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Altering Boundaries of Hawera and Eltham Counties.

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Hawera County Council on the tenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen : And whereas a similar resolution was passed by the Eltham County Council on the twelfth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, praying for the inclusion in the Hawera County of that part of the Eltham County described in the said resolutions and in the First Schedule hereto, and also praying for the inclusion in the Eltham County of that part of the County of Hawera described in the said resolutions and in the Second Schedule hereto : And whereas it is expedient to make such alterations in accordance with the said resolutions :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Eltham County, shall, as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, be deemed to be added to and form part of the Hawera County ; and that the area described in the Second Schedule hereto, being now part of the Hawera County, shall, as from the date of such publication as aforesaid, be deemed to be added to and form part of the Eltham County ; and, with the like power and authority, do proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Counties of Hawera and Eltham respectively shall as from the aforesaid date be those set forth under their respective headings in the Third Schedule hereto.

Prescribing Dues for the Use of Taiotea Wharf, Takapuna.

2. The master of any such vessel landing passengers as aforesaid shall furnish to the Council a certified statement of the number of passengers so landed.

- (a.) For any breach which in the opinion of the Governor can be met by a fine, for thirty days after the service of such notice.
 (b.) For any breach which in the opinion of the Governor is of such a nature as to require the revocation of this license, for ninety days after the service of such notice.

12. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor by Order in Council.

13. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon, if so required by the Minister, remove from the ground all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. Regulations for the Protection of Life on Ships.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section two hundred and thirty-two of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, that the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council make regulations, *inter alia*, for regulating matters relating to the protection of the life and property of passengers and others on board ships:

And whereas it is desirable to make such regulations:
Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the said section, and of all other powers

enabling him in this behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations; and doth hereby declare that the said regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

(1.) WHEN coal is being transferred by means of baskets running on a tramway from one vessel to another, the master, or person in charge of the vessel, shall see that a net is stretched under the tramway in such a manner as to catch a man if he should fall whilst working on the plank or tramway. Should the net be found to in any way interfere with the basket being landed on the tram, then some other efficient means may be used in lieu of the net, providing that such means are approved by the Marine Department's Surveyor.

(2.) Every person who omits to observe or commits a breach of this regulation is liable to a fine not exceeding £50.

Regulations made by Public Service Commissioner in respect of Staff of Dominion Laboratory attending Science Lectures, Victoria College.

IN pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred upon him by the Public Service Act, 1912, the Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto with respect to officers of the staff of the Dominion Laboratory attending Science lectures at Victoria College. The said regulations shall have effect from and after the date of publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

1. THE regulations shall apply—
 - (a.) To Professional cadets appointed or transferred to the Dominion Laboratory who have passed the Public Service Senior Examination in the subjects prescribed for the Dominion Laboratory, and who have also passed the Matriculation Examination ;
 - (b.) To such other officers of the Dominion Laboratory as the Dominion Analyst recommends, provided this concession shall terminate on 31st December, 1919.
2. The Commissioner may, on application, grant leave to attend lectures at Victoria College for a term not exceeding three years, and, in the case of Honours, one whole session, subject to the following conditions :—
 - (a.) The application must be approved by the Dominion Analyst, such approval to be contingent on satisfactory work and behaviour in the Dominion Laboratory.
 - (b.) Term reports on attendance and progress at the classes will be obtained from the Professors in charge ; and if these, in the opinion of the Commissioner, show that the concession is being abused, or that the student is not utilizing it to the best of his ability, then the Commissioner may cancel the agreement.
 - (c.) The leave granted may be on the following conditions :—
 - (i.) Term of three years—two half-days per week, on full pay ;
 - (ii.) Honours, whole session—half pay, with a maximum of £100.
 - (d.) An agreement must be entered into with the Department to refund all college fees paid by the Department, and also all half-pay allowances received should the officer, within three years after completion of his college course, leave the Department for any reason whatsoever, save sickness or injury or dismissal through no fault of his own.

(NOTE.—The Department will in each case make arrangements for the payment of college fees, unless such fees are covered by bursary.)
3. An officer who has joined the Department as a cadet under these conditions must obtain a degree in Science or Arts before passing from Class F to Class E.
4. When an officer has obtained a degree in Science or Arts he shall be entitled to the annual increments in the Second Schedule of the Public Service Act until his salary reaches £260.
5. On return to full duties after completion of course the Commissioner may review the officer's classification, and will make due allowance for such officer's improved standing.

H. H. Young, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by the Governor, in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. W. J. Morrison, the Vice-chairman of the Club and the chairman of the meeting, moved, and Mr. W. P. Kirkwood seconded, and it was resolved, That such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to :—

STRATFORD RACING CLUB.
REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Stratford Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the club's property situate in the District of Taranaki, and known as the Stratford Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

2. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely :—

- (a.) Bookmakers.
- (b.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the Racing Conference of New Zealand.
- (c.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

The foregoing regulations of the Stratford Racing Club were made and passed by the club on the 17th day of November, 1915, and signed by the Acting-Chairman and Secretary.

And that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of February and the 1st day of August in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of 5 years, or until the loan is fully paid off.

RESOLUTION.

THE following regulations were laid before the members of the Wanganui Jockey Club at a meeting held on the first day of December, 1915, at 7.30 p.m., with a recommendation by the Chairman of the Club, Mr. Ewen Campbell, that the same be passed at once with a view to their approval by the Governor, in pursuance of the Gaming Act, 1908, section 33.

Mr. Ewen Campbell, the Chairman of the Club and the meeting, moved, and Mr. Gifford Marshall seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

WANGANUI JOCKEY CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities, it enabling in that behalf, the Wanganui Jockey Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to the Wanganui Racecourse situate at Wanganui while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

2. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the part of the said Wanganui Racecourse Reserve while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:—

(a.) Bookmakers.

(b.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated with the Racing Conference of New Zealand.

(c.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

The foregoing regulations of the Wanganui Jockey Club were made and passed by the Wanganui Jockey Club on the

first day of December, 1915, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
