concerned will be shipped thence without any other Customs restrictions than those operating in respect of ordi-nary transhipments under Bond. The Consular Certificates will, however, be required to be produced in New Zealand for all such goods.

win, however, be required to be produced in New Zealand for all such goods.
5. Cases may arise where a Consular Certificate covers goods partly for Home use in United Kingdom and partly for transhipment to New Zealand. In such cases the Certificate would be required by British Customs and be retained by them. Exporters are advised that under such circumstances the British Customs, on request being made to that effect and on payment of prescribed fee, will issue a copy of the Certificate, or an extract of so much thereof as may concern the Exporter interested in the New Zealand shipment.
6. If the Exporter elects he may, however, present the Consular Certificate to the High Commissioner's Office, 13 Victoria Street, and there obtain, free of charge, a certified copy or extract. This would have to be done before presentation of original to the British Customs.
7. In like manner a Certificate may cover goods for transhipment to different Overseas Dominions. In such case, if the original be presented at the High Commissioner's Office,

In such case, if the original be presented at the High Commissioner's Office, 13 Victoria Street, a certified copy or extract will, on appli-cation, be given free of charge to the Exporter. 8. These certified copies of Certificate or extracts, as the case may be, must be prepared in duplicate (one to be re-tained by the High Commissioner) by the Exporter or his agent, and will, upon due completion, be accepted in New Zealand in lieu of the original Consular Certificate.

GOODS RE-EXPORTED FROM UNITED KINGDOM.

9. These goods will have been imported into the United Kingdom and passed through Customs there on Free or other Entry for home use or for warehousing under Bond. In such case, when the goods are shipped for New Zealand, they are entered for re-export at the Customs on "Specification" (Form No. 30) or on "Shipping Bill" for warehoused goods (Form No. 64).

(Form No. 64). 10. In either of these cases the Exporter should obtain from the Customs a duplicate of such "Specification" or "Shipping Bill," as the case may be, duly signed by the proper Officer and having an impression of the Customs Office stamp placed thereon. The duplicates should there-after be sent out to New Zealand with other usual shipping documents, and when presented to the Customs Authorities at the Port of Destination will obviate any necessity for pro-duction of British Consular Certificate for the goods specified. 11. Cases may occur where goods for various Overseas consignees are passed for export on one "Specification" or "Shipping Bill." In such case the Exporter or his agent may, if he so desires, apply for and obtain a sufficient number of extracts from the original Specification or Shipping Bill as will enable him to supply one each to his different clients. 12. The duplicate Specification or Shipping Bill or extracts thereof will be required only in respect of goods re-exported

thereof will be required only in respect of goods re-exported from United Kingdom which were originally imported on Consular Certificate or otherwise (the Certificate is not required in United Kingdom for certain specified goods) from Holland, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Italy, Switzerland, or Balaium Belgium.

Belgium. 13. The British Customs have consented to issue these duplicates on application being made therefor by the Exporter or his agent. The duplicates must be prepared by the latter, and be presented for signature and stamping at the same time as he lodges his original "Specification" or "Shipping Bill" at the Customs. There will be no charge made by the Customs for this service.

RE-EXPORTED BELGIAN GOODS.

14. Goods of Belgian manufacture can be imported into United Kingdom only when a License has first been obtained

Any Belgian goods so imported will, if re-exported to New Zealand, be dealt with in a similar manner to other re-exportations by the Exporter obtaining from the British Customs a duplicate of Specification (Form 30) or Shipping Bill (Form No. 64), as the case may be. The procedure laid down in paragraphs 9–13 above will also apply to Belgian goods re-exported from the United Kingdom. 16. The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 600, against 559 in June—an increase of 41. The deaths in July were 274—an increase of 37 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 149, females 125. Fifty of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 18.25 per cent. of the whole number; 44 of these were under one year of age.

MARINERS are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following orders have been made, as to cruising of yachts and pleasure-boats between the undermentioned areas, and are now in force :

-NORTH FORELAND TO SOUTH FORELAND.

1. All yachts and pleasure-boats are to keep within a distance of half a mile from the shore, except when in the waters between Ramsgate and Deal, when they are to keep inside a line joining North Foreland and Old Stairs Bay. 2. Yachts and boats plying for hire must be duly licensed, and are not to leave the shore without a competent boatman

in charge. In places where licenses are not granted by the local authorities a permit must be obtained from the Senior

Naval Officer, Ramsgate (see par. 3). 3. Private yachts and boats are not allowed to cruise in these waters without a permit from the Senior Naval Officer, Ramsgate. (When applying for a permit state name and address of owner, and name and description of craft.)

address of owner, and name and description of craft.)
4. No yachts or pleasure-boats are to cruise at night— *i.e.*, between the hours of sunset and sunrise.
5. Yachts and pleasure-boats are strictly forbidden to go alongside or communicate with any vessel in the Downs.
6. Yachts and pleasure-boats embarking or disembarking passengers at Ramsgate Harbour are to use the steps at inner end of West Pier, and are to keep to the westward of a line joining outer extremity of East Pier and west gate of basin.

When H.M. vessels are entering or leaving harbour, yachts and pleasure boats are to keep clear of the entrance. 7. Infringements of the above regulations are punishable offences under the Defence of the Realm Act.

II. SOUTH FORELAND TO DUNGENESS.

1. All yachts and pleasure-boats plying for hire between 1. All yaonts and pleasure-boats plying for hire between Dungeness and St. Margaret's Bay are only allowed to do so by day. They must be supplied with a permit signed by the Chief of the Local Police, and they are to keep within a distance of one mile from the shore. They are to be at their moorings at night—*i.e.*, between the hours of sunset and suprise and sunrise.

2. Yachts and pleasure-boats are not allowed to leave shore without a competent boatman in charge, and are for-bidden to go alongside or communicate with any vessel lying off shore.

3. Dover Harbour being a fortified area is subject to special regulations.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the power conferred on it by section 22 of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Johnsonville Town Board hereby resolves to amend the said special rate of 11/64ths of a penny in the pound on the rate-able value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property in the Johnsonville Town District, by increasing the said special rate to §ths of a penny in the pound.
