*Declaring Washdyke Lagoon and certain other Land adjoining to be a Sanctuary for Imported and Native Game.*

LIVERPOOL, Governor.

PURSUANT to the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby notify and declare the areas described in the Schedule hereto to be a sanctuary for the purpose of the said Animals Protection Act, 1908, and that no imported or native game shall be taken or killed in the said areas.

*Regulations for Deer-shooting, Otago.*

LIVERPOOL, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the Otago Acclimatization District, and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

REGULATIONS.

1. RED-DEER stags may be taken or killed within the Otago Acclimatization District, except in the areas described in the First Schedule hereto, from the 1st day of April, 1916, to the 20th day of May, 1916 (both days inclusive).
2. Fallow-deer bucks may be taken or killed within the said district, except in the areas described in the First Schedule hereto, from the 1st day of April, 1916, to the 15th day of May, 1916 (both days inclusive).
3. Licenses to take or kill red-deer stags may be issued by the Chief Postmaster, Dunedin, on the recommendation of the secretary of the Otago Acclimatization Society, on payment of a license fee of £4, and licenses to take or kill fallow-deer bucks may be issued by the said Chief Postmaster, upon a like recommendation, on payment of a license fee of £2; such licenses to be issued in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations.
4. No licensee shall take or kill more than four red-deer stags or two fallow-deer bucks, and no red-deer stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than ten points, and no fallow-deer buck shall be killed carrying antlers with less than fourteen points (on a palmate of less than 4 in.). Ball cartridge only to be used.
5. The licensee must give notice to the said Chief Postmaster of the date on which it is his intention to stalk deer; such notice to be posted, or delivered, or telegraphed three clear days before such date.
6. No doe, hind, or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.
7. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or any portion thereof.
8. Regulations as to deer "tags," per *New Zealand Gazette* No. 40, Vol. I, of 20th May, 1909, page 1408, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the secretary

of the Otago Acclimatization Society immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with a statement of the number of deer shot.

9. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

The members of the Board shall at their first meeting, and thereafter at the annual meeting hereinafter mentioned, elect one of themselves to be Chairman, who may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote. The Chairman shall hold office until the election of his successor.
3. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.
4. Any four members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.
5. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.
6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.
7. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three

consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

*Special Order raising Supplementary Loan of £5,500.*

WHEREAS the Epsom Road Board in the year 1914 did, for the purpose of constructing drainage-works for the drainage of the whole of the Epsom Road District, raise a special loan of £55,000: And whereas the amount of the said loan has been found insufficient to complete the undertaking in respect of which the said loan was raised:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in and conferred upon it in that behalf by the provisions of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, and in pursuance and exercise of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Epsom Road Board doth hereby resolve by special order—

## ALTERATIONS TO LIGHTS (BUOYS), PORT PHILLIP.

MARINERS and others are hereby notified that on or about the 3rd March, 1916, the following alterations will be made to the system of lighting the buoys in South and West Channels, Port Phillip Bay:—

## No. 12 Buoy, South Channel.

The present fixed white light on No. 12 buoy will be altered to a single flashing green light, with a flash of three-tenths of a second duration, alternating with an eclipse of two and seven-tenths seconds.

## No. 2 Royal George Buoy, West Channel.

## PORT OF GEELONG.—WILSON'S SPIT.

(c) *On the South:* By a line drawn from the south-western point of Futau-chau in the direction of Pak-sha-wan for a distance of 5.6 cables. (d) *On the West:* By a line drawn from Maun-chau in 180° (south mag.) direction to meet the south limit (c).

*Remarks.*—The Eastern Junk Examination Anchorage is that portion of Chung-kwang-o northward of a line joining Maun-chau and Bak-sin-kok.

## 2. Western Anchorage.

*Position.*—Southward of Chung-hue. Rock 10 ft. high, off south-eastern point of Chung-hue; lat. 22° 20' N., long. 114° 6½' E.

*Limits.*—(a) *On the North:* By the southern coastline of Chung-hue, extending from the rock 10 ft. high off the south-eastern point to the rock 8 ft. high off the south-western end. (b) *On the East:* By a line drawn from the 10 ft. rock above referred to in 180° (south mag.) direction for a distance of 14.6 cables. (c) *On the South:* By a line drawn from the southern extremity of limit (b) in a 270° (west mag.) direction for a distance of 7.3 cables. (d) *On the West:* By a line drawn from the 8 ft. rock above referred to in 180° (south mag.) direction to meet the south limit (c).

*Remarks.*—The western Junk Examination Anchorage is the same as that for other vessels.

To enable the company to be appointed and to act as attorney of any person or corporation, and to enable the powers of the company under any power of attorney to be exercised by the manager of the company, or any director or two directors thereof, and to extend and apply the provisions of section 100 of the Property Law Act, 1908, and section 306 of the Companies Act, 1908, to any such power of attorney, and to enable the manager or any director or two directors to make the statutory declarations as prescribed by the said sections.

9. To provide for the audit and examination of the accounts and books of the company affecting or having reference to any estate committed to the company, at the instance of any person interested therein.

10. To prevent the voluntary winding-up of the company while any estate committed to it shall not be wholly administered; and to enable the Supreme Court or a Judge thereof, on the application of any person interested, to restrain the voluntary winding-up of the company.

11. To provide for payment into the Public Account of all moneys held by the company which shall be unclaimed for a period of five years, to be dealt with as unclaimed moneys in the Public Trust Office are dealt with, and to provide for a penalty on the company in case of default.

12. To render the whole assets of the company, including its unpaid capital, liable for the proper administration of all estates committed to the company, and for the proper discharge by the company and by its officers of its and their duties under all the before-mentioned powers.

13. To provide that all the existing powers and jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of New Zealand shall apply in respect of all trusts undertaken by the company, that the constitution or incorporation of the company shall remain unaffected by the proposed legislation, and that the company shall be subject to all future legislation regulating trust companies without any right to compensation for the effect of any such legislation on the interests of the company.

## SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Director: Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

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By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
