Altering Boundaries of Opotiki and Waiapu Counties.

[L.S.] LIVERPOOL, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection two of section three of the Counties Amendment Act, 1913, that the boundaries of any one or more counties may be altered in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Council of each of such counties in which the principal Act is in force:

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Opotiki County Council on the seventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and sealed with the seal of the Council of the said county on the same day: And whereas a similar resolution was passed by the Waiapu County Council on the fifteenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and sealed with the seal of the said county on the same day, praying for the inclusion in the Waiapu County of that part of the Opotiki County described in the said resolutions and in the First Schedule hereto: And whereas it is expedient to make such alteration in accordance with the said resolutions.

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Opotiki County, shall, as from the date of the publication hereof in the New Zealand Gazette, be deemed to be added to and form part of the Waiapu County; and, with the like power and authority, do proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Counties of Opotiki and Waiapu respectively shall as from the aforesaid date be those set forth under their respective headings in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA TO BE ADDED TO WAIAPU COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line along the left bank of the Whangaparaoa River from its mouth to the northernmost corner of Waikura No. 1 Block, and along the north-western boundaries of Waikura Nos. 1 and 2 Blocks to the southernmost corner of Whangaparaoa

No. 3A Block, and along the western boundary of that block to the Mangapouri Stream, along that stream and the southern boundary of Whangaparaoa No. 1 Block to the sea, and along the seashore to the mouth of the Whangaparaoa Stream, the place of commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

OPOTIKI COUNTY.

ALL that area bounded towards the north and north-west by the Bay of Plenty from a point where the Maraetotara Road first strikes high-water mark of the sea to the south-western corner of Whangaparaoa No. 1 Block, and by that block and the Mangapouri Stream to Whangaparaoa No. 3a Block; thence towards the east generally by Whangaparaoa No. 3A and Waikura No. 2 Blocks to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned block; thence towards the south-east generally by a right line to Whanakao Trig. Station; thence towards the south-east generally by Waikohu County; and towards the west by Whakatane County to the sea, the place of commencement.

All that area bounded towards the north and east generally by the sea from the south-western corner of Whangaparaoa No. 1 Block to the north-eastern corner of Cook County, towards the south generally by Cook and Waikohu Counties to Arowhana Trig. Station, and towards the west by Opotiki County hereinbefore described.

Notice respecting Bills of Lading.

Office of the Minister of Customs, Wellington, 19th October, 1915.

THE appended public announcement (issued by the Board of Trade on behalf of His Majesty's Government) as to the manner in which bills of lading should be made out during the war is published for general information.

BOARD OF TRADE ANNOUNCEMENT. Notice respecting Bills of Lading.

THE Board of Trade have received numerous inquiries with regard to the manner in which bills of lading should be made out during the war in order to minimize risk of delay if vessels are boarded or diverted at sea by officers of His Majesty's Navy.

vessels are boarded or diverted at sea by officers of His Majesty's Navy.

It should be clearly understood that no form of consignment will secure to vessels immunity from the beligerent right to visit, search, and detention, whatever the country or port from which they may have shipped the goods they are carrying and whatever the description of those goods. Compliance with the following recommendations in respect of bills of lading will, however, minimize the risk of delay, and will therefore be in the interest both of the ship and of the goods. the goods.

and will therefore be in the interest both of the ship and of the goods.

(1.) Shipments to Neutral European Ports or Russian Ports in the Baltic, or by Vessels calling at a Neutral European Port.

—In the case of goods shipped to a neutral European port or to a Russian port in the Baltic, or shipped by a vessel which is to call at a neutral European port, it is recommended that bills of lading should never be made out "to order," but that they should be made out either (a) to a named consignee or (b) to a bank or financial house of high standing with the remark "Notify A. B.," A. B. being the name of the person or firm for whom the goods are ultimately destined. Goods shipped to Holland should be consigned to Netherlands Oversea Trust.

(2.) Shipments to British, French, or Italian Ports, or Russian Ports not in the Baltic.—It is not necessary that goods shipped to a British, French, or Italian port, or to a Russian port not in the Baltic, should be consigned as above described, provided that it is clearly indicated in the bill of lading and in the manifest that the ultimate destination is as stated, and provided that the vessel is not to call at a neutral European port on her voyage.

(3.) Shipments to Neutral Countries outside Europe.—It is desirable, in cases where the use of another form of consignment might lead to an interruption of the voyage, that goods shipped to neutral countries outside Europe should be consigned.

desirable, in cases where the use of another form of consignment might lead to an interruption of the voyage, that goods shipped to neutral countries outside Europe should be consigned in the same manner as those shipped to neutral countries in Europe; but where this course is not adopted, it should be clearly indicated in the bill of lading that the destination of the goods is outside Europe, and is not in Asiatic Turkey, nor in nor adjacent to any enemy possession.

(4.) In all cases it is essential that the bill of lading, or a certified copy of it, should be on board the vessel.

Mean dew-point, 47.2°; mean elastic force of vapour, 0.325 in.; and mean relative humidity, 77 per cent. of saturation.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1915.

Except in the northernmost portion of the North Island and the West Coast of the South, rainfall was below the age. The East Coast districts again experienced very dry conditions, and many places report a serious deficiency in the amount of water in the streams.

Several westerly atmospheric disturbances passed over the Dominion, with centres to the southward, and a low-pressure area was also in evidence off East Cape on the 20th.

The latter was accountable for strong southerly winds generally. Fair weather predominated during the month, although cloudy skies were much in evidence, particularly in the northern half of the North Island.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

THEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned under the Harbours Act Amendment Act, 1883, Messrs. William Brown and Raymond Brown, of Te Kopuru, trading under the style or t.tle of W. Brown and S.n (hereinafter called "the licensees"), did in the year 1901 apply for a license under the said Act to occupy a part of the foreshore, and the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous to such foreshore, in order to erect and maintain thereon a wharf; and, in accordorder to erect and maintain thereon a whar; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fifty-sixth section of the Harbours Act, 1878, deposited plans in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, marked M.D. 2416, showing the place where it was intended to erect such wharf, and the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose: And whereas, it having been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed works would not be or tend to the injury of navigation, a license was duly issued to the licensees to occupy the said foreshore and land below low-water mark for a period of fourteen years from the ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and one: And whereas, the said license having expired, the licensees have, in pursuance of the provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), applied for a renewal of the said license for a period of ten years from the date of expiry of the said license, and it is expedient to grant the same, under the said Act, on the terms

expedient to grant the same, under the said Act, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said ligous is required by purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore, and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto, which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said wharf thereon, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Sch dule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order 2. The concessions and privileges conterred by this order in Council shall extend and apply only to the part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of such wharf, which are shown on the plans marked M.D. 2416, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council, the licensees shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1, in advance, payable on the 1st day of Apr.l, dating from the 1st day of April, 1915, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council

4. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the

4. His Majesty or the Governor, and all others in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.

5. All persons shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefore. therefrom.

6. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit there-from, and maintain at their own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon the Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring them, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to make good the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made, as the case may be.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulation made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for ten years from the 9th day of April, 1915, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee.

11. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part.

12. In case the licensees shall

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of

thirty days;

(3.) Fail to pay the sum specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or

(4.) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy,

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license. right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the New Zealand Gazette of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee; and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

Under the Control and Supervision of the Education Department.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

- Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
- Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
- Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
