Change of Name of Locality and Bay. "German Bay" to "Takamatua."

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Board of the Road District of Akaroa-Wainui has, by resolution adopted at an ordinary meeting thereof, requested that the name of the locality situated in the Road District of Akaroa-Wainui and known as "German Bay" be altered to "Takamatua":

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the locality now known as "German Bay" shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Takamatua," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such locality accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the bay now known as "German Bay" shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Takamatua Bay," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such bay accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), Catherine McCallum, of Auckland (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor in Council for a license under the said Act to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark of Karamuramu Island, Hauraki Gulf, as shown on plan marked M.D. 4674, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in order to erect and maintain a wharf thereon:

The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at her own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

6. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof, and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring her, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, she shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

7. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

8. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

9. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

10. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and hereinafter referred to as "the regulations," hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain the said electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes.

1. THE ELECTRIC LINES AUTHORIZED.

5. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power,

heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. WHEREAS by section six of the Rangitaiki Land Drainage Act, 1910 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is enacted that the Governor may, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of the said section:

And whereas regulations were duly made by Order in Council dated the eighth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, and published in the *Gazette* of the sixteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eleven:

And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said recited regulations, and to make other regulations under the said section six:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the above-recited regulations, and doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said section six; and doth hereby declare that such revocation and the regulations hereby made shall take effect as from the date of the publication hereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations—

"Minister" means the Minister of Lands:

"The district" means the land described in the Schedule to the said Act.

2. For the purpose of making and levying the rate provided for in section 6 of the said Act the Minister shall be deemed to be a local authority within the meaning of the Rating Act, 1908.

3. The Valuer-General shall, when requested by the Minister so to do, prepare from the district valuation rolls in force under the Valuation of Land Act, 1908, a valuation roll containing particulars of all lands referred to in subsection (2) of section 6 of the said Act.

4. From the valuation roll of the district supplied by the Valuer-General, corrected each year as at the 31st March, the Minister shall cause a rate-book to be prepared in the form in the First Schedule hereto.

5. Not less than fourteen days before making any rate the Minister shall publicly notify in a newspaper circulating in the district his intention to make such rate, and in the same advertisement shall also give notice of the following, viz:—

(a.) The period for which the rate is made;

(b.) The date on which it is to become payable; and

(c.) That the valuation roll is open for inspection at the Lands and Survey Department, Government Buildings, at Wellington, also that a copy of the same may be inspected at such other place or places and at such time or times as the Minister from time to time publicly notifies.

6. The Minister may, by notice under his hand published in the *New Zealand Gazette*, make and levy the rate on the unimproved value of all land within the district on a graduated scale according to the classification of the land, and in such proportion on each class of land as the arbitrators have appointed.

7. The rate shall be an annual rate payable in one sum on a date to be fixed by the Minister at the time of making the rate, and shall be for such amount in the pound on each class of land as will provide for the repayment of the moneys raised for the purposes of the said Act, together with the interest thereon, and the payment of the expenses of the general administration of the said Act within a period of forty years from the commencement of the period for which the first rate made and levied by the Minister hereunder is payable.

8. The rate-book shall be signed by the Minister, and shall be kept in the Lands and Survey Department, Government Buildings, at Wellington, and shall at all times during office hours be available for inspection by the ratepayers. A copy of the rate-book shall also be kept at such place in the district as may be publicly notified from time to time by the Minister, for inspection by the ratepayers during office hours.

9. The Minister shall, under his hand, appoint a Collector of Rates, who shall issue all demands for rates in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule hereto.

10. The Minister and the Collector of Rates shall be deemed to have all the powers and authorities of a Chairman and Clerk of a local authority respectively pursuant to the Rating Act, 1908.

11. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Rating Act, 1908, or in the last preceding regulation, all alterations and corrections made in the rate-book shall be initialled by the Under-Secretary for Lands and by the Collector of Rates.

12. Except as otherwise provided in the said Act and in these regulations the provisions of the Rating Act, 1908, shall apply to the making, levying, collection, and recovery of rates authorized to be made and levied in respect of the lands in the district.

Subsidies to Public Libraries.

NOTICE is hereby given that the sum of £2,500 has been voted by Parliament for distribution to public libraries in country districts.

The distribution will take place about the 1st March, 1917, and no claim will be entitled to consideration that shall not have been sent in in due form and received by the Secretary, Education Department, Wellington, on or before the 26th January, 1917.

1. A library to be entitled to a subsidy must be public in the sense of belonging to the public, and of not being under the control of an association, society, or club whose membership is composed of a section of the community only; and if it is within a borough a reading-room where the books may be read, and containing newspapers and periodicals, must be provided for the public free of charge; in addition, it must not be situated in a borough, town, or town district the population of which exceeds one thousand. The receipts for the year from subscriptions and donations must not have been less than £2, exclusive of moneys received from endowments, or from Government, or from Borough or County Councils, or for special building purposes, or as rent, hire, or consideration for the use of any room, or building, or land belonging to the institution, in respect of none of which will subsidy be allowed. The net proceeds of concerts, lectures, or other entertainments on behalf of the current expenses of the library will be regarded as voluntary contributions. A subsidy will not be given to more than one library in the same town.

2. In the division of the vote a nominal addition of £25 will be made to the amount of the income of each library derived from subscriptions, donations, and rates, and the vote will be divided according to the amounts thus augmented; but no library will receive credit for a larger income than £25—that is, in no case will the augmented amount on which distribution is based exceed £50.

3. The whole of the subsidy must be expended without delay in the purchase of books for the library.

4. It is particularly enjoined upon the authorities in charge of the public libraries concerned that a due proportion of the books purchased shall be books having a permanent value—that is, on books of more than merely passing interest.

5. Application to share in the distribution must be by means of a statutory declaration by the Chairman, or Secretary, or Treasurer of the institution on behalf of which it is made, and must be accompanied by a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1916, and such declaration must be on the form provided for the purpose, which form shall be as follows:—

abstracts of accounts is a true statement of the receipts and expenditure of the institution for the year herein specified; that the whole of the subsidy received during the year was expended in the purchase of books for the library; [and that by the rules of the library the reading-room is open to the public free of charge].

The total births in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs amounted to 571, as against 697 in August—a decrease of 126. The deaths in September were 311—an increase of 16 as compared with the previous month. Of the total deaths males contributed 168, females 143. Sixty-eight of the deaths were of children under five years of age, being 21.87 per cent. of the whole number; 49 of these were under one year of age.

There were 117 deaths of persons of 65 years and upwards in the four chief cities and their suburban boroughs, as against 118 in August. The following table shows the classification:—
