WHEREAS the lands described in the first column of the Schedule hereto were by warrants, the dates of which are specified in the second column of the said Schedule and the notifications of which were published in the Gazettes specified in the third column, permanently set apart as reserves for scenic purposes under the provisions of the Land Act, 1892: And whereas it is expedient that the said lands should be declared reserves under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908: Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by section twelve of the Scenery Preservation Amendment Act, 1910, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall, from and after the date hereof, be scenic reserves under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and its amendments.

Altering Boundaries of Whangaroa and Hokianga Counties.

LIVERPOOL, Governor. [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection two of section three of the Counties Amendment Act, 1913, that the boundaries of any one or more counties may be altered in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Council of each of such counties in which the principal Act is in force :

Act is in force: And whereas a resolution was passed by the Whangaroa County Council on the tenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and sealed with the seal of the Council of the said county: And whereas a similar resolution was passed by the Hokianga County Council on the twentieth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and sealed with the seal of the said county, praying for the in-clusion in the Whangaroa County of that part of the Hoki-anga County described in the said resolutions and in the anga County described in the said resolutions and in the First Schedule hereto; And whereas it is expedient to make such alteration in accordance with the said resolutions :

such alteration in accordance with the said resolutions: Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Act, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Do-minion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the Hokianga County, shall, as from the date of the publication hereof in the New Zealand Gazette, be deemed to be added to and form part of the Whangaroa County; and, with the like power and authority, do proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Counties of Hokianga and Wha-ngaroa respectively shall as from the aforesaid date be those set forth under their respective headings in the Second Scheet forth under their respective headings in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA TO BE ADDED TO WHANGAROA COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a ALL that area in the Auckland Land Listnet bounded by a line along the north-eastern and eastern boundaries of Pupuke Parish from the Wainui Stream to the Mangakino Stream; thence along the Mangakino and Whakateterekia Streams to the road at the southernmost corner of Section 58, Pupuke Parish, across the road, along the western boundaries of Sections 58 and 57, and across a road to the boundary be-tween Kauri-Putete Block and forest reserve; thence along that boundary to the southernmost corner of the said Kauri-Putete Block, along the south-western, western, and northern boundaries of that block to the Wainui Stream, and along that stream to the north-eastern boundary of the Pupuke Parish, the place of commencement.

Station No. 18 on Tarai-o-Rahiri to Trig. Station No. 43 on Tutamoe; thence towards the south-east by the said right line to Trig. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free. By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to con-tinue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed. The following classes of deaf children are admitted to

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a

- 1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
 2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
 3. Children who have lost their bearing after having become to proceed.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a chari-table or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child. and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child: and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
