Electric Line Regulations.—Transmission of Telegrams by Telephone.

LIVERPOOL, Governor.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this thirtieth day of October, 1916.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the sixteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the nineteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, regulations were made under the authority of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), for the transmission of telegrams by telephone: And whereas it is desirable to revoke such regulations and to make other regulations in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in that behalf enabling him, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations hereinbefore referred to, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth order that the regulations hereby made shall form part of and be read together with the regulations made under the said Act by Order in Council dated the seventeenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and shall have effect on and after the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen.

SCHEDULE.

TRANSMISSION OF TELEGRAMS BY TELEPHONE.

1. (1) SUBSCRIBERS to telephone exchanges and owners of private lines connected with telephone bureaux may, by pre-arrangement in writing with the telegraph office, have telegraphic messages which are addressed to them forwarded by telephone from the office of destination to their business or private addresses. Such messages will, after transmission, be posted for delivery to such address, and be marked on the front "Transmitted by telephone."

(2.) Subscribers and owners of private lines may, upon application on the form provided, also telephone to any telegraph office connected with a telephone exchange, during the ordinary hours of telegraph attendance, if the exchange is open, messages to be further transmitted from the telegraph office to the respective destinations of such messages as telegrams, provided the usual cost of such telegrams is paid in addition to the fees prescribed.

2. If desired, short Press messages up to fifty words may be telephoned to newspapers the proprietors of which are subscribers to a telephone exchange, and who agree to pay the fee for so doing. After being telephoned, such messages will be delivered by messenger, when their values (if "collect"), together with the fee for telephoning, will be collected.

3. The provisions of the foregoing regulations may be availed of during the ordinary hours for attendance of officers at the telegraph office, except in the case of offices where officers are on duty until 10 p.m., when telegrams may be telephoned up to that hour.

4. (1.) At all offices where provision is made for the delivery of telegrams, the charges for messages telephoned over a subscriber's line or that of a private-wire owner, to a destination within the limits of the free delivery of telegrams, shall be as follows:—

For each separate transmission, if the telephone conversation does not exceed three minutes	£	s.	d.
For each additional three minutes or fraction thereof	0	0	3

One conversation may include two or more messages.

(2.) Subscribers to a telephone exchange at a central office, whose telegrams are addressed to a sub-office connected therewith, may have such telegrams transmitted by telephone from the sub-office through that exchange on payment of the fees prescribed above.

(3.) No charge shall be made for messages telephoned over a subscriber's line, or that of a private-wire owner, to a destination beyond the limits of the free delivery of telegrams, or for messages telephoned from an office where the delivery of telegrams is not provided for.

(4.) No charge shall be made for messages telephoned over privately owned telephone lines connected with an office not in charge of a permanent officer of the Post and Telegraph Department.

5. Free service shall not extend beyond the transmission of fifty words at a time if the telephone is required for any other purpose.

6. The fee payable in respect of the transmission by telephone of any message telephoned from a telegraph office to a subscriber or private-wire owner under these regulations is to be affixed in stamps to a docket which will be provided, and which must be delivered to the telegraph office immediately after the message has been telephoned.

7. Prior to telephoning any message within the limits of a town the sender shall reduce such message to writing, and, immediately after transmission, shall deliver the written message to the telegraph office, with the charges affixed in stamps. To prevent duplication the word "Transmitted" must be written in a conspicuous place on the form after the message has been telephoned, otherwise the charge for a second transmission will be made. Messages telephoned after 5 p.m. and before 8 p.m. must be handed in to the telegraph office not later than 10 o'clock the following morning. In country places the same procedure must be followed, except that the written message must be delivered to the telegraph office within a reasonable time.

8. The Department reserves the right to exclude any person from the privilege of sending or receiving telegrams by telephone under this system until any arrears of fees or charges which may be due are fully paid, and to demand a deposit before or at any time after registering any application.

9. The transcribed copies of messages telephoned by subscribers to telephone exchanges, or by private-line owners, will, so far as the Department is concerned, become the original telegrams, and the Department will not assume or be subject to any liability by reason or on account of any failure, delay, or mistake in or about the transmission, receipt, or delivery of any telegram under this system, from whatever cause the same may arise. Messages will only be received upon the understanding that the Department's counting and charging are accepted without question.

10. On payment of 3d. in addition to the charge at the prescribed rates for the transmission of any telegram, the sender of a telegram may insert in the place reserved therein for instructions the direction "To be telephoned," and thereupon such telegram upon arrival at the telegraph office of destination shall be forthwith telephoned through the telephone exchange to the addressee, if such addressee is a subscriber to that exchange; and in other respects the provisions made for the transmission of telegrams to addressees through telephone exchanges at their own request shall, as far as applicable, apply to such telegram.

License authorizing the Hamilton Borough Council to erect Electric Lines within the Borough of Hamilton.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, place, put up, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued by the Governor in Council under that Act :

And whereas the Hamilton Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect lines within

the area of supply as defined in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter called "the area of supply," and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and hereinafter referred to as "the regulations," hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes within the area of supply hereinafter described.

SCHEDULE.

1. AREA OF SUPPLY.

The area of supply comprises the Borough of Hamilton as at present constituted.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph 1 (b) of clause 2 of the regulations.

The generating voltage shall be approximately 460 to 500 volts between the terminals.

3. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 12 degrees Fahrenheit.

4. NOTICES *re* EXTENSIONS, ETC.

Records of results of tests (Regulation 37), and notices *re* commencement of work (Regulation 44) and *re* extensions and alterations (Regulation 49), should be sent to the Under-Secretary, Public Works Department, Wellington, and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at Auckland.

5. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 3d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

Revoking Regulations for Trout-fishing in Auckland Acclimatization District, and making others in lieu thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the Auckland Acclimatization District and the waters thereof; and doth hereby declare that the regulations shall, as from the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, supersede all regulations for the said district at variance therewith, and such regulations are hereby revoked.

REGULATIONS.

1. LICENSES to fish for trout in all waters within the said district as described in the First Schedule hereto shall be

issued under the hand of the secretary of the Auckland Acclimatization Society (hereinafter termed "the said society"), or any one duly authorized by such secretary in that behalf. Such licenses shall be whole-season, half-season, or day licenses.

2. Every such whole-season license shall entitle the holder thereof to fish for trout in all the waters of the said district for a period extending from the 1st day of October in any one year to the 30th day of April in the year following, both days inclusive, subject, however, to the special limitations and restrictions hereinafter provided.

3. Every half-season license shall entitle the holder thereof to fish as aforesaid in the waters of the said district for a period extending from the 1st day of February to the 30th day of April in any one year.

4. Every day license shall entitle the holder thereof to fish as aforesaid in the waters of the said district during and throughout any one day of twenty-four hours therein specified within the period aforesaid.

5. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred upon holders of such aforesaid licenses shall be exercised subject to the provisions of the said Act, and to the regulations made or hereafter to be made thereunder during the currency of such licenses, and to regulations made or hereafter to be made as aforesaid in force in or affecting any particular acclimatization district, or having special reference to any particular water, stream, river, or lake; provided always that the secretary of the said society, or any person authorized by him as aforesaid, shall not be compelled to issue a license to any person who within two years previously to the date of his application therefor has been convicted, or shall have been convicted, of any breach of the provisions of the said Act or the regulations thereunder, or of any Act relating to trout-fishing, or any regulations thereunder.

6. Licenses shall be issued by the said society at the following rates: For men—whole-season licenses, 20s.; half-season licenses, 12s. 6d.; day licenses, 2s. 6d. For women—whole-season licenses, 5s.; half-season licenses, 3s. 6d.; day licenses, 1s. 6d. For boys attending school or under the age of sixteen years—whole-season licenses, 5s.; half-season licenses, 3s. 6d.; day licenses, 1s. 6d. Such licenses shall be in the form or to the effect set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

7. The holder of any such license as aforesaid may fish as aforesaid with one rod and line only, and may use a landing-net or gaff to secure any trout caught with such rod and line.

8. No person shall use any bait or lure other than the natural or artificial fly, or natural or artificial minnow, and any small indigenous fish, insect, grasshopper, beetle, or spider. The use of shellfish, koura, or the houhou or matai grub shall be a breach of the regulations:

Provided that no bait other than artificial fly shall be used for taking fish in that portion of the Mangaokiwa River in the King-country which lies between the south side of the Government quarry and the north side of Wilton's lime-kiln, in the Waipa River or any of its tributaries from eight miles above Otorohanga upwards, in the Ongarue and Waimiha Rivers from the Waimiha Railway-station upwards, in the Waikato River from power-house to traffic-bridge at Horahora, in the Waikato River between No. 1 Creek and Melville's Creek, Hamilton, in the Waimakariri from source to Okoroire Bridge, the Waiomo, the Mangapohue, the Kaniwhaniwa, the Pokaewhenua, the Moakururua, and the Mangatoki Rivers, or in the Puniu River above Kihikihi.

9. No license shall be transferable, or be deemed to authorize any person other than the person named therein to fish.

10. The period from the 1st day of May in any one year to the 30th day of September in the year following, both days inclusive, is hereby appointed a close season, during which it shall be unlawful for any person to fish for or to take trout, or to in any way injure or disturb the same. No person shall have in his possession, whether frozen, chilled, or otherwise, any trout between the 5th day of May in any one year and the 1st day of October in the year following.

11. No person shall cast or throw into any stream or waters in the said district in which trout exist or have been liberated, nor shall allow to flow into or place in or near the bank or margin of any such stream or waters, any sawdust or sawmill refuse, lime, sheep-dip, flax-mill refuse, or any other matter or liquid that is noxious, poisonous, or injurious to fish; provided that nothing herein contained shall extend to or prohibit the depositing in any such stream or waters of debris from any mining claim.

12. No person shall fish for trout without a license; and every person fishing in any such waters shall, on demand of any fishery officer, constable, officer of the said society, or person producing a license to fish issued in New Zealand, give his true name and place of residence, either permanent or for the time being, and on the like demand produce and show to such fishery officer, constable, officer of the said society, or person producing a license as aforesaid, his license to fish, and the contents of his creel, bag, or other receptacle for carrying

fish, and also the bait or lure used or intended to be used by him for taking, catching, or killing such trout.

13. Every trout not exceeding 10 in. in length from tip of nose to tip of tail taken or caught by any person shall immediately be returned alive, with as little damage or hurt as possible, into the water from which the same has been taken.

14. No hand-line, night-line, or cross-line fishing, stroke-hauling, trimmer, or any other unsportsmanlike device shall be used for the purpose of taking or attempting to take, catch, kill, or capture trout; nor shall any of the hereinbefore-mentioned permitted baits or lures be prepared or used with any medicated or chemical preparation whatever.

15. Except as provided in Regulation 7, no person shall fish with or use any net or engine, instrument, or device of any kind whatever for taking or attempting to take trout in any lake, river, or stream within the said district, or at the mouth or entrance of any such lake, river, or stream. Any trout taken by any such net or other means shall immediately be returned alive into the water from which the same is taken.

16. For the purposes of these regulations a lake and the mouth of a river or stream shall respectively be deemed to include every outlet of such lake, river, or stream respectively, and the sea-shore between the outlets of any such river or stream, and shall extend over a radius of one quarter of a mile from the point or line where the waters of such river, lake, or stream meet those of the sea or of any harbour at low water.

17. No person shall buy, sell, or expose or offer for sale, or shall fish for the purpose of obtaining for sale, any trout, or any portion thereof.

18. Any person convicted of any offence against these regulations shall have his license to fish (if any) confiscated, and such license (if any) shall thereupon become null and void.

19. No person shall take or catch more than twenty-five trout in any one day.

20. Except as provided for by the regulations regarding keeping trout in freezing-works or freezing-chambers during the close season which were made by the Governor in Council on the 6th day of October, 1908, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 8th day of the same month, no person shall have in his or her possession, whether frozen, chilled, or otherwise, any trout between the 5th day of May and the 1st day of October in any year; provided that this regulation shall not apply to any fish taken by officers of the Government or by officers of the Auckland Acclimatization Society for the purpose of acclimatization.

21. The penalty for every breach of any of these regulations shall be not less than 40s., and not more than £50.

WHEREAS the land described in the First Schedule hereto was on the eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, granted to the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury upon trust for a cemetery or burial-ground for members of the Church of Rome of the town and district of Christchurch :

And whereas the land described in the Second Schedule hereto was on the twenty-seventh day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, granted to the said Superintendent upon trust for a cemetery or burial-ground for the Dissenters of the town and district of Christchurch :

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority conferred upon me by the Defence Act, 1909, and its amendments, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby revoke certain regulations for the New Zealand Military Forces made on the eleventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and in lieu thereof do hereby make the regulations in the Schedule hereto; and I do hereby declare that such revocation shall take effect and such regulations shall come into force as from the date of publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

FINANCIAL INSTRUCTIONS AND ALLOWANCE REGULATIONS FOR THE NEW ZEALAND MILITARY FORCES.

REGULATIONS 229 to 246 (both inclusive) are hereby revoked, and the following regulations substituted in lieu thereof.

(a.) *Territorial Force.*

229. A maintenance grant will be paid annually to each unit of the Territorial Force to meet the following expenses:—

- (1.) Extra stationery, extra training manuals, and printing of regimental orders or instructions, cheque-books, and bank charges.
- (2.) Provision of cleaning-material for arms, saddlery, horses, &c.
- (3.) Provision of saddlery.
- (4.) Extra appliances for camps.
- (5.) Regimental bands.
- (6.) Entrance fee for such military tournaments or shooting competitions as are approved by the Officer Commanding District.
- (7.) Engraving of medals, cups, &c.
- (8.) Rations for daylight parades or week-end camps, when approved by the Quartermaster-General.
- (9.) Any purpose which in the opinion of the Commandant is of military benefit to the unit, and for which no provision has been made on the parliamentary appropriations.

(10.) Moneys owing to the Department. This amount shall be deducted on the voucher and the net amount only paid.

230. The maintenance grant payable to units shall be at the following rates:—

For each mounted unit in which the members supply the horses gratuitously: £1 per member.

Other units: 10s. per member.

(b.) *Senior Cadets.*

231. A maintenance grant shall be paid to Senior Cadet companies for the same purposes as detailed in paragraph 229, at the rate of 2s. 6d. per member.

(c.) *General Training Section.*

232. A maintenance grant at the rate of 2s. 6d. per member shall be paid to each Group Commander or Area Officer, in accordance with paragraph 627, General Regulations. It may be expended on any purpose enumerated in paragraph 229.

ADVANCES ON MAINTENANCE GRANT.

233. In the event of an Officer Commanding a unit or Senior Cadet company wishing to obtain an advance on the maintenance grant, a written application must be submitted showing—

(a.) Amount of advance required;

(b.) Why the advance is required; and

(c.) The total amount of maintenance grant that it is anticipated the unit or Senior Cadet company will be entitled to for the year.

234. The application will be forwarded to Headquarters with a recommendation or otherwise from the Officer Commanding District. The application will then be placed before the Quartermaster-General, who may approve the issue of the whole or part of the advance asked for.

235. No advance will be issued before the 31st July in the year for which such advance is claimed.

FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION.

236. All sums due on account of maintenance grant (including advances) shall be paid into the official banking account of the unit, Group Commander, or Area Officer, as the case may be.

237. All units of the Territorial Force and Senior Cadet companies entitled to maintenance grant shall each have an official banking account to which no other moneys but the maintenance grant are to be paid.

238. In the case of Senior Cadet companies the Officer Commanding District may approve of the maintenance grant being paid to the official banking account of the Group Commander or Area Officer, such grant to be administered by that officer. The Group Commander or Area Officer shall keep a separate cash-book for each company whose grant he receives.

239. Payments from the account of Territorial units shall be made by cheque, signed by an officer nominated by the Officer Commanding District, and countersigned by the Commanding Officer.

240. Under no circumstances must any official account be overdrawn.

241. Commanding Officers will be responsible for keeping an accurate account of all receipts and disbursements in the authorized cash-book. Every separate sum, received or paid, shall be entered in the cash-book with the date on which the transaction took place.

SECTION VII.—AUDIT.

242. The official accounts of all Territorial units, Group Commanders, and Area Officers shall be audited at least once annually by officers appointed for the purpose by the Controller and Auditor-General.

243. The Assistant Quartermaster-General in each district is responsible that the official accounts in his district are ready for audit before the 31st July in each year.

244. Before the transfer or retirement of any officer to whom power is given by these regulations to operate on or administer the maintenance grant account, such account is to be audited, the necessary application for same being made to the Quartermaster-General.

245. Officers administering official accounts will submit, when required, the following books and documents to the Controller and Auditor-General or his representative:—

(1.) The authorized cash-book.

(2.) Balance-sheet on prescribed form (in duplicate). (One copy for unit and one copy for District Headquarters.)

(3.) Bank pass-book }
(4.) Cheque-book } or Post Office Savings-bank book.

(5.) Vouchers in support of expenditure.

(6.) Treasury or other official advice of payment of grant.

NOTE.—A mild spring month with barometric pressure and temperatures above the average, while precipitation was 31 per cent. below the mean of previous years. Total bright sunshine, 168 hours 43 minutes; and three sunless days. Frost was recorded on six mornings. Mean earth-temperature at 1 ft. was 52.4°, and 52.8° at 3 ft. Mean dew-point, 45.4°; mean elastic force of vapour, 0.304 in.; and mean relative humidity, 76 per cent. of saturation.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1916.

The weather during September was on the whole mild and spring-like, and, except in the southernmost districts, precipitation was everywhere below the average.

There were three noteworthy atmospheric depressions accounting for short periods of disturbed weather, and these may be briefly described.

Although an anti-cyclone ruled in the north between the 1st and the 11th, relatively low pressure was in evidence during this period in the southern districts, and on the 6th and 7th this depression intensified considerably over the South Island, being responsible for somewhat boisterous conditions in and southward of Cook Strait. Some heavy rainfalls occurred about this time in Westland and Otago. Bluff recorded 5.57 in. for twenty-four hours up to 9 a.m. on the 7th, and some of the rivers in Otago rose to flood-level.

Between the 13th and 15th the passage of an intense Antarctic low-pressure area caused very stormy weather, heavy westerly gales prevailing on the 13th, changing to south-westerly on the 14th. Considerable rain fell, and on the 15th snow was also reported in various districts in the South and inland on the higher levels in the North Island.

The third unsettled period—viz., between the 26th and the end of the month—was the result of a disturbance located on the Tasman Sea, the centre of which passed down the west coast on the 28th and 29th. Dull skies and much mist and fog were experienced, with rain in scattered districts, but in Taranaki heavy rain fell on the two latter days.

A week of very fine weather was experienced from the 18th to the 25th, when a decided anti-cyclone held sway which, on the 21st, was remarkable for a central isobar of nearly 30.8 in. about Cook Strait.

Estimated Areas under Wheat and Oats, Season 1916-17.

Census and Statistics Office,
Wellington, 1st November, 1916.

IN submitting an estimate of the areas to be sown in wheat and oats this season it is deemed advisable to give the following explanation as to the new system being adopted for the collection of these statistics and as to the method of arriving at the estimates here given.

Formerly the agricultural and pastoral statistics were collected in the spring-time, but in 1916 these statistics were obtained after the harvest; the collections during the past few years were made by means of returns through the post, but in 1916 there was a holding to holding canvass throughout the Dominion by Police officers acting as Sub-Enumerators.

The areas sown or intended to be sown are estimated in the spring-time, the information on which the estimate is based being obtained by issuing cards through the post to every grain-grower of the previous season. Such of these cards as are returned are tabulated, and the proportion which the total areas so returned as sown or intended to be sown bears to the total areas actually reaped in the previous harvest by those persons is applied over the whole areas reaped at the previous harvest, and the result is taken as the estimated area for the ensuing season.

This briefly is the new system which will be continued in future, and the principal differences between it and the previous system are that the actual areas reaped and the actual yields are obtained in the harvest-time, and the areas sown or intended to be sown are estimated in the spring-time, whereas previously the actual areas sown or intended to be sown were obtained in the spring-time and the estimated yields obtained in the harvest-time. The average yields were applied to the areas obtained in the spring, which resulted in the total actual yield for the Dominion being frequently stated inaccurately.

For the estimate now being prepared, cards were sent out by post to 26,000-odd grain-growers in the Dominion asking

them to state the areas of wheat and oats which they had sown or proposed to sow for the present season. Of these, over 24,000 cards have been returned to the office and duly tabulated, with the following results:—

In the North Island 19,197 acres were under wheat last year, and cards representing 15,416 acres (or 80 per cent.) of this area have now been returned to the Census and Statistics Office. The growers returning these cards state that they have sown or intend to sow 5,937 acres in wheat this year, and assuming that those growers who have not yet returned their cards sow proportionate areas, the total area in wheat for the 1916-17 season should be 7,395 acres. Treating the figures for oats on the same basis it is estimated that a total of 76,208 acres will be grown this season.

Similarly, in the South Island 316,225 acres were under wheat in 1915-16. Cards representing 92½ per cent. of this area have been returned, and show a proposed 1916-17 area of 195,610 acres. It may, therefore, be assumed that in the South Island a total of 211,482 acres will be sown.

Oats harvested for all purposes in the South Island in 1915-16 covered 518,101 acres, and cards representing 91 per cent. of this acreage have been returned, showing an area of 428,379 acres. The estimated oat area for 1916-17 is therefore 472,318 acres.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Director: Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child: and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
