Change of Name of Locality and Bay, "German Bay" to "Takamatua."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Board of the Road District of Akaroa-Wainui has, by resolution adopted at an ordinary meeting thereof, requested that the name of the locality situated in the Road District of Akaroa-Wainui and known as "German Bay" be altered to "Takamatua":

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the locality now known as "German Bay" shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Takamatua," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such locality accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the bay now known as "German Bay" shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Takamatua Bay," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such bay accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

Directing Preparation of Valuation Lists for Parts of City of Dunedin.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the sixteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, duly published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, at page 1777, the boundaries of the City of Dunedin were altered by including therein the areas particularly described in the Schedules to the said Orders in Council, as from the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen: And whereas the said areas so included in the City of Dunedin were formerly parts of the Tomahawk, Portobello, and Peninsula Road Districts respectively, in the County of Peninsula: And whereas it is necessary that valuation lists for the areas so added to the City of Dunedin should be prepared, and that the various times prescribed in the making and preparation of such lists by the Rating Act, 1908, should be extended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf enabling me in the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, and of all other powers in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim, declare, and direct—

- (a.) That valuation lists be prepared for the areas described in the First, Second, and Third Schedules hereto so added to the City of Dunedin, as constituted at the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, setting forth the rateable value of all rateable property in those areas, and the names of the occupiers and owners thereof, and all other necessary particulars, as provided or required by section seven of the Rating Act, 1908, as amended by the Rating Amendment Act, 1910, be prepared.
- (b.) That such valuation lists shall be prepared on or before the twenty-first day of June, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen.
- (c.) That objections to the said valuation lists shall be delivered on or before the fifth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen.

(d.) That such valuation lists, when completed and signed, shall form part of the valuation roll of the City of Dunedin.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the provisions of the Rating Act, 1908, relating to the valuation list and roll respectively shall apply hereto, save and except as the same are hereinbefore modified or altered.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

License authorizing the Christchurch Tramway Board to erect Electric Lines from the Tramway Trolley-wires in Sumner from Nayland Street to Holmes's Premises.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, put up, place, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued to him by the Governor in Council under that Act :

And whereas the Christchurch Tramway Board (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee" desires to erect electric lines from the tramway trolley-wires in Nayland Street, Sumner, to the premises of Hester Ann Holmes in Stoke Street, Sumner, being part Lot 37, Rural Section 2, D.P. 13, Sumner Survey District (hereinafter referred to as "the said electric lines"), and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, hereby authorize the said licensee to erect and maintain the said electric lines for house-lighting purposes, the route of such electric lines being approximately indicated by the position of the poles shown on the plan marked P.W.D. 39998, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District.

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS.

1. In this license the following words and phrases shall have the meanings hereby attached to them respectively :—

"Earthed" means connected to the general mass of earth in such a manner as to ensure at all times an immediate and safe discharge to earth of electric energy.

"Electric line" means any wire, wires, conductor, or other means used for conveying, transmitting, or distributing electricity for power, lighting, or heating purposes; and includes any instrument, insulator, casing, tubing, pipe-covering, or post enclosing or supporting an electric line, or anything connected therewith.

"Inspecting Engineer" means and includes any Inspecting Engineer appointed by the Minister to inspect the works to be constructed or maintained by virtue of electric-line licenses issued under the Public Works Act, 1908, and any or all of its amendments, or under any one or more of such amendments only, or any Act or Acts passed in amendment thereof or substitution therefor.

"Minister" means Minister of Public Works.

"Telegraph" includes telephone.

"Telegraph line" has the same meaning as "electric line" in the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, and also includes all telegraph, telephone, and electric signalling wires belonging to the Government Railways Department.

2. The conductors shall not be less than 7/20 S.W.G. hard-drawn copper wires, firmly attached to porcelain insulators, and erected on supports placed not more than 150 ft. apart. The positive conductor shall be covered throughout, and the covering may consist of vulcanized indiarubber or of triple braiding thoroughly impregnated with weatherproof compound. The negative conductor may be bare.

3. The conductors shall be carried on substantial and durable supports, which shall be designed to have a factor of safety of four in the case of steel, iron, or ferro-concrete, and five in the case of wood, calculated upon the ultimate strength of the material, assuming the wind-pressure to be 20 lb. per square foot upon a plane surface, and 12 lb. per square foot upon a diametral plane upon a cylindrical surface.

4. The conductors shall not in any part thereof be at a less height than 18 ft. from the surface of the ground.

5. A single-pole fuse cut-out shall be inserted in the positive conductor, and arranged to operate with an overload of 100 per cent. above the rated full load of the circuit. Such fuse cut-out shall be placed in a suitable locked or sealed receptacle of fireproof construction fixed at a convenient height on the pole nearest the point where the positive conductor leaves the trolley-wire or feeder. At the distributing-point of a lighting circuit there shall be inserted in the positive conductor a single-pole switch, together with a fuse arranged to operate with an overload of 50 per cent. above the rated full load of such circuit. In a motor circuit there shall be provided, in the immediate vicinity of each motor connected thereto, a double-pole switch and fuse cut-out or circuit-breaker arranged to operate with an overload of 50 per cent. above the rated full load of the motor so controlled. Each motor shall be fitted with a no-volt release and a series resistance.

6. The negative conductor shall, in a lighting circuit, be continuous throughout its length from the lamps to the tramway-rail, to which it shall be effectively bonded, and in a motor circuit from the switch terminal to the tramway-rail, to which it shall be effectively bonded.

7. At telegraph-line crossings the conductors shall pass over or under, as may be decided by the Minister of Telegraphs. In every crossing-span the maximum tension in any conductor shall not exceed one-half the elastic limit of the conductor under the conditions of a minimum temperature of 12° F. and wind-pressure as specified in clause 3 occurring simultaneously. Efficiently earthed guard-wires, to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs, shall be erected where such protection may be considered necessary by the Minister of Telegraphs, and earth-wires where led down poles shall be protected by a casing for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground. Guard-wires shall be carried on substantial supports at a height of 2 ft. above the said electric lines if the telegraph lines pass over the said electric lines, or 2 ft. above the telegraph lines if they pass under the said electric lines. In addition to the above precautions, telegraph lines shall be suitably insulated if deemed necessary by the Minister of Telegraphs. The cost of all necessary guard-wires and special provisions required to comply with this clause, or deemed to be necessary as a protection to telegraph lines generally, shall be borne by the licensee when the telegraph lines are erected before the said electric lines. In cases where the said electric lines are erected before the telegraph lines, the licensee, on receipt of notice from the district Telegraph Engineer of the Post and Telegraph Department, or his deputy, that it is proposed to run a telegraph line along the route, shall forthwith make the necessary changes required to comply with this clause at any points at which the said electric lines already cross such routes, the cost of such changes being borne by the Post and Telegraph Department.

8. No work of any nature shall be erected or constructed upon, over, or under any part of the New Zealand Government Railways until the licensee has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto, as required by section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2).

9. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of July, 1916, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of October, 1916.

10. The licensee shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister at least seven days' notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

11. The licensee shall not use the said electric lines, or permit the same to be used, until the Minister has given notice in writing to the licensee that he has received from the Inspecting Engineer a certificate that the work hereby authorized has been satisfactorily carried out.

12. The said electric lines shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained by the licensee as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions, and shall not be permitted by the licensee to remain erected after they have ceased to be used for the supply of electricity.

13. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the licensee without the expressed consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferee is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

14. The Minister may at any time order an inspection to be made of the said electric lines. If any defect is found to exist it must be remedied forthwith; and if, in the opinion of the officer or person inspecting, such defect is serious the Minister may, on receipt of the report, direct the licensee to at once cease transmitting energy either over the whole of the said electric lines or over any specified part thereof until such defect is repaired or remedied. In default of the licensee remedying the defect or ceasing to transmit energy the licensee shall be liable to a penalty of £20 for each day during which the defect remains if energy is transmitted, such penalty to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown. The cost of such inspection shall be borne by the licensee.

15. If the licensee fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the licensee within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice; and if the licensee fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period, the licensee shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown.

16. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the licensee fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

17. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the licensee, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the said works.

18. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or abridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf, authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works; nor shall any compensation be payable to or on behalf of the licensee for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public works as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

19. The regulations made under section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated 29th day of April, 1915, shall not apply to this license.

20. This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, place, put up, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued by the Governor in Council under that Act :

And whereas the Heathcote County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect electric lines within the area of supply as defined in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter called "the area of supply," and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and hereinafter referred to as "the regulations," hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes within the area of supply hereinafter described.

SCHEDULE.

1. AREA OF SUPPLY.

THE area of supply comprises—

(1.) The Bromley Riding of the Heathcote County, bounded on the south-west by the Canal Reserve, on the south-east and north-east by the Avon River from the Canal Reserve to Page's Road, thence on the north-west by portion of Page's Road, thence on the north-east by portion of Wai-iti Street and portion of Bexley's Road and the Avon River to a point about seven chains north-west of the northern end of Eureka Road, thence on the north-west by a line from the last-mentioned point to a point on the north-eastern boundary of R.S. 4636 about eight chains and a half north-west of the southern end of Eureka Road, thence on the south-west by portion of the north-eastern boundary of R.S. 4636, thence on the north-west by the south-eastern boundaries of Rural Sections 4636, 4622, 28598, 8776, 4533, 326, and the road on the north-western boundary of R.S. 1144 to point of commencement on the Canal Reserve.

As the said ridings are more particularly delineated on the plans marked P.W.D. 39245 and 39633, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, Wellington, in the Provincial District of Wellington, and thereon bordered green and red respectively.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (c) of clause 2 of the regulations.

Electrical energy shall be obtained from the Public Works Department's substation in Heathcote Valley, and from such other substation or substations as may be agreed upon.

3. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 12 degrees Fahrenheit.

4. NOTICES re EXTENSIONS, ETC.

Records of results of tests (Regulation 37), and notices re commencement of work (Regulation 44) and re extensions and alterations (Regulation 49), should be sent to the Under-Secretary, Public Works Department, Wellington, and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at Christchurch.

5. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 6d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 3d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-third day of May, one thousand nine hundred and six, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 41, of the thirty-first day of the same month, the Waitemata County Council, of Auckland (hereinafter called "the Council"), was licensed to use and occupy a port of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Takapuna, Auckland, as shown on plan marked M.D. 2952 (in duplicate), and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in order to erect thereon a wharf, as shown on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for a term of fourteen years, computed from the twenty-third day of May, one thousand nine hundred and six:

And whereas it is considered expedient to prescribe dues and rates to be charged and taken for the use of the said wharf:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the Harbours Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Schedule hereto shall, on and after the twentieth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, be charged and taken by the Council for the use of the said wharf.

SCHEDULE.

PASSENGER WHARFAGE.

1. FOR every passenger landed on the said wharf by means of a boat or other tender from any vessel lying away from such wharf the sum of 2d. shall be paid, and the owner of the vessel from which the passenger is landed shall pay such charge to the Council immediately on the landing of such passenger.

2. The master of any such vessel landing passengers as aforesaid shall furnish to the Council a certified statement of the number of passengers so landed.

SHIPPING WHARFAGE.

For every vessel the sum of 1d. per ton on the gross tonnage of such vessel per day or part of a day the vessel shall occupy

a berth alongside the wharf or alongside of any other vessel using the wharf, or shall lie off the said wharf with a line attached thereto, shall be paid.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the Public Works Act, 1908, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke such portion of the Order in Council dated the twelfth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-second day of the same month, as refers to the portion of road described in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby order and declare that the said portion of road, shall on and after the date of this Order in Council, become a county road.

Regulations as to the Cook Islands Public Service.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this fifth day of June, 1916.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by section sixteen of the Cook Islands Act, 1915, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations with respect to the Cook Islands Public Service; and doth hereby declare that the said regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

Expenses of Removal of Officers.

1. (1.) EXCEPT as otherwise provided in these regulations, officers proceeding to the Cook Islands from New Zealand on appointment to the Cook Islands Public Service, officers returning to New Zealand on the termination of their appointment to the Cook Islands Public Service, and officers on transfer from one island of the Cook Islands to another shall be entitled to receive a refund of the reasonable locomotion expenses actually incurred by them in respect of the conveyance of themselves and their families, and also in respect of the removal of necessary household furniture and effects :

Provided that the sum payable to any officer under this regulation in respect of the removal of furniture shall not exceed such sum as the Minister, in the case of officers proceeding from or returning to New Zealand, or the Resident Commissioner in the case of officers on transfer within the Cook Islands, deems reasonable, taking into consideration the furniture provided by the Crown for the equipment of officers' quarters.

(2.) All claims for the refund of expenses under this regulation shall be supported by receipted vouchers in respect of all items of expenditure in excess of 5s.

2. In lieu of a refund of the actual cost of removal as aforesaid, the Minister or the Resident Commissioner, as the case may be, may in any case authorize the payment to the officer of a lump sum towards the expenses of the removal of his furniture and effects not exceeding such amount as the Minister or the Commissioner deems reasonable.

3. In no case shall any payment under the preceding regulations be made in respect of the expenses of the removal by an officer of any of the following effects, namely :—

Dog-kennels.

Plants in boxes or pots.

Wood or coal.

Horses, vehicles, or harness (except when such are portion of equipment in connection with official work).

Live-stock of any description.

Clothes-props, garden-seats, timber, or material connected with outside structures.

Aviaries and bee-hives.

Boats.

4. All moneys payable pursuant to the foregoing regulations shall be paid out of the Cook Islands Treasury.

5. (1.) In order to avoid, so far as practicable, the recurrence of freight charges on furniture in case of the transfer of officers, where officers' quarters are provided they shall be equipped with such articles of furniture as in the opinion of the Resident Commissioner are necessary for the comfort and convenience of the officers occupying the same.

(2.) For the purposes of this regulation the term "furniture" shall not be deemed to include bedding or bed-linen, crockeryware, glassware, cutlery, kitchenware, or cooking utensils.

6. Except with the express approval of the Resident Commissioner or of the Minister, no payment under the foregoing regulations shall be made to—

- (a.) Officers who are transferred from one locality to another at their own request; or
- (b.) Officers who are transferred on account of misconduct; or
- (c.) Officers returning to New Zealand on the termination of their appointment, if such appointment has been terminated before the expiration of such period (if any) as may have been agreed on between the officer and the Minister as the minimum period of the duration of such appointment.

Travelling-expenses and Travelling-allowances.

7. (1.) While travelling on the public service officers shall, in addition to a refund of actual and reasonable locomotion expenses, receive from the Cook Island Treasury travelling-allowances at the following rates:—

- (a.) Officers in receipt of salaries of not less than £250 per annum,—

For every night during which the officer is absent from his headquarters	s. d.

Provided that while at sea the allowance for the first night of absence from headquarters shall be	5 0
For each subsequent night, the allowance shall be	3 6
Provided further that where officers sleep on shore but have their meals supplied on or from a vessel, the allowance for each night on shore shall be	3 6
- (b.) Officers in receipt of salaries of less than £250 per annum,—

(2.) Nothing in this regulation shall preclude the Minister or the Resident Commissioner from authorizing the payment in special cases of travelling-allowances in excess of the rates herein provided.

8. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding regulation, officers of the Cook Islands Public Service while travelling on the public service in or to New Zealand shall, with the approval of the Minister, receive travelling-allowances at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rates for the time being in force with respect to officers of the New Zealand Public Service.

House Allowance.

9. In any case where an officer is not provided with a residence or other official quarters the Minister may, in lieu thereof, authorize the payment to such officer of a house allowance at a rate not exceeding £40 per annum.

Leave of Absence.

10. Officers who desire leave of absence must make application therefor to the Resident Commissioner, who may grant or refuse such leave in accordance with the directions of the Minister. The directions of the Minister as to leave of absence may be communicated to the Resident Commissioner either generally from time to time, or may be given particularly in respect of any application for leave of absence.

11. No leave on account of illness shall be granted with pay to any officer if his illness has been caused by his misconduct.

Holidays.

12. The following days, or an equal number of days to be authorized by the Resident Commissioner in lieu thereof, shall be observed as holidays, if, in the opinion of the Commissioner, no inconvenience to the public will be occasioned by the observance thereof, namely:—

- 25th, 26th, and 27th December.
- 1st and 2nd January.
- Good Friday to Easter Monday (inclusive).
- 17th March (St. Patrick's Day).
- 23rd April (St. George's Day).
- 30th November (St. Andrew's Day).
- 3rd June (King's Birthday).
- 8th October (except in Mangaia) } Proclamation Day.
- 9th October in Mangaia }

*Qualifications of Officers.**(a.) Medical Examination.*

13. Before any person, not being resident in the Cook Islands, is appointed to any position in the Cook Islands Public Service he shall be required to produce to the Minister a medical certificate, in an approved form, certifying as to the health of the applicant and as to his fitness to reside in the Cook Islands.

(b.) British Subjects.

14. No person who is not a British subject shall be appointed to or shall continue in the Cook Islands Public Service.

Employment outside the Public Service.

15. Except with the express permission in writing of the Minister (which permission may at any time be withdrawn), no officer of the Cook Islands Public Service shall—

- (a.) Accept or continue to hold or discharge the duties of, or be employed in, any paid office in connection with any banking, insurance, mining, mercantile, or other commercial business, whether the same is carried on by any corporation, company, or firm, or by an individual; or
- (b.) Engage in or undertake any such business, whether as principal or agent; or
- (c.) Engage in or continue in the private practice of any profession or trade.

Communications.

16. All official communications addressed to the Minister by any officer of the Public Service shall be transmitted to the Minister through the Resident Commissioner.

Discipline.

17. (1.) If any officer of the Cook Islands Public Service commits a breach of any of these regulations, or is guilty of any act of insubordination or negligence in connection with the duties of his office, or uses intoxicating liquor to excess so as to detrimentally affect the performance of the duties incident to his office, or is otherwise guilty of any misconduct in relation to his position in the said service, he may be fined such amount, not exceeding ten pounds, as the Resident Commissioner with the approval of the Minister thinks proper.

(2.) Every fine imposed by the Resident Commissioner pursuant to this regulation may be deducted from any salary then due and payable, or thereafter becoming due and payable, to the officer, and shall be paid by the Commissioner into the Cook Islands Treasury.

(3.) A record of all fines imposed under this regulation, under the hand of the Resident Commissioner, shall from time to time be transmitted to the Minister.

(4.) Any fine imposed under this regulation may be remitted by the Resident Commissioner with the approval of the Minister.

Miscellaneous.

18. All requisitions for supplies shall be forwarded in duplicate to the Resident Commissioner.

19. Returns of public property in the charge or under the control of officers shall be furnished to the Resident Commissioner as soon as possible after the 31st day of December in each year. When articles become worn out or otherwise useless, application for authority to write off such articles must be made to the Resident Commissioner.

20. Officers shall forthwith report to the Resident Commissioner any damage to public buildings, or loss of public property, and as to any necessary repairs.

21. No information out of the strict course of official duty shall be given, directly or indirectly, or otherwise used by any officer without the express direction or permission of the Resident Commissioner.

22. Officers are required to acquaint themselves with the Cook Islands Act, 1915, and all regulations for the time being in force thereunder.

Regulations as to Leases for the Toheroa-bearing Areas in the South Island.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this fifth day of June, 1916.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by the fifth section of the Fisheries Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that the Governor may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations which shall have force and effect either throughout New Zealand or only in such waters or places as are specified in the regulations for, *inter alia*, imposing conditions and restrictions on the taking of fish:

And whereas it is desirable to make regulations imposing conditions and restrictions on the taking of the shell-fish known as toheroa, in the South Island:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section five of the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby make the following regulations imposing conditions and restrictions on the taking of toheroa from places in the South Island of New Zealand; and do hereby declare that the said regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person, firm, or company shall take toheroa, for the purpose of canning the same or for marketing fresh, without a lease in writing under the hand of the Minister of Marine (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister"), and subject to the regulations hereinafter specified.

2. Persons wishing to obtain a lease of any toheroa bed shall make application in writing to the Collector at the nearest port, giving a clear description of the locality, and the extent and boundaries of the area for which the application is made.

3. On receipt of an application for a toheroa lease by the Collector, a notification that such an application has been received shall be advertised in a newspaper circulating in the district, and if no other application is received, the Minister may, on the report of the said Collector, grant such lease.

4. Should there be more than one application for the same area, a ballot shall be taken and the lease shall be granted to the successful applicant: Provided that preference shall be given to an applicant who may be deemed to have been the first to discover, or bring under the notice of the Department, the existence of toheroa beds of commercial value in any locality; and the Minister may, if he thinks fit, grant a lease to such applicant without advertising or ballot.

5. No person, firm, or company shall be granted a lease for more than one area.

6. The lessee shall have the exclusive right to take toheroa for canning purposes, or for marketing fresh, from the area included in his lease.

7. If within one year from the date of the lease the lessee has failed to make reasonable use of the toheroa on his lease either by canning or by placing them on the market fresh, the Minister may, on the report of an Inspector of Fisheries, cancel such lease.

8. The Minister may, as considered necessary, set apart areas in any district from which toheroa may be taken by the public for private use, and also areas for the exclusive use of the Maoris for their food.

9. The lease shall remain in force for a period of ten years from the date thereof, unless in the meantime such lease is cancelled as hereinafter provided, and the lessee shall not dispose of, assign, or change his interest in the lease without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The lessee shall pay in respect of the lease held by him an annual rental of £5 in advance, dating from the date of the lease.

11. The working of the area in respect of which the lease is granted shall be under the control of an Inspector of Fisheries, who shall have power to regulate the quantity of toheroa that may be taken, in order to prevent the beds or area being depleted or injuriously affected.

12. In case the lessee shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of these regulations or any of them;

(2.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 10 of these regulations;

C

(3.) Take toheroa from any area other than that in respect of which his lease is issued, without the previous consent of the Minister; or

(4.) Work the beds in such a way that they become depleted or injuriously affected,—

then and in any of the said cases the Minister may cancel the said lease on giving written notice to the lessee; and upon such cancellation the lessee shall forthwith remove all buildings and structures from the area in respect of which the lease was issued.

Amendment to Regulations under the Nurses Registration Act.

LIVERPOOL, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers and authority conferred upon me by section eleven of the Nurses Registration Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations in respect of hospitals acting as training schools for nurses.

REGULATIONS.

In addition to the conditions under which a general hospital shall be eligible for recognition as a training school for nurses, as set forth in the regulations made on the 12th day of May, 1913, the following conditions must be fulfilled:—

(1.) Additional to clause 1 of regulations, "and shall be approved by the Registrar of Nurses."

(2.) Before being accepted by the training school for the full course, pupil nurses shall serve a term of probation of at least three months, and at the end of that period shall be recommended as suitable for training by the matron.

(3.) The proposed termination of the training of a pupil nurse during the prescribed period shall, with the cause thereof, be notified to the Registrar of Nurses, whose consent to such termination shall be required.

Notice of Intention to change the Purpose of Portion of a Reserve in the Christchurch and Rolleston Survey Districts, Canterbury Land District.

WHEREAS by the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908, it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor may declare his intention to change, exchange, or alter the dedication of any public reserve now or hereafter vested in His Majesty or the Governor for any of the purposes named in Class II of the Second Schedule to the said Act, whether the same be granted or not; and in the case of any reserve made under the authority of section three hundred and twenty-one of the Land Act, 1908, if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to change the purpose for which such reserve was set apart to any other purpose, or if it shall, in the opinion of the Governor, be expedient to exchange any of the land comprised in such reserve for other land of equal value, to be dedicated to one or more of the purposes named in the said Class II, the Governor may, by notice gazetted, make such change, exchange, or dedication, as the case may be, and in such notice declare the manner and terms in which the same is intended to be so made:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908, aforesaid, declare my intention to change the specific purpose of the portion of the reserve described in Part II of the Schedule hereto from that named in Part I of the said Schedule to that named in Part III of the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Description and Purpose of Original Reserve.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District, containing by admeasurement 912 acres, more or less, and being Re-

serve 702, situated in Blocks IX, Christchurch, and XII, Rolleston Survey Districts, and bounded as follows: On the north-west by Bealey's Road; on the north-east generally by Sections 2919, 2603, 2552, 2342, and 2343; on the south-east by Haskett's Road; and on the south-west generally by Section 4069, Barter's Road, Sections 4364, 4910, Rifle Butt Road, and Sections 4911 and 6099: excluding thereout Reserves 325 and 326, Section 8005, and those portions of Barter's Road and Rifle Butt Road intersecting the above-described area. As the same is delineated on the plan marked L. and S. 6/1/6c, deposited in the Head Office, Department of Lands and Survey, at Wellington, and thereon coloured with a red margin.

Deaths occurring at hospitals, of persons not residents of the borough wherein the hospital is situated, have been allotted in each case to the borough where the disease was contracted, and not to that in which the death actually took place.

The inclusion of the suburban boroughs lowers the death-rate at Auckland, Wellington, and Dunedin, the Christchurch death-rate being unaffected.

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 629, against 579 in April—an increase of 50. The deaths in May were 272—an increase of 16 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 152, females 120. Fifty-six of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 20.59 per cent. of the whole number; 42 of these were under one year of age.

There were 92 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 92 in April. The following table shows the classification:—

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity) :-

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
