Change of Name of Borough, Campbelltown to Bluff.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Council of the Borough of Campbelltown has, pursuant to section two of the Designation of Districts Amendment Act, 1909, passed a resolution that the name of such borough be changed to "Bluff":

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on me by the Designation of Districts Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the name of the borough now known as "Campbelltown" shall be and the same is hereby altered to "Bluff," and do assign the last-mentioned name to such borough accordingly; and also do hereby proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, not being earlier than six months after the first publication thereof in the *Gazette*.

WHEREAS by the River Boards Act, 1908, as amended by the River Boards Amendment Act, 1913, it is, among other things, enacted that the Governor may, on petition signed by a majority in number of the ratepayers of a river district, abolish any such district:

And whereas a petition signed as aforesaid has been duly presented, praying that the Castlepoint River District, established under the said River Boards Act, 1908, may be abolished:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the above-recited power and authority, do hereby proclaim and declare that, from and after the first day of February, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, the said Castlepoint River District shall be and the same is hereby abolished.

Union of Boroughs of Hamilton and Frankton.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the respective Councils of the Boroughs of Hamilton and Frankton, by petitions under the respective common seals of the Corporations of such boroughs, as provided by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, have prayed the Governor that such boroughs (forming one continuous area) be constituted one united borough:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, do hereby proclaim that the said Boroughs of Hamilton and Frankton are hereby constituted one united borough, by the name of the Borough of Hamilton, and also that the boundaries of the said borough so constituted and named shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto:

And I do also proclaim and declare that the said borough shall be an undivided borough, and that the number of Councillors to be elected to the Council thereof shall be twelve, exclusive of the Mayor:

And I do hereby appoint Edwin John Davey (the Town Clerk to the existing Borough of Hamilton) to be the Town Clerk and Returning Officer temporarily of the said united borough:

And I do also proclaim and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and from the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District bounded by a line along the left bank of the Waikato River from the Waitawhiriwhiri Stream to a point in line with the northern side of Boundary Road; thence across the Waikato River and along the northern side of Boundary Road to and across River Road; thence along the north-eastern side of River Road, 566·7 links; thence along the eastern and south-eastern boundaries of Allotment No. 3 on plan No. 4721, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland, and along the south-eastern boundary of Allotment No. 12 on the aforesaid plan to Casey's Avenue; thence along a right line across Casey's Avenue to the south-western corner of Allotment No. 20 on plan No. 4721 aforesaid; thence along the south-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment and Allotment No. 12 on plan No. 3014, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland, to Heaphy Road; thence across Heaphy Road and along the south-eastern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 24 and 33 on plan No. 3014 aforesaid and the south-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment produced to the middle of Peach Grove Road; thence along the middle of that road to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section No. 223A, Parish of Kirikiriroa; thence to and along the south-eastern boundary of that section and along its south-western boundary, the abutment of a road, and along the south-western boundaries of Sections Nos. 224, 225, 229, 230, 231, across a road, the south-western boundary of Section No. 251, the abutment of a road, and the south-western boundary of Section No. 254, Parish of Kirikiriroa, to the Waikato River; thence along the right bank of that river to a point in line with the north boundary of Section No. 24, Parish of Te Rapa; thence across the Waikato River and along the northern boundary of the said Section No. 24 to Ohapu Road; thence along the eastern side of that road to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section No. 26, Parish of Te Rapa; thence across the Ohapu Road and along the northern boundary of Section No. 26 aforesaid for a distance of 700 links; thence along a line at right angles to the last-mentioned boundary to Lake Hamilton; thence along the eastern and northern shores of Lake Hamilton to the northern boundary of Section No. 363; thence along the northern boundary of that section to the lake drain at its north-western corner; thence by the lake drain to and across the Main Trunk Railway line; thence by the railway-line to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section No. 371, Block I, Hamilton Survey District; thence towards the south-west by a right line to the southernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence by the south-western boundary of that section and that boundary produced to the western side of the Frankton-Tuhikarama Road; thence towards the west generally by the western side of the said road to its junction with the Frankton-Whatawhata Road; thence by the northern side of the last-mentioned road to the

Waitawhiriwhiri Stream, including Dinsdale's Bridge; thence by the said Waitawhiriwhiri Stream to the Waikato River, the place of commencement.

And whereas the Kanieri Power Company (Limited), a company incorporated under the Companies Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), desires to erect lines along the route hereinafter described, and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section :

4. NOTICES *re* EXTENSIONS, ETC.

Records of results of tests (Regulation 37), and notices *re* commencement of work (Regulation 44) and *re* extensions and alterations (Regulation 49), should be sent to the Under-Secretary, Public Works Department, Wellington, and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at Hokitika.

5. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

6. REQUIREMENTS OF WESTLAND COUNTY COUNCIL.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the Westland County except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Westland County Council.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby consent to the transfer of the fund held by the said committee entitled the "Ohura County Queen Carnival Fund" to the Auckland Provincial Patriotic and War Relief Association (Incorporated).

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

THE HONOURABLE JAMES ALLEN PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section one hundred and twenty-five of the Education Act, 1914, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the award of bursaries for the purpose of promoting the study and practice of Agricultural Science.

REGULATIONS.

AGRICULTURAL BURSARIES.

1. THE Minister of Education may grant bursaries under these regulations to duly qualified male students who desire to pursue a further course of agricultural study and practice. Such bursaries shall be termed agricultural bursaries.

2. No person shall be entitled to receive an agricultural bursary unless on the last date on which applications for a bursary are receivable he is over sixteen and not over twenty years of age, and has been resident in New Zealand for not less than twelve months, or unless he produces evidence satisfactory to the Minister as to character and health.

3. The term of a bursary shall be two years, if the holder so long fulfils the prescribed conditions; provided that on the recommendation of the Director or Manager of the farm or institution attended the Minister may extend the term for one year longer.

An agricultural bursary shall be tenable at a State experimental farm, an agricultural college, or some other similar institution under public control in New Zealand that the Minister may approve for the purpose.

4. Every applicant for a bursary under these regulations must satisfy the Minister—

(a.) That he has passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of New Zealand, or has passed some equivalent examination approved for the purpose by the Minister, or that he has received a higher or lower leaving certificate issued under the regulations respecting secondary-school certificates; and

(b.) That he has satisfactorily completed not less than two years of an approved agricultural or rural course at a secondary school or its equivalent, a technical high school, or the secondary department of a district high school:

Provided that if a sufficient number of candidates qualified under paragraph (b) are not forthcoming, a bursary may be awarded to a candidate otherwise qualified who satisfies the conditions of paragraph (a).

5. Every application for an agricultural bursary must be on the form provided, must reach the Director of Education, Wellington, not later than the 1st December in each year, and must be accompanied by the necessary certificates of birth and education.

6. Should the number of duly qualified candidates in any year exceed the number for whom accommodation can conveniently be provided, a selection shall be made from the candidates of those most qualified in such manner as the Director of Education shall determine.

7. Every holder of a bursary shall enter, by his parent or guardian, or some other person approved by the Director of Education, into a bond to return the amount paid in allowances and fees (including a sum at the rate of not more than £40 per annum for board and lodgings, when these are provided) in case he shall fail to complete satisfactorily the prescribed course, or fail to complete within five years after the close of his course service of not less than three years in New Zealand (a) as a teacher in a public, secondary, technical, or registered school, or in an agricultural college, or (b) as an officer in the Agricultural Department, or (c) in farming.

8. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these regulations, agricultural bursaries may be awarded without limit of age to students who have satisfactorily completed a course of at least one year at a training college for teachers, and in such cases the tenure of the bursary shall be for one year or two years, as the Minister of Education shall determine.

9. (1.) An agricultural bursary shall be of the annual value of £20, in addition to the amount of the tuition fees (if any) payable by the holder thereof in respect of the approved course of instruction.

(2.) If the holder of a bursary is obliged to live away from home in order to carry out the required course of instruction, he shall, in addition to the amount of the bursary and fees as aforesaid, receive a further allowance at the rate of £30 per annum.

(3.) If board and lodging are provided at the institution attended there shall be deducted from the amounts named in subclauses (1) and (2) an amount in payment therefor not exceeding £40 per annum.

10. An agricultural bursary shall not be tenable with a University Junior Scholarship or any other scholarship, bursary, or exhibition of the value of £20 a year or upwards.

11. If at any time the Director or Manager of the farm or institution at which the agricultural bursary is held reports that the holder has failed regularly to carry out the courses of agriculture required, or has failed to make satisfactory progress in the work, the Minister may forthwith determine the bursary, unless he is satisfied that such failure was due to illness or other sufficient cause; and on such determination no further payment or allowance under the regulations shall be made to the holder of such bursary.

Regulations for Deer-shooting, North Canterbury Acclimatization District.

LIVERPOOL, Governor.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in the North Canterbury Acclimatization District, and the conditions affecting the same, and also the form of license and the fee payable therefor.

REGULATIONS.

1. RED-DEER stags may be taken or killed within the North Canterbury Acclimatization District from the 2nd day of April, 1917, to the 10th day of May, 1917 (both days inclusive).

2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Christchurch, upon the recommendation of the secretary of the North Canterbury Acclimatization Society, on payment of a license fee of £5, in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and subject to the said Act and these regulations. The number of such licenses to be issued by the said Chief Postmaster shall not exceed ten. Provided that not more than one such license shall be issued to the same person; and also that if the number of applications received for licenses exceeds the number of available licenses, then the persons to whom such licenses are to be issued shall be decided by ballot.

3. No licensee shall take or kill more than three stags, and no stag shall be killed carrying antlers with less than ten points. Ball cartridge only to be used; provided that no metal-patched or metal-cased bullet shall be used for killing such deer.

4. No hind or fawn shall be taken or killed on any pretext whatever; and no licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant he may have with him.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to authorizing any person to sell any deer or portion thereof.

6. Regulations as to deer "tags," per *New Zealand Gazette* No. 40, Vol. I, of 20th May, 1909, page 1408, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the Secretary of the North Canterbury Acclimatization Society, Christchurch, immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with a statement of the number of deer shot.

7. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

Amendments to the Regulations under the Public Service Act, 1912.

IN pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby revoke clauses one hundred and one to one hundred and eight of the regulations made under the said Act on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, as amended by notice published in the *Gazette* of the eighth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and

in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto. The regulations hereby made shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS.

PROCEDURE ON APPEAL.

1. (1.) IN case of an appeal under the said Act the appellant shall, within the time limited by the Act, notify the Commissioner of his intention to appeal, and shall at the same time forward to the Commissioner, in duplicate, his case on appeal setting out concisely the grounds of his dissatisfaction with the decision appealed against.

(2.) The Commissioner shall, as soon as may be convenient, forward the appeal, together with his answer thereto, to the Chairman of the Board of Appeal. If in such answer the Commissioner consents to the appeal being allowed, the Board may decide accordingly without calling for the attendance of the appellant.

2. If in any case the Commissioner is of opinion that no ground of appeals exists he shall forward the notice of appeal to the Board, with an intimation to that effect, setting out his reason or reasons for such opinion, and if the Board concurs in such opinion the appellant shall be notified accordingly. If in any such case the Board considers there is a ground of appeal, then the matter shall be referred to the Solicitor-General for an opinion.

3. The sittings of the Board shall, if necessary, be held in Wellington on or about the first Monday in June and the first Monday in November in each year; the Board shall, on the application of the Commissioner, also sit at such other times and at such places as may be arranged.

4. The Chairman shall, as soon as practicable after the receipt of an appeal, forward to the appellant the answer of the Commissioner, and a notification of the time and place fixed for the hearing of the appeal, which time shall be at least ten days after the day such notice is posted to the appellant. If the appellant or his representative fails to appear at the hearing, the Board may determine the appeal in his absence on such evidence as is available. If he appears, the evidence shall be taken in his presence or in the presence of his representative, or both.

5. An appellant shall be entitled to be present at the hearing of his appeal, and if the appeal is allowed shall be entitled to expenses incurred in attending such hearing, not exceeding the rates set out in Regulation 109 of the regulations made on the 31st March, 1913; but if the appeal is not allowed, he shall not be entitled to any such expenses, unless the Board expressly directs that the whole or a portion of such expenses shall be allowed.

6. The Board of Appeal may, at the request of the appellant, allow any person to appear before them on his behalf.

7. A record of all evidence taken on any appeal shall be kept by the Board.

8. The Department may be represented by the Permanent Head, or by a senior officer of the Department nominated by the Permanent Head.

9. (1.) The Chairman of the Board may for the purposes of any appeal summon any officer of the Public Service whose evidence appears to be material to the determining of that appeal, and any person so summoned shall attend at such place and time as is specified in the summons, and produce any official or public books, documents, and writings in his custody and control which may be considered material to the appeal, and the Board may examine such person with respect to any matters relevant to the appeal.

(2.) The Board may, if it thinks fit, also hear the evidence of any person not being an officer of the Public Service.

10. Where the evidence of witnesses employed in remote localities is required, and where arrangements cannot conveniently be made for their attendance in person, or where they would be subjected to undue expense in travelling to appear before the Board of Appeal, the Chairman may appoint a competent person or persons to take the evidence of such witnesses concerning the matter of appeal.

11. The scale of allowances which may be paid to any witness summoned by the Board in respect of his travelling-expenses and

maintenance during his absence from his usual place of residence shall be the same as that allowed under the regulation for travelling-allowances.

12. If any officer interviews or communicates with any member of the Board, either directly or indirectly, in reference to any appeal which such officer has made, or may be about to make, such appeal shall not be considered by the Board.

13. The Chairman of the Board shall, as soon as possible after the appeal has been considered, forward the decision of the Board, together with all papers in connection with the appeal, to the Commissioner, who shall keep them as records of his office.

14. The Board shall notify the appellant of the result of his appeal.

15. Where, in the opinion of the Commissioner, the decision of the Board of Appeal in favour of an appellant may properly be applied in the case of any other officer or officers, the Commissioner may extend to such officer or officers the same advantage as has been granted to the appellant.
