Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section forty-six of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1913, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby order and declare that the portion of Hohoura Kauri-gum Reserve described in the Schedule hereto shall, from the tenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, cease to be subject to the Kauri-gum Industry Act. 1908. Act, 1908.

SCHEDULE.

All that area in the Auckland Land District, situate in Block V, Hohoura East Survey District, and containing by admeasurement 2 acres, more or less. Bounded commencing at a point on the Te Kao-Waihopo Road, 1169930-1 links north and 781821-6 links west of Mount Eden Trig. Station; towards the north-east by the said road, 333-3 links; towards the south-east by a right line bearing 250° 54′ for a distance of 600 links; towards the south-west by a right line bearing 340° 54′, 333-3 links; and towards the north-west by a right line bearing 70° 54′, 600 links, to the point of commencement: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less. As the same is delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 6/6/79, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon edged red. (Auckland Plan 18526.)

Regulations for the Guidance of Telegraph Officers.

# LIVERPOOL, Governor. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this thirty-first day of January, 1916.

#### Present:

THE RIGHT HON. W. F. MASSEY, P.C., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

HEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and five, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the first day of September, one thousand nine hundred and five, regulations were made under the authority of the Electric Lines Act, 1884, for the guidance of officers of the Post and Telegraph Department engaged in the performance of telegraphic duties: And whereas it is desirable to amend and add to such regulations in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, and its amendments, and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby revoke so much of the regulations in the Schedules to the above-recited Order in Council as is inconsistent herewith; and doth further order that the said revocation shall take effect and the regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the New Zealand Gazette, and that the regulations hereby made shall form part of and be read together with the regulations first above recited.

#### SCHEDULE.

- 1. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context, "officer in charge" includes a Superintendent, Chief Postmaster, Postmaster, or other officer in charge of a telegraph or telephone office.
- 2. A "forwarded" telegram is a telegram handed in for despatch. A "transmitted" telegram is a telegram received by wire for retransmission. A "received" telegram is a telegram received by wire for delivery.
- 3. Officers are forbidden to write out telegrams for the public, unless the senders are unable to write.
- 4. Telegrams should be written on the form supplied by the Department, or an approved form, but when the regular form cannot be obtained may be written on a piece of paper. This must not be destroyed or copied, but gummed to an "A" form.
- 5. Interlineations, erasures, or alterations must be authenticated by the initials of the sender or his representative.
- 6. Instructions as to delivery, or any other directions, such as "Post," "Confidential," &c., must be written by the sender in the space provided for the purpose, and be paid for. Oral instructions cannot be accepted.
- 7. When a telegram is presented without a signature, or is signed with a Christian name or surname only, the sender's ordinary signature must be endorsed thereon; it may then be transmitted without a signature, or with a pen-name or a familiar

name, but the addressee may have the full signature telegraphed by paying for the necessary telegrams, or at the originating station may be shown the original. A signature written thus, "(John D.) Brown," where the surname only is intended to be telegraphed, may be accepted. The signature must be in the usual handwriting of the sender, or in that of his authorized agent; but when written by the agent the latter must add his or her name or initials, not for transmission, but for the information of the Department. When the sender is unknown to the accepting officer he should be requested to endorse his address on the telegram.

- 8. A fee of 1d. each is to be charged for receipts for amounts paid for telegrams or cable messages. This fee, however, must not be collected if the special telegram forms provided with receipt foils are used.
- 9. When the sender of a telegram wishes to pay for carriage, and the amount required is not known, a deposit should be obtained.
- 10. If the sender guarantees that carriage will be paid for by the addressee, "Carriage guaranteed" must be written on the back of the telegram, and signed by the sender, whose address should be added. The instructions "Collect carriage" must be inserted; but should the addressee refuse to pay, the amount due must be recovered from the sender. When the sender declines to pay for carriage, or to give a guarantee, the word "Post" should be inserted in the instructions.
- 11. All charges for transmission, carriage, postage, &c., must be accounted for by means of postage-stamps firmly affixed to the forms, or by impressions of automatic stamping-machines or cash-registers, and in every case the smallest number of stamps that will denote the charge must be used.
- 12. Stamps in prepayment of inland telegrams must be affixed by the senders themselves.
- 13. Discount and postage-due stamps must not be accepted in payment of telegraph charges.
- 14. Stamps must not be affixed or impressions of the automatic stamping-machine be made one over another. Surcharges will be made on insufficiently or irregularly stamped messages. No telegram is to be accepted for transmission if the form has been mutilated by the removal of an automatic stamping-machine impression therefrom.
- 15. Automatic stamp impressions inadvertently affixed to telegraph forms may be refunded upon, providing the upper portion of the form, consisting of not less than one-third of the whole, is produced, and the number shown in the impression corresponds with the number of the machine owned by the person claiming the refund. The usual 5-per-cent. commission collected from the public on stamps repurchased will be charged. The impressions must be quite legible, and the whole documents on which the impressions are made must be attached to the receipt taken for the refunds. Cut-out or indistinct impressions will not be refunded on.
- 16. Telegrams, except for well-known addressees, must not be accepted when the surname of an individual only is offered as the address unless the address is otherwise amplified to make it quite clear to the receiving office. An address should consist of at least three words (registered code addresses excepted), and only in the case of persons or companies well known throughout the Dominion shall a bare surname or title be accepted without demur. While it is not imperative that telegrams for well-known firms should be fully addressed, telegrams

for a business firm containing an address which is so abbreviated that delivery is likely to be delayed should not be accepted.

- 17. Telegrams must be read over at the time of presentation, and the sender requested to make doubtful words clear by rewriting them at the foot of the telegram.
- 18. The sender may order the second transmission of a telegram, if necessary, but must prepay an additional rate. One extra word must be charged for the name of the office of origin, to be inserted in the signature of the redirected message. Such telegrams must bear the instruction "Second rate prepaid."
- 19. Telegrams enclosed in an envelope bearing the inscription "Telegram for transmission" must be carried by mail contractors free of postage to the nearest telegraph-office.
- 20. No telegram or communication relating to Customs duties is to be transmitted by any officer, or allowed by him to be transmitted, during any period for which transmission shall be prohibited by the Minister.
- 21. No telegram in plain language relating to betting or to investments on the totalizator, or in coded language reasonably supposed to relate to betting or to investments on the totalizator, addressed to any person on a racecourse, or addressed to any person who has been convicted in a Court of law under the Gaming Act, 1908, or any amendment thereof, of any offence relating to betting or investments on the totalizator, and no money-order telegram addressed to any such person, is to be accepted. Money-order telegrams addressed to a racing club, or to a secretary, or other officer, agent, or servant of a racing club, relating to investments on a totalizator, whether addressed to a racecourse or elsewhere, must be refused.
- 22. Any person tendering a telegram of a seditious, libellous, indecent, or offensive nature must be informed that before it can be accepted a copy will have to be telegraphed to the Secretary, and authority obtained for its acceptance.
- 23. Where a counter clerk has reason to believe that an improper combination is presented as a code-word, the onus of proof must lie with the sender, who should be called upon to produce his code in support of his contention.
- 24. When the sender is not known, his address must be ascertained and written on the back of the form.
- 25. Telegrams on which week-day rates only have been paid or are to be collected may not be transmitted on Sundays.
- 26. After the hour of closing the forwarding station, the reopening fee payable to the forwarding operator is to be retained as a personal payment; if more than one telegram is handed in at the same time by the same person, only one reopening fee is chargeable by the forwarding officer. The special-delivery fee of 1s. is, when payable to the receiving operator, to be affixed in stamps to the "A" form as part of the value of the telegram, and claimed for as carriage paid out. No fee will be paid to transmitting officers.
- 27. The charge for reopening an office to receive a telegram or bureau communication after hours also includes the fee for delivering the same within the limits of the free delivery.
- 28. When the use of a wire is granted to a chess club no charge is to be made unless the Department provides accommodation for the players, when 2s. 6d. should be collected for light and fuel. Payment of fees in such cases must be made in advance, and notified to the Chief Accountant. Should no amount be collectible, or a match be abandoned or postponed, the Chief Accountant must be informed. Telegraphists who may be employed are at liberty to accept payment from the club.

- 29. When the transmission of a telegram is delayed at the request of the sender for the purpose of making a correction or addition, the message must be retimed with the actual time of re-presentation, and a certificate upon the back of the form obtained, as follows:—
  - "Withdrawn [time].....
    Re-presented [time].....
    - "Signature of sender:...."
      Date: ""
- 30. The time transmitted forward is to be the time of representation, not the original time of presentation. In no case is any alteration to be permitted in a telegram already transmitted. Such a correction must be made by a further paid message.
- 31. In order to prevent a monopoly of the line by any one company or individual presenting a number of telegrams for despatch about the same time which would be likely to block the line to the serious prejudice of other telegrams, the supervising officer may divide the telegrams, and forward others, or portions of others, in "time" turn.
- 32. When the sender of a telegram desires to cancel or correct it, the officer in charge must satisfy himself that the person making the application (which must be in writing) is either the person who handed in the telegram or the actual sender.
- 33. When the code notice DF is received at the office of origin respecting any paid telegram and it is necessary to amend or amplify the original address, the alteration or addition must be conveyed in a paid correcting telegram at a fee of 6d., coded UCT.
- 34. Redirected telegrams are liable to a second charge for transmission.
- 35. The charge for readdressing an urgent telegram is the same as for an urgent telegram. It must be coded as "Urgent readdressed," unless otherwise directed by the person authorizing the redirection.
- 36. Telegrams for Government officers, originally coded as ordinary telegrams, are subject to redirection fees as other ordinary telegrams are.
- 37. If the receiver of a telegram doubts its accuracy he may have it repeated by paying half the amount paid for its transmission—fractions of 1d. not exceeding ½d. being charged as ½d., fractions above ½d. being charged as 1d. Should he require only a portion of the message to be repeated the deposit must be at the half-rate sufficient to cover the number of words embraced in the repetition, but the maximum charge for the repetition of any portion of a telegram containing not more than twelve words shall be half the transmission fee. Free repetitions may be obtained for Government Departments in the case of paid telegrams, as well as when they are sent on the public service.
- 38. In the case of temporary interruption to the New Zealand land lines making communication with Auckland impossible, messages for Norfolk Island, Fiji, Fanning Island, and Sandwich Islands must be referred to the sender, who should be informed that the message cannot go forward unless routed "Via Eastern and Pacific," and an additional 4d. per word paid; messages for America, Great Britain, and Germany presented unrouted or marked "Via Pacific" must be amended to "Via Eastern and Pacific" without reference to the sender; all other messages should bear the indicator "Via Eastern."

- 39. On receipt of advice of interruption on the Pacific cable route, the preamble of cable messages presented for transmission thereby should be altered by substituting the word "Eastern" for "Pacific" in the instructions. If, however, the rate "via Eastern" is higher than that "via Pacific" the sender must be called upon to pay the difference, otherwise the message must be cancelled. When the interruption is reported after the transmission has been partially effected, and it appears likely that the cable message will suffer serious delay through the necessity for diversion, the service advice announcing the interruption should always indicate the locality of the fault, thus: When diversion is owing to interruption on New Zealand land lines, "DIL N.Z."; on the Pacific cable, "DI cable"; on the Vancouver Island land lines, "DIL Vancouver"; on the Canadian land lines "DIL Canada." Cable messages must not be diverted to a more expensive route until the senders have been advised of interruption and given the option of paying the increased charges or of cancelling the messages.
- 40. An international cable message arriving at an office in Australia or New Zealand after the addressee has sailed for New Zealand or Australia, as the case may be, and has left no redirection instructions, but whose whereabouts has been ascertained by the first delivery office, may be retransmitted, in accordance with the information obtained, as a "collect" message. All charges on such messages must be paid before the message is handed to the addressee. In no case is the addressee to be allowed to open the message before payment of the charge.
- 41. Requests for rectification of a cable message may be forwarded without prepayment if the addressee gives a written undertaking to pay the cost of the service should the reply confirm the original rendering.
- 42. Prepaid replies to week-end cable letters are allowed, and must be paid for at full ordinary rate, the addressee being allowed to use the amount prepaid for a full-rate, a deferred, or a week-end message. The indicator RP charged at week-end rate should be signalled after prefix, thus "TWT, RP" (followed by the amount, in words, prepaid for the reply). Paid service messages are chargeable at the full rate for ordinary cable messages, and are subject to same rules as similar STs for such messages. No other special services are allowed.
- 43. The fee paid for registration of a code address during a specified period holds good at any office in New Zealand, provided the person registering the indicator desires it to be transferred and pays the transfer fee of 6d. This does not, however, apply to telegrams which are regularly addressed to more than one place, such as to firms having branches in different towns, &c.
- 44. When it is desired to temporarily transfer a cable or an inland code address from one office to another a fee of 6d. is to be charged for the service when application is made. If such transfer calls for telegraphic advice the telegram must also be paid for.
- 45. If a message is received bearing a code address which is not registered at the office of receipt the receiving office should at once communicate with the Secretary and ask for instructions. Should the Secretary's office be closed, the Superintendent at Auckland or Wellington must be applied to. If, however, it is known for whom the message is intended it may be delivered upon the address being registered and the fee paid.
- 46. Before reporting non-delivery of a cable message inquiry must be made from Reuter's agent whether the address is registered with or known by him. If so, delivery may then be made on payment of the usual registration fee.

- 47. Cable messages which come to hand bearing lapsed code addresses must not be delivered unless a fresh registration fee is paid.
- 48. Officers in charge must at once report to the Chief Telegraph Engineer and the District Telegraph Engineer the existence of any wireless installation in their locality which they have reason to believe has not been licensed in accordance with the regulations. No such installation, however apparently rough or inefficient, is to be neglected.
- 49. "Collect" telegrams addressed to a post-office are to be retained at the receiving telegraph-office, and a notice posted to the addressee intimating that such a telegram awaits delivery on payment of its cost. Should delivery of any "collect" telegram not be effected within twenty-four hours, or the addressee refuse to pay the charge, the forwarding office must be directed to make the telegram prepaid, except in the case of cable messages.
- 50. The accepting officer may demand a deposit from the sender of the amount to be collected on the delivery of a telegram. When the sender of a "collect" telegram for which no deposit is made pays for it after it has been sent to the Chief Accountant, the value is to be affixed in stamps to a separate form, on which the particulars of the telegram must be stated, and the form sent in with the next parcel of telegrams. The charges collected for any other telegram after it has been sent in must be similarly accounted for.
- 51. The sender of a "collect" telegram may direct that delivery shall be conditional on the addressee first paying the charges. In such cases the words "Delivery conditional" must be inserted in the instructions and charged for.
- 52. Telegrams to be repeated must bear in the instructions "Repetition paid." The fee for repetition of a telegram must in every case be prepaid by the sender, and affixed to the form in stamps.
- 53. When a "reply-paid" telegram is presented for transmission the sender should be requested to insert the words "Reply paid" in the instructions, and these words must invariably be signalled and written in full.
- 54. The prepaid-reply form of a "reply-paid" message may be used by the holder of it for not more than one telegram of any code, whether a reply or not, at any time within six weeks. No prepaid-reply form which has not been date-stamped by the issuing office may be accepted. If the telegram exceeds the number of words stated in the reply voucher the difference is to be paid by the sender and affixed in stamps to the form.
- 55. The refund of money prepaid for a reply can only be made on an application to the Chief Accountant, giving full particulars of the RP telegram—i.e., of the telegram authorizing the reply—and on production of the unused reply voucher.
- 56. Money-order telegrams addressed to racing clubs, or to secretaries or other officers of racing clubs, relating to investments on the totalizator are to be refused, whether addressed to racecourses or not.
- 57. When a telegram is presented for transmission applying for the transfer or repayment of a money-order telegram, the signature of the applicant, who must be either the remitter or the payee, must be obtained upon the message form, and the word "Verified" written in the instructions and signalled.
- 58. A Press telegram must not be addressed to any person by name, and must consist of news of general public interest for immediate publication in a registered newspaper; and may not

contain either advertisements, code-words, cipher language, letters to the editor, mere theatrical or business puffs, or anything for the publication of which a money-payment is usually made. Bona fide Press correspondents, however, may forward telegrams at Press rates about theatrical matters of more than local interest.

- 59. When any matter of a private or personal nature, or matter not intended for publication, is included in or added to a Press message, such matter must be charged for at the rate of ½d. per word, and the number of words so charged shown in the instructions. Some latitude must, however, be allowed in the case of brief directions such as "Leader," "New paragraph," "Take in division-list from Association," "More to follow," &c., explanatory of the matter under transmission. These may form part of a Press telegram.
- 60. Provided the offices are open, all newspapers are entitled to receive Press news at night at evening rates, no matter whether sent on the evening prior to publication or not. The evening rates on day telegrams for evening papers are restricted to the day of publication unless otherwise ordered.
- 61. "Collect" Press telegrams for the United Press Association, Wellington, must be refused unless they bear the signatures of the senders. Telegrams from Wellington may be signed "Association," but such privilege does not apply to any other office.
- 62. Precedence will, except on occasions when the public interest forbids it, be given to Press work for evening papers during the following hours:—
  - (1.) On main circuits: From 9 a.m. to 3.30 p.m. During the session of Parliament short telegrams from Wellington, not exceeding 150 words, may be sent up to 4.30 p.m.
  - (2) On country circuits: From 9 to 10 a.m., and noon to 3 p.m. During the session of Parliament short telegrams, not exceeding 150 words, may be sent up to 4.30 p.m. PTs are not necessarily to be excluded between 10 a.m. and noon.
- 63. Any Press telegram presented at night for an office that is closed must be accepted, coded, timed 8 a.m. of the next day, and transmitted as far as practicable. The rate of charge ruling at the time of receipt at the office of destination is to apply.
- 64. Telegrams sent in correction of inland Press telegrams are to be transmitted at Press rates, with the words "Press correction" in the instructions.
- 65. Any Press telegram from an agent of the United Press Association which may be refused by the addressee is not to be charged more than evening rates. Such messages are to be scheduled and charged for in the aggregate at the rate of 6d. per hundred words or fraction thereof.
- 66. Telegrams are to be accepted from masters of vessels, addressed to "Weather," Wellington, or to the Harbourmaster at any New Zealand port, asking for information as to the state of the weather. Such telegrams must be concise, and in no instance will more than twelve words be allowed in the text. Sixpence only is to be charged for the telegram and reply. If a larger number of words is offered the telegram must be paid for at OT rate. These telegrams must be coded OT, and "Reply paid, Weather," inserted in the instructions of the original telegram.
- 67. Telegrams for "Weather," Wellington, seeking information as to the state of the weather, are to be accepted from farmers at a uniform rate of 1s. for each message (including reply).

The number of words in the request and reply is not to exceed twenty-four. If required, the message may be made urgent at double the above rate and coded OT or UOT, as the case may be, the instructions "Reply paid, weather," being inserted in the original message.

- 68. Government and public-service telegrams shall be prepaid in stamps, with the following exceptions:—
  - (1.) Telegrams from His Excellency the Governor;
  - (2.) Telegrams from any of His Majesty's Ministers;
  - (3.) And others as set out in the Official Correspondence List published annually.
- 69. Telegrams forwarded by or on behalf of His Excellency the Governor or any of His Majesty's Ministers must be marked "Official paid, Government House," or "Official paid [Name of the Minister's office]," as the case may be; or franked by the signature, or a fac-simile thereof, of His Excellency, or the Minister, or of any officer to be designated by His Excellency or by such Minister as the case may be, in the space provided for "Instructions." (See Official Correspondence List.) The envelope superscribed "Telegram for transmission," or any other envelope used for enclosing telegrams, must be affixed to the back of the relative telegram.
- 70. All other Government telegrams, and public-service telegrams from local bodies and from the Bank of New Zealand, shall be paid for by means of "official" stamps to be affixed to the telegrams before presentation.
- 71. "Collect" telegrams sent by or addressed to Government Departments must be delivered, and an acknowledgment of the sum due obtained on a form provided for the purpose; the amount to be subsequently claimed by the Post Office.
- 72. "Collect" telegrams on public business which may have been accepted, addressed to His Excellency the Governor or to His Majesty's Ministers, must be delivered in the ordinary course; the envelopes to be marked "Official," and initialled by His Excellency, or the Minister, or by an official designated by His Excellency or by such Minister as the case may be, and then handed to the message-boy delivering the telegram.
- 73. Government and public-service telegrams not complying with these regulations may be refused transmission.
- 74. The special stamps in use by the Government Insurance Department may be used in prepayment of telegrams or bureau communications on Government Insurance business.
- 75. In lieu of prepayment of telegrams by adhesive "official" or Government Insurance stamps, the charge may be indicated by an imprint made by any automatic stamping and recording machine of which the use is sanctioned by the Postmaster-General. The use of such machines shall be subject to such conditions as the Postmaster-General may prescribe in each case.
- 76. Service telegrams must only be used by officers on the business of the Department, except when sent by those officers of the Post and Telegraph Corps who are authorized to communicate with one another by service telegram on the business of the corps. When communicating with or on business of other Departments the telegrams must be either prepaid or coded and sent as GMs. Received STs must be written with a soft black-lead pencil. The writing of a false or bogus ST is a very serious offence, punishable with dismissal. The sending of an ST on telegraph or postal business is absolutely forbidden to any officer not specially deputed by a Telegraph Engineer, Superintendent, a Chief Postmaster, or a Postmaster to send such telegrams.

- 77. In the service of notices by telegraph, and the transmission, receipt, and service of such documents, officers appointed in that behalf will be guided by and will strictly conform to the regulations in force for the time being.
- 78. Postmasters or officers in charge who are appointed to deal with the transmission of writs or warrants by telegraph will, after the service has been completed, forward the documents, under separate cover, to the Chief Accountant, filing a docket in their place in the day's telegrams stating the date on which the originals were posted.
  - 79. A warrant issued by the Court under section 88, subsection (3), of the Bankruptcy Act, 1908, for the arrest of a debtor may be accepted as an ordinary telegram with ordinary repetition, and be paid for as such. The subsection reads: "(3.) Any such warrant may, if the Court so orders, be transmitted by telegraph (the telegraphic charges being first duly paid) and executed on the telegraphic copy thereof, accompanied by a telegraphic copy of the order of the Court." Such a warrant is held not to be a "notice" within the meaning of section 148 of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, and consequently the warrant may not be refused transmission as an ordinary telegram. At the same time, if it be desired to send it as a "notice," no objection should be offered to its being so sent, provided the necessary fees are paid. The responsibility of sending such a warrant either way rests with the sender.
  - 80. If the sender elects to transmit the warrant as an ordinary telegram it is not necessary that the transmitting or receiving officer should be gazetted as such, but no other than gazetted officers may deal with warrants to be treated as provided in sections 148 to 153 of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, and the regulations made thereunder.
- 81. Originals of inland telegrams and cable messages are retained for periods of three months and twelve months respectively, after which they are destroyed. Old tape must be kept for six months, and then destroyed in the presence of the officer in charge, who will certify to the destruction.
- 82. When the originals or copies of telegrams which have been sent to the clearing-room are applied for, a fee of 1s. when the necessary particulars are supplied, or 2s. 6d. if such particulars are not forthcoming, must be collected, together with a copying fee of 6d. for each copy required, and the application forwarded to the Chief Accountant. Telegrams asking for originals or copies must be paid for, and should bear the word "Verified" in the instructions as an indication that the identity of the applicant has been satisfactorily established.
- 83. If the sender or the addressee of any telegram applies for a copy of such telegram before it has been sent to the clearing-room, such copy may be supplied, on satisfactory evidence of the identity of the applicant, at a charge of 6d. If the application is for the copy of a Press telegram a copying fee of 6d. per 100 words or fraction thereof must be charged. The applicant must not under any circumstances be allowed to make the copy. To prevent telegrams being altered or tampered with after they have been telegraphed they must not leave the hands of the officer entrusted with their exhibition, but be shown in his hands to the applicant.
- 84. Applications for copies of "received" telegrams at offices where such messages are not taken off in duplicate may be satisfied by means of UCT to the office of origin at a total charge

of 6d. for the request and reply; the fee for such copies to be affixed in stamps to the "forwarded" UCT.

85. A record must be kept and a statement furnished, on form Acct. 192, showing the receipts and expenditure in connection with the opening of temporary offices—i.e., the value of all telegrams received for transmission, and the cost of erecting and dismantling instruments, expenses of operators, &c. In the event of the expenditure exceeding the receipts the deficiency must be made good by the body or corporation at the instance of which the office was opened, and brought to charge as "Telegraph cash receipts." Officers' expenses must be claimed by voucher.

86. In order to prevent, as far as possible, abuse of the facilities that telephonic communication affords, with the consequent loss of revenue to the Department, telephonists are paid fees instead of fixed salaries. This applies to all new offices from their opening except where services are performed gratuitously, and to offices where a salary is at present paid when a change in telephonist takes place, also when otherwise required specially. Notification of the system of payment is to be given to the incoming telephonist at the earliest possible moment, before he has taken up duty if possible, and his objections to the change are to be tactfully met. Three halfpence will be paid for each telegram and each bureau communication forwarded and received, including urgents, and 1d. for each "transmit," which will be counted as one message only. At offices which receiving offices only, 2d. will be paid  $\mathbf{for}$ ordinary telegram forwarded, provided the telegram is telephoned to the central office; and 11d. when the telegam is collected by Departmental message-boy.

- 87. In cases in which non-permanent telephonists are paid fees for telephone-exchange work, £2 per annum will be paid for each subscriber on exclusive circuits, and £1 per annum for each subscriber on party-line circuits.
- 88. The first account rendered for a telephone-exchange subscription should cover the period elapsing between the date on which the connection is completed and the first day of the following half-yearly period, unless such first period does not exceed one month.
- 89. If the period does not exceed one month the account must also include the hire payable for the half-year next ensuing. All accounts other than the first must be rendered in advance for a half-yearly period.
- 90. Seven days may be allowed in which to pay the initial subscription or that for any subsequent half-year.
- 91. Should a subscription for which the account has been duly rendered remain unpaid after the last day of grace has expired, the wire is to be disconnected at the switchboard and the subscriber so informed; and should it remain unpaid for a further seven days the connection must, provided the term of the bond has expired, be cancelled, and a report of the same forwarded to the Chief Accountant through the Telegraph Engineer.
- 92. If the term of the bond has not expired the wire is to be disconnected at the switchboard, and payment of the subscription repeatedly demanded; and if it be not paid within fourteen days of the due date a report is to be made to the Chief Accountant.
- 93. Telephone subscriptions are not to be accepted unless accompanied by amount due for stores accounts,

94. A sports club which requires a telephone connection for six months in each year may be granted the connection upon paying the cost of making the connection and at least a half-year's subscription at residential rates. If the connection is used beyond six months, one month's rental is to be charged for each additional month or fraction of a month. After payment of the cost of making the first connection only the bare cost of inside work necessary for installing or dismantling the connection in any subsequent year is to be charged.

95. Where a medical practitioner having a telephone fails to pay his subscription within the period of grace allowed he must be specially informed by telephone or by memorandum that prompt payment is necessary to ensure continuance of the connection. If a telephonic notification is given it must be given to the doctor personally. On the expiration of forty-eight hours the request is to be repeated by telephone, and the doctor warned that unless the account is paid within twenty-four hours the connection will be cut off.

96. An entrance fee of £1 only is chargeable for a party line. The fee will be waived in the event of any one of the applicants being already the holder of an exclusive connection, provided both connections are held simultaneously for one year.

97. Not more than six connections may be made on one party line.

98. When an additional connection is applied for on an existing line a fresh bond must invariably be signed by both the old and the new subscribers, and a note made on the face of the bond that the line is an existing one. A fresh form of appointment of agent must also be signed. The new bond must be dated and will commence to run from the day on which the latest connection is made. In other words, the joint liability of each of the existing parties to retain his connection for a stated period is extended by each addition to the number of connections.

99. If not more than 40 chains of new line is required for the additional connection the new bond must be made to expire twelve months later than the existing one, or, if the original bond has already expired, a fresh bond for a term of twelve months from the date on which the new connection is made must be obtained. Where more than 40 chains of new line would be necessary the question of the term for which the fresh bond will be required must be referred to the Chief Accountant.

100. When a new connection is made on an existing line an account is to be rendered to the agent at the rate of the difference between the former and the new rentals for the then current half-year.

101. A subscriber on a party line may not relinquish his connection while under bond excepting with the written consent of each of the remaining parties, which must embody an undertaking to pay any additional rental involved by the change.

102. Transfer of a connection on a party line may not be made until all parties on the line have indicated in writing their concurrence in the proposed transfer. The party-line agent must obtain the signature of all the subscribers to an agreement to read as follows: "We, the undersigned subscribers to the party-line exchange connection No.

Exchange, agree to the transfer of the telephone on this line at present held by to

." When the agreement has been duly signed the ordinary transfer forms (Acct. 162) must be prepared and the agreement attached. In cases of ordinary transfers of

telephones on party lines it is not necessary to prepare a fresh bond, the above procedure being all that is required.

103. Payment of the subscription due by one or more of the parties must not be accepted without reference to the Chief Accountant unless the total amount due on the whole line is tendered at the same time. An exception to this rule may be made, however, in cases where the parties were connected before the appointment of agents for all party lines was enforced.

104. If payment of the whole of the rental for a party line is not made within reasonable time the line should be disconnected at the switchboard, and a report of the circumstances made to the Chief Accountant immediately. A few days' notice of intention to disconnect should be given to each of the parties.

105. Charitable institutions which hold party lines are allowed half-rates on one connection only, and that only after the sanction of the Secretary has been obtained.

106. The private residences of officers of the Department will, if desired, be connected with the telephone exchange at the following reduced rates, subject to the undermentioned conditions:—

- (a.) For an exclusive circuit, half-rates, with a minimum of £4 per annum. For a party wire to connect with the premises of two or more officers of the Department the minimum fee payable by each fofficer will be £3 per annum for a two-party line and £2 13s. 4d. for a three-party line. No entrance fee will be charged.
- (b.) The usual bond is to be given agreeing to retain the connection for one year for each two miles. The terms of the bond will not be enforced in the event of the officer's transfer to another town.
- (c.) The removal of a telephone within the area served by the exchange must be paid for by the officer as in the case of an ordinary connection.

107. When a subscriber wishes to have his telephone moved the usual guarantee to meet estimated expenditure is to be taken in all cases, and a deposit is to be required at the discretion of the officer dealing with the matter. He will usually claim the deposit only in cases where he has reasonable doubts as to payment being made, or, having no knowledge whatever on the point, prefers to take a deposit.

108. Exchange attendants are cautioned against listening to subscribers' conversations. It is not necessary to listen to a conversation: all that is required of an attendant in the way of "tapping" being to ascertain whether a conversation is ended or not. A moment of time and the hearing of a single syllable will suffice. If the offence of "tapping" out of curiosity is sheeted home to any officer dismissal from the Department's employ will probably follow. Controlling officers must report every case. Failure to do so will be severely dealt with.

109. In the case of an application for a bureau communication unsatisfied at the hour of closing, the receiving station, if a combined telegraph or telephone office and bureau, must be "stopped," and the communication given at ordinary rates, provided the application is made not later than a quarter of an hour before closing-time. When the application is made within the last quarter of an hour, or where the receiving station is a bureau only, the reopening fee and the switching fee, if any, are chargeable.

110. If any person wishes to communicate from a bureau or a post-office over a private wire which has been run into such

office for the purpose of sending and receiving telegrams, the communication must be charged for and treated as a bureau message.

111. When an application is made for the use of a bureau the applicant may be required to deposit the minimum fee for the desired communication before the connection is allowed.

112. Any subscriber who has a telephone-exchange connection may have the name of the person who makes a bureau communication from his telephone inserted in his weekly account, provided that he makes written application therefor, and agrees in writing to pay an extra charge of 3d. on each bureau communication from his connection.

113. When a bureau account remains unpaid after the expiration of one week from the termination of the month during which the charge arose, credit may be stopped without reference to the Head Office, and the subscriber informed that no further communications will be permitted from his connection until the outstanding account has been paid, without prejudice to other proceedings to enforce payment of the sum unpaid.

114. To obtain the benefit of the "subscriber" rate of 3d. a subscriber must speak from his own telephone.

115. Subscribers speaking from bureaux within a radius of twenty-five miles of their own exchange must pay a minimum rate of 6d.

116. Telephonists in charge of bureaux are entitled to charge a fee of 1s. for opening the bureau after their ordinary hours of duty or on Sundays.

117. "Received" telegrams may only be telephoned once to a business or private connection for the one fee; when required to be repeated to another connection a further fee must be charged.

118. On payment of 3d. in addition to the transmission fee senders may have telegrams addressed to exchange subscribers telephoned to subscribers' connections upon receipt at the office of destination. The words "To be telephoned" must be inserted in the instructions and charged for.

119. During the hours the telegraph-office is open for business, upon request being made to the exchange, a special messenger must be placed at the disposal of any subscriber, under the conditions and at the fees shown in the Guide.

120. Payment of fees must be made at the time the service is performed; if more than the actual fee is received the surplus must be returned by post, not by messenger. Receipts for payment made at any time must be given free of charge.

121. Officers in charge at offices where linemen are stationed and where no messengers have been appointed will utilize the services of the lineman in delivering telegrams within the limits of free delivery, and not leave the office themselves under any circumstances during office hours, except when the linemen are absent on line duty. A lineman refusing to deliver telegrams when directed to do so, or to perform any other duty consistently with his other duties, will, upon being reported, be liable to a heavy fine, and on repetition of the offence to dismissal.

122. Message-boys when on duty must always use the bags provided for holding telegrams. They are strictly forbidden to carry telegrams in their pockets, and any message-boy guilty of a breach of this instruction will be liable to dismissal.

123. The fines to be inflicted for errors and irregularities in carrying out the Telegraph Regulations and Instructions are set forth in Appendix A.

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE W. F. MASSEY, P.C., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section twenty-five f the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, it is provided that at any time while His Majesty is at war with any foreign Prince or State the Governor may from time t time, by Order in Council, if satisfied that such a course is necessary in the public interest, modify or suspend wholly or partially, and subject to such conditions as he thinks fit, all or any of the provisions of any industrial award or industrial agreement under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments, and all or any of the provisions of the Shops and Offices Act, 1908, and the Factories Act, 1908, and their amendments, and all or any of the provisions of any other Act so far as such provisions take away or restrict the liberty of private contract in matters of trade, commerce, business, or employment: And whereas the Governor is satisfied that it is necessary in the public interest to suspend certain of the above-recited provisions for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by section twenty-five of the Regulation of Trade and Commerce Act, 1914, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that **D**ominion, doth hereby suspend those provisions of any award or industrial agreement which prescribe the conditions of employment of under-rate workers and apprentices, and those provisions of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act and its amendments relating thereto, in so far as they prevent or restrict the employment of any "discharged soldier" who is authorized in the manner following to be employed in the industry to which such award or industrial agreement relates, viz.:-

An application by a discharged soldier to be so employed may be made by him to any Inspector of Factories who is authorized in writing by the Chief Inspector of Factories to

2. The Inspector, after making inquiry as to the fitness and ability of the applicant for such employment, and after giving the union which is bound by the award or industrial agreement a reasonable opportunity of expressing its views upon the application, may, in writing, issue to him a "Discharged Soldier's Permit" to be employed in the industry for such term at such rate of way a and upon uch other conditions as term, at such rate of wag s, and upon uch other conditions as he thinks fit.

For the purposes of this Order in Council "discharged soldier" means a discharged soldier as defined in section two soldier" means a discharged soldier as defined in section two of the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, who is incapable of efficiently working at his previous occupation by reason of disablement contracted during his period of military service.

WHEREAS by section thirty-eight of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1912 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor may by Order in Council make such regulations as he considers necessary for carrying into effect the provisions of Part II of the

said Act (relating to the purchase by lessees of the freehold of Crown lands comprised in leases in perpetuity, other than lands subject to the provisions of the Land for Settlements Act):

And whereas regulations as aforesaid were duly made by Order in Council dated the tenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the twentieth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said recited

regulations and to make others in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the above-recited regulations, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulations; and doth hereby declare that such revocation and the regulations hereby made shall take effect as from the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand

Gazette.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. Every owner of a lease in perpetuity who desires to purchase the fee-simple of the land comprised in his lease, in pursuance of the provisions of Part II of the said Act, shall give notice of his intention to the Commissioner of Crown Lands in the form No. 1 in the Schedule hereto.

2. Every such notice shall, on delivery at the office of the Commissioner, be stamped with the date of such delivery, and the Commissioner shall as soon as practicable give notice under his hand in the form No. 2 or in the form No. 3 in the Schedule hereto, informing the lessee of the receipt of the notice, and setting out, in accordance with the said Act, the terms upon which the purchase is to be completed.

#### Rental of Quarters provided by Government.

WHEREAS by section thirty of the Public Service Act, 1912, it is provided that "If any officer not entitled to quarters is allowed to use, for the purpose of residence, any building belonging to the Government, the Commissioner may direct that a fair and reasonable sum as rent thereof be deducted for such officer's salary, and the amount of such sum shall be fixed by the Commissioner":

And whereas it is considered desirable to adopt a uniform method of charging rentals to officers of Departments.

Notice is hereby given that I have adopted the following principles as to such charges, and that I direct that the payments hereinafter specified shall be made:—

- (1.) An officer, whether married or unmarried, sent to a station where quarters are provided must occupy the same and pay the rent specified.
- (2.) No rent will be charged where the accommodation provided is insufficient for the officer's family, and where, as a consequence, the officer has to rent a house for his family.
- (3.) In the case of buildings occupied by more than one officer, rent shall be proportionately allocated among them.
- (4.) Rental will be computed at an annual rate payable monthly, and, except under special circumstances herein provided for, will be not exceeding ten (10) per cent. of the officer's salary.
- (5.) Where fuel or lighting is provided at Government expense, an additional charge equal to the actual cost will be made for the same. Where the salary at present paid is based on the supplies being furnished by Government, an equivalent addition will be made to the classified rate of pay.
- (6.) The Commissioner, in any case in which he is of opinion that the enforcement of the above-mentioned directions would be inequitable, may waive or vary any or all of them.

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE.

TN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Hamilton Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of provicing the interest and other charges on a loan of £700 (seven hundred pounds), authorized to be raised by the Hamilton Borough Council, under the above-mentioned Act, for the purpose of taking and acquiring, under the provisions of the Public Works Act or otherwise, all those pieces of land being Allotments 320 and 325 of the Town of Hamilton West, including the compensation or purchase price of the same and of all costs of so taking or acquiring the said land, the said Hamilton Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-eightieth of a penny in the £1 upon the rateable value (unimproved) of all rateable property of the Borough of Hamilton, being the whole of the Borough of Hamilton; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the first day of January in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of twenty years, or until the loan is fully paid off.
