1. Should the slip be required for a longer period than forty-eight hours, special application must be made to the Akaroa County Council, when an extension of time will be granted, provided the slip is not required for another boat.

2. The Council may demand that any boat at the slip shall vacate it at any time in case of emergency, such as another boat or launch requiring immediate attention owing to an accident. The County Council, or the officer appointed by it to be in charge of the slip, to be the sole judge as to the recessity. necessity.

necessity.

3. The axle-bearings of the carriage of the slip are to be oiled each time before being run down, and the wire rope is to be kept greased or oiled on that part which runs in the water, such greasing or oiling to be done by the boat or launch owner without charge to the County Council.

4. When boats are launched after using the slip, the carriage must be hauled up at once to the top of the slipway and secured by the user, unless it is required to take another boat on the same tide. The winch is to be padlocked and the key returned to the place appointed by the County Council.

5. Boat and launch owners will be granted the use of the slip in the order of application, and must use it on the date appointed; failing their doing so the next on the list will be

appointed; failing their doing so the next on the list will be allowed first use of it.

6. If any person fails, or refuses, or neglects to do anything required by these regulations, or in any manner obstructs, impedes, or interfers with the doing of anything enjoined or authorized to be done by these regulations, he shall in every ease so offending be liable to a fine not exceeding £20.

"Minister" means Minister of Public Works.

"Telegraph" includes telephone.

"Telegraph line" has the same meaning as "electric line" in the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908, and also includes all telegraph, telephone, and electric signalling wires belonging to the Government Railways Department.

2. The conductors shall not be less than 7/20 S.W.G. hard drawn wires, firmly attached to porcelain insulators, and erected on supports placed not more than 150 ft. apart. The positive conductor shall be covered throughout, and the covering may consist of vulcanized indiarubber or of triple braiding thoroughly impregnated with weatherproof com-pound. The negative conductor may be bare.

3. The conductors shall be carried on substantial and durable supports, which shall be designed to have a factor of safety of four in the case of steel, iron, or ferro-concrete, and five in the case of wood, calculated upon the ultimate strength of the material, assuming the wind-pressure to be 20 lb. per square foot upon a plane surface, and 12 lb. per square foot upon a diametral plane upon a cylindrical surface.

4. The conductors shall not in any part thereof be at a less height than 18 ft. from the surface of the ground.

height than 18 ft. from the surface of the ground.

5. A single-pole fuse cut-out shall be inserted in the positive conductor, and arranged to operate with an overload of 100 per cent. above the rated full load of the circuit. Such fuse out-out shall be placed in a suitable locked or sealed receptacle of fireproof construction fixed at a convenient height on the pole nearest the point where the positive conductor leaves the trolly-wire or feeder. At the distributing-point of a lighting circuit there shall be inserted in the positive conductor a single-pole switch, together with a fuse arranged to operate with an overload of 50 per cent. above the rated full load of such circuit. In a motor circuit there shall be provided, in the immediate vicinity of each motor connected vided, in the immediate vicinity of each motor connected thereto, a double-pole switch and fuse cut-out or circuit-breaker arranged to operate with an overload of 50 per cent. above the rated full load of the motor so controlled. Each motor shall be fitted with a no-volt release and a series re-

6. The negative conductor shall, in a lighting circuit, be continuous throughout its length from the lamps to the tramway-rail, to which it shall be effectively bonded, and in a motor circuit from the switch terminal to the tramway-rail, to which it shall be effectively bonded.

7. At telegraph-line crossings the conductors shall pass over or under, as may be decided by the Minister of Telegraphs. In every crossing-span the maximum tension in any conductor shall not exceed one-half the elastic limit of the conductor under the conditions of a minimum temperature of 12° F, and wind-pressure as specified in clause 3 occurring simultaneously. Efficiently earthed guard-wires, to the satisfaction of the Winister of Televisian and the satisfaction of the satisfacti taneously. Efficiently earthed guard-wires, to the satisfaction of the Minister of Telegraphs, shall be erected where such protection may be considered necessary by the Minister of Telegraphs, and earth-wires where led down poles shall be protected by a casing for a distance of 8 ft. from the ground. Guard-wires shall be carried on substantial supports at a height of 2 ft. above the said electric lines if the telegraph lines pass over the said electric lines, or 2 ft. above the telegraph lines if they pass under the said electric lines. In addition lines if they pass under the said electric lines. In addition to the above precautions, telegraph lines shall be suitably insulated if deemed necessary by the Minister of Telegraphs. The cost of all necessary guard-wires and special provisions required to comply with this clause, or deemed to be necessary as a protection to telegraph lines generally, shall be borne by the licensee when the telegraph lines are erected before the said electric lines. In cases where the said electric lines are erected before the telegraph lines, the

licensee, on receipt of notice from the District Telegraph Engineer of the Post and Telegraph Department, or his deputy, gineer of the Post and Telegraph Department, or his deputy, that it is proposed to run a telegraph line along the route, shall forthwith make the necessary changes required to comply with this clause at any points at which the said electric lines already cross such routes, the cost of such changes being borne by the Post and Telegraph Department.

8. No work of any nature shall be erected or constructed upon, over, or under any part of the New Zealand Government Railways until the licensee has obtained the consent of the Minister of Railways thereto as required by section of

the Minister of Railways thereto, as required by section 4 of the Government Railways Amendment Act, 1910 (No. 2).

9. The construction of the works hereby authorized shall be substantially commenced on or before the 1st day of August, 1916, and shall be completed on or before the 1st day of October, 1916.

10. The licensee shall, prior to the completion of the said works, give to the Minister at least seven days' notice in writing of the estimated date of such completion.

11. The licensee shall not use the said electric lines, or permit the same to be used, until the Minister has given notice in writing to the licensee that he has received from the Inspecting Engineer a certificate that the work hereby authorized

specting Engineer a certificate that the work hereby authorized has been satisfactorily carried out.

12. The said electric lines shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained by the licensee as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions, and shall not be permitted by the licensee to remain erected after they have ceased to be used for the supply of electricity.

13. This license, and the benefits and obligations hereunder, shall not be assigned by the licensee without the expressed consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained.

consent in writing of the Minister first had and obtained; but such consent shall not be withheld if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that the transferce is financially and otherwise able to carry out the obligations specified in this license.

14. The Minister may at any time order an inspection to be made of the said electric lines. If any defect is found to exist it must be remedied forthwith; and if, in the opinion of the officer or person inspecting, such default is serious the of the officer or person inspecting, such default is serious the Minister may, on receipt of the report, direct the licensee to at once cease transmitting energy either over the whole of the said electric lines or over any specified part thereof until such defect is repaired or remedied. In default of the licensee remedying the defect or ceasing to transmit energy the licensee shall be liable to a penalty of £20 for each day during which the defect remains if energy is transmitted, such penalty to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown. The cost of such inspection shall be horse by to the Crown. The cost of such inspection shall be borne by the licensee.

15. If the licensee fails to comply with any of the con-15. If the ficensee fails to comply with any of the conditions of this license the Minister may, by notice in writing, require the licensee within thirty days to remedy the default specified in that notice; and if the licensee fails to comply with the terms of the notice within the said period, the licensee shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, to be recoverable by or on behalf of the Minister as a debt due to the Crown

16. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of these conditions, if the licensee fails to comply with the terms of any such notice for ninety days after the receipt thereof, the Governor in Council may thereupon revoke this license without further notice.

17. For the purpose of ascertaining whether the conditions of this license are being faithfully complied with by the licensee, the Minister, or any person appointed by him in that behalf, may at all reasonable times enter on the lands and works and inspect the said works.

18. Nothing in this license shall be desired in a second to the said works.

18. Nothing in this license shall be deemed in any way to interfere with, affect, or a bridge any rights or powers vested in His Majesty the King, or in the Governor on his behalf authorizing the construction, management, or working of any public works; nor shall any compensation be payable to or on behalf of the licensee for injury done to the works herein authorized by the construction, management, or working of any such public works as aforesaid, or for the loss occasioned thereby, or for the exercise of any such right or power as aforesaid.

19. The regulations made under section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and published in the New Zealand Gazette dated 29th day of April, 1915, shall not apply to this license.

20. This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. N pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Cook Islands Act, 1915, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purpose of preventing the growth and spread of noxious weeds in the Cook Islands; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall come into force on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. In these regulations, if not inconsistent with the context,
 - and all references thereto, mean cutting down and keeping cut down, or grubbing or pulling up, the stem or root of any noxious weed so as to prevent any part thereof
 - flowering:
 "Inspector" means any Inspector duly appointed for the purpose, inter alia, of ensuring compliance with these regulations:
 - "Noxious weeds" means the plants mentioned in the First
 - Schedule hereto:
 "Noxious seeds" means the seeds or spores of the plants mentioned or included in the Second Schedule hereto
 - "Occupier" means every person in occupation of land, and includes the owner of any land which is unoccupied or of which the occupier is unknown or cannot be found; and includes any agent, trustee, executor, or administrator of the occupier or owner.
- 2. Nothing in these regulations shall apply to or be in force in the Island of Niue
- 3. Where land abuts on a road or is intersected by a road, the boundaries of the land on each side of the road shall, for the purposes of these regulations, be deemed to extend to the centre of the road, and the occupier of the land shall accordingly be deemed to be the occupier of so much of the road as is within such extended boundaries.
- 4. Every person commits an offence against these regulations who knowingly sows, sells, or offers for sale-
 - (a.) Any noxious seeds;
 - (b.) Any grass-seed, or other seed or grain, which has not been thoroughly dressed by means of a seed-cleaning machine, or other sufficient process for the purpose of removing all noxious seeds.
- 5. Every occupier of land shall in every year commence and continuously thereafter do all things necessary to effectually clear the same of noxious weeds.
- 6. (1.) An Inspector may at all reasonable times enter upon any land, whether enclosed or not, for the purpose of ascertaining if the provisions of clause 5 of these regulations are being complied with by the occupier.
- (2.) In any case where default is made by the occupier in complying with the provisions of clause 5 of these regulations the Inspector may, by notice to the occupier in the form in the Third Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, specify the matters as to which default has been made, and request him to do the necessary work within the period specified in the notice; and it shall be the duty of the occupier so to do. Any notice under this regulation may be served either by delivering the same personally to the person upon whom the same is to be served, or by leaving the same or by posting the same addressed to him at his usual or last known place of abode, or by affixing the same in some conspicuous place on the land to which the notice relates.

(3.) If the occupier fails or neglects to duly comply with such notice he commits an offence under these regulations, and the Inspector may enter upon the said land and do the necessary work at the expense in all things of the occupier. But nothing herein shall relieve the occupier from any penalty he may have incurred or become liable to by reason of his default, failure, or neglect.

(4.) The amount of expenses incurred by the Inspector under this regulation shall be recoverable from the occupier by the In-

spector by action in the High Court of the Cook Islands.

- 7. In the case of land the title to which has not been individualized and partitioned, the Resident Commissioner shall cause the land to be cleared as provided by clause 5 hereof if the occupier fails or neglects so to do to the satisfaction of an Inspector; and the Resident Commissioner may register in the Native Land Court of the Cook Islands a memorandum under his hand setting forth the amount paid by him for the clearing of such land, and such memorandum shall operate as a charge against the said land, and thereafter no alienation thereof, whether by way of sale, lease, mortgage, or otherwise, shall
- have any validity unless and until such charge is satisfied.

 8. All lands included in any public reserve shall from time to time be cleared under the authority of the Resident Commissioner.

9. Every person who commits an offence against these regulations

shall be liable to a penalty of £5.

10. Every person commits an offence who obstructs or hinders any Inspector or any other person in the exercise of any power or function conferred on him by these regulations.

11. All fines recovered under these regulations shall be paid into the Cook Islands Treasury.

CAPTAIN Badger, of the steamer "Col. E. L. Drake," reports observing a break 1½ miles 230° 30' from Tatoosh Island Lighthouse on 20th April, 1916. At the time there was a heavy westerly swell, which was not topping, and the break was observed to occur regularly every four or five minutes. It was observed simultaneously by the operator at Tatoosh Island Lighthouse, who also took a bearing which very closely approximates that given above.

Captain Badger is of the opinion that the break was caused by a pinnacle rock not shown on the charts.





Te Makarini Scholarships tenable at Te Aute College, Hawke's Bay.

THREE scholarships of the yearly value of £35, tenable for two years, are offered for competition in the year 1916. One of these scholarships, to be called the Senior

Makarini Scholarship, is open to all Maori boys under sixteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination. The other two scholarships, to be called the Junior Makarini Scholarships, are open to Maori boys under fourteen years of age at the end of the month preceding the date of the examination. One of the junior scholarships is reserved for competition amongst candidates from Native village schools only, the other is open to Maori boys attending any public or Native school in the Dominion. The scholarships are open to Maori boys on the conditions set forth in the regulations of the Trustees of the Te Makarini Scholarships Fund, as printed in the Appendix to the Regulations relating to Native Schools, except that for the Junior Scholarship the age limit is now fourteen years, and that for the senior examination the work required is that of Standard VI instead of Standard V. The examination will be held at convenient centres on the 4th and 5th of December,

Candidates must, either directly or through their teachers, send notice to the Inspector of Native Schools, Education Department, Wellington, of their intention to present themselves for examination. Such notice must be posted so as to reach the Department not later than the 30th of September, 1916.

Copies of the regulations and forms of notice may be obtained from teachers of Native schools and boarding institutions, the Secretaries to Education Boards, or the Director of Education, Wellington.

The Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak. learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
