Vesting Portion of Pouakani Block in certain Natives.

### [L.S.] LIVERPOOL, Governor. A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by section fifty-seven of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal and Public Bodies Empowering Act, 1914, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto is hereby vested in the persons whose names appear in an order of the Native Land Court, under the hand of Michael Gilfedder, Esquire, a Judge of the said Court, made at Greytown North on the twenty-second day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, as the Maori owners of such land for the relative interests therein set out.

### SCHEDULE.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 30,486 acres, being part of the land known as the Pouakani Block, and bounded towards the northeast by the Waikato River from the Waipapa River to Mangakino Stream; thence towards the south-east by that stream and the Mihianga Stream; towards the south by a right line running due west from the said Mihianga Stream to the eastern boundary of Maraeroa A Block, Section 3, so as to include the said area of 30,486 acres; and towards the west generally by the said Maraeroa A Block, Section 3, to the Waiteti Stream, by that stream to and by Pouakani C No. 2 Block, and again by the Waiteti Stream to the Waipapa River, and by that river to its confluence with the Waikato River, the place of commencement. WHEREAS by section five of the Public Works Amend-W ment Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council grant to any person or body corporate a license to use water from any fall, river, stream, or other source for the purpose of generating electricity for electric light, mechanical power, or other uses, and to exercise in respect of that purpose any of the powers and authorities specified in that behalf in the said section : And whereas it is further provided by the said section that any such license may confer upon the licensee a right at any time or times during the continuance of the license (but subject to such conditions and restrictions as are expressed in the license) to enter upon any road, railway, or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown, or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such cables, wires, and other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the fall, river, stream, or other source aforesaid and any place to which the licensee is authorized

to transmit electricity in pursuance of the license : And whereas the Wairoa Borough Council (hereinafter, with its successors and assigns, referred to as "the licensee") has applied for a license under the said section to take and use water from the Wairoa River, near Te Reinga Falls, in the Provincial District of Hawke's Bay (hereinafter referred to as "the said river"), for the purpose of generating elec-tricity as aforesaid, and it is expedient to issue such license accordingly :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him as aforesaid, and of the powers conferred by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to the licensee (subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the licensee (subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto) a license to take and use from the Wairoa River aforesaid, for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as "the said water") not exceeding three hundred (300) cubic feet per second at any one time; and also to erect and maintain electric lines for power, lighting, heating, or other uses along the routes hereinafter described, and subject to the regulations pub-lished in the New Zealand Gazette dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and hereinafter referred to as "the regulations."

### SCHEDULE.

### 1. PLANS.

THE licensee shall, before the works hereby authorized are commenced, forward for the approval of the Minister of Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister")—

- (a.) Full detailed drawings and specifications of the divert ing weir and dam.
- (b.) Drawings showing how and in what manner the water diverted is to be returned to the said river.
  (c.) Contour-plan showing difference in level of water due to the construction of the headworks.

### 2. UTILIZATION OF THE WATER.

The said water shall be used solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be returned to the Wairoa River at or near the power-house.

### 3. LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said water shall be taken from the said Wairoa River at the headworks, situated near the junction of the Ruakituri and Hangaroa Rivers, about three chains above the Te Reinga Falls in the Opoiti Survey District, at a point indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 38164, deposited in the office of the Minister at Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington.

### 4. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, The licensee is hereby authorized to construct, instruction, and use the following works for the purposes of this license; the position of the said works being indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 38164 hereinbefore referred to :--

- (a.) Headworks consisting of a dam and necessary intake.
  (b.) Water-races, tunnel fluming, and pipe-lines leading from such dam to the power-house hereinafter referred to.
  (c.) A power-house with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity.
- and other appliances for generating electricity.
   (d.) Transmission and other lines over the routes shown by means of dotted lines coloured red and yellow on the said plan.

### 5. INSPECTION OF WORKS.

The Inspecting Engineer, both during and after the con-struction of the works, shall have free access to and liberty at any time to inspect the same so as to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

### 6. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

• After the said works have been completed, the licensee shall maintain the same in proper working-order during the continuance of this license.

### 7. RIGHT TO ENTER LANDS, ETC.

7. KIGHT TO ENTER LANDS, ETC. The licensee shall have the right at any time or times during the continuance of this license, with the consent of the Minister, to enter upon any road or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such transmission-lines, poles, or other things as are required for the transmission of elec-tricity between the generating-stations and any of the sub-stations to which this license applies.

### 8. POWER TO TAKE LAND.

The licensee is hereby empowered to take, under the Public Works Act, 1908, as for a public work such land as may, in the opinion of the Governor, be necessary to enable the licensee to construct and maintain the various works authorized by this license.

### 9. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

### 10. RENTAL.

The licensee shall, in respect of this license, pay to the Public Works Engineer for the district, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, a rental of one peppercorn per annum if demanded.

### 11. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER-RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than

the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said Wairoa River, except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it; provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said river.

### 12. FINES.

- If the licensee fails or neglects— (a.) To use or maintain the said works, after completion, so as to secure the full benefit of the undertaking; or
- (b.) To observe any of the conditions or obligations herein imposed,-

then and in any such case the licensee shall be liable to a then and in any such case the needed shaded so that is the fine of £50 for every week or part of a week during which such default or neglect continues; or the Governor may in Order in Council revoke this license.

### 13. SERVICE OF NOTICE.

Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause, Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause, this license shall not be revoked, and no proceedings shall be taken for the recovery of a fine in respect of the breach thereof, unless and until notice in writing of the intention so to revoke the license or to take such proceedings has been served upon the licensee, or placed upon some principal or conspicuous part of the works, and default has been made by the licensee in remaining or remedving the breach or by the licensee in repairing or remedying the breach or breaches specified in the said notice for the following periods :----

- (a.) For any breach which in the opinion of the Governor can be met by a fine, for thirty days after the service of such notice.
- (b.) For any breach which in the opinion of the Governor is of such a nature as to require the revocation of this license, for ninety days after the service of such notice.

### 14. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor by Order in Council.

### 15. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon, if so required by the Minister, remove from the ground all re-movable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do provide appipment machinery huildings poles lines and do, such equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, lines, and other plant shall, without payment or compensation, vest in and become the property of the Crown.

### 16. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 4d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

### 17. System of Supply.

Electrical energy shall be generated in the form of threephase current at a frequency of 50 cycles per second and a pressure of 2,200 volts between phases, and transformed up to 22,000 volts for transmission to main substation or substations, there to be transformed down to 2,200 volts for distribution.

### 18. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purposes of calculating stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as twenty-two (22°) degrees Fahrenheit.

### 19. NOTICES re EXTENSIONS, ETC.

Notices re commencement of work (Regulation 44) and re extensions and alterations (Regulation 44) and re extensions and alterations (Regulation 49) should be sent to the Public Works Engineer at present stationed at Gis-borne, and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at Gisborne.

### 20. HEADWORKS, COMPLETION OF.

The licensee shall within six months from the date of the signification of the Minister's approval of the drawings and signification of the Minister's approval of the drawings and specifications mentioned in paragraph 1 of Schedule, make a substantial commencement of such works, and shall proceed continuously and energetically with the construction of all such works until they are completed, and such works shall be completed by the licensee within three years from the date of this license; provided, however, that in the event of

unavoidable accident or delay the Minister may grant such further time within which the works shall be commenced or completed as, in his opinion, is just and reasonable in the circumstances.

### 21. Assignment.

This license and the benefits and obligations thereunder shall not be assigned by the licensee without the express consent in writing of the Governor in Council first had and obtained, upon such terms and conditions as he shall approve, but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified under the license.

### 22. Option to purchase.

The right is hereby reserved to His Majesty the King to purchase at his option, at such price and on such conditions as may be mutually agreed upon (or failing such mutual agree-ment, then by arbitration in the manner prescribed by the Arbitration Act, 1908), this license, together with the whole of the business and undertaking of the licensee so far as the same relates to or is connected with the exercise of this license, and together with all real and personal property and all rights acquired by the licensee under this license and used or enjoyed in connection therewith. The said right may be exercised by His Majesty the King at any time during the currency of this license, but the said valuation shall not include any sum in respect of the value of the goodwill of the licensee's business or undertaking, or in respect of the value of necessee sousmess or undertaking, or in respect of the value of the license for the unexpired period thereof. On the com-pletion of the purchase His Majesty the King shall be deemed to be the assignee of this license, and all the rights vested in the licensee by the license shall thereupon vest in His Majesty the King : Provided that in the event of His Majesty the King correspondent to windth to purchase the license a conservation King exercising the right to purchase the license as aforesaid, His Majesty shall thereupon, if the licensee shall so require, supply the licensee with such quantity of electrical power for the use of the said licensee's own works as is equal in quantity to that which the licensee has been using on the average for twelve months immediately prior to the said purchase, and the charge for such power shall not exceed the rate which the the energy for such power shall not exceed the rate which the production of such power has cost the said licensee during such year, plus an amount equal to 5 per cent. interest on the amount of the purchase-money paid by His Majesty to the licensee; but if any power is sold to any person, corporate body, or company other than the licensee then, and in any such case, the licensee shall be charred with interest on such such case, the licensee shall be charged with interest on such proportion only of the said purchase-money as the quantity of electrical energy sold to the licensee bears to the tota sales.

### 6. DURATION OF LICENSE.


