WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for historic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a reserve for historic purposes under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 69, of the thirtieth day of the same month, rules were made as to life-saving appliances for ships: And whereas it is desirable to make additional rules:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power conferred upon him by section one hundred and ninety-seven of the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following additional rules as to life-saving appliances for ships; and doth order that they shall come and be in force on and after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen.

#### RULES.

##### LIFE-JACKETS.

1. THE word "life-jacket" in these regulations is used in lieu of and in substitution for the word "lifebelt" in the aforesaid regulations of the 27th day of July, 1914, and



wherever the word "lifebelt" occurs in the last-mentioned regulations, of the 27th day of July, 1914, it shall be taken to mean a "life-jacket" as referred to in these regulations.

2. *Inspection of Life-jackets.*—No life-jacket inspected on or after 1st July, 1917, may be passed (except as specified in paragraph 3) as part of the statutory equipment of a vessel, unless—

- (a.) It is of a type approved by a certificate of approval issued on or after 1st January, 1915, by the Imperial Board of Trade or by the Marine Department of New Zealand;
- (b.) It complies with the specification annexed to the certificate; and
- (c.) It is in good condition and generally fit for the service intended.

Makers of life-jackets who wish to obtain approval for their life-jackets should make application as indicated in paragraph 10. On 1st January, 1917, all certificates of approval dated earlier than 1st January, 1915, will be cancelled.

3. *Life-jackets previously passed.*—Until 1st July, 1918, any life-jacket which has been previously passed by a Marine Department Surveyor as part of the statutory equipment of a vessel may be accepted as part of the statutory equipment of the same vessel so long as it remains in good condition. On and after that date no life-jacket should be passed unless it complies with the conditions stated in paragraph 2.

4. *General.*—Life-jackets intended to form part of the statutory equipment of a vessel must be of approved material and construction, and those intended for use by adults must be capable of supporting 15 lb. of iron in fresh water for twenty-four hours. Life-jackets intended only for use by children must in general be capable of supporting 12 lb. of

(b.) The buoyancy of the jacket should be so arranged that it will keep the wearer's head clear of the water when floating in the inert position.

(c.) In the event of the wearer through any cause being rendered unconscious the head should be so supported that it would not fall forward and the face become submerged.

The "adult's" jacket should satisfy these conditions when worn by a man of average size, weighing 10½ to 11 stone, and the "child's" when worn by an average-sized boy about eight years of age.

10. *Approval of Life-jackets.*—Application for test and approval of life-jackets should be made to the Secretary, Marine Department, Wellington, New Zealand, by ship-owners desirous of adopting any special type of life-jacket, or by makers; a sample jacket should be forwarded for a test, arrangements for which may then be made, the makers or their representatives usually being notified so that they may be present.

When the test is completed a specification form will be supplied by the Marine Department, which must be correctly filled in and duly signed by the maker, who must also submit sample photographs in various positions of adjustment, with instructions for adjustment.

The specification and photographs, and report on the test by the Department's Surveyors will then be submitted for the consideration of the Department, the result of which will be communicated to the makers, and if the jacket is approved they will be requested to supply a number of copies of the specification and photographs for distribution amongst the Department's Surveyors, and to undertake to provide with all jackets supplied a minimum number of photographs showing adjustment.

**WELLINGTON STOCK EXCHANGE.**

**AMENDMENTS AND ADDITIONS TO RULES.**

*Commission.*

RULE 66 amended to read as follows:—

66. The brokerage chargeable for buying and selling shares in all companies, and debentures and stocks, shall be as follows:—

On Government or local bodies' debentures:  $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. on face value.

On all other debentures: 1 per cent. on face value.

On shares other than mining:  $1\frac{1}{2}$  per cent.

On mining shares up to 6d.:  $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per share.

„ over 6d. up to 2s.:  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per share.

„ over 2s. up to 3s. 4d.: 1d. per share.

„ over 3s. 4d. up to 10s.:  $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. per share.

„ over 10s.:  $1\frac{1}{2}$  per cent.

On syndicate shares:  $2\frac{1}{2}$  per cent.

Minimum charge, 5s. on any transaction; buyers paying stamp duty and transfer fees. The above rates in respect of sales of shares or debentures already issued are in all cases chargeable to both buyer and seller.

On mining transactions both buyer and seller pay stamp duty.

A special charge in excess of the above rates may be made according to the circumstances of the case for the negotiations of new flotations and of issues of new or reserve shares, in which case the vendor or issuing company alone is to be charged or of shares or securities not on the official list.

*Advertising.*

Rule 67 amended to read as follows:—

67. No member shall advertise in any manner whatsoever in connection with sharebroking business, without first obtaining the sanction of the Committee. Any breach of this rule shall be dealt with under Rule 108.

Rule 70 amended to read as follows:—

70. No member shall do business for or with any broker or other person in New Zealand (other than a member of an affiliated Exchange) at net prices or at less than the rate of commission specified in Rule 66.

Rule 79 amended to read as follows:—

79. All sales of stock and shares made at official meetings shall be quoted, except sales not amounting to a quotation. Only sales of shares made between the ordinary calls between two sharebrokers, members of the Exchange, may be quoted at the call immediately following such sale, but on reported sales shall be quoted at the first morning call. Due dates must accompany quotations of debentures. Members shall not publish in the local newspapers quotations of shares. Time-bargains shall not be quoted on the official list.

**NEW RULES.**

*Country Members.*

115. Any licensed broker carrying on business at a distance of not less than twenty miles from the Exchange may be elected a country member of the Exchange by payment of a fee of £2 2s. per annum. Such country members shall have the privilege of doing business with any member of an affiliated Exchange, but shall not be eligible to attend any "calls" or meetings of the Exchange except as a guest. A country member shall be deemed to be on the roll of the Exchange.

The election of a country member shall be carried out in the same manner as prescribed in Rules 36, 37, and 38 in respect of the election of ordinary members.

116. No member of the Exchange shall be permitted to print or affix his name stamp on any transfer or script delivered to another broker.

117. In all dealings with members of other Exchanges affiliated with the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand the rules of the Association shall apply and prevail over the rules of this Exchange.

#### UNITED KINGDOM.

##### ADMIRALTY PUBLICATIONS.—METHOD OF REVISION OF NOTICES TO MARINERS.

IN future, when Admiralty Notices to Mariners are revised and republished from time to time, new matter and alterations, &c., will be indicated in the following manner:—

- (1.) Entirely new paragraphs, by a broad line at the side.
- (2.) New or altered portions of paragraphs, will be underlined with a broad line.
- (3.) Paragraphs deleted will be indicated by a bracket extending right across the page, thus:—  

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- (4.) Portions of paragraphs deleted will be indicated by a similar bracket, three-quarters of an inch long, thus:—  

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##### REGULATIONS WITH REGARD TO VESSELS' LIGHTS.

Notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following order has been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated 24th June, 1916:—

1. *Anchor Lights.*—No electrically lit lanterns shall be employed as anchor lights. The normal brilliancy of all other anchor lanterns shall be reduced by 50 per cent.

All anchor lanterns are to be fitted with overhead screens, so arranged as to cut off the light at an angle of between 20 and 25 degrees above the horizontal.

*Note.*—Specimen screens can be viewed at the Board of Trade Surveyor's Offices at Leith, North Shields, Hull, London, Plymouth, Cardiff, Liverpool, Glasgow, and Dublin.

2. *Bow and Masthead Steaming Lights.*—Vessels in estuaries and harbours where navigation in the dark hours is permitted shall not employ electrically lit lanterns as bow or steaming lights.

3. *Other Lights.*—No light, either aloft, on deck, or below, except those required by the Regulations for the Prevention of Collisions at Sea, and such as may be necessary for authorized signalling purposes, shall be permitted to be visible from outboard. This shall apply to all vessels whether under way or at anchor.

4. The above order applies to vessels of every description, other than H.M. ships, in the waters of the United Kingdom except within three miles of the Irish coast, and is now in force with the exception of the regulation relating to the screening of anchor lights, which shall come into force four weeks after the date aforesaid.

#### CAUTION.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.

##### BRITISH ISLANDS.—CAUTION WITH REGARD TO EXTINCTION OF LIGHTS AND DISCONTINUANCE OR REMOVAL OF AIDS TO NAVIGATION.

*Former Notice.*—No. 3 of 1916.

*Caution.*—Mariners are hereby warned that it may be necessary to extinguish certain lights and to discontinue or remove any aids to navigation on the coasts of the British Islands without further notice.

Raids by hostile air-craft may necessitate local extinction of light, but the period of extinction will be as short as possible.

*Note.*—This notice is a republication of Notice No. 3 of 1916, with additional information.

##### ENGLAND, SOUTH-EAST COAST.—THE DOWNS.—SOUTH GOODWIN LIGHT VESSEL.—TEMPORARY ALTERATION IN FOG-SIGNAL.

*Position.*—Lat. 51° 9' N., long. 1° 28' E.

*Alteration.*—The siren has been temporarily replaced by a horn giving three blasts every two minutes, thus—blast 2 secs., silent 2 secs.; blast 5 secs., silent 2 secs.; blast 2 secs., silent interval 107 secs.

*Note.*—Further notice will be given when the siren is again working.

#### PORTUGAL.

##### REGULATIONS RESPECTING ENTRY INTO PORTS.

###### Vianna.

1. Any vessel wishing to cross the bar must wait on the leading-line for the bar do Sul, at a distance of about 7 cables from the shore, until the arrival of a pilot and an official from the Port Captain's office.

2. The vessel when hoisting the signal for a pilot must also signal her name and port of departure.

3. By day no merchant vessel is permitted to cross the bar without a pilot; by night no vessel is permitted to enter whether there is a pilot on board or not; any vessel attempting to do so will be treated as hostile.

4. If a vessel already has a pilot on board, she must nevertheless wait, at the distance from the shore indicated above, for the arrival of the official from the Port Captain's office. No vessel may anchor in the channel or in its vicinity without a pilot being on board.

5. When permission to enter is refused to any vessel the semaphore on Santiago Castle will hoist N flag, International Code, the vessel must then immediately proceed to sea, or anchor in order that the Captain of the port may examine her, at which the master of the vessel must assist.

6. Any vessel not obeying the instructions given will be treated as hostile.

7. In the event of a vessel hoisting the danger signal, to indicate an attack from a submarine, she may proceed to cross the bar if the conditions of sea and weather permit, but must comply with all instructions received from the pilots.

8. In the event of bad weather preventing the boat with the official from the Port Captain from leaving the port, a vessel which already has a pilot on board may proceed to cross the bar, if it is practicable for her to do so, after permission has been given from the semaphore station, which will hoist C pennant of the International Code.

9. Vessels must comply with all instructions received from the pilots and hoist all the signals ordered.

10. All vessels will be subject to a close examination whenever it may be considered necessary.

###### Lisbon.

1. No vessel approaching the Port of Lisbon or navigating along the coast may enter the area to the east of the meridian of long. 9° 25' W., and to the north of the parallel of lat. 38° 33' 45" N., without a pilot.

2. Entry or exit of vessels from the Port of Lisbon is entirely prohibited between sunset and sunrise, or in foggy weather when the range of visibility is less than two miles.

3. Passage of vessels through the North Channel is prohibited until further notice.

4. Any man-of-war or merchant vessel, whether there is a pilot on board or not, which attempts to enter through any of the channels during the night will be considered hostile, and Fort San Julian will notify her approach by firing a blank shot.

5. All vessels wishing to enter the Tagus must approach the citadel at Cascaes in order to embark a pilot and to communicate by signals or wireless telegraphy their name and port of departure; they must comply promptly with all orders received, and hoist such signals and distinctive marks as the pilot may prescribe. No vessel may proceed into any of the entrance channels without authorization from the semaphore station, which will be given by means of a signal known only to the pilot.

6. Any vessel, to which the semaphore station refuses permission to enter by hoisting flag N, is to proceed to sea at once, or to anchor so that the Captain of the port or the naval patrol vessel may visit her for the purpose of examination, at which the master should assist.

7. When authorization to enter is given to any vessel she will follow the directions received from the pilot, and continue to fly her name or other distinctive signal ordered by the pilot, and must reduce speed off Fort San Julian until a similar signal is hoisted at the fort, granting permission for the vessel to continue on her course. From outside or inside the bar, up to the anchorage, the vessel is to comply promptly with all orders received from naval patrol vessels.



8. Passage of vessels past Belem Tower is only permitted when a ball is hoisted on a mast at the Bom Sucesso Basin. Two balls hoisted on the same mast indicate that vessels are prohibited from passing the above tower; they must either anchor or heave to until high or low water.

Two balls hoisted with a white pennant and cross indicate that vessels may cross the bar.

9. Any man-of-war or merchant vessel which attempts to enter by day through any of the entrance channels, and which fails in any way to strictly observe the foregoing regulations, will be treated as hostile, whether there is a pilot on board or not.

10. If on account of bad weather, or other unforeseen circumstances, the pilot-boat cannot remain on her station, vessels are nevertheless bound to approach the citadel at Cascaes in order to obtain permission to enter, but they must wait until a naval patrol vessel puts out to meet them in order to conduct them into the port, in this latter case they will be subject to a visit as soon as they pass Fort San Julian.

#### Setubal.

1. Any vessel wishing to enter the port must take a pilot and communicate her name, nationality, and port of departure to the pilot-vessel by the International Code.

2. The vessel is to pass as close as possible to the patrol anchored off Adoxe Point, at the same time indicating her name and port of departure by the International Code, and keeping her national flag hoisted.

3. The patrol vessel will hoist Y flag to indicate that the vessel must anchor abreast of her, or N flag, in which case she is to anchor on the line of the meridian of Fort d'Albarquel and between that fort and Outao Tower.

4. The Y flag will be hauled down after the vessel has anchored.

5. In the event of N flag being kept flying, the vessel will await orders and anchor in the manner described in the latter portion of paragraph 3.

6. From sunset to sunrise no vessel is permitted to cross the bar.

Note.—This notice is a repetition of Notice No. 506 of 1916, with additional information in paragraph 8 relating to the Port of Lisbon in Section II.

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## SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

**F**OR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
