A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eight, the Town District of Upper Hutt was duly constituted and proclaimed under the Town Boards Act, 1908, with the boundaries described in the Schedule to the said Proclamation: tion :

And whereas it is expedient to enlarge the boundaries of the said town district in the manner hereinafter set forth, and which said enlargement does not exceed the limits prescribed by the said Act for the area of a town district: Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of

Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in me by the said Town Boards Act, 1908, do hereby enlarge the said Town District of Upper Hutt by adding thereto the area described in the First Schedule hereto, and do declare that on and after the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, the boundaries of the said town district shall be those described in the Second Schedule hereto.

# The Census and Statisties Act, 1910.—Agricultural and Pastoral Statistics.

Census and Statistics Office, Wellington, 22nd November, 1916.

The last complete collection of Agricultural and Pastoral Statistics was made in connection with the Census of 1911, since when particulars of certain principal crops only have been collected annually by post.

Statistics for the 1915-16 season were collected on behalf of the Census and Statistics Office by police officers acting as Sub-Enumerators, who made a holding-to-holding canvass throughout the Dominion. The figures given in the subjoined tables include all holdings of 1 acre and upwards outside of borough and town district boundaries.

The following tables give the areas in grain and pulse and green and root crops, and also the yields of these crops, for each county in the Dominion. The Dominion totals have already been published. Tables showing other cultivation and live-stock are in course of preparation, and will be published shortly.
