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*Altering Boundaries of Waitotara and Patea Counties.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection two of section three of the Counties Amendment Act, 1913, that the boundaries of any one or more counties may be altered in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Council of each of such counties in which the principal Act is in force:

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Waitotara County Council on the second day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and sealed with the seal of the Council of the said county on the second day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen:

And whereas a similar resolution was passed by the Patea County Council on the ninth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and sealed with the seal of the said county on the ninth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, praying for the alteration of the boundaries of such counties in the manner described in the said resolutions and in the First and Second Schedules hereto:

And whereas it is expedient to make such alteration in accordance with the said resolutions:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the areas described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Patea County, shall, as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, be deemed to be added to and form part of the Waitotara County, and that the area described in the Second Schedule hereto, being now part of the Waitotara County, shall, as from the date of such publication as aforesaid, be deemed to be added to and form part of the Patea County; and, with the like power and authority, do proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Counties of Waitotara and Patea respec-

tively shall, as from the aforesaid date, be those set forth under their respective headings in the Third Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREAS TO BE ADDED TO WAITOTARA COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, bounded by a line commencing at the north-eastern corner of Manganui-o-tahu Block; thence along the northern boundary of that block, the Manganui-o-tahu Stream, and the western boundary of the said block to Te Korokio Stream, and along that stream to its confluence with the Mangamingi Stream, along that stream to and along the north-eastern boundary of Section 11, Block XIV, Momahaki Survey District, to Pakira Trig. Station; and thence along the eastern boundary of Patea County as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 23rd October, 1902, page 2325, to the place of commencement.

Also all that area bounded by a line commencing at Pakira Trig. Station; thence along the southern boundary of Section 11, Block XIV, Momahaki Survey District, to Orangihoangi Trig. Station; thence along the western boundaries of Lots 17 and 14 on plan No. 918, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Wellington, to and across the Waitotara Road and the eastern boundary of Lot 4 on plan No. 659, deposited as aforesaid, to the south-eastern boundary of the Patea County; and thence along the south-eastern and eastern boundaries of that county to Pakira Trig. Station, the place of commencement.

Also all that area bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the Mangaone Stream by the south-eastern boundary of the Patea County; thence along that stream to the eastern boundary of Section 16, Block V, Nukumaru Survey District, along the eastern boundary of that section to Wharekarangi Trig. Station, along the southern boundary of the said section to the Mangaone Stream, and along that stream to the Waitotara River; thence to and along the middle of that river to the boundary of Patea County; and thence along the south-eastern boundary of that county to Mangaone Stream, the place of commencement.

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the south-eastern boundary of Patea County by the eastern boundary of Lot 4 on plan No. 659, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Wellington; thence along the eastern and south-eastern boundaries of that lot to the Mangaone Stream, along that stream to the said south-eastern boundary of Patea County, and along that boundary to the eastern boundary of Lot 4 aforesaid, the place of commencement.

## THIRD SCHEDULE.

## BOUNDARIES OF WAITOTARA COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Taranaki and Wellington Land Districts, bounded by a line along the middle of the Wanganui River from its intersection by a right line running from Mount Humphries to the confluence of that river with the Tangarakau River to the sea, along the seashore to the mouth of the Waitotara River, and along the middle of that river to a point opposite the mouth of the Mangaone Stream, to and along that stream, and along the southern boundary of Section 16, Block V, Nukumaru Survey District, to Wharekarangi Trig. Station; thence along the eastern boundary of Section 16 aforesaid to and along the Mangaone Stream to the south-eastern corner of Lot 4 on plan No. 659, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Wellington; thence along the south-eastern boundary of that lot to and across the Waitotara Road and along the western boundaries of Lots 14 and 17 on plan No. 918, deposited as aforesaid, to Orangihoangi Trig. Station, and along the south-eastern and north-eastern boundaries of Section 11, Block XIV, Momahaki Survey District, and the Mangamingi Stream, to and along the Te Korokio Stream, and along the western and northern boundaries of the Manganui-o-tahu Block to Watershed Road near Trig. Station Taurangapiopio, to and along the middle of that road and the summit of the range over Maungarau Trig. Station to Mount Humphries; and thence along a right line running in the direction of the confluence of the Tangarakau River with the Wanganui River to the middle of the latter river, the place of commencement: excluding the part of the Borough of Wanganui which is in the above-described area and the Town Districts of Castlecliff and Gonville.

## BOUNDARIES OF PATEA COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Taranaki and Wellington Land Districts, bounded towards the north by Stratford County as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 1st August, 1912, page 2380; towards the east generally by Waitotara County hereinbefore described; towards the south-west by the sea; and towards the west generally by Hawera County as described in the Second Schedule to the Waimate West County Act, 1908, and the Eltham County as described in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 27th April, 1911, page 1412: excluding the Borough of Patea and Waverley Town District.

6. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned additions in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels ; provided

that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said additions and view the state of repair thereof ; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such additions, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the 20th day of May, 1913, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority ; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company.

11. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said additions may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on the part of the company.

12. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein before set forth, or any of them ;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said additions for a period of thirty days ;
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved ; or

DESCRIPTIONS OF SECTIONS.

*Section 1, Block X, Porangahau S.D.*—Altitude, 100 ft. to 850 ft. Open pastoral country, hilly mostly, but having good even faces. Open pastoral country, containing a fair amount of terrace and easy undulating land, balance in easy sloping spurs; hilly on the west near the south boundary, and in the east towards the main range; a very good spur with easy slopes traverses the section; about half is in native and exotic grasses, balance in scrub, with a small clump of ngaio bush near the main range. The soil is a good quality, on both sandstone and papa foundation; well watered. Access from Porangahau, similar to Section 3.

*Section 5, Block XIV, Porangahau S.D.*—Altitude, 130 ft. to 900 ft. Open pastoral country, hilly generally, with a fair amount of terrace and easy sidling country; gully in centre of section running up in even steep slopes to the main range, where the land is undulating and in good grass. Good soil, on clay, sandstone, and papa foundation. The section contains an even sloping spur in good grass on the south, the balance is under low scrub with a clump of good mixed bush; well watered. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made by the above-recited Order in Council, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that such regulations shall form part of and be read together with the regulations made on the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and shall have effect on the publication of this Order in Council in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

**SPECIAL ORDER.**

THE Mount Roskill Road Board hereby makes by special resolution intended to operate as a special order the following by-law, to be known hereafter as By-law No. 2.

Whereas the Mount Roskill Road Board has recently provided a water-supply for the water-supply area of the Mount Roskill Road District. And whereas the said water-supply is in danger of pollution by the keeping of pigs in proximity to the source of the said water-supply: And whereas it is deemed advisable to prevent such danger of pollution:

Now, therefore, the Mount Roskill Road Board, in pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the Road Boards Act, 1908, the Public Health Act, 1908, and their several amendments, and of every other power and authority enabling in that behalf, hereby makes the following by-laws:—

1. No person shall keep, allow, suffer, or permit to be kept any pig or pigs within that part of the Mount Roskill Road District bounded by a line commencing towards the east at the intersection of the Mount Albert Road and Church Road, thence along Church Road to its intersection with Landscape Road; thence towards the north by Landscape Road and Boundary Road to the intersection of the latter road with Lovers Lane; thence towards the west along Lovers Lane to its intersection with Mount Albert Road, thence along Mount Albert Road to the commencing-point. And also that part of the said Mount Roskill District having a frontage to Mount Albert Road, and being Lots 38 to 51 inclusive of the subdivision of Allotments 7 and part 6 of Section 13, Suburbs of Auckland:



Provided that the Mount Roskill Road Board may license any person to keep one or more than one pig in the said part of the Mount Roskill Road District if kept in a sty or sties having a floor or floors made of concrete or other impervious material, and constructed so that there shall be no soakage of soil with pigs' food or urine; and may revoke such license if satisfied that the keeping of such pig or pigs causes or is likely to cause a nuisance, or pollutes or is likely to pollute the said water-supply.

2. This by-law shall apply to the aforesaid part of the Mount Roskill Road District only, and shall come into force on being gazetted.

3. If any person commit a breach of this by-law he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the case of a continuous breach to an additional fine not exceeding £5 for every day on which the breach is continued after the first day.

BY-LAWS.

BY-LAWS FOR CONDUCT OF BUSINESS AND PROCEEDINGS AT THE MEETINGS OF THE NEW PLYMOUTH FIRE BOARD AND OF COMMITTEES APPOINTED BY IT (FIRE BRIGADES ACT, 1908).

*Offices of the Board.*

1. THE offices of the New Plymouth Fire Board shall be at the Secretary's Office, Devon Street, situate in the Borough of New Plymouth, or at such other place as may from time to time be determined by the Board.

*Board to meet.*

2. Subject to section 36 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, the Board may meet for the despatch of business on the third Friday in the last month of each quarter, but may adjourn and regulate its meetings as it thinks fit, or when summoned by direction of the Chairman or two members.

*Notice of Meetings.*

3. Three clear days' notice of the meetings of the Board shall be sent to every member. Any notice posted to or delivered at the address of any member shall be deemed to have been given or sent to such member on the day on which it was posted or delivered.

*Commencement of Business.*

4. The Board shall commence business as soon after the time stated in the notice as there is a sufficient number of members in attendance to form a quorum, but if at the expiry of fifteen minutes from the time specified in the notice there is not a quorum present no business shall be transacted by the Board at that meeting, and such circumstance, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute-book.

*Appointment of Committee.*

5. The Board may appoint any committee for any purpose, and the Chairman of the Board shall be chairman of such committee, the majority of such committee to form a quorum. In the absence of the Chairman the committee may appoint its own chairman. Committees so elected not to have power to commit the Board to anything unless specially granted power to do so.

*Report of Proceedings of Committee.*

6. Minutes of all proceedings of committees shall be entered in the minute-book (and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the Board), and a report of the proceedings of any committee shall be presented to the Board at the first meeting of the Board subsequent to the meeting of such committee.

*Meetings of Committees.*

7. All committees appointed by the Board shall meet within thirty days of their first appointment, or any time thereafter by order of the Board, or on the written order of the chairman of any committee or of any two members of any committee.

*Secretary.*

8. The Secretary, or other officer acting in his stead, shall attend at all meetings of the Board or committees of the same, and shall enter the minutes of resolutions and proceedings in a minute-book to be kept for that purpose. He shall keep

a book showing all receipts of money on account of the Board, and all disbursements made, and shall at the statutory meetings in each quarter present to the Board a report of the finances and a statement showing the balance at the bank verified by banker's certificate that the balance represented in the pass-book is correct. He shall, subject to the control of the Board, have charge of all books and papers and other property of the Board, and shall give receipts for all moneys payable to, and disburse amounts payable by, the Board. He shall lay all correspondence before the Board.

*Bankers.*

9. The Board shall have the sole appointment and removal of the bankers. The bankers shall be the Union Bank of Australia (Limited), and all moneys shall be banked at least once a week.

*Finance Committee.*

10. A committee may be appointed from time to time by the Board, which shall exercise supervision in all matters relating to the finances of the Board. This committee shall be known as the Finance Committee.

*Payment of Accounts.*

11. All payments of £1 or upwards shall be made by cheques upon the bankers of the Board, signed as the Board may from time to time decide.

*Financial Year.*

12. The financial year of the Board shall expire on the 30th day of June in each year (Fire Brigades Act, 1908, section 42, clause 1), and all accounts shall be made up to and including that day for audit. A statement showing the receipts and disbursements of the Board for each financial year shall be presented to the Board, duly audited, in the month of September in each year.

*Auditor.*

13. The books, accounts, and vouchers of the Board shall be audited by the audit officer of the Audit Department (Fire Brigades Act, 1908, section 42, clause 2).

*Common Seal.*

14. The common seal of the Board shall be in the custody of the Secretary, or other officer authorized by the Board, but shall not be affixed to any document except by order of the Board as recorded in the minute-book, and shall only be affixed in the presence of two members of the Board; and every document for which such seal is required shall be signed by two members and by the Secretary of the Board.

*Confirmation of Minutes of Preceding Meeting of Board.*

15. The minutes of any preceding meeting of the Board not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the Board, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes, if confirmed, shall then be signed by the Chairman.

*Order of Business at Meetings of the Board.*

16. The order of business of an ordinary meeting of the Board, after the minutes of the preceding meeting have been read and signed, shall be as follows, or as near thereto as practicable:—

- (1.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Board, if called for.
- (2.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3.) Presentation of reports of committees and officers.
- (4.) Ordinary business.
- (5.) Payments.
- (6.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (7.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (8.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof, and no other business shall be discussed at such special meeting unless by the unanimous vote of the members present.

*Vote, how taken.*

17. The Chairman shall in taking the vote on any motion or amendment put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and shall declare his opinion as to which party has the majority; any member may, however, call for a division upon any question. The Chairman at any meeting shall have a casting vote as well as a deliberate vote.

*Notices of Motion.*

18. Any member of the Board may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice

of motion, such notice to be dated and given in writing to the Secretary at least seven clear days previous to the meeting at which same is to be considered, or to be given by the intending mover to the Secretary at the close of the meeting of the Board.

*Mover of Motion.*

19. No notice of motion shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorized by him in writing, shall be present when the business shall be called in order; and motions must be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved, or postponed, shall be struck out.

*Press.*

20. All meetings of the Board shall be open to the Press, unless otherwise determined; but strangers will not be permitted to be present at meetings of committees unless at the request of such committees.

BY-LAWS FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AND THE ENSURING OF GOOD CONDUCT OF THE PERMANENT, VOLUNTEER, AND AUXILIARY MEMBERS OF THE FIRE BRIGADE.

*Appointments and Promotions of Officers.*

1. The appointment of the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent shall be made by the Board. The appointment of foremen shall be made by the Board, due consideration being given to the recommendation of the Superintendent as to engagement of men not heretofore in the service of the Board, or as to promotion of officers or men in the Board's service.

*Qualifications for Membership of Brigade.*

2. Candidates for appointment must be physically strong men, free from any defect in limb, hearing, or sight. They must be not less than eighteen years of age, nor more than thirty-two years, unless they have been previously and recently engaged as active and efficient firemen, or are otherwise thoroughly competent: in such cases the age-limit may be extended to forty years. They will be required to produce testimonials as to character and ability. They will also be required to produce certificate of birth, or other satisfactory proof of age, if required. If applicants have served in a fire brigade they must produce a certificate of discharge from the last brigade in which they served.

*Application for Enrolment.*

3. Applications for enrolment must be made in form set out in Schedule A to these by-laws, and applicants shall only be enrolled as members of the brigade on their application being approved by the Superintendent.

*Members on Appointment to serve a Term of Probation.*

4. Eligible candidates, when finally approved, will be accepted as members of the brigade on probation only, the term of which shall not be less than three months. If at the end of such term the probationer shall have given satisfaction to the Superintendent, and have proved himself suitable, his appointment to the brigade may be confirmed by the Board.

*Engagement terminable by Board without Reason assigned.*

5. All engagements or appointments made by the Board may be cancelled or annulled without any reason being assigned.

*Retiring-age.*

6. The age at which members of the brigade shall retire from the service shall be as follows: Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent, sixty-five years; engineers and foremen, fifty-five years; firemen and motormen, fifty years; but the Board may, if it thinks fit, in any special case extend these limits for a further five years, but no more.

*The Superintendent.*

7. The duties and powers of the Superintendent, in addition to those specified in the Act, shall be as follows:—

- (1.) He shall be responsible to the Board for the efficiency of the members of the brigade, and all gear used in its service.
- (2.) He shall have the power to suspend any member for breach of discipline, or misconduct of any description, at any time, but must at once report in writing such suspension to the Board. The member suspended may appeal to the Board, who will hold an inquiry into the alleged breach of discipline or misconduct. At such inquiry the suspended member shall be present, and have the right to speak in his defence, and, if he desires, bring witnesses in support of same.

(3.) He shall, with the approval of the Board, allot quarters to the members of the brigade, and such members shall reside in such quarters as he may from time to time direct.

(4.) He shall allot such duties to the members of the brigade as he shall deem necessary for assuring the efficiency thereof, and may withdraw any member from any special duty and allot him fresh duties at his (the Superintendent's) discretion.

(5.) He shall keep a store-book, in which shall be entered all property of the Fire Board, the date of purchase, and the date when it was first used and when condemned.

(6.) Stores required for use of the brigade, and repairs required to any of the premises or gear, shall only be obtained or carried out by direction of the Board on requisition signed by the Superintendent. Neither the Superintendent nor other officer for the time being in control of the brigade shall have any authority to purchase on behalf of the Board, nor to in any way pledge the Board's credit for repairs or materials.

(7.) He shall keep the service-record book, containing the names, occupations, places of birth, date of birth, dates of joining and discharge from the brigade, with awards and punishments by the Board, in proper manner.

(8.) He shall perform any duty the Fire Board may from time to time assign to him.

#### *Duties of an Officer in Charge of a Station.*

8. To take charge of the reels, engines, escapes, and all gear property of the Board, and to keep an inventory of same.

To keep the premises and all appliances in thorough working-order, and to see that the reels, engines, and escapes are in position and ready in every particular to turn out immediately on a call being received.

To take charge of all men belonging to the station, and to maintain a strict system of discipline at all times.

To see that all electrical and other communicating appliances are maintained in proper working-order.

To implicitly obey all orders of his superior, and to exact the same implicit obedience from those serving under him.

To see that all orders of his superior, as far as they refer to matters under his control, are carried out in the most effective manner.

To set an example to his men by his sobriety, cleanliness, promptitude, civility, and general attention to his duties.

Finally, in regard to these matters and to all others not above specified, the officer in charge shall be held responsible for the efficient working of the station in every particular.

#### *General Duties of a Fireman.*

9. To be always available for duty unless booked otherwise. To be civil and respectful in demeanour, and clean in appearance.

To perform all duties entrusted to him in a prompt and efficient manner.

To study and otherwise endeavour to be able to perform the duties of his superiors should he be called upon to do so.

#### *Watch-room Duty.*

10. Upon receiving a call to a fire, whether by telephone or other means, the fireman on duty must immediately record the time and give the necessary alarms.

Upon receipt of a call to a fire the man on station duty must see that the officers are informed of the locality of the occurrence.

When a call is received at night, and the lights of the station have been turned up for the occasion, the man on station duty must turn them down again as soon as the appliances have left the station.

The police must be informed as soon as possible of a call to a fire.

The station-duty man must promptly inform the New Plymouth Borough Engineer on a call being received, being careful to name the exact locality of the fire.

Upon receiving a call from outside the borough limits the station-duty man must at once inform the Superintendent or officer in charge.

The watch-room at all stations is to be used by the brigade for watch duty only.

The man on duty must at all times be acquainted with the whereabouts of all officers attached to the station.

#### *Insurances of Members.*

11. The Board will insure members of the brigade against accident whilst working at fires from time of call to return to station, also whilst at any drills or practices ordered by

the Superintendent or other officer for the time being in control of the brigade, and also whilst practising for or taking part in any fire brigades' demonstration or competition.

#### *Brigade may make Rules.*

12. Subject to the approval of the Board, and provided they in no way conflict with any provision of these by-laws, the brigade may make rules and regulations for its own government.

#### *Uniform.*

13. Members of the brigade shall be mustered not less than once a month, and their uniforms and accoutrements inspected. Members to attend at least two-thirds of the musters, or their boot-money will be forfeited.

#### *General Behaviour.*

14. Any member of the brigade guilty of intoxication, disobedience of orders, insubordination, abusive or obscene language, shall thereby render himself liable, under the conditions of service, to instant suspension or dismissal.

Gambling is strictly forbidden on any part of the brigade premises.

Any member or members of the brigade who shall damage the property of the Fire Board wilfully must make the same good at his or their own cost.

Members of brigades shall at all times salute all superior officers when addressing them or being addressed by the latter on a point of duty.

No member of a brigade shall enter or in any way use the Board room except on business.

No member of the brigade provided with married quarters shall on any account allow any person except his wife and children to sleep in such quarters without the written permission of the Superintendent.

No noisy recreations shall be indulged in on brigade premises.

#### *Penalty for Breach of Discipline.*

15. For breach of discipline by any member of the brigade the Board may inflict such monetary penalty, not exceeding £1, as it deems necessary, and such penalty when inflicted shall be deemed a debt due by the member of the brigade to the Board, and may be recovered by process of law; or the Board may, if it thinks necessary, dismiss any member from the brigade without assigning any reason for such dismissal, and such dismissed member shall thereupon cease to be a member of the brigade, but shall remain liable for any money due to the Board. In case of wilful damage to the brigade premises or other property of the Board, the Board may order the member or members causing such damage to make good the value of the damage done, and such value shall be deemed a debt due to the Board, and may be recovered by process of law.

#### *Monetary Penalties, to whom paid and how disposed of.*

16. All moneys due to the Board for fees or under penalty clauses of these by-laws shall be paid to the Secretary of the Board upon demand, and shall be recoverable by him, and when received shall be paid into and form part of the Board's funds.

#### *General Station Duty.*

17. The officer in charge of a station shall be promptly informed of all messages or other business requiring the attention of the Superintendent, and shall give or send the same to the Superintendent at the first opportunity.

No member of the brigade shall, under any circumstances, write any letters or give any information to the Press, except the foreman in charge of the station, who may give particulars regarding fires in the absence of a superior officer.

Members of the brigade, after the Superintendent, shall be classed as follows: Deputy Superintendent, foreman, firemen, motormen; and they shall rank according to numbers or rotation of service in their respective station. Promotion will be awarded on the recommendation of the Superintendent, and must be approved by the Board.

In the absence of all officers, the senior fireman present shall assume command of the brigade.

No man dismissed from the brigade shall be reinstated except upon recommendation of the Superintendent.

Any member or members of the brigade wishing to make a statement to the Superintendent may do so on request.

#### *Rates of Pay.*

18. Members of the brigade may be paid for attendances at fires in accordance with the following schedule:—

(1.) Firemen to receive pay at the rate of 2s. per hour or any part of an hour.

(2.) For false alarms and chimney and other fires, when not required to leave the station, the rate of pay will be 1s. per man between the hours of 5 p.m.

and 8 a.m., and 2s. per hour between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

- (3.) The sum of £1 per annum (payable half-yearly on the 30th June and 31st December in each year) may be paid as boot allowance to the members who have been at least six months in the brigade, and who have attended at least two-thirds of the musters during each half-yearly period.

#### BY-LAWS.

BY-LAWS of the New Plymouth Fire Board, made in pursuance of the powers and provisions contained in the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, and in pursuance of all and every power in that behalf contained in any other Act enabling the said Board in that behalf

#### Interpretation.

1. In these by-laws, if not inconsistent with the context, "the Superintendent" shall mean the Superintendent of the fire brigade in the Borough of New Plymouth; "Board" shall mean the New Plymouth Fire Board; "station" shall mean any building in which any of the plant or property of the Board shall be kept; "brigade" shall mean New Plymouth Volunteer Fire Brigade.

#### Penalties.

2. Every person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of any of these by-laws shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

#### PART I.

##### *In respect of Fires outside the Borough of New Plymouth.*

3. The Superintendent may, by his own discretion, render any assistance he deems necessary at any fire taking place outside the borough, provided always that he can do so without endangering the safety of the New Plymouth Fire District. If any portion of the New Plymouth Fire Brigade established and maintained by the Board attends and performs any services at a fire outside the Borough of New Plymouth at the request of the owner or occupier of such property, then such owner or occupier of such property shall pay to the Board for such attendance and services at the undermentioned rates:—

##### *In respect of Fires on Board any Ship or Vessel.*

4. If any brigade, or any portion of any brigade, established and maintained by the Board attends and performs any services at a fire taking place on board any ship or vessel, then the owner of such ship or vessel shall pay to the Board for such attendance and service the undermentioned rates as fixed by the Board, not exceeding—

##### *Inspection of Public Buildings.*

5. The fee to be paid by the owner or occupier of any building for the inspection of such building, under the provisions of section 51 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, shall be according to the following scale:—

The owner and occupier of any such building shall be severally liable for the payment of the proper fee according to the above scale.

##### *Electric Fire-alarm Circuits.*

6. The Board may establish or contract with any person, corporation, or Government Department for the establishment of an electric fire-alarm system, or any part thereof, and may from time to time extend such system and provide for the connection therewith of street alarms and public and private buildings and premises. All connections of alarms installed in public or private buildings or premises, and alterations to the same, shall be carried out to the approval of the Board at the cost of the owner of the property to be connected, and the cost of maintenance and of the periodical examination and testing of such connections shall be borne by the owner of the property connected, and all such connections shall be efficiently maintained to the satisfaction of the Board or the officer appointed by the Board for that purpose. With the consent of the owner such cost may be commuted to the payment of such annual sum as may be agreed on between the Board and the owner.

##### *In respect of the Storage of Inflammable Substances.*

7. In this part of these by-laws, and for the purposes thereof, the term of "Inspecting Officer" means and includes the Superintendent of the New Plymouth Fire Brigade or any other officer for the time being appointed by the Board to carry out the office or duty of inspection, control, and superintendence under this part of these by-laws, and includes every such person as may from time to time be appointed by the Board to carry out, perform, exercise, or use the office or duties of such Superintendent or other officer; and the words "inflammable packings" shall mean all materials of an inflammable or combustible nature as may be used in the packing of goods and merchandise, and shall include paper, shavings, sawdust, chips of wood, grass, straw, fibre, kapoc, empty packing-cases, boxes, crates, casks, bags, and bales.

No person shall upon or in any other land or premises place, store, or keep, or permit or suffer to be placed, stored, or kept, any inflammable packings in such quantities or in such manner as to create or cause a risk of fire upon such or any adjoining land or premises.

If any inflammable packings are placed, stored, or kept, or suffered to remain, in or upon any land or buildings in such quantities or in such manner as to create or cause a risk of fire, the Superintendent shall, by notice in writing duly served upon the occupier of such land or premises, and in case there is no occupier of such land or premises upon the owner thereof, direct the occupier or owner thereof, within a time to be specified in the notice, to remove the whole or any part of such inflammable packings therefrom, or may direct the said occupier or owner to place or store the same in a manner to the satisfaction of the said Superintendent; and every occupier or owner who fails to perform or comply with the directions contained in such notice shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, and in the case of a continuance of the offence to a further penalty not exceeding £2 for every day after the expiration of the time specified in such notice.

It shall not be lawful to make or place, or keep stored, or to suffer to remain, in any premises within the Borough of New Plymouth any stack of hay, corn, straw, or other agricultural produce belonging to the class of cereals, or cover such stack with any inflammable material, in the open air at a distance of less than 30 ft. from any building, or 30 ft. from any fence, street, private street, or public place, or adjacent land.

It shall not be lawful to make or place, or keep stored, any such stack as aforesaid in any building within the Borough of New Plymouth attached to, or at a less distance than 20 ft. from, any other building, unless the roof of such first-mentioned building is covered with 22-gauge corrugated iron or best-quality slates, and its walls are constructed wholly of brick, stone, or concrete, or of any combination of such materials: Provided always that this clause shall in no case apply to the case of any such agricultural produce required for the keeping of horses, and stored in any building used only for the *bona fide* purpose of, or in connection with, a stable the storing-capacity of which shall not exceed 3,000 ft. (cubic).

No occupier of any premises shall deposit or keep, or suffer to be deposited or kept, any inflammable or combustible material within 100 ft. of any building, or 30 ft. of any fence, street, public place, or adjacent land.

No person shall deposit or keep, or suffer to be deposited or kept, any wood shavings in any building whatever situated at a less distance than 20 ft. from any adjoining land, street, private street, public place, or building.

No empty or partially empty case, crate, or package, no sawdust, shavings, hay, straw, or other inflammable substance, shall be placed, stored, or suffered to remain in the open air on any street, lane, or public place, or in any public or private right-of-way, or on any land in the borough at a distance of
