Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto, being the locality defined in the said petition, with boundaries as altered by the said Commission, shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district, under the Town Boards Act, 1908, on and from the first day of April, 1916, by the name of the Manurewa Town District. And, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, I do hereby proclaim, declare, and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of seven members.

Regulations relating to the Stamping of Eggs imported into New Zealand.

For the purpose of these regulations "eggs" means the eggs of poultry, and includes only eggs in the shell.

(1.) All eggs imported into New Zealand, and the packages containing the same, shall be stamped as hereinafter set out to indicate the country of origin, and no eggs shall be admitted into New Zealand unless and until such stamping has been effected. effected.

(2.) Each egg in every consignment shall be stamped on the shell in indelible ink and in bold sans-serif capital letters of not less size than six points face measurement, with the words "Imported from" followed by the name of the country

words "Imported from" tollowed by the name of the country in which the eggs were laid.

Regulations regarding the Disposal of Crown Land situated within a Kauri-gum District for the Systematic Recovery of Kauri-gum and other Valuable Products pursuant to the Provisions of Section 3 of the Kauri-gum Industry Amendment Act, 1915.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section three of the V him by section three of the Kauri-gum Industry Amendment Act, 1915 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations with respect to the disposal of Crown land within a kauri-gum district for the systematic recovery of kauri-gum and other valuable products contained therein; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

In the above table are given the deaths and death-rates for each of the four cities, for the suburban boroughs severally, and for each city with its suburban towns.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs lowers the death-rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Dunedin, but raises it at Christchurch.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 602, against 597 in December—an increase of 5. The deaths in January were 286—a decrease of 5 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 142, females 144. Fifty-five of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 19.23 per cent. of the whole number; 30 of these were under one year of age.

There were 117 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 110 in December. The following table shows the classification:—

Arrivals and Departures in 1915.

Census and Statistics Office, Wellington, 25th February, 1916.

TABLES showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1915, with totals for the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The total number of persons who arrived in the Dominion during 1915 was-25,551, and the departures during the year numbered 22,476, the excess of arrivals over departures for the year being 3,075.

According to returns furnished by the Immigration officers, 3,531 persons arrived from the United Kingdom, and 2,063 persons departed therefor during the year. From the Commonwealth of Australia the arrivals are returned as numbering 19,499 persons, and the departures thereto as 17,793 persons. Arrivals and departures from and to other countries were 2,521 and 2,620 persons respectively.

Of the 25,551 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 2,967, or 11-62 per cent. of the total, were children-i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 22,476 departures the children numbered 1,997, or 8-89 per cent.

The arrivals and departures shown do not include members of the Expeditionary Forces.
