WHEREAS it is provided by section thirty of the Public Works Act, 1908, that if it is found that any land held, taken, purchased, or acquired at any time under this or any other Act or Provincial Ordinance, or otherwise howsoever, for any public work is not required for such public work the Governor may, by an Order in Council publicly notified and gazetted, cause the same to be sold under the conditions therein mentioned:

And whereas it is further provided by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, that in the case of any land so taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work and not required for that purpose the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without complying with any other requirements of the aforesaid section thirty, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

*Amending Regulations under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908.*

LIVERPOOL, Governor.  
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this ninth day of August, 1916.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend the regulations under the said Act dated the fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and published in the *Gazette* of the thirteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare that the amendments hereby made shall take effect as from the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

THE regulations hereinbefore referred to are hereby amended as follows:—

(1.) The following new regulation is hereby inserted after Regulation 10:—

"10A. Every industrial agreement, and every duplicate original and copy thereof filed with the Clerk of Awards, shall be signed at the foot of each page by at least one representative on behalf of the employers and one representative on behalf of the industrial union or industrial association of workers party to the agreement."

(2.) The following new regulation is hereby inserted after Regulation 14:—

"14A. Every application made by an industrial union or association under Regulation 14 shall be accompanied by a copy of the rules of the industrial union or association, and (in the case of an industrial association) by a copy of the rules of each affiliated industrial union affected by the dispute."

(3.) Regulation 17 is hereby amended by adding thereto the words "and a copy of the citation shall be transmitted by the Commissioner to the Clerk of Awards."

(4.) Regulation 30 is hereby revoked, and the following regulation is substituted therefor:—

In the case of a transfer of any surveyed portion of any surveyed claim the following course shall be pursued: The Registrar shall, as provided in the regulations, register such transfer, and shall cancel the plan on the special-claim license as to the transferred portion of such claim, and shall issue a new license for such transferred



portion (the cost of putting plans thereon to be paid by the transferor), and shall also deliver to the transferor the license for the untransferred balance.

And that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the first day of October in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of thirty-six and a half years, or until the loan is fully paid off.

That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £3,100, authorized to be raised by the Cook County Council, under the above-mentioned Act, for constructing a new line of road from Tuawhata Block to Section 65, Paremata, on the main East Coast Road, and erecting a cart-bridge across the Mangaheia at Wigan Settlement, the said Cook County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-twelfth of a penny in the £1 upon the rateable value of all rateable property of the Tolaga Riding Special-rating District, comprising the Tolaga Riding of the County of Cook as defined in *Gazette*, 12th October, 1911, page 3027; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable yearly on the first day of July in each and every year during a period equal to the currency of such loan, being a period of thirty-six and a half years, or until the loan is fully paid off. The rate of interest to be five and a quarter per cent.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Hutt Road Act, 1915, it is provided that towards the cost of forming and constructing the Hutt Road there shall be payable by each of the local authorities mentioned in the First Schedule thereto the sum set opposite the name of the local authority in the said Schedule: And whereas the Eastbourne Borough Council is one of the local authorities so mentioned: And whereas the same Act authorizes the issue by each of the local authorities of debentures for the amount payable by it as aforesaid: And whereas it is provided that for the purpose of paying the interest and sinking fund in respect of debentures so issued the local authority shall make and levy a special rate on all rateable property within its district:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Hutt Road Act, 1915, the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, and the amendments thereto, and all other Acts and powers (if any) enabling it in that behalf, the Eastbourne Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:—

That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of three hundred pounds (£300), authorized to be raised by the Eastbourne Borough Council, under the above-mentioned Acts, for the purpose of providing its share of the cost of the construction of the Hutt Road as set out in the First Schedule to the Hutt Road Act, 1915, the said Eastbourne Borough Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of three-eighths of one penny in the pound upon the rateable value of all rateable property in the district, comprising the whole of the Borough of Eastbourne; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan, and be payable half-yearly on the last days of September and March in each year during the currency of such loan, being a period of fifty years, or until the loan is fully paid off.
