*Declaring certain Area added to the County of Eketahuna to be included in Alfredton Riding thereof.*

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirtieth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, the boundaries of the Counties of Castlepoint and Eketahuna were altered by the exclusion of a certain area from the County of Castlepoint and the inclusion of such area in the County of Eketahuna: And whereas it is desirable that the area so added to the County of Eketahuna should be included in the Alfredton Riding of that county:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section twenty-two of the Counties Act, 1908, do hereby declare that the area included as aforesaid in the County of Eketahuna shall be included in the Alfredton Riding of the said county, and that the boundaries of that riding shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.

ALFREDTON RIDING, EKETAHUNA COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Eketahuna County bounded towards the north-east generally by Akitio County from the summit of the Puketoi Range to Castlepoint County; thence towards the south-east generally by Castlepoint County to Masterton County; thence towards the south generally by Masterton and Mauriceville Counties to the south-eastern boundary of Section 75, Block XV, Mangaone Survey District; thence towards the west generally by Section 75, Block XV, Sections 41, 44, 25, the crossing of a road and Section 6, Block XI, Sections 39, 41, the crossing of a road, 30, 30A, and 30B, Block VII, Section 1, Block VIII, and the north-western side of Pa Valley Road to Section 175; thence by the southern and western boundaries of the said Section 175 to the southern

boundary of Pahiatua County; and thence towards the north by that county to Akitio County, the place of commencement.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of April, 1916.

IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the third section of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, a majority of the ratepayers in the area of land described in the Schedule hereto, situated in the County of Waikato, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, praying that the said area be constituted a drainage district under the provisions of the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in the third section of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby constitute and declare the area of land described in the Schedule hereto to be a district for the purposes of Part I of the said Act, and to be called by the name of the "Mangawara Drainage District"; and also, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in the fourth section of the said Act, doth hereby declare that the Board of Trustees of the said district shall consist of five persons to be elected as members of the said Board, and under and in accordance with the said Act.

*Regulations relating to Butter made from Milk-fat in Whey.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-first day of March, 1916.

THE HONOURABLE W. H. HERRIES PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend the regulations made under the said Act on the fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the sixth day of the same month, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen.

SCHEDULE.

PARAGRAPH 17 of Part II of the said regulations (relating to butter) is hereby amended as follows:—

(a.) By inserting, after the words "and includes" in clause (1), the words "whey butter and."

(b.) By inserting, after the said clause (1), the following new clause:—

"Whey Butter.

"(1A.) Whey butter is butter which is manufactured wholly or in part from milk-fat recovered from whey."

(c.) By inserting, after clause (6), the following new clause:—

"(6A.) Whey butter shall not be sold save with a statement or label attached on which shall be clearly written or printed, on a white ground in black capitals of a size not less than one-half of an inch in length, the words "Whey butter."

THE RIGHT HONOURABLE W. F. MASSEY, P.C., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth, and doth hereby declare that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

## REGULATIONS.

## THE GRADING OF TEACHERS.

1. The Inspectors of the several education districts, acting together when there is more than one Inspector in a district, shall proceed annually as grading officers to grade, in accordance with the regulations herein contained, all the certificated teachers employed by the Board in their district as on the 1st day of February, and shall report the result of their grading to the Director of Education not later than the 31st day of March following.

2. Certificated teachers who are temporarily out of the employment of the Board at the time of grading or who for the first time are employed by the Board after the 1st day of February may, on or before the 15th day of March, apply to the Senior Inspector of their district to have their names included in the grading-list, and such teachers shall be graded accordingly as circumstances permit.

3. Certificated teachers who are for the time being employed in Native schools under the Education Department may, if they so desire, be graded in a similar manner by the Inspectors instructed thereto by the Director, but any such grading shall have effect only in respect of any subsequent employment of the teacher in the service of an Education Board.

4. For the purpose of determining the grading of the teachers of any district the grading officers shall provisionally divide the teachers to be graded in that district into six groups, to be determined as follows:—

- Group "A"—Head teachers with salary of Grade I and assistants with salary of Grade 1 or 2:
- „ "B"—Head teachers with salary of Grade II and assistants with salary of Grade 3:
- „ "C"—Head teachers with salary of Grade III and assistants with salary of Grade 4 or 5:
- „ "D"—Head teachers with salary of Grade IV and assistants with salary of Grade 6 or 7:
- „ "E"—Head teachers with salary of Grade V:
- „ "F"—Head teachers with salary of Grade VI or VII.

Provided that—

- (a.) The head teacher of a district high school, unless he is already in Group "F," shall be placed in the group next above that in which he would otherwise be placed under the above provisions.
- (b.) Teachers in charge of part-time schools shall in all cases be grouped as if their grade of salary were determined by Part IV (b) of the Fifth Schedule to the Act.
- (c.) Relieving and temporary teachers, other than permanent relieving teachers, shall be grouped according to the grade of salary of their last permanent position.
- (d.) Teachers who have not previously held a permanent position under an Education Board shall be placed in Group "A"; provided that in special cases a Senior Inspector may recommend to the Director that a teacher should, by reason of other experience, be placed in a group higher than "A."
- (e.) In the case of Normal Schools, the kindergarten mistress, the senior secondary assistant, and the sole teacher shall be placed in Group "D." The remaining assistants in such schools,

other than those in charge of model schools, shall be grouped according to the grades of salary they would receive in corresponding positions in a school of Grade VII, but shall not be placed in a group lower than "B."

- (f.) Teachers in separate girls' schools shall be grouped as if they received the grade of salary of corresponding positions in a separate boys' school.
- (g.) Native-school teachers shall be placed in such groups as if they received the grade of salary for positions in schools of corresponding grades under the Fourth Schedule of the Act.

5. Except as otherwise expressly provided, the grade of salary for the purposes of Regulation 4 shall be the grade of salary set out in the tables forming Parts I and II of the Fourth Schedule to the Act, and payable to the teacher in each case on the 1st day of February in each year, but shall not include any additional payment or allowance by way of salary or otherwise.

6. For the purpose of grading, marks shall be allotted by the Inspectors on the following basis, namely:—

	Maximum Marks.
Skill in teaching ... ..	40
Personality and discipline ... ..	15
Organization and management ... ..	15
Environment ... ..	5
Academic attainments ... ..	15
Service ... ..	10

Total maximum, 100 marks. To the total marks thus ascertained shall be added in each case the quota as prescribed for each group under the provisions of Regulation 13 hereof. Such quota shall be for the purpose of weighting the value of the marks in the successive groups in recognition of the relatively higher qualifications demanded by the higher positions. The combined total of the marks and the quota shall determine the grading of the teachers.

7. In allotting marks under the several headings above stated, grading officers shall be guided by the following table of comparative values:—

8. Marks for skill in teaching, for personality and discipline, for organization and management, and for environment shall be allotted with special relation to the teacher's efficiency in the class of position occupied by him up to the time of grading, and shall be assessed in all essential respects on a basis of comparison with teachers in the same group only.

9. In the case of an assistant teacher the maximum assignable for organization and management shall be 5 marks, provided that—

- (a.) An assistant who has held the position of head or sole teacher may be allotted marks up to a maximum of 10 under this heading:
- (b.) An assistant teacher may be allotted marks up to a maximum of 15 under this heading if he has been head or sole teacher of a school in which the salary allocated to the position at the time he occupied it would, if determined under the present scale of salaries, place him in the same group as that warranted by the salary of his present position:
- (c.) The assistant mistress placed by the headmaster in charge of the infant department of a school of Grade VI or VII may be assigned marks up to 15 for organization and management.

10. Marks for environment shall be awarded for the teacher's taste and care with respect to the school and its surroundings, and for evidence of the teacher's value as a useful factor in the life of the community.

11. Marks for academic attainments shall be based on the class of teacher's certificate held, and shall be given as follows: For certificate of Class E, 3 marks; Class D, 6; Class C, 9; Class B, 12; Class A, 15.

12. Teaching service shall be reckoned in accordance with Regulations 5 and 6 of the Regulations for the Examination and Classification of Teachers, and shall include service up to the 31st day of December next preceding the grading. For each complete two years of service so reckoned 1 mark up to a maximum of the marks shall be assigned.

13. The quota of additional marks for which provision is made by Regulation 6 shall for the respective groups be as follows:—

For Group	“ A ”	a quota of 10 marks.
“ B ”	20	“
“ C ”	30	“
“ D ”	40	“
“ E ”	50	“
“ F ”	60	“

Provided that in the case of any teacher who receives less than 40 per cent. of the marks assignable to him apart from the quota, the marks of the corresponding quota shall be reduced by 20 per cent.

14. From the grading-lists forwarded to the Director of Education shall be compiled annually a general graded list of teachers, which shall be duly published in accordance with the Act before the 30th day of June. Every such general list shall contain—

- (a.) The names of all teachers graded as herein provided, arranged in order, and consecutively numbered in accordance with the totals of the grading-marks assigned.
- (b.) The name in each case of the district, if any, in respect of service in which the teacher was graded, the nature of the position occupied, and such other information as the Director may determine.

15. No marks either in general or in detail on which the grading has been based shall in any case be contained in the list aforesaid. All such marks shall be regarded as strictly confidential, and shall not be disclosed by any officer concerned except in pursuance of his official duties as prescribed by these regulations.

16. Any teacher who considers that he has a good ground of objection to the position assigned to him on the graded list may, not later than the 31st day of July next following the publication of the list in the *New Zealand Gazette*, lodge an appeal by letter directed to the Director of Education, Wellington, giving the grounds on which the appeal is based, and every such appeal shall be dealt with as the Director may determine.

17. For the purpose of the grading of teachers for the present year, Regulation 1 hereof shall be read as if the words “ May, nineteen hundred and sixteen,” were substituted for the words “ March following ”; and Regulation 2 shall be read as if the word “ May ” was substituted for the word “ March.”

*Scheme for the Control of the Christchurch High Schools.*

Education Department,  
Wellington, 11th May, 1916.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Education Act, 1914 (hereinafter called "the Education Act"), and with the powers thereunder, I, Josiah Alfred Hanan, Minister of Education, do hereby cancel the scheme of control for the Christchurch Boys' and Girls' High Schools published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 17th February last, and hereby approve of the following scheme for the said schools (hereinafter called "the schools"), which are established under the provisions of the Christchurch Boys' and Girls' High School Act, 1878.

1. The schools shall be controlled by the Board of Governors of Canterbury College (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), constituted by the Canterbury College and Canterbury Agricultural College Act, 1896.

2. (1.) The schools shall provide a course of general secondary education and one or more vocational courses.

(2.) The program of each pupil shall be determined by the principal of the school after consultation with the parents or guardian of the pupil; but no pupil shall be compelled to take Latin, or to take more than one language besides English.

(3.) The fees to be charged to those who are not holders of scholarships or free places shall be as follows:—

For the Boys' School: £10 10s. per annum for boys under the age of twelve years, and £13 10s. per annum for boys who have reached that age; provided that if two or more brothers who pay fees attend, a reduction of 10s. per term shall be allowed for each brother after the first; and provided further that the fees shall be subject to a rebate of £1 on each proportional one-third part of such fees on payment within fourteen days from the commencement of each term.

For the Girls' School: £12 12s. per annum for girls in the preparatory class, £12 12s. per annum for girls under the age of twelve years, and £15 15s. per annum for girls who have reached that age and are not in the preparatory class; provided that if two or more sisters who pay fees attend, a reduction of £1 1s. per term shall be allowed for each sister after the first; and provided further that the fees shall be subject to a rebate of £1 1s. on each proportional one-third part of such fees on payment within fourteen days from the commencement of each term.

(4.) The school year shall consist of three terms of about thirteen weeks each.

(5.) The principal shall cause the school to be examined during each term; provided that it shall not be necessary for the school to be so examined in any term in which it is examined by some person appointed by the Minister or the Board, and provided further that it shall not be necessary to include in such examination classes the majority of whose members are sitting for public examinations during the term.

3. Subject to the general direction and control of the Board, the principal shall have the following powers with respect to the Boys' School and the lady principal shall have similar powers with respect to the Girls' School:—

(1.) He shall have control of the school buildings and premises, and of the apparatus and furniture thereof.

(2.) He shall have the power to recommend the appointment or dismissal of assistant teachers or of other officers of the school, and to allot their several duties; and no assistant teacher or other officer of the school shall be appointed until the principal has been consulted.

(3.) He shall have the power in cases of grave neglect of duty or of gross misbehaviour to suspend any assistant teacher or other officer, but shall forthwith report his action to the Chairman of the Board, who shall report the matter to the Board at its next meeting, when the matter may be determined; and the action of the principal shall hold good until the Board has determined the matter.

(4.) He shall be supreme over the discipline, and may suspend any pupil, reporting his action to the Board at its next meeting, and the action of the principal shall hold good until the Board has come to some determination in regard to the matter. He shall not expel any pupil without the sanction of the Board.

(5.) He shall be consulted when salaries of assistants, estimates, additions or alterations to buildings, or other matters of a similar character are under consideration.

(6.) He shall regulate all text-books, methods, and organization; and, subject to clause 2 hereof and to the regulations under the Education Act, he shall determine the course of study for each pupil.

4. The Board may establish or license hostels or boarding-houses for the accommodation of pupils, and may place such hostels or boardinghouses under the charge of teachers of the school or other suitable persons, and shall provide for the inspection of such hostels or boardinghouses.

5. The school shall be open to inspection as provided by section 96 of the Education Act.
