And whereas application has been made for the consent of the Governor in Council to enable the St. Kilda Borough Council to borrow a loan of two thousand pounds:

And whereas it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor in Council should issue:
Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby consent to the borrowing of the said loan by the St. Kilda Borough Council; provided that the rate of interest at which he loan is to be raised shall not produce to the lender a return exceeding five and one-quarter pounds per centum per annum; and it is hereby declared that this Order in Council is made under the provisions in that behalf of the Appropriation Act, 1915, and shall operate accordingly as a consent of the Governor in Council to the raising of the loan hereby authorized.

ARTHUR WILLIAM DE BRITO SAVILE, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, do hereby, in pursuance of the authority conferred upon me by the Military Service Act, 1916, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in that behalf, make the following regulations under that Act, and declare that they shall come into operation on the publication thereof in the Gazette.

### REGULATIONS.

HOME SERVICE BRANCH, NEW ZEALAND EXPEDITIONARY FORCE.

### Posting.

- 1. RESERVISTS called up for military service under the Military Service Act, 1916, and recruits who voluntarily enlist, are attested into the Expeditionary Force for general service, and shall be posted to the branches of that Force in the following manner:—
  - (a.) All reservists and recruits who are certified by the Medical Boards, or Medical Officers authorized to examine and report on their physical condition, to be "fit for active service beyond the seas" (category A, B 1, and B 2) shall be posted to the Foreign Service Branch.
  - (b.) All reservists and recruits who are certified by the said Medical Boards to be "permanently unfit for active service beyond the seas," but "fit for service in New Zealand in connection with or for the purposes of the present war" (categories C 1 and C 2) shall be posted to the Home Service Branch.

### Transfers.

- 2. Transfers between the branches of the New Zealand Expeditionary Force shall be carried out as follows:—
  - (a.) A reservist or recruit having been posted or transferred to the Home Service Branch, but subsequently certified by a duly authorized Medical Board to be "fit for active service beyond the seas," shall be transferred from the Home Service Branch to the Foreign Service Branch.
  - (b.) A reservist or recruit having been posted or transferred to the Foreign Service Branch, but subsequently certified by a duly authorized Medical Board to be "permanently unfit for active service beyond the seas," but "fit for service in New Zealand in connection with or for the purposes of the present war," shall be transferred from the Foreign Service Branch to the Home Service Branch.

Conditions of Service in the Home Service Branch.

3. Soldiers of the Home Service Branch will serve under precisely the same conditions as soldiers of the Foreign Service Branch, excepting that non-commissioned officers and men who are not quartered and rationed by the Department will be paid a lodging-allowance, as provided in Special General Order 174/1917; and that warrant rank will not be granted to any N.C.O. of the Home Service Branch.

### Leave.

4. Soldiers of the Home Service Branch who are not immediately required for service shall be granted leave without pay.

### Actual Home Service.

5. Until the Minister of Defence shall otherwise direct, soldiers of the Home Service Branch who are required for actual home service will be called up from those only who volunteer for such actual home service.

Volunteers belonging to such trades or occupations as may from time to time be specified by the Minister of Defence shall not be accepted for actual home service.

#### Records.

6. The records of the Home Service Branch will be held by the Director of Recruiting, who, when a soldier is called up for home service, will pass one copy to the Commander of the "section" or Camp Commandant concerned.

#### Mobilization.

7. Soldiers of the Home Service Branch will mobilize at their Group Headquarters or other specified centre when summoned by proclamation or posted orders.

# Provisional Organization and Establishments.

- 8. Soldiers of the Home Service Branch employed on actual home service will be organized in "sections" according to their military arm or the nature of their employment.
- "Sections" will be of irregular strength, and their establishment shall be as determined by the Commandant from time to time to meet the requirements of the situation in regard to the particular duties discharged. Establishments will be published in General Orders.
- "Sections" will be commanded by an officer detailed from the unit or branch of the service to which the "section" is attached, under the Officer Commanding the district or camp in which they are serving; in the case of "sections" attached to the R.N.Z.A., under the O.C. Regiment, R.N.Z.A.; and in the case of "sections" connected with branches at Headquarters, N.Z. Military Forces, under the director of the branch in which they are serving. Promotion in accordance with establishment may be made by the Officer Commanding the district, the Camp Commandant, or the director of the branch at Headquarters under whom the "section" is serving.

# War Organization and Establishment.

9. The war organization and establishment will be improvised to meet any situation which may arise.

10. The rate of pay and allowances in the Home Service Branch will be as laid down in Special General Order No. 174/1917, of the 2nd April, 1917.

# Dress.

11. Dress and rank badges will be as laid down for the Foreign Service Branch in New Zealand, excepting puggarees, which will be of khaki with a centre fold of black.

The following distinguishing patches will be worn on the left-hand side of the puggarees:—

In N pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations in force on the coming into operation of this Order relating to certificates of secondary instruction, and in lieu thereof doth make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereto; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

#### SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS FOR SECONDARY SCHOOL CERTIFICATES.

Intermediate Certificates.

1. To pupils taking a secondary-school course who, after gaining a certificate of proficiency or otherwise obtaining the educational qualification for a junior free place, satisfactorily complete at an approved school, being a secondary school, district high school, or technical high school, at least a two-years course of secondary instruction in accordance with the conditions set forth in clauses 6 and 7 (c) of the Regulations for Free Places in Secondary Schools and District High Schools, certificates of the satisfactory completion of such a course may be issued at the conclusion of the period to which they refer. Such certificates shall be termed "Intermediate Certificates," and shall be granted by or under the authority of the Director of Education, who shall satisfy himself in all cases, through the Principal of the school, or otherwise, that the conditions have been duly complied with. In general, no such certificate shall be granted unless evidence is given that the pupil is qualified by attainment to receive a senior free place in a secondary school, district high school, or technical high school in accordance with the regulations relating thereto.

# Lower Leaving Certificates.

2. Under the same authority, and subject in like manner to the conditions governing the tenure of junior and senior free places in secondary schools and district high schools, certificates, to be termed "Lower Leaving Certificates," may be issued to pupils who have completed at an approved school at least a three-years course of secondary instruction, including not less than one year of a senior course in which the standard of work pursued in the classes attended is sufficiently advanced in character to meet the requirements of the examination for a teacher's certificate of Class D or of the Matriculation Examination of the University of New Zealand; provided that the total units of work satisfactorily completed during three years shall be not less than 56, and shall include not less than 12 units in English, 9 units in Arithmetic (or 12 units in Mathematics, including Arithmetic), and 6 units in Science; provided further that no such certificate shall be granted unless evidence is given that the pupil has reached a reasonable standard of attainment in the classes.

# Higher Leaving Certificates.

3. Further, under the same authority, and subject in like manner to the same conditions, Higher Leaving Certificates may be issued to pupils who have satisfactorily completed at an approved school at least a four-years course of secondary instruction; provided that any such pupil has satisfied the requirements for a Lower Leaving Certificate, and in addition, has completed to good advantage a further secondary course of not less than one year, including therein at least 4 units of a standard higher than that prescribed for the Matriculation Examination of the University of New Zealand in English and 4 units of like standard in each of two other subjects selected from the following: Mathematics, Latin, Greek, French, German, Geography, Mechanics, Heat and Light, Electricity and Magnetism, Chemistry, Geology, Botany, Zoology, Physiology, Agriculture, Home Science; provided further that the total units

of work satisfactorily completed during four years shall be not less than 75.

### General.

4. A unit of work shall be taken, in consonance with the terms of the Regulations for Free Places in Secondary Schools, to denote school classwork of one hour per week regularly throughout the school year.

5. In ascertaining the total number of units satisfactorily completed, no units shall be counted in respect to any subject in which the minimum number of units as shown in the following table has not been obtained:—

- 6. These certificates may be obtained by any candidates who fulfil the required conditions, whether they have been holders of free places or not.
- 7. Applications for Leaving Certificates must in all cases be made within fifteen months after the pupil has fulfilled the required conditions, and must be sent through the Principal of the school attended, from whom a special recommendation may be required in support of the application. In the case of pupils from district high schools, the application must be sent through the Senior Inspector of the district.

### REGULATIONS.

1. Every person commits an offence and is liable to a fine of £50 or to imprisonment for three months who, not being registered in New Zealand under the Medical Practitioners Act, 1914, practises medicine or surgery, or any branch of medicine or surgery, in the Cook Islands, under the style or title of a physician, surgeon, doctor, licentiate in medicine or surgery, bachelor of medicine, or medical practitioner, or under any name, title, addition, or description implying that he holds any diploma or degree in medicine or surgery or in any branch of medicine or surgery, or is otherwise specially qualified to practise medicine or surgery or any branch of medicine or surgery.

2. Every person commits an offence and is liable to a fine of £20 who, not being registered in New Zealand under the Dentists Act, 1908, or under the Medical Practitioners Act, 1914, practises dentistry in the Cook Islands.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Cook Islands Act, 1915, make the following regulations accordingly; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall not apply within the Island of Niue, but shall apply within all the Islands of the Cook Islands other than the said Island; and doth hereby further declare that these regulations shall come into force in those Islands on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen.

### REGULATIONS.

1. (1.) The Resident Commissioner of Rarotonga may from time to time make such orders or give such directions as he thinks expedient for the isolation of persons affected with or suffering from leprosy or from any other infectious or contagious disease, or for preventing communication between them and other persons, or otherwise for preventing the spread of any such disease, and all such orders and directions shall have the force of law, and any breach thereof shall be an offence against these regulations.

(2.) The said Commissioner may for the purposes of these regulations appoint any place within the Cook Islands as a quarantine-ground for the isolation of persons affected with leprosy or with

any other infectious or contagious disease as aforesaid.

2. (1.) Whenever in any house or kainga any person is found to be sick of leprosy or of any infectious or contagious disease to which a direction or order of the Resident Commissioner under the last preceding clause relates, or whenever in any house or kainga as aforesaid any person is found to be suffering from any sickness the symptoms of which raise a reasonable suspicion that such sickness may be leprosy, or an infectious or contagious disease as aforesaid, the occupier or head of such house or kainga shall forthwith give notice thereof in writing to a Medical Officer or to the Resident Commissioner of Rarotonga, or to the Resident Agent for the island in which such house or kainga is situate.

(2.) Any person required by this regulation to give notice of any disease, who fails or neglects to give such notice for a period of twenty-four hours or more, shall be guilty of an offence against

these regulations.

3. (1.) Where a Medical Officer, or the Resident Commissioner, or a Resident Agent at any island has reason to suspect that leprosy, or any other disease in respect of which notice is required to be given pursuant to these regulations, exists in any house or kainga, and that such notice has not been given, the Medical Officer, Resident Commissioner, or Resident Agent, as the case may be, may visit and inspect such house or kainga and all persons therein.

(2.) Any person who wilfully obstructs or interferes with any such Medical Officer, Resident Commissioner, or Resident Agent in the course of such visit or inspection, or who prevents or seeks to prevent any such person from making such visit or inspection, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

4. Every person who commits an offence against these regulations shall be liable to a fine of £50 or to imprisonment for a

term of three months.

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SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH

TOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity) :-

- 1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing
- before learning to speak.

  Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.

  Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves hability to a fine.
