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Districts constituted under the Marriage Act, 1908.

A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage districts known as the Nightcaps, Lumsden, Otautāu, and Orepuki Districts, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said districts is hereby divided anew into three marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

LUMSDEN DISTRICT.

All that area in the Southland Land District bounded towards the north by Manapouri, Mararoa, and Burwood Survey Districts from Lake Manapouri to the Oreti River, and across that river to Windley Stream; thence towards the north-west by a right line to Eyre Peak; thence towards the east generally by a right line to the source of the Mataura River, and by that river to a point in line with the southern boundary of Section No. 511, Hokonui Survey District; thence towards the south generally by a right line to the easternmost corner of that section and by Sections Nos. 201, 563, and 202 to the westernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by a right line to the road at the easternmost corner of Section No. 148, by that road and its continuation to the junction of roads at the northernmost corner of Section No. 198, by the road forming the north-western boundaries of Sections Nos. 198, 629, 628, 627, 626, and 625 to Section No. 50, and by that section to Longridge Stream; by that stream to its confluence with Waimea Stream, and by Waimea Stream to the road intersecting Section No. 169; thence by that road and its continuation through Sections Nos. 403, 99, and 167, and by Sections Nos. 486, 798, 797, 796, and the road intersecting Sections Nos. 354, 405, and 670, and its continuation along the north-eastern boundary of Section No. 19, through Section No. 445, and along the north-eastern boundary of Section No. 258, Hokonui Survey

District, to and across the Oreti River, by that river and Southland County to the north-western corner of Section No. 162A, Taringatura Survey District; thence by a line running due west to and across the Aparima River, and by that river to Etal Stream; thence by that stream to its source; thence by a right line to Spence Peak; thence by a right line to the source of Redcliff Creek, and by that creek to the Waiau River; and thence towards the west by the Waiau River and Lake Manapouri to Manapouri Survey District, the place of commencement.

OTAUTAŪ DISTRICT.

All that area in the Southland Land District bounded towards the north by Redcliff Creek from the Waiau River to its source; thence by a right line to Spence Peak; thence by a right line to the source of Etal Stream, and by that stream to the Aparima River; by the right bank of that river to a point due west of the north-western corner of Section No. 162A, Taringatura Survey District, and by a right line to the said north-western corner of that section; thence towards the east by Southland County to Jacob's River Hundred; thence towards the south generally by Jacob's River Hundred and Longwood Survey District to the north-eastern corner of Block XVIII, Longwood Survey District; thence by a right line to the confluence of the Orawia River and the Waiau River; and towards the west generally by the said Waiau River to Redcliff Creek, the place of commencement.

OREPUKI DISTRICT.

All that area in the Southland Land District bounded towards the north-east by a right line from the confluence of the Waiau River and the Orawia River to the north-eastern corner of Block XVIII, Longwood Survey District; thence towards the north by Waiau Survey District to the western boundary of Aparima Hundred; towards the east by Aparima Hundred to its south-western corner; thence by a right line to the source of the Ourawera Stream and by that stream to the sea; towards the south and south-west by the sea to the mouth of the Waiau River; and towards the west generally by that river to the place of commencement.

ERRATA.—In description of Otago Riding of County of Ootiki at page 2764 of *Gazette* No. 93, of 5th August, 1915, for "Block XII," in the eleventh line thereof, insert "Block XIV"; for "Block XV," in the twenty-ninth line, insert "Block XI"; for "Block XII," in the forty-sixth line, insert "Block VIII."

Regulations in regard to the Importation of Fruit or Plants into New Zealand.—Notice No. 1794.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-third day of August, 1915.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section four of the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act") it is provided that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations under the said Act, the introduction into New Zealand, either generally or from any specified colony, country, port, or place, of any plant, fruit, fungus, parasite, insect, or any other thing which in his opinion is likely to introduce any disease as defined in the said Act, into New Zealand: And whereas in the opinion of the Governor the unrestricted introduction into New Zealand of fruit and plants is likely to introduce such diseases into New Zealand:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the several Orders in Council specified in the First Schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare that the introduction into New Zealand of any fruit or plants is absolutely prohibited except when such introduction takes place in accordance with the following regulations made under the said Act; and it is hereby declared that these regulations shall come into force on the day of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. For the purpose of these regulations,—

"Disease" means any disease as defined in the said Act, and includes any disease declared to be a disease within the meaning of that Act:

"Fruit" means the edible product of any plant, and includes the peel, skin, or shell of such product, and also the seeds of such plant, whether such fruit is or is not attached to the plant:

"Plant" means any tree, flower, shrub, vegetable, or other vegetation:

"Fruit or plants infected with disease" means any fruit or plant (including cuttings, buds, or any other portion of a plant), or package or wrapping containing the same, in or on which such disease is or has been present in any form or stage of development, or any fruit or plant (including cuttings, buds, or any other portion of a plant), or package or wrapping containing the same, infected with such disease, or with which any such fruit, plant, package, or wrapping has come in contact.

2. For the purpose of the said Act the Ports of Auckland, Wellington, Lyttelton, Dunedin, and Bluff are hereby appointed to be the only ports of entry for fruit or plants:

Provided that in the case of direct consignments of fruit or plants for any other port than those above mentioned the whole consignment or any portion thereof, as may be required by the Inspector, shall be actually landed by the owner or person in charge thereof, at the owner's expense, for examination at a port of entry; and on a permit being issued by such Inspector, after examination, authorizing their release, such fruit or plants shall be allowed to land on production of such permit to the Customs officer at the port of destination. The form of permit shall be as set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

ADMISSION OF FRUIT.

Grapes from Australia.

3. Grapes may be introduced into New Zealand from the Commonwealth of Australia, provided that every shipment of grapes must be accompanied by a certificate as set out in form No. 1 of the Third Schedule hereto, signed by the shipper, setting forth the number and kind of packages, the shipping-marks, the name of the grower of such grapes, the locality and the State where such grapes were grown, and certifying that no phylloxera is known to exist in or within one mile of the vineyard where such grapes were grown, that no grape-vine foliage or wood is attached to such grapes, that no grapes from any other vineyard than the one specified as

aforsaid have been mixed with the consignment, and that such grapes are contained in clean new packages not previously used for any purpose; also by a certificate, as set out in form No. 2 of the Third Schedule hereto, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture in the State where such grapes were grown, certifying that such grapes are clean and free from disease, that no phylloxera is known to exist in or within one mile of the vineyard where such grapes are certified by the shipper to have been grown, and that no grape-vine foliage or wood is attached to such grapes.

Pine-apples, Passion-fruit, Lemons, or Bananas in a Green Condition from Australia or the Pacific Islands.

4. Pine-apples, passion-fruit, lemons, or bananas shipped in a green and thoroughly unripe condition may be introduced into New Zealand from the Commonwealth of Australia or from the islands in the Pacific Ocean, provided that every shipment of such pine-apples, passion-fruit, lemons, or bananas as aforesaid must be accompanied by a certificate as set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto, signed by the shipper, setting forth the shipping-marks, the number of packages of each class of fruit shipped under each mark, the name of the grower of such fruit, the locality and the State or island where such fruit was grown, and certifying that such fruit was shipped in a green and thoroughly unripe condition, and that such fruit is contained in clean new packages not previously used for any purpose:

Provided further that if the Inspector at the port of entry, on examination, is of opinion that such fruit was not shipped in the condition as aforesaid, he may direct that such fruit, together with any packages, wrappings, &c., containing it, shall either be reshipped at once to a port or place beyond New Zealand by the person introducing or attempting to introduce it, or be disinfected or destroyed at the port of entry, as provided for in section 9 of the said Act:

Provided further, however, that no such fruit, packages, or wrappings, &c., shall be reshipped without the consent of an Inspector under the said Act first had and obtained.

Pine-apples, Passion-fruit, or Lemons, not Green, from Australia or the Pacific Islands.

5. Pine-apples, passion-fruit, or lemons other than green and thoroughly unripe pine-apples, passion-fruit, or lemons as hereinbefore mentioned may be introduced into New Zealand from the Commonwealth of Australia or from the islands in the Pacific Ocean, provided that every shipment of such pine-apples, passion-fruit, or lemons as aforesaid must be accompanied by a certificate as set out in form No. 1 of the Fifth Schedule hereto, signed by the shipper, setting forth the shipping-marks, the number of packages of each class of fruit shipped under each mark, the name of the grower of such fruit, and the locality and the State or island where such fruit was grown, and certifying that such fruit is contained in clean new packages not previously used for any purpose; also by a certificate as set out in form No. 2 of the said Fifth Schedule, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture, or other Department performing the functions or duties relating to horticulture, in the State or island where such fruit was grown, certifying that such fruit is clean and free from disease.

General Provisions relating to the Admission of Fruit other than Grapes.

6. Any fruit, other than grapes, in respect of which provision has not been made in the preceding regulations may be introduced into New Zealand, provided that every shipment of such fruit must be accompanied by a certificate, as set out in form No. 1 of the Sixth Schedule hereto, signed by the shipper, setting forth the shipping-marks, the number of packages of each class of fruit shipped under each mark, the name of the grower of such fruit and of the locality and of the country or place where such fruit was grown, and certifying that no species of fruit-fly is known to exist in or within one mile of the orchard where such fruit was grown, and that such fruit is contained in clean new packages not previously used for any purpose; also by a certificate, as set out in form No. 2 of the Sixth Schedule hereto, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture, or other Department performing the functions or duties relating to horticulture, in the country or place where such fruit was grown, certifying that such fruit is clean and free from disease, and that no species of fruit-fly is known to exist in or within one mile of the orchard where such fruit is certified by the shipper to have been grown.

ADMISSION OF PLANTS.

Grape-vine Cuttings from Australia.

7. Fresh grape-vine cuttings, not being rooted vines, may be introduced into New Zealand from any of the States of

the Commonwealth of Australia, provided that every shipment of such grape-vine cuttings must be accompanied by a certificate, as set out in the Seventh Schedule hereto, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture in such State, setting forth the name of the district from which such grape-vine cuttings came, and certifying that the said district is free from phylloxera, and that the cuttings have been treated in such a manner as to destroy any insects or eggs thereof should such be present.

Plants other than Grape-vines or Portions thereof.

8. Plants or portions of plants, except grape-vines or portions thereof, may be introduced into New Zealand, provided that every shipment of such plants or portions of plants must be accompanied by one or other of the certificates as follows:—

- (a.) In the case of plants or portions of plants grown in countries where an official inspection of nurseries is maintained, a certificate as set out in form No. 1 of the Eighth Schedule hereto, signed by the grower of such plants or portions of plants, setting out the number, kinds, packing, and marking of such plants or portions of such plants, and the name and address of the consignee, and certifying that such plants or portions of plants are wholly the produce of the nursery of which he is the occupier, and are to the best of his knowledge and belief clean and free from disease; also by a certificate as set out in form No. 2 of the Eighth Schedule hereto inscribed on the above-mentioned grower's certificate, and signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture or other Department carrying out the official inspection of nurseries, certifying that the nursery in which the plants or portions of plants are certified to have been grown has been officially inspected and is clean and free from disease.
- (b.) A certificate in the form set out in the Ninth Schedule hereto, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture, or other Department performing the functions or duties relating to horticulture, in the country or place where such plants or portions of plants were grown; or, in the case of plants or portions of plants grown in the United Kingdom, signed by the director of any public or botanic gardens in the United Kingdom, certifying that such plants or portions of plants have been subjected to the one of the three following methods of treatment appropriate to the case—namely, that they have been subjected in a suitable enclosure to the fumes of hydrocyanic-acid gas for the space of one hour, or have been sprayed with or dipped in Bordeaux mixture, or have been sprayed with or dipped in red-oil emulsion of the proportion of one part of red oil to twelve parts of water.
- (c.) A certificate in the form set out in the Tenth Schedule hereto, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture, or other Department performing the functions or duties relating to horticulture, in the country or place where such plants or portions of plants were grown; or, in the case of plants or portions of plants grown in the United Kingdom, signed by the director of any public or botanic gardens in the United Kingdom, certifying that such plants or portions of plants are clean and free from disease.

Special Provisions relating to the Admission of Pear, Apple, or Quince Trees or Portions thereof from North America.

9. In the case of pear, apple, or quince trees or portions thereof introduced into New Zealand from North America, every shipment of such pear, apple, or quince trees or portions thereof must, in addition to one of the certificates provided for in the preceding regulation, be accompanied by a certificate as set out in the Eleventh Schedule hereto, signed by an officer of the Department of Agriculture, or other Department performing the functions or duties relating to horticulture, in the country or place where such pear, apple, or quince trees or portions thereof were grown, certifying that such pear, apple, or quince trees or portions thereof came from a district which is free from pear-blight or fire-blight of the pear (*Bacillus amylovorus*).

GENERAL.

10. On the production of the certificates prescribed in the preceding regulations at the office of an Inspector under the said Act situate at one of the prescribed ports of entry, such Inspector may, if satisfied that the certificates apply to the

fruit or plants proposed to be introduced, that the statements contained in the certificates are correct in fact, and that such fruit or plants are, in fact, free from disease as so certified, and that the law has been otherwise complied with, allow such fruit or plants to be landed and disposed of without further restriction:

Provided, however, that possession of such certificates shall not relieve any person seeking to introduce such fruit or plants from any other liabilities he may be subject to under the provisions of the said Act or these regulations.

11. If any fruit or plants, the introduction of which into New Zealand is absolutely prohibited by this Order in Council, are introduced or attempted to be introduced into New Zealand, such fruit or plants shall, together with any package containing the same, or with which the same may have come in contact, be either reshipped at once to a port or place beyond New Zealand by the person introducing or attempting to introduce them, or be destroyed, as provided in section 9 of the said Act, at the port of entry:

Provided, however, that no such fruit or plants shall be reshipped without the consent of an Inspector under the said Act first had and obtained; and provided further that in the event of destruction of such fruit or plants the fee for such destruction, as provided in these regulations, shall be paid by the owner or person in charge thereof on demand.

12. If any fruit or plants are introduced, or attempted to be introduced, into New Zealand without being accompanied by the certificates prescribed by these regulations as necessary for such fruit or plants, such fruit or plants may, together with any package containing the same or with which the same may have come in contact, be seized by an Inspector or other authorized officer, or an officer of Customs, and be disinfected, destroyed, or otherwise disposed of as such Inspector deems fit, at the expense of the owner or person in charge thereof.

13. If any fruit or plants are introduced or attempted to be introduced into New Zealand which, though accompanied by the certificates prescribed as necessary for such fruit or plants, are yet found on examination by an Inspector to be infected with disease, such fruit or plants shall, together with any packages, wrappings, &c., containing the same, be dealt with as hereinafter provided, namely:—

- (a.) In the case of fruit, plants, or things infected with the diseases included in the Twelfth Schedule hereto, such fruit, plants, or things shall be held and fumigated under the directions of the Inspector or other officer authorized by him in this behalf at the port of entry before being handed over to the owner or person in charge thereof; and the fee for such fumigation as provided in these regulations shall be paid by such owner or person on demand.
- (b.) In the case of fruit, plants, or things infected with the diseases included in the Thirteenth Schedule hereto, such fruit, plants, or things shall be seized and destroyed by the Inspector or other officer authorized by him in this behalf at the port of entry, as provided in section 9 of the said Act; and the fee for such destruction as provided in these regulations shall be paid by the owner or person in charge thereof on demand.
- (c.) In the case of plants or things infected with the diseases included in the Fourteenth Schedule hereto, such plants or things shall be held and dipped under the directions of the Inspector or other officer authorized by him in this behalf at the port of entry before being handed over to the owner or person in charge thereof; and the fee for such dipping as provided in these regulations shall be paid by such owner or person on demand.
- (d.) In the case of fruit, plants, or things infected with the diseases included in the Fifteenth Schedule hereto, such fruit, plants, or things shall be either reshipped at once to a port or place beyond New Zealand by the person introducing or attempting to introduce them, or be destroyed, as provided in section 9 of the said Act, at the port of entry: Provided, however, that no such fruit, plant, or thing shall be reshipped without the consent of an Inspector under the said Act first had and obtained; and provided further that in the event of destruction of such fruit, plant, or thing the fee for such destruction as provided in these regulations shall be paid by the owner or person in charge thereof on demand.

14. No fee shall be charged for inspection, but all labour connected with the opening and repacking of packages of fruit or plants for that purpose shall be provided at the expense of the owner or person in charge thereof.

15. The fees for fumigation, dipping, or destruction of fruit or plants as hereinbefore prescribed shall be as follows:—

16. Every person commits an offence against these regulations who—

- (a.) In any way introduces, attempts to introduce, or is concerned in introducing or attempting to introduce, any fruit, plant, or other thing infected with disease, or who keeps, sells, or exposes or offers for sale or barter such fruit, plant, or other thing, or in any way causes the distribution of the same:
- (b.) Removes or attempts to remove, or is concerned in removing, any fruit or plant, or package or wrapping containing the same, from any wharf or landing-place within New Zealand without first having obtained a permit from the Inspector in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS by the Patents, Designs, and Trade-marks Amendment Act, 1914, and the regulations thereunder, it is provided that the Governor in Council may, on the application of any person, and subject to such terms and conditions (if any) as he may think fit, order the avoidance or suspension in whole or in part of the registration of any trade-mark the proprietor whereof is a subject of any State at war with His Majesty :

And whereas application has been made by Herbert Albert Reeves, of 15 Elm Street, London, W.C., England, on behalf of Pearson's Antiseptic Company (Limited), of the same address, for the avoidance or suspension of the registration of Trade-mark No. 6182, registered as on the fifteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and six, in the name of Schulke and Mayr, of Hamburg 21, in the German Empire, and consisting of the word "Lysol" :

And whereas, on consideration of the said application and of the report of James Clark Lewis thereon, the Governor in Council has determined to make such order as hereinafter appears :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act and regulations, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby order that the registration of the Trade-mark No. 6182, registered in Class 2, shall, unless and until the Governor in Council shall otherwise order, be suspended so far as regards and in favour of the said Pearson's Antiseptic Company (Limited), subject to the following terms and conditions :—

(a.) That any Lysol to which the trade-mark is affixed by the company or on its behalf is of such purity and strength as may be approved by the Dominion Analyst.

(b.) That the price at which any such Lysol to which the name is applied will be sold by the company or on its behalf shall not exceed the market price of the goods obtained in New Zealand immediately before the commencement of the present state of war, plus any additional cost attributable to increased cost of raw material, as may be decided by the Minister of Justice.

(c.) That the company shall use with the name "Lysol" some other mark or means for distinguishing the goods.

(d.) That the company shall during the continuance of the suspension keep proper accounts, containing full particulars of all Lysol to which that name is applied sold by the company or on its behalf, and of the price or prices charged therefor.

(e.) The company shall during the continuance of the suspension furnish, or procure to be furnished, all such information as the Minister may consider to be material for the

purpose of ascertaining the cost of producing any Lysol to which the trade-mark is affixed by the company or on its behalf, or, where the Lysol is imported into New Zealand from abroad, the cost price of the Lysol landed in New Zealand; and the price or prices charged for the said Lysol; and for that purpose shall, if requested by the Minister, permit or procure permission to be given to such person or persons as may be authorized in that behalf by the Minister at any time or times to enter upon and inspect at any reasonable time any factory or place of business in which the manufacture or sale of Lysol is carried on by the company.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Director : Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity) :—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
