A PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in the Governor by the Marriage Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby abolish the existing marriage district known as the Kawhia District, and do proclaim and declare that the territory heretofore comprised within the said district is hereby divided anew into two marriage districts, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follows:—

KAWHIA DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north-west generally by the Aotea Harbour and the north-western boundary of the Moerangi and Matakowhai Block to the south-western boundary of Raglan County; thence towards the east generally by that county to Mahaukura Trig. Station, a right line thence to Te Ake-o-Hikopiro Trig. Station, and a right line to the easternmost corner of Section 1, Block VI, Pirongia Survey District; by the eastern boundary of that section, the eastern boundaries of Sections 1, 2, and 5, Block IX, and the road forming the eastern boundary of Section 6 and Te Rau-a-Moa Village to the northernmost corner of Section 8; thence towards the south generally by that section and Sections 12 and 11, Block IX aforesaid, and Section 2, Block XII, Kawhia North Survey District, to Te Kauri Stream, by that stream and Kawhia Harbour to the sea; and towards the west by the sea to Aotea Harbour, the place of commencement.

WAIHARAKEKE DISTRICT.

All that area in the Auckland Land District bounded towards the north by Kawhia Harbour from the sea to Te Kauri Stream, and by that stream to Section 2, Block XII, Kawhia North Survey District; thence by the northern boundary of that section and the northern boundaries of Sections 11, 12, and 8, Block IX, Pirongia Survey District, and the road forming the eastern boundary of Section 6 to the junction of roads at the easternmost corner of Te Rau-

Moa Village; thence by the northern boundaries of Sections 1, 4, 7, and 8, Block X, Pirongia Survey District; thence towards the east generally by the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned section to its south-eastern corner; thence by a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section 1, Block XIV, Pirongia Survey District, by the eastern boundary of that section and the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 1 and 2, Block II, Orahiri Survey District, and the northern boundary of Section 1A to its easternmost corner, by the south-eastern boundaries of Sections 1A, 5, and 7, Block II aforesaid, and the eastern boundaries of Blocks VI, X, and XIV, Orahiri Survey District, to the south-eastern corner of the said Block XIV; thence towards the south generally by the southern boundaries of Orahiri and Kawhia South Survey Districts to the northernmost corner of Section 3, Block IV, Maungamangero Survey District; thence by the production of the north-western boundary of that section to the southern boundary of Section 6, Block XVI, Kawhia South Survey District (Small Grazing-run 26); thence by Blocks XV, XIV, and XIII, Kawhia South Survey District, to the Marakopa River, and by that river to the sea; and thence towards the west generally by the sea to Kawhia Harbour, the place of commencement.

And I hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventeen.

*Regulations regarding Free Places in Secondary Schools and District High Schools.*

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this ninth day of July, 1917.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914, and all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the regulations made by Order in Council of the twenty-third day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, relating to the examination for junior free places in secondary schools, district high schools, and technical high schools, and also the regulations made by Order in Council of the second day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eight, relating to free places in secondary schools and district high schools, and in lieu of the latter doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto ; and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*, except with respect to clause six of the Schedule hereto, which shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen.

SCHEDULE.

1. A FREE place under these regulations is tenable at a secondary school or a district high school.

Such a free place is to be regarded as alternative with (not in addition to) a free place held on a corresponding qualification under the Regulations for Manual and Technical Instruction.

2. A secondary school shall be held to provide free places within the meaning of section 97 of the Education Act, 1914, if, in accordance with the Act and these regulations, it admits to such free places all qualified pupils who wish to attend such secondary school, called in these regulations "the secondary school"; provided that if any pupil is resident outside the education district in which the secondary school is situated it shall be at the option of the governing body of such secondary school to admit or to refuse to admit such pupil to a free place.

JUNIOR FREE PLACES IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS AND DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOLS.

3. Subject to these regulations a pupil shall be qualified to be a junior free pupil or the holder of a junior free place under the Act, if—

(a.) He is the holder of a Junior National Scholarship, or any other scholarship that the Minister shall approve for this purpose : Provided that the value of any such scholarship is not greater than £40 per annum in the case of any pupil who is obliged to live away from home in order to attend the secondary school or district high school, or than £15 per annum in any other case ; or if

(b.) He has qualified for a free place in the Junior National Scholarship Examination on such pass conditions as the Minister may from time to time determine. (NOTE.—To qualify in this examination a candidate must obtain not less than 75 marks in English, not less than 50 marks in arithmetic, and a total of not less than 400 marks in the whole examination); or if

(c.) Being not over fifteen years of age on the 1st December preceding the date of his admission to a free place, he has obtained a certificate of proficiency as defined by regulations under the Act, or an equivalent or higher qualification.

4. With regard to pupils qualified under clause 3 hereof—

(i.) The secondary school shall admit to a junior free place any pupil qualified under (a) or (b), unless such pupil can attend as a junior free pupil a secondary school nearer his home.

(ii.) The secondary school shall also admit any pupil qualified under (c), unless such pupil can attend a secondary school nearer his home, or unless it is shown to the satisfaction of the Minister that such pupil can obtain suitable instruction at a district high school or a technical high school.

(iii.) But the secondary school may admit, subject to such other conditions, if any, as the governing body, with the concurrence of the Minister, shall see fit, any pupil qualified under (c).

(iv.) Every district high school shall admit as a junior free pupil any pupil qualified under any of the paragraphs of clause 3 hereof, and no such school shall admit to a junior free place any pupil not so qualified.

5. (i.) A junior free place at a secondary school is tenable for two years from the 1st January preceding the actual date of admission as a free pupil, but in case of a holder who was under thirteen years of age on the 1st December preceding such date of admission the tenure of the free place may, on the recommendation of the principal of the secondary school, be extended to a third year. In no case, however, shall a junior free place be tenable after the holder has passed his seventeenth birthday: Provided that if the seventeenth birthday occurs during a school term the free place shall be tenable till the end of that term.

(ii.) A junior free place at a district high school is tenable until the end of the quarter in which the holder reaches his seventeenth birthday, but no longer.

6. The secondary school or district high school shall give to each holder of a junior free place under these regulations suitable instruction in subjects (1) English and (2) history and civics (Group I of the following schedule), in one of the subjects (3) or (4) of Group II, in one subject at least chosen from Group IV, and in not less than two other subjects chosen from Groups III, IV, and V, in such a way that the total number of units of work in a year is in general not less than 20: Provided that during the tenure of a junior free place subject (12), home science, shall be taken by every girl, whether attending a secondary or a district high school, and that subject (11), practical agriculture and dairy science, shall be taken by every boy attending a district high school with an average attendance of not more than seventy in the secondary department, unless it is shown to the satisfaction of the Minister that adequate provision for instruction in these subjects cannot be made, or that equivalent instruction of a vocational character is otherwise provided for.

Further, the school shall give to each free pupil suitable physical training, including where possible instruction in swimming and life-saving, equivalent to at least one unit annually.

NOTE.—This clause is not intended to be construed in such a way as to limit unduly the discretion of the principal of a school in determining the programme of a pupil, but any material departure from the course prescribed must be approved beforehand by the Director of Education.

#### Schedule.

##### Group I:—

- (1.) English, as for the Intermediate Examination, and including the general study of a fairly wide range of selected standard works in both prose and verse, reading and recitation, composition (both oral and written), grammar (so far as it bears directly on composition). The cultivation of correct habits of speech and of facility of expression, both oral and written, must receive special attention. . . . . 4, 5, or 6 units.
- (2.) History and civics, including the history of the British Empire in outline and the rights and duties of citizens so treated as to develop a sense of responsibility with regard to social service, and embracing generally more advanced instruction based on the course in civics recommended in the Syllabus of Instruction for public schools preparatory to a course in the elementary principles of economics to be taken at a later stage 1½ to 3 units.

##### Group II:—

- (3.) Arithmetic (including the arithmetic of business transactions) . . . . . 3 units;
- or (4.) Mathematics—viz., arithmetic, algebra, and geometry 4, 5, or 6 units.

##### Group III:—

- (5.) Latin . . . . . 3, 4, or 5 units.
- (6.) Greek . . . . . 3, 4, or 5 units.
- (7.) French . . . . . 3, 4, or 5 units.
- (8.) German . . . . . 3, 4, or 5 units.

Group IV :—

- (9.) Physical science—*i.e.*, one or more of the following :  
 elementary physical measurements, mechanics,  
 heat and light, magnetism and electricity, chemis-  
 try . . . . . 2, 3, or 4 units.
- (10.) Natural science—*i.e.*, one or more of the following :  
 physiology and hygiene, botany, zoology, geology . . . . . 2, 3, or 4 units.
- (11.) Practical agriculture and dairy science (one or both) . . . . . 2, 3, or 4 units.
- (12.) Home science, including elementary general science  
 relating to the home and domestic hygiene (not  
 less than 1 unit), together with one or more of  
 the following in conjunction with economical  
 household management: plain cookery, laundry-  
 work, needlecraft and garment-making, home  
 nursing . . . . . 2, 3, or 4 units.

NOTE.—To gain credit for any of the subjects (9) to (12) each pupil must give to individual practical work in that subject at least half the time devoted to instruction, and such individual practical work must not occupy less than thirty minutes in any one lesson.

Group V :—

- (13.) Geography, physical and political . . . . . 2 or 3 units.
- (14.) Geography, commercial (not to be reckoned if (13) is  
 taken) . . . . . 1 or 2 units.
- (15.) Plain cookery and laundry-work, if not included  
 under (12) . . . . . 1 or 2 units.
- (16.) Needlecraft and garment-making, if not included  
 under (12) . . . . . 1 or 2 units.
- (17.) Commercial correspondence and shorthand . . . . . 1 or 2 units.
- (18.) Book-keeping . . . . . 1 or 2 units.
- (19.) Woodwork or metalwork . . . . . 1 or 2 units.
- (20.) Drawing, one or more branches . . . . . 1 or 2 units.
- (21.) Any other subject prescribed in the Regulations for  
 Manual Instruction for S5 and upwards . . . . . 1 or 2 units.
- (22.) Singing . . . . . 1 or 2 units.
- (23.) Any other subject approved by the Minister . . . . . 1 or 2 units.

NOTE.—(i.) The work in any of the subjects (where not otherwise indicated) shall be equivalent at least to that prescribed for the Intermediate Examination so far as this is applicable.

(ii.) A "unit" denotes one hour a week regularly throughout the school year; provided that in the case of subjects (15) and (16) two hours a week for half the year may be counted as a unit.

(iii.) No credit will be given in any subject, for the purpose of clause 7 (c) hereof, for work in any year of less amount than the minimum number of units shown in the schedule above; but, subject to that condition, two lessons of forty minutes each may be counted as 1.3 units, three lessons of forty-five minutes each as 2.3 units, five lessons of fifty minutes each as 4.2 units, and so on, in each such case the nearest tenth of a unit being taken, provided that the minimum number of units prescribed for the subject is reached.

SENIOR FREE PLACES.

7. Subject to these regulations—(a.) A senior free place is tenable by any pupil who is the holder of a Senior National Scholarship, or of any other scholarship that the Minister shall approve for this purpose: Provided that the value of any such scholarship is not greater than £45 per annum in the case of any pupil who is obliged to live away from home in order to attend the school, or more than £20 in any other case.

(b.) A senior free place is tenable by any pupil who has passed the Matriculation Examination, or the Public Service Entrance Examination, or the Intermediate Examination; or has qualified for a pass in the examination for a Senior National Scholarship or any other scholarship that the Minister shall approve for this purpose.

(c.) On the recommendation of the principal of the secondary school, based on the school records and examination results for the year, or of an Inspector of Secondary Schools, or, in the case of a district high school, on the recommendation of the senior Inspector of the district, or in part on such a recommendation and in part on the results of a special examination, a senior free place may be awarded by the Director of Education to any pupil who has satisfactorily completed during the two years immediately preceding not less than 36 units of work as defined in the schedule to clause 6 hereof, such 36 units to include at least 8 units in English (Group I), 6 units in Group II, 4 units of a continuous course in Group IV, and, if a subject is chosen from Group III, not less than 6 units therein. In reckoning

units for this purpose, credit cannot be given for any subject in which less than 2 units have been completed during the two years, nor for any subject in which the conditions of the schedule to clause 6 have not been satisfied.

NOTE.—Applications to be admitted to the Intermediate Examination under paragraph (b), and applications for admission to senior free places under paragraph (c), must be sent on forms provided by the Education Department to the Director of Education before the 8th September.

8. (i.) The secondary school shall admit to a senior free place any pupil qualified under clause 7 hereof, unless such pupil can attend a secondary school nearer his home.

(ii.) Every district high school shall admit to a senior free place any pupil qualified under the before-mentioned clause, and no such school shall admit to a senior free place any pupil not so qualified.

9. A senior free place at a secondary school or district high school is tenable until the holder has reached his nineteenth birthday: Provided that if the nineteenth birthday occurs during a school term or quarter the free place shall be tenable until the end of that term or quarter.

10. The secondary school or district high school shall give to each holder of a senior free place more advanced instruction in the secondary subjects named in clause 6 hereof, and under the conditions set out in that clause, except that the proviso contained in the first paragraph of the clause shall not be held to apply, and that when the pupil reaches the standard required for a lower leaving certificate the requirements of the course prescribed may be deemed to be satisfied if the pupil receives at least 4 units of instruction of a higher standard in English, at least 4 units of like standard in each of two other subjects named in clause 3 of the regulations for secondary-school certificates, together with instruction in other subjects so selected in accordance with the provisions of clause 6 hereof that the total number of units completed each year is not in general less than 20.

#### GENERAL.

11. As a condition of admission to a free place, any candidate may be required to furnish to the principal of the school to which admission is sought reasonable evidence of good character.

12. Notwithstanding the foregoing regulations, the secondary school shall not be required to admit pupils to free places at any other time than the beginning of the school year, unless it shall seem expedient to the governing body of the secondary school to admit such pupils at any other time.

13. In case there shall not be sufficient accommodation at the secondary school for all pupils seeking admission to the school, those qualified as holders of scholarships under paragraph (a) of clause 3, and under paragraph (a) of clause 7 hereof, shall first be admitted, next applicants qualified by attainment for senior free places, and then the remaining applicants in such order as the Minister, after consultation with the Board, shall determine.

14. (i.) A free place, whether held at a secondary school or a district high school, or held partly at the one and partly at the other, shall be reckoned continuously from the date of the original admission of the pupil to a free place in the school first attended.

(ii.) Except as hereinafter provided or as the Director of Education may decide, any intermission of attendance exceeding a period of three months in duration shall be deemed to determine the free place; further, the free place held by a pupil whose attendance during any term or quarter falls below 50 per cent. of the possible total of attendance at the school shall, with a like exception, be deemed to have lapsed as at the close of the period specified.

(iii.) If, on a report from the governing body of the secondary school or from an Inspector of Schools, it shall appear to the Director that the attendance, conduct, diligence, or progress of any free pupil is not satisfactory, the Director may forthwith, or after due warning, determine the free place. In any case under review a special report may be required.

(iv.) Any junior or senior free pupil who has forfeited his free place shall not be eligible for a free place of the same kind, junior or senior respectively, at any other secondary school or district high school or at a technical school, nor shall any pupil who for any reason has forfeited his free place at a technical school be eligible for a similar free place in a secondary school or a district high school.

15. (i.) Except as provided for in clause 16 hereof, a holder of a free place at a district high school or a secondary school shall not be allowed to transfer his free place to another school of secondary instruction, whether a district high school, secondary school, or technical school.

Provided that, in special cases where it is shown to the Minister's satisfaction that the free pupil is unable to obtain at the secondary school or district high school he is attending instruction in the subjects required for the course of study he desires to follow, such free pupil may, with



the consent of the Minister previously obtained, continue his free place for the unexpired period thereof at another school—namely, a secondary school, or a district high school, or a technical school :

Provided, further, that a junior or senior free pupil who leaves a secondary school or a district high school to take up employment at any time before the completion of the tenure of his free place shall be eligible to continue his free place at a technical school for the unexpired period thereof.

(ii.) A pupil who has completed his tenure of a junior or senior free place at a secondary school, or district high school, or technical school shall not be eligible to hold a similar free place—junior or senior, as the case may be—at any secondary school, district high school, or technical school.

(iii.) Nothing in this clause shall be taken to prevent a pupil who has qualified for but has not entered upon a senior free place while attending a secondary or district high school from entering upon a senior free place at another school being a district high school, secondary school, or technical school.

16. (i.) Any free pupil whose parents, after his admission to the secondary school or district high school, shall remove more than five miles from the school at which his free place is held may continue to hold his free place at any secondary school nearer his home, or at any district high school or technical school; and such secondary school, or district high school, or technical school shall admit him accordingly on the same terms as if he had remained at the first-named school, provided that a secondary school shall not be required to admit under these circumstances a holder of a free place at a district high school who can attend another district high school or a technical high school.

(ii.) If any free pupil fails on account of illness to fulfil the conditions of his free place, or if any junior free pupil fails on account of illness to pass the examination or otherwise qualify for a senior free place, his free place may, with the approval of the Minister, be continued for another year, provided that the limits of age stated in clauses 5 and 9 hereof are not thereby exceeded. The fact of illness must be proved by evidence satisfactory to the Director of Education.

17. Any pupil who has held a free place at a district high school or secondary school that has been disestablished by the Minister, or that for any other reason has ceased to exist, may continue to hold his free place at another secondary school, district high school, or technical school; and such secondary school, district high school, or technical school shall admit him accordingly on the same terms as if he had remained at the first-named school; nevertheless, a secondary school may decline to admit such pupil if he can attend a secondary school nearer his home.

18. The programme of each free pupil under these regulations shall be determined by the principal of the school after consultation with the parent or guardian of the pupil: Provided that no such pupil shall be compelled to take Latin or to take more than one language besides English.

The programme of each free pupil shall consist not of a number of disconnected subjects, but of a group of subjects duly arranged in accordance with the pupil's capacities, surroundings, and probable future calling, as far as such a programme can be provided for with regard to the general circumstances of the school.

19. Free places under these regulations are not tenable with any other scholarships or free places, except as provided in clause 3 (a) or in clause 7 (a) hereof.

20. (a.) Payments of the grant under section 100 of the Education Act, 1914, shall be made at the end of each term or quarter of the secondary school, claims being made on forms provided by the Education Department.

(b.) The annual return of free pupils under these regulations shall be sent to the Director of Education not later than the 1st April in each year.

21. The principal of every secondary school or district high school shall keep record-cards, on the forms provided or approved by the Education Department, showing such information with respect to the course pursued and progress made by each free pupil as may be required; and in the case of transfer from one school to another the free pupil who is entitled to a transfer under these regulations shall be given his record-card duly filled up and signed, and no secondary school, district high school, or technical school shall admit such pupil to a free place until he produces his record-card. A record-card duly completed so as to form a certificate should be given to every pupil who has satisfactorily completed his course as the holder of a junior or senior free place, and such certificate must accompany every application for the transfer of a free place under the first proviso to clause 15 (i), or for the granting of a senior free place under clause 7 (c) or for the granting of a leaving certificate under the regulations relating to certificates of secondary instruction.

*Amending Regulations relating to the Registration of Births and Deaths in the Cook Islands.*

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-fifth day of June, 1917.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the nineteenth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, regulations were made relating to the registration of births and deaths in the Cook Islands: And whereas it is desirable to amend the said regulations in so far as they relate to the registration of deaths within the Island of Niue:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Cook Islands Act, 1915, doth hereby amend the regulations hereinbefore referred to in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. CLAUSE 10 of the regulations hereinbefore referred to is hereby amended by inserting, after subclause (1), the following new subclauses:—

“(1A.) On the death within the Island of Niue of any person who has not been attended by a medical practitioner as aforesaid, the Chief Medical Officer of Niue, or other Medical Officer authorized by him in this behalf, shall sign and deliver, or cause to be delivered, to the Registrar a certificate in the form No. 3A in the First Schedule hereto, or to the effect thereof, stating to the best of his knowledge and belief the causes of death (both primary and secondary) of the deceased.

“(1B.) For the purpose of enabling him to give such certificate the Medical Officer shall have the right to make such examination of the body of the deceased as he thinks fit, and any person who prevents a Medical Officer from making such examination, or who obstructs or interferes with a Medical Officer in such examination, shall be liable to a fine of five pounds.

“Provided that if any relative of the deceased objects to such examination being made, he may appeal to the Resident Commissioner of Niue, whose decision shall be final.

“(1C.) On the receipt by the Registrar of a medical certificate under the foregoing regulations, in the case of any person dying within the Island of Niue, the Registrar shall issue to such person as he deems entitled thereto an authority for the burial of the deceased. Every such authority shall be in the form No. 3B in the First Schedule hereto.

“(1D.) Every person who buries or causes to be buried any person who has died within the Island of Niue, without an authority in the form No. 3B having been first obtained as aforesaid, shall be liable to a fine of five pounds.”

2. The First Schedule to the said regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the form No. 3, the following new forms:—

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Christopher McKay, of Waipu (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark of the Waihoihoi Stream as a site for timber-booms; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 4799), showing the place where it is intended to construct such timber-booms, the area of foreshore and

land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose, and the manner in which it is proposed to carry out the work: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council: And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the licensee on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining thereon timber-booms constructed in accordance with the said plan, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the construction of the timber-booms, as shown on plan M.D. 4799.
3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1 in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.
4. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.
5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said timber-booms without payment.
6. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensee may be required to remove the timber-booms at his own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.
7. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned timber-booms in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, any lights that may be required by the Minister; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.
8. The licensee shall at all times give not less than twenty-four hours' notice to owners of boats using the stream above the site of the timber-booms of his intention to close the booms, and shall open the booms within six days of the date of closing same.
9. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said timber-booms and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such timber-booms, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.
10. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which may be sustained by any vessel or boat in passing the timber-booms, or by contact therewith, and which may be occasioned by any default or neglect on the licensee's part.

11. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said timber-booms for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
- (4.) Become bankrupt,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined; and upon such revocation the Minister may cause the said timber-booms to be removed, and may recover the costs incurred by any such removal from the licensee.

12. The construction of the timber-booms shall be deemed to be an acceptance by the licensee of the conditions of this Order in Council.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, place, put up, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued by the Governor in Council under that Act :

And whereas the Lion Brewery (Limited) (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect electric lines along the route defined in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter called "the said electric lines," and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and hereinafter referred to as "the regulations," hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain the said electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes.

2. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The generating voltage shall be approximately 460 to 500 volts between the terminals.

3. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 20 degrees Fahrenheit.

4. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby

granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

5. REQUIREMENTS OF LOCAL AUTHORITY.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the City of Auckland, except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Auckland City Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by section nine of the Apiaries Amendment Act, 1913 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations, *inter alia*, for the free registration of apiaries, and the terms and conditions of such registration: And whereas it is expedient to make regulations for such purpose accordingly:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him as aforesaid, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes aforesaid; and doth hereby declare that the said regulations shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. FOR the purposes of these regulations—

"Director" means the Director of the Horticulture Division of the Department of Agriculture, Industries, and Commerce:

"Apiary" means any place where bees are kept:

"Beekeeper" means any person who keeps bees or allows the same to be kept on any land occupied by him, or who has in his possession or allows to be kept on any land occupied by him any appliances that have been used in connection with apiculture.

2. Every beekeeper shall, on or before the 15th day of August, 1917, and in the month of June in the year 1920 and in every third year thereafter, make application to the Director in or to the effect of the form in the Schedule hereto, for the registration of his apiary; provided that in the event of—

(a.) any apiary being established, or

(b.) any apiary being transferred from one beekeeper to another,

subsequent to the gazetting of these regulations, application for the registration of such apiary must be made as directed within twenty-one days after such establishment or transfer has been effected.

3. Forms of application for registration of an apiary shall be obtainable, free of charge, from the Director, or from any District Agent or Apiary Instructor of the Department of Agriculture, Industries, and Commerce.

*Warrant vesting Control of Portions of the Main South Road in the Green Island Borough Council, and apportioning the Cost of Maintenance of Same.*

WHEREAS by section twelve of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, as amended by section thirteen of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1910 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is provided that where a road or street lies along the boundary of two or more districts, whether that road or street is wholly within one or is partly within one and is partly within another of those districts, or is within none of those districts, the Governor may from time to time by Warrant under his hand and gazetted, direct which of the local authorities of those districts shall have control of the road or street, or any part thereof, and also may in like manner determine from time to time whether any other of those local authorities shall contribute to the cost of construction, reconstruction, or maintenance of that road or street, and, if so, in what proportions: And whereas the portions of the road known as the main South Road firstly and secondly described in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter termed "the said portions of road," form part of the boundary between the Borough of Green Island and the Taieri County:

And whereas a dispute has arisen as to which local authority should have control of the said portions of road, and what proportion of the cost of maintaining the said portions of road should be borne by the local authorities affected:

And whereas an inquiry was duly held, and a report was made in respect to the matter:

And whereas it is expedient that effect should be given to the recommendations contained in the said report, and that provision should be made for the purposes and in the manner hereinbefore set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that from and after the date of this Warrant, the portions of road firstly and secondly described in the Schedule hereto shall be under the control of the Green Island Borough Council.

And, in further pursuance of the aforesaid powers and authorities, I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining the portion of road firstly described in the Schedule hereto shall be borne in the following proportions—viz., the Green Island Borough Council to bear forty-two and one-half per centum of such cost, the Taieri County Council to bear forty-two and one-half per centum of such cost, and the Dunedin City Council to bear fifteen per centum of such cost respectively; and that the cost of maintaining the portion of road secondly described in the Schedule hereto shall be borne

in the following proportions—viz., the Dunedin City Council to bear twenty-five per centum of such cost, the Green Island Borough Council to bear forty-five per centum of such cost, and the Taieri County Council to bear thirty per centum of such cost respectively.

And I do also further direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Dunedin City Council and the Taieri County Council shall be paid from time to time in the proportion hereinbefore described, out of the funds of the said Councils, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Green Island Borough Council, and that such payment shall be made from time to time to the Town Clerk, Green Island, for and on account of the said Councils.

FIRSTLY, all that portion of the main South Road in the Otago Land District, situated on the boundary between the Taieri County and the Green Island Borough, running from Thompson Street to the boundary between Sections 96 and 97 near Gunn's Corner.

And whereas a dispute has arisen between the local authorities hereinafter mentioned on the question of the maintenance of the road hereinafter mentioned: And whereas by the said section one hundred and twenty it is, *inter alia*, provided that the Governor may, with a view to determining what proportion (if any) of the cost of maintaining any work should be borne by any local authority, direct any Magistrate or other person to be a Commissioner to inquire into and report to him upon any matter which he shall deem necessary to enable him to determine any such question as aforesaid:

And whereas a Commissioner was appointed for the purpose aforesaid, and an inquiry was duly held:

And whereas such Commissioner did report to the Governor, after due inquiry, his opinion thereon:

And whereas the Governor-General is of opinion that it is equitable that the cost of maintaining the road mentioned in the Schedule hereto should be provided and paid in the manner and in the proportion hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do hereby direct that from and after the date of this Warrant the cost of maintaining the road described in the Schedule hereto shall be borne in the following proportions—viz., the Taieri County Council shall

pay fifteen per centum, the Dunedin City Council shall pay thirty per centum, and the Green Island Borough Council shall pay fifty-five per centum of such cost respectively. And I do hereby direct that any contribution hereby required to be made as aforesaid by the Taieri County Council and the Dunedin City Council shall be paid from time to time, out of the funds of the said Councils, within a period of thirty days after demand in writing made by or on behalf of the Green Island Borough Council, and such payment shall be made from time to time to the Town Clerk of the said borough for and on account of such Councils.

**N**OTICE is hereby given of the intention to hold Public Service examinations as follows, namely:—

The Public Service Entrance Examination: On or about the 21st November, 1917, and following days.

The Public Service Senior Examination: On or about the 5th January, 1918, and following days.

For the entrance examination a fee of £1 is payable, but this fee will be refunded if a candidate is successful in passing the examination and accepts employment in the Public Service.

This Senior Examination is held solely for the purpose of permitting those who hold a partial pass to complete the examination. Candidates who have not already obtained partial success will not be admitted. There will be no fee charged if candidates (a) are employed in Departments of the Public Service coming under the provisions of the Public Service Act, 1912; or (b) have passed the Public Service Entrance Examination of November, 1916, and have not declined appointment; or (c) have entered and sat for the Public Service Entrance Examination of November, 1917. In all other cases a fee of £1 will be required as an entrance fee for the examination.

Entries for the Public Service Entrance Examination and the Public Service Senior Examination must be addressed "The Director of Education, Wellington," and be sent so as to reach his office on or before the 8th September, 1917, and 15th October, 1917, respectively. Both male and female candidates will be admitted to the Entrance Examination.

Late applications, if accompanied in each case by a receipt for the late fee of £1 in addition to any fee ordinarily payable, will be received for the Entrance and Senior Examinations up to the 15th September and 31st October respectively.

All entries must be made on the proper forms, which may be obtained shortly from the office of the Public Service Commissioner, or of the Education Department, or of any Education Board.

THE annual collection of the agricultural and pastoral statistics for the season 1916-17 is now sufficiently advanced to enable fairly accurate figures to be given showing the results so far as the North Island is concerned.

The appended interim tables for the North Island are therefore published in order to give the earliest possible information regarding the principal crops and live-stock.

Complete returns have so far been received for sixty-one counties, but there are still some returns outstanding for the remaining twelve counties which comprise the North Island. The figures which have been adopted in these cases are estimated for the incomplete portion only, and the totals now given are therefore subject to slight revision on the complete returns coming to hand.

An interim return for the South Island will be published as soon as sufficient information is available.
