A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Council of the Borough of Campbelltown has, pursuant to section two of the Designation of Districts Amendment Act, 1909, passed a resolution that the name of such borough be changed to "Bluff":

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the borough now known as "Campbelltown" shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Bluff," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such borough accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and sixty-eight of the Native Land Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Crown may purchase any Native land in pursuance of a resolution of the assembled owners passed and confirmed in accordance with Part XVIII of the said Act, and on the resolution being adopted by the Native Land Purchase Board it shall become a contract of pur-

chase as between the Crown and all persons who are the owners of the land; and the Governor may by Proclamation, at any time after the contract of purchase has been so made, declare that the land so purchased is vested in His Majesty the King, and it shall vest accordingly, and shall become Crown land:

And whereas a resolution was passed by a meeting of assembled owners, and duly confirmed by the Waikato-Maniapoto District Maori Land Board, that the land set out in the Schedule hereto be sold to the Crown:

And whereas the Native Land Purchase Board duly considered and adopted the resolution:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three hundred and sixty-eight of the said Act, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare the land set out in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and seventy-four of the Native Land Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, it is provided, *inter alia*, that, on being satisfied that the purchase of any Native land has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the said Act, the Governor may issue a Proclamation that such land has become Crown land:

And whereas the purchase of the Native land set out in the Schedule hereto has been duly completed by or on behalf of the Crown under the authority of the said Act:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon me by section three hundred and seventy-four of the said Act, and by section fourteen of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1914, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the land set out in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section ninety-six of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order in Council declare that any land subject to Part XIV or XV of the Native Land Act, 1909, and vested in a Maori Land Board, shall no longer be subject to such Parts of that Act, and shall be re-vested in the Native owners thereof :

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto, and known as Kaurinui No. 2 Block, is now, by virtue of an Order in Council made on the third day of November, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and by virtue of the provisions of section two hundred and thirty-three of the Native Land Act, 1909, subject to Part XIV of the said Act, and vested in the Tokerau District Maori Land Board accordingly :

And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the said land is not subject to any lease, license, contract for sale, or other alienation, and that no moneys are charged on the said land or on the revenue thereof in accordance with the said Act or under any other authority :

And whereas it is expedient that the said land should cease to be subject to Part XIV of the said Act :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section ninety-six of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto shall no longer be subject to Part XIV of the Native Land Act, 1909.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the third section of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, a majority of the ratepayers in the area of land described in the Schedule hereto, situated in the Counties of Ohinemuri and Thames, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, praying that the said area be constituted a drainage district under the provisions of the said Act :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority hereinbefore mentioned, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the Order in Council as set out in Part I of the Schedule hereto, only in so far as it affects the land mentioned in Part II of the said Schedule.

Licenses will in general be granted only in respect of goods on the way to the United Kingdom or actually purchased at the date of the Proclamation.

Licenses will be granted for the importation of goods sent by post for repairs and return to New Zealand.

All materials for the manufacture of paper, including wood pulp, esparto grass, and linen and cotton rags.

Paper and cardboard, including strawboard, pasteboard, millboard, and wood-pulp board.

Manufactures of paper and cardboard.

All periodical publications exceeding sixteen pages in length imported otherwise than in single copies through the post.

(b) Canned, bottled, dried, and preserved fruits, except currants.

[NOTE.—This does not apply to such fruits which are the produce of British possessions.]

Musical instruments, including gramophones, pianolas, and other similar instruments, and accessories and component parts and records therefor.

(a) With regard to tobacco produced in the British Dominions, licenses allowing importation to the United Kingdom will not be issued unless a certificate is produced similar to that required for fruit. In the case of tobacco, this certificate should be forwarded as promptly as possible to the consignee, to enable him to submit proof to the Licensing Committee that the particular consignment has in fact originated in the British Dominions, or has been manufactured in such Dominions from imported leaf.

(b) With regard to the exemption from the prohibition of fruits, vegetables, or pickles which are the produce of the British Dominions, exporters are informed that every invoice for such goods (being New Zealand produce exported to the United Kingdom) must show the marks and numbers of the packages, and must bear a certificate in the following form signed by and bearing the official stamp of a Collector of Customs:—

This is to certify that the fruit [or vegetables, or pickles] specified in this invoice is [are] the produce of New Zealand.

The packages containing such goods should also be branded "Produce of New Zealand" or "Made in New Zealand."

(c) The Board of Trade, London, state that licenses will be granted for commercial motor vehicles where the goods were en route for the United Kingdom or paid for at the date of the Proclamation (27th June, 1916), or where importation is desirable in the national interests; and for spare parts of imported commercial vehicles already in the United Kingdom.

(d) Licenses for yeast will be granted up to about half the amount imported during 1915. Licenses for vacuum cleaners will be granted only if the goods were en route or paid for at the date of the Proclamation (27th June, 1916).

(e) Special licenses will be issued by the Board of Trade, London, for the importation of specific quantities, as occasion requires, of hops which are the produce of the British Dominions. On issue of a license the exporter should forward to the consignee an invoice for such hops bearing a certificate in similar form to that required for fruit.
