WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended

that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation :

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, the Dargaville Borough Council (hereinafter called "the Council"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore, tidal land and tidal water of the Wairoa River at Dargaville, in Kaipara Harbour, in order to erect and maintain thereon a fire-brigade shed; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, marked M.D. 4663 (in duplicate), showing the manner in which it is proposed to construct such shed, the place where it is intended to erect the same, and the area of foreshore, tidal land, and tidal water intended to be occupied for such purpose:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the Council under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the Council as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the Council to use and occupy that part of the foreshore, tidal land, and tidal water which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of constructing or erecting thereon a fire-brigade shed, such license to be held and enjoyed by the Council upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. THE concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore, tidal land, and tidal water necessary for the erection of such fire-brigade shed which are shown on the plan marked M.D. 4663, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.

2. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the Council shall pay to the Minister an annual rental of 1s., payable on demand.

3. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress, into, through, and out of the fire-brigade shed without payment.

4. The Council shall maintain the above-mentioned fire-brigade shed in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

5. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said fire-brigade shed and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known office of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such fire-brigade shed, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

6. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulation made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the Council shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

8. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known office of the Council.

9. The Council shall be liable for any injury which the said fire-brigade shed may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

10. In case the Council shall—

(1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or

(2.) Cease to use or occupy the said fire-brigade shed for a period of thirty days,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without any notice to the Council or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

11. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

12. The erection of the fire-brigade shed shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the Council of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

And whereas Nelson Brothers (Limited), (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect the electric

lines defined in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter called "the said electric lines," and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section: 4-4

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and hereinafter referred to as "the regulations," hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain the said electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes.

1. ELECTRIC LINES AUTHORIZED.

THOSE electric lines extending from the engine-room of Nelson Brothers (Limited) situated in Lot 1, Subdivision D, Heretaunga Block, Block XVI, Heretaunga Survey District, Hawke's Bay Land District, across the railway-line to the office of Nelson Brothers (Limited) situated in Lot 8 (D.P. 3005) of the said Lot 1, and to the Tomoana Railway-station situated on the railway reserve. SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS OF MANAGEMENT.

1. ALL His Majesty's subjects shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the above-mentioned wharves, and rights of ingress and egress thereto and therefrom.
2. His Majesty or the Governor, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said wharves without payment.
3. The Council shall maintain and keep the above-mentioned wharves, and all erections on or in connection therewith, in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved by the Minister for the time being having charge of the Marine Department (hereinafter called "the Minister").

Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharves and erections on or in connection therewith, and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the Council a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharves or erections, requiring it within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.
5. The Council shall not erect, or suffer to be erected, on the said wharves any buildings or structures whatsoever, except with the consent of the said Minister.
6. The Council shall appoint all officers necessary for the working and management of the wharves.
7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.
8. The rights, powers and privileges conferred under or by virtue of this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years, computed from the date of this Order in Council, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.
9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Governor or the said Minister, or by any person acting under his or their instructions, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council, its successors, or assigns.
10. The Council shall be liable for any injury which may be caused by the said wharves or any of them to any vessel or boat through any default or neglect on the part of the Council.
11. In case the Council shall—
 - (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them; or
 - (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharves or either of them for a period of thirty consecutive days,—
 then and in either of the said cases every right, power, and privilege hereby conferred may be revoked and determined by the Governor in Council without notice to the Council or other proceeding whatsoever, and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the Council, and to all persons concerned or interested, of the facts stated in such Order in Council.

NOTE.—The following is section 33 of the War Legislation Amendment Act, 1916, referred to:—

POLICE OFFENCES AMENDMENT.

33. (1.) The Governor may from time to time, by notice in the *Gazette*, prohibit the use in connection with any trade or business of any word having reference in any way to the present war, on the ground that the use of the said word for any such purpose may be offensive to public sentiment.

(2.) The prohibition of the use of any word under this section shall be deemed to include the prohibition of the use of any abbreviation or variation of such word, and also the use of any other word that may incorporate such word, variation, or abbreviation.

(3.) Every person who acts in contravention of a notice under this section shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten pounds.

(4.) Nothing in this section shall affect the right of the proprietor of any trade-mark registered before the publication of a notice under this section, and containing any word the use of which for the purposes of any trade or business is prohibited or deemed to be prohibited by such notice, to continue to use such trade-mark for a period not exceeding three months after the issue of that notice.

(5.) While any notice under this section remains in force the Registrar of Patents, Designs, and Trade-marks shall refuse to accept any application for the registration of a trade-mark, including any word prohibited or deemed to be prohibited by such notice; and on the expiration of three months after the issue of any such notice the Registrar shall, if such notice remains in force, cancel the registration of any trade-mark that includes any such word, or may modify any such trade-mark by the exclusion of any such word.

(6.) Proceedings under this section shall not be instituted, except with the previous consent of the Attorney-General.

Import Licenses.

Customs Department,

WITH reference to the War Regulations dated 24th July, 1916, and amended 28th August, 1916, the following statement now explains the position.

It will be noticed that there is not now necessity to obtain licenses to trade with firms in Japan or France.

(a.) Licenses are required to import goods into New Zealand from all countries except Britain, British Possessions, France, Japan, and the United States.

(b.) A license must be obtained from the Comptroller of Customs, before the goods are ordered, for each firm with whom it is desired to trade.

(c.) Where goods are ordered through a buying agent in the United Kingdom who is given discretionary power as to the sources of supply, and irrespective of whether the supplier's invoice is to be ultimately sent along with the agent's invoice to New Zealand or not, there will be no necessity to obtain a license in New Zealand, provided that the agent gets the invoice to be sent to New Zealand viséed, approved, and endorsed at the office of the High Commissioner in London.

(d.) It should be clearly understood that it is only in cases covered by the preceding clause that invoices should be submitted to the High Commissioner, and that whenever the name of the probable supplier is known to the New Zealand importer a license must be obtained.

(e.) Where a New Zealand importer has got into touch with a new firm subsequent to the outbreak of war, he should state when applying for a license how he came to communicate with that firm, and should submit any relative papers.

(f.) Licenses will not be required for goods bought out of stock in Britain, British Possessions, France, Japan, or the United States, but in no case shall this be construed into permission to import—

- (1.) Any goods of enemy manufacture, origin, or ownership; or
- (2.) Goods being the produce or manufacture of any firm with whom a license to trade has been refused; or
- (3.) Any goods prohibited from importation under the War Regulations.

(g.) Importers are specially warned against ordering or importing goods from any firm or person from time to time declared in the *New Zealand Gazette* to be an enemy.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in it in that behalf by the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1913, the Waitomo County Council hereby resolves as follows:—
