In pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Tobacco Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

GENERAL.

1. (1.) APPLICATIONS for the approval and appointment of buildings or premises to be used as bonded tobacco-factories shall be addressed to the Minister of Customs and forwarded through the Collector of Customs, and shall state the exact locality where such buildings or premises are situated, and shall contain or have annexed thereto a full description, with

shall contain or have annexed thereto a full description, with such diagrams or drawings as may be required by the Collector, of such buildings or premises.

(2.) The description shall set forth every separate room, cellar, shed, or other compartment of the buildings or premises, and shall specify what use is to be made of each, and shall contain a list and state the location of all tools, presses, machinery, and appliances proposed to be used therein in the manufacture of tobacco.

2. All buildings approved and appointed as a bonded

2. All buildings approved and appointed as a bonded tobacco-factory under the said Act must be sound and strong, properly lighted and ventilated, and windows must be secured by stout iron bars; those on the ground floor, in addition to iron bars, must have shutters made to open internally, with strong hinges thereon, and a cross-bar to each window. The

strong hinges thereon, and a cross-bar to each window. The principal entrance must be secured with two locks, one to be kept by the holder of the tobacco license and the other by the Collector of Customs.

3. Over the principal entrance of every building approved and appointed as a bonded tobacco-factory the designation "
[Stating name of factory] Bonded Tobacco-factory" shall be marked in oil colours on a dark ground in white or yellow letters, or on a light ground in black letters. Such letters shall be not less than 4 in. in length and of proportionate breadth. tionate breadth.

4. Every holder of a tobacco license shall provide a room to the satisfaction of the Collector, to be known as "the factory bulk store," in which all raw tobacco and materials for the manufacture of tobacco shall be placed and stored. Such tobacco and materials shall only be issued from the

* If all tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, and snuff are delivered for consumption from the factory as soon as they are ready for such delivery, these columns may be omitted

factory bulk store for manufacture in such quantities and at |

such times as the Collector permits.

5. No other business or work except that of manufacturing tobacco shall be carried on within any bonded tobacco-factory, and no such factory shall be in direct communication with any shop or premises wherein_duty-paid tobacco is stored or sold by retail.

6. A room or enclosed office in the factory, to the satisfaction of the Collector, shall, if so required by him, be provided for and devoted to the exclusive use of an Officer of Customs.

7. Suitable weights and scales or approved weighing-machines shall be provided by the holder of the tobacco license, and shall be kept in the factory for weighing tobacco and other materials received into and delivered from the

8 All raw tobacco and all materials for sweetening or flavouring or manufacturing tobacco shall, immediately on bonded tobacco-factory, be weighed

flavouring or manufacturing tobacco shall, immediately on being received into any bonded tobacco-factory, be weighed in the presence of an Officer of Customs if he so requires.

9. Every holder of a tobacco license shall, if required by the Collector, provide a room, to be known as "the tobacco-room," in which shall be stored all manufactured tobacco which is ready for delivery for consumption. If any dispute shall arise as to when any manufactured tobacco is so ready for delivery the decision of the Collector shall be final.

10. Any tobacco stored in the tobacco-room may, with the approval of the Collector, he returned to the factory, provided due entry thereof is made in the tobacco-manufacturer's book.

11. (1.) Any person other than a person growing and manufacturing tobacco solely for his own use shall, as soon as any raw tobacco grown by him is harvested, make a return to the nearest Collector of Customs showing the kind and quantity of such tobacco, the number and description of the packages (if any) in which it is packed, and the purpose for which it is intended to be used.

(2.) Before any such tobacco is removed from the premises on which it has been grown, notice as to the place to which it is to be removed shall be sent to the nearest Collector of Customs.

TOBACCO LICENSES.

12. Tobacco licenses shall be in the form set forth in the form No. 1 of the Schedule hereto. Any such license may, subject to the provisions of section 8 of the said Act, be renewed from year to year by payment of the prescribed fee to the Collector of Customs on or before the 5th day of January in each year.

TOBACCO-MANUFACTURER'S BOOK.

13. The book (hereinafter called "the tobacco-manufacturer's book") which is required to be kept by the holder of a tobacco license in accordance with section 9 of the said Act shall be in the form set forth in the form No. 2 of the Schedule hereto.

14. The tobacco-manufacturer's book shall be balanced to the satisfaction of the Collector on the last days of March, June, September, and December in each year. 15. Every holder of a tobacco license shall, not later than

the 10th day of January, April, July, and October in each year, render to the Collector a correct transcript from the tobacco-manufacturer's book of all entries made therein since tobacco-manufacturer's book of all entries made therein since the date of the last preceding return, verified by declaration in the following form made before an Officer of Customs, a Postmaster, or a Customs Agent:—

"I, [duly authorized agent of], the holder of a tobacco license for Bonded Tobacco-factory, do hereby declare that the foregoing particulars are true and correctly stated in every respect."

PENALTY.

16. If any person commits a breach of these regulations he shall be liable to a fine of £50.

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By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

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- Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
- Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child: and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
