Parcel-post Regulations.—Amendments.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-third day of August, 1915.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the twenty-sixth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and seven, the tenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, the sixteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and the twenty-third day of November, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and seven, the thirteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, the nineteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and the twenty-sixth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, respectively, regulations were made and rates of postage fixed under the authority of the Post Office Act, 1900, and the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, respectively, for the conveyance of parcels by means of the Post Office: And whereas it is desirable to amend and add to such regulations, and to alter such rates of postage in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, and the Post and Telegraph Amendment Act, 1910, and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations and fix the rates of postage set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby revoke so much of the regulations and rates in the Schedules to the above-recited Orders in Council as is inconsistent herewith; and doth further order that the said revocation shall take effect, and the regulations hereby made and the rates of postage hereby fixed shall come into force, on the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*, and that the regulations hereby made shall form part of and be read together with the above-recited regulations.

SCHEDULE.

GENERAL.

1. POSTAGE-STAMPS in prepayment of postage must be affixed to the parcel by the sender or the person handing it in.
2. Parcels addressed to the Australian States shall not be liable to detention through being posted in posting-boxes.
3. Tire-covers exceeding the prescribed limit of size cannot be forwarded in hampers. If the senders are prepared to accept all risk of damage, the tires shall be accepted and forwarded in parcel-post bags. In such cases the tires shall be labelled "Post Office accepts no risk."
4. Articles similar to fishing-rods and golf-sticks shall be accepted under the same conditions as fishing-rods and golf-sticks.
5. Boxes containing articles such as hats and millinery, unless made of wood or stout "leather board" with lids extending about two-thirds of the depth of the box, must be protected by light cross-bars of wood. Strawboard boxes are unsuitable. If a person presents a parcel which is damaged, insufficiently protected, or insecurely packed, and insists on its being forwarded, the parcel shall be labelled "Post Office accepts no risk," and accepted on such condition.
6. Powders and puddings may be forwarded both within New Zealand and to such countries beyond New Zealand as do not specially prohibit their introduction, provided that such articles are securely packed so as to prevent all risk or injury to other parcels or to officers of the Post Office.

7. Mushrooms shall not be sent through the post unless they are enclosed in liquid-tight tins and securely packed.

8. No Maori antiquities or curiosities, or articles of Maori workmanship, or apparently of Maori workmanship, shall be accepted for transmission by parcel-post to places beyond New Zealand unless they are accompanied by the permit of the Minister of Internal Affairs.

9. Tobacco may be imported into New Zealand by parcel-post without restriction.

10. Parcels of bullion shall be accepted for inland transmission subject to the same conditions as to size and weight as ordinary parcels.

11. All plants, bulbs, fruit, &c., received by parcel-post from places beyond the Dominion and accompanied by the requisite certificate shall, if after inspection by an officer of the Department of Agriculture they are found to be free from disease, be admitted at the Ports of Auckland, Christchurch, Dunedin, Wellington, and Bluff only; if received at any other port in the Dominion, they shall be despatched at once to the nearest of these five offices to be first inspected by an officer of the Department of Agriculture.

12. Before delivery of any parcel (inland or foreign) a receipt shall be obtained from the addressee.

13. For the purpose of assessing the charge for demurrage watches shall not be deemed to be jewellery.

UNCLAIMED PARCELS.

14. If an inland parcel is not claimed in fourteen days the sender shall be advised. If in such a case redirection is required a fresh rate of postage shall be charged. A charge for postage insufficiently prepaid in the first instance shall not be waived on the return of an undelivered parcel.

15. Parcels originating in the United States of America or any of its dependencies, and unclaimed at the expiration of thirty days from their receipt at the office of destination, shall be returned to the office of origin without charge. Parcels originating in other countries which cannot be delivered shall be kept at the office to which they are addressed for one clear month irrespective of the one in which they are received, and, if not claimed, forwarded to the chief post-office. The senders shall be advised through the Post Office of the country of origin, and in the absence of instructions the parcels originating in Australia shall be retained for four months, and those from other countries six months, from the date of posting of the advice of non-delivery, and then returned through the Dead Letter Office to the countries whence they were received.

REDIRECTED PARCELS.

16. Where the original and corrected addresses of a redirected parcel are both within a delivery from the same post-office, a new rate of postage shall not be charged for each redirection. Parcels addressed to His Excellency the Governor and his household shall be readdressed without charge within New Zealand. Parcels shall not be redirected to the United States of America unless the redirection fee is prepaid in New Zealand.

INSURANCE OF PARCELS.

17. A parcel of which the contents have no saleable value may be insured for a nominal sum in order to obtain the safeguards of the insurance system; the fee payable shall be the minimum one.

18. A fresh insurance fee shall not be charged on an insured parcel for each redirection within New Zealand. Ordinary redirection charges only shall be levied, and the insurance shall be maintained without additional charge.

19. In the case of a parcel originating outside New Zealand, no application for compensation shall be entertained unless it is made within twelve months from the date of posting.

20. Where the insurance system is shown in column 7 of the following table to be restricted to particular post-offices, only parcels addressed to those offices shall be accepted for insurance, unless the note "See clause 20, page 2981," appears against the entry. In that case parcels for destinations beyond the post-offices named shall also be accepted for insurance, but only for that part of the journey which terminates at one or other of those offices. The covers of the parcels accepted under this agreement must be endorsed by the sender "To be insured as far as the service permits."

| <p><i>Prohibitions.</i>—Ospreys; bullion, blank or partly blank in invoice forms capable of being filled up and used as genuine invoices, opium, vines or cuttings, hop extracts or substitutes, horns and hoofs, human hair (unless sterilized and dressed or made up for sale, tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, and snuff, unless <i>bona fide</i> samples or for the personal use of the addressee, who must satisfy the Australian Customs authorities as to the facts. Potatoes are prohibited from importation into Western Australia. The importation of potatoes into other States of the Commonwealth, and of plants, fruits, spirits, vaccine or lymph, hides, skins, wool, hair, and bones into the Commonwealth generally, is subject to special restrictions; and the addressees of parcels containing these articles must make arrangements with the local authorities for delivery.</p> <p><i>Observations.</i>—When the sender wishes to undertake the payment of Customs and other charges a deposit of 1s. for every 4s. or fraction of 4s. of the value of the parcel is required. Delivery of parcels is confined to places having communication by rail or coach with the principal towns. Addressees of parcels addressed to places having no such communication are informed by letter of the place where the parcels await delivery. Parcels for the Northern Territory of South Australia (Port Darwin, &c.) are sent forward <i>via</i> Sydney.</p> | Australia |

| <p>Prohibitions.—Bullion exceeding £5 in value, oilskins, and similar goods.</p> <p>Observations.—Parcels for the Lower Congo (Banana, Boma, Matadi, Ponta da Lenna, Vivi) are liable on delivery to a charge of 1 franc, for the Upper Congo (Bengala, Kukunga, Kunchassa, Kwamouth, Leopoldville, Lutete) and for the Katanga Province, if forwarded <i>via</i> Belgium, to a charge of 10 francs, and for the Katanga Province, if forwarded <i>via</i> Beira or Cape Town, to special charges. | <p>Prohibitions.—Base or counterfeit coin, articles infringing trade-mark or copyright laws, oilskins or other similar oiled goods, oiled paper, carbon paper (except typewriting carbon paper, which may be accepted provided that the sender certifies the contents on the Customs declaration in the following terms: "Typewriting carbon paper coated with wax and containing no oxidizable, oily, or fatty substance"), live animals (except bees in properly constructed cases), oilskins and similar goods. No parcel may contain coin, unless clearly intended for purposes of ornament, or bullion exceeding £5 sterling in value, addressed to the United Kingdom or for certain places in transit through the United Kingdom.</p> <p>Observations.—No compensation is paid in respect of loss or damage of uninsured parcels or their contents. Parcels must be so wrapped or enclosed as to permit their contents to be easily examined by Postmasters or Customs officers. No parcel may be sealed with sealing-wax or closed by the use of any adhesive substance which would prevent the opening of the package easily and without damage to its cover. Boxes with lids screwed or nailed on may be used, and bags closed by means of sewing. If the value of the goods (exclusive of papers such as stocks, bonds, &c. of no commercial value) contained in a parcel or in several parcels sent at the same time by one sender to the same addressee, exceeds £20 10s., or 100 dollars, an invoice certified by a United States Consul must be furnished. To avoid delay it is desirable that this invoice should accompany the parcel or parcels, but the sender, if he prefers, may send it direct to the addressee. In either case the relative Customs Declaration should be suitably noted.
