Access is from two railway-stations on the Otago Central line—viz., Oturehua and Lauder. The distance from Oturehua is from nine to fourteen miles; that from Lauder is from nine to seventeen miles. There are formed roads from both places. The sections comprise undulating and ridgy land intersected by gullies. The greater part of nearly every section is ploughable. The soil is a black loam, good in places and light in places, on a clay, shingle, and sand formation. Generally speaking, the land is not well watered, but water might be obtained by sinking. The altitude is from 1,600 ft. to 2,200 ft. above sea-level.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1917.

With the exception of some places along the northern portion of Cook Strait and a few scattered stations in the South Island, the total rainfall was everywhere above the average, the greatest excess being in the northern and southernmost districts.

The two chief causes of excessive rains were both extra-tropical cyclones. One which ruled during the first few days of the month moved from the north-west down towards the West Coast of the South Island, and passed in the South on

The other passed in the Northern districts on the 21st, and was followed by a "secondary" centre, which was effective until the 25th. The latter disturbance was responsible for extremely heavy rain and flooded rivers in the Northern and East Coast districts of the North Island. Some of the northern stations recorded over 5 in. on three consecutive days viz., 21st, 22nd, and 23rd.

About the 16th a small anticyclone prevailed, and on the 21st and 22nd anticyclonic pressure ruled in and southwards of Cook Strait; otherwise atmospheric pressure was generally below normal, and in consequence dull skies were the rule.

Two white beacons, 24 ft. high, with a black diamond shape painted in their centres, have now been erected on North Head 30 ft. and 35 ft. respectively above H.W. mark; they bear when in line with one another 60½° (N. 45° E. magnetic) and lead vessels over the bar in safety. Recent soundings taken on the bar by steamers entering the river give the same soundings as previously obtained in 1916—viz., 6¾ ft. at M.L.W. springs.

After vessels have negotiated the bar and are bound inwards they should steer a course on the line of beacons and continue so until within three-quarters of a cable of the seaward beacon (this course will lead vessels clear of southern bank). They should then round in on the port helm keeping

They should then round in on the port helm keeping close to the northern shore of the river with the white beacons (which were previously painted red) and situated on the southern shore bearing when in line with one another 103° (N. 87½° E. magnetic). These beacons should be kept nothing open to the northward, as a soft (steep-to) mud-and-sand bank, which is not buoyed, exists on the port hand opposite Putataka Point.

The anchorage for vessels drawing from 10 ft. to 13 ft. is close in shore opposite the Courthouse and school, but vessels of less draught may anchor on quarter of a cable off the wharf. Vessels should not lie alongside the wharf at low water or half cbb tide, as several broken piles are standing up on end.

Bottom hard, coarse, black and white sand mixed with punice, and under this there is mud. Ebb tide runs at the rate of from four to six knots opposite inner bar beacon, and the flood from three to four and a half knots.

Any vessels drawing more than 13 ft. run a risk in negotiating the bar.
