WHEREAS W HEREAS by a Proclamation dated the eleventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the sixteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, the boundaries of the Counties of Kairanga and Horowhenua were altered by the exclusion of a certain area from the County of Horowhenua and the inclusion of such area in the County of Kairanga: And whereas it is desirable that the area so added to the County of Kairanga should be included in the Fitzherbert Riding of that county:

The total rainfall was above the average in the northernmost and southernmost districts, and also in portions of the west coast of the South Island, but in most other parts of the Dominion it was below the mean.
