1. To facilitate the delivery of letters, a letter-box should be affixed to every house-door. Any person whose residence

lies back from the street may be required at any time by the Chief Postmaster to provide a box on the street-line for the reception of mail-matter. In the case of rural deliveries, settlers off the road-line must either meet the mailman or provide a suitable box on the road-line in which their correspondence can be deposited.

And whereas the Pukekohe Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee"), desires to erect lines within the area of supply as defined in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter called "the area of supply," and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and hereinafter referred to as "the regulations," hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes within the area of supply hereinafter described, such electric lines at present proposed to be erected being indicated by means of red and broken red lines shown on the plan marked P.W.D. 41466, and deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Wellington Provincial District.

SCHEDULE.

1. AREA OF SUPPLY.

THE area of supply comprises the Borough of Pukekohe as at present constituted.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (b) (1) of clause 2 of the regulations.

The generating voltage shall be approximately 460 to 520 volts between the terminals.

## 3. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

4. NOTICES *re* EXTENSIONS, ETC.

Records of results of tests (Regulation 37), and notices *re* commencement of work (Regulation 44) and *re* extensions and alterations (Regulation 49), should be sent to the Under-Secretary, Public Works Department, Wellington, and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at Auckland.

## 5. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 9d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 5d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes. The charge herein of 5d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes shall be reduced to 4d. per unit in two years' time from the date of this license.

## 6. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The block is situated between Porangahau and Whangaehu Station (Mr. C. H. St. Hill's), the nearest point being two miles distant from the township and the farthest seven miles and three-quarters.

The district is all good grazing-ground, suitable for both sheep and cattle rearing.

The altitudes vary from sea-level to 1,000 ft., and the country comprises flat, undulating, and hilly land, giving shelter from south and westerly winds. There is no broken country on the block, except the face fronting the sea, which is a high terrace with steep sides.

Section 2, Block XVI.—Altitude, 30 ft. to 600 ft. above sea-level. Undulating to hilly, with good level and easy sloping uplands and foothills near Mangareia Stream and branch valley. Soil loamy clay, on clay formation; general quality of section is good; well watered for greater part of year. Distant two miles and three-quarters from Porangahau, of which one mile and a half is unformed.

Section 3, Block XVI.—Altitude, 70 ft. to 800 ft. Hilly country with easy sloping tops, and good flats near Mangareia Stream. #### DESCRIPTION OF SECTIONS.

Section 1, Block V.—Altitude, 150 ft. to 325 ft. above sea-level. Open pastoral land, for most part flat, with a little easy undulating country in native grass and scrub. Soil is clay generally, on papa formation, and is fair in quality, but stony in places; well watered by Tangaruhe Stream. Nine miles from Porangahau—three miles and a half by unformed road.

Section 3, Block VI.—Altitude, 200 ft. to 400 ft. Open pastoral country, flat terrace and undulating hills, in native grass and scrub. Soil is clay generally, on papa and rock formation; fairly well watered by Kaiparahorua Stream, but water will need to be conserved in summer. Nine miles from Porangahau—two miles by unformed road.

#### GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The block is situated between Messrs. Donnelly and Co.'s station on the south and Mr. J. D. Ormond's property on the north.

In the southern part of the block the nearest section is about six miles and the farthest about nine miles and a half from Porangahau Township, which contains a post and telegraph office, two stores, a saddler's shop, and a hotel. Waipukurau Borough and railway-station is about thirty-three miles distant.

There is a good metalled coach-road between Waipukurau and Porangahau, over which a daily motor mail and passenger service is maintained. From this road the access is via the Mangaorapa Road, which is gravelled, into the Manawaangi-angi Settlement, at a distance of about two miles and a half,

the access is then by the unformed and unbridged Te Uri Road line running through Messrs. Donnelly and Co.'s property, but over which carting is carried on via the station dray-track. Teams are constantly travelling into the Mana-waangi Settlement with supplies from the main road, and material is of easy transport to the sections generally.

Access to the northern portion of the block is by unformed road for a distance of two to three miles from Porangahau-Waipukurau main road.

The whole block is for the most part open country, in native grass, with mingi and manuka scrub throughout.

The altitude varies from 40 ft. to 600 ft. above sea-level, but the greater portion of the land lies at an elevation of 250 ft. to 350 ft.

The soil varies, but is of fair quality, though generally light, and in places is stony; the major portion is clay, resting on papa rock.

INSERT— *Weekly Twelve-trip Tickets.*

Weekly twelve-trip tickets are issued for distances not exceeding twenty-five miles. They are available for use only between the stations specified thereon, and will be issued only to persons resident in the neighbourhood of the issuing station and for use by the purchaser when travelling second class only.

They will expire on Saturday of the week in which issued, and are limited to one outward and one homeward trip per day. They are not available for break of journey nor for use on Sundays. No reduction in charge will be made for children. Holders of weekly twelve-trip tickets will be charged the full ordinary first-class fare when found travelling in first-class carriages.
