WHEREAS by section sixty-three of the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1913, it is, amongst other things, enacted that in no case shall any moneys be expended under the provisions of the said section sixty-three in connection with any block of land, unless that block is set apart for selection under that section pursuant to Proclamation in that behalf:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of every power and authority enabling me in this behalf, and for the purposes of the aforesaid Act, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim the land described in the Schedule hereto as set apart for selection.

Declaring Land taken for a Public Work, and not required for such Public Work, to be Crown Land.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by section thirty of the Public Works Act, 1908, that if it is found that any land held, taken, purchased, or acquired at any time under this or any other Act or Provincial Ordinance, or otherwise howsoever, for any public work is not required for such public work the Governor may, by an Order in Council publicly notified and gazetted, cause the same to be sold under the conditions therein mentioned:

And whereas it is further provided by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, that in the case of any land so taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work, and not required for that purpose, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without complying with any other requirements of the aforesaid section thirty, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

And whereas the land described in the Schedule hereto was taken for the purposes of a road: And whereas the said road has been stopped, and it is desirable to declare the land contained therein to be Crown land:

And whereas a plan has been prepared, and the Minister has recommended the Governor-General to declare such land to be Crown land:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon me by the above-in-part-recited Acts, and of all other powers in anywise enabling me in this behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl

of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and that such land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby direct that a poll shall be taken on the proposal that the area described in the Schedule hereto may be constituted a borough under the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908; and, further, doth hereby make the following appointments and arrangements for the purpose of taking the said poll:—

1. Francis Edwin Merlet, of Featherston, to be the Returning Officer for the purpose of taking the said poll, and also to be the person authorized to prepare a voters roll of the persons entitled to vote at the said poll.

2. The voters roll prepared and signed by the said Francis Edwin Merlet shall be the voters roll to be used at the said poll.

3. Each person on such roll shall have and may exercise one vote, and no more.

4. The said poll shall be taken on Thursday, the twenty-sixth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, at the office of the Featherston Town Board, Featherston, and shall close at seven o'clock in the afternoon of that day.

5. Except as herein provided, the said poll shall be taken as nearly as may be in the manner provided by the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1908, and the Returning Officer hereby appointed shall be deemed to be a Returning Officer appointed for the purposes of that Act.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act, 1913, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby direct that a poll shall be taken on the proposal that the area described in the Schedule hereto may be constituted a borough under the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908; and, further, doth hereby make the following appointments and arrangements for the purpose of taking the said poll:—

1. John Wheeler, of Whakatane, to be the Returning Officer for the purpose of taking the said poll, and also to be

the person authorized to prepare a voters roll of the persons entitled to vote at the said poll.

2. The voters roll prepared and signed by the said John Wheeler shall be the voters roll to be used at the said poll.

3. Each person on such roll shall have and may exercise one vote, and no more.

4. The said poll shall be taken at the office of the Whakatane Town Board on Wednesday, the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and shall close at seven o'clock in the afternoon of that day.

5. Except as herein provided, the said poll shall be taken as nearly as may be in the manner provided by the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1908, and the Returning Officer hereby appointed shall be deemed to be a Returning Officer appointed for the purposes of that Act.

Authorizing the Whangarei Harbour Board to reclaim Land between Haha Creek and the Railway-line at Kioreroa, Whangarei Harbour.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is provided by the one-hundred-and-fifty-eighth section of the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), that where a Harbour Board is desirous of executing or constructing upon lands vested in such Board or upon lands of the Crown any harbour-works of such a nature that the same could, but for this section, only be carried out and executed under the authority of a special Act, the Board may apply to the Governor-General in Council for a special order, and, if the Governor-General in Council thinks fit, such order may be made and granted:

And whereas the Whangarei Harbour Board (hereinafter called "the Board") is desirous of reclaiming from the sea certain lands between Haha Creek and the railway-line at Kioreroa, Whangarei Harbour, and the said harbour-works are of such a nature as aforesaid, and the Board has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a special order authorizing the execution of the said harbour-works:

And whereas the conditions precedent to the granting of a special order prescribed by the said Act have been duly performed and observed, and it appears expedient that such order should be made:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of

the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby authorize and empower the Board to reclaim from the sea in Whangarei Harbour lands containing eighty acres, more or less, of mud-flat, shown edged in red on plan marked M.D. 4693, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington; such reclamation to be carried out and constructed in accordance with plan marked M.D. 4693, subject to the provisions of the said Act.

And whereas application has been made for the consent of the Governor-General in Council to enable the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto to borrow the loans set out in column B therein :

And whereas it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council should issue :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby consent to the borrowing of the loans hereinafter mentioned by the several local authorities set out in the Schedule hereto, provided that the rate of interest at which the loans or any of them are to be raised shall in no case produce to the lender a return exceeding five and one-quarter pounds per centum per annum; and it is hereby declared that this Order in Council is made under the provisions in that behalf of the Appropriation Act, 1915, and shall operate accordingly as a consent of the Governor-General in Council to the raising of the loans hereby authorized.

WHEREAS by section four of the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is provided that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations under the said Act, the introduction into New Zealand, either generally or from any specified colony, country, port, or place, of any plant, fruit, fungus, parasite, insect, or any other thing which in his opinion is likely to introduce any disease into New Zealand:

And whereas hairy root, crown gall, or root-knot (*Bacterium tumefaciens*) is a disease within the meaning of the said Act:

And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor-General, the introduction of pear, apple, quince, or stone-fruit trees, cuttings, or buds into New Zealand from the Commonwealth of Australia is likely to introduce the said disease into New Zealand:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prohibit the introduction into New Zealand of pear, apple, quince, or stone-fruit trees, or of cuttings, buds, or any other portion of any such trees (except the fruit), from the Commonwealth of Australia.

And, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him as aforesaid, and acting with the like advice and consent, doth hereby declare that the regulations under the said Act made on the twenty-third day of August, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, shall be modified to the extent herein set forth; and doth also declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the ninth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 63, of the eighteenth day of the same month, the Leyland-O'Brien Timber Company (Limited), (hereinafter called "the company"), was licensed to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark of Wharekawa River, Thames County, for the purpose of using and maintaining thereon timber-booms, erected in accordance with plans marked M.D. 2062 (two sheets), and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, for a period of five years from the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and twelve:

And whereas the company has made application for a fresh license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), for a further term of five years, computed from the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and it is expedient to grant the same for the term and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the company as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the company to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and of the land below low-water mark immediately contiguous thereto, which is particularly shown and delineated on the plans so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of using the aforesaid timber-booms in connection therewith, such license to be held and enjoyed by the company upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. THE concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to the parts of the foreshore and the land below low-water mark necessary for such booms, as shown on the plans marked M.D. 2062, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department as aforesaid.
2. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the company shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £2 in advance, payable on the 1st day of March, dating from the 1st day of March, 1917, the first of such annual payments to be made on the company being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.
3. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said booms without payment.
4. The company shall maintain the said booms in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at its own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.
5. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said booms and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the company a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such booms, requiring it, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed,

to repair the same, it shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

6. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the company to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulations of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

7. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for the term of five years, computed from the first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the company shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

8. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company.

9. The company shall be liable for any injury which the said booms may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on its part.

10. In case the company shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said booms for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Be in any manner wound up or dissolved; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 2 of these conditions,—

then and in any such case this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege thereby conferred, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the company or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the company, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

11. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

Special Regulations for Deer-shooting, Wellington.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the conditions under which certain red-deer may be destroyed in the following parts of the Wellington Acclimatization District, namely :—

All that area commencing at the Onoke Lake, thence northward along the west side of the Wairarapa Lake to Featherston, thence along the railway-line to Eketahuna, thence eastward in a direct line to the sea at Castlepoint, thence northward along the coast to the Waimata River, thence in a direct line westward to Mangatainoka, thence westward to Palmerston North, thence along the railway-line to Paekakariki, thence south-east to the sea at Petone, thence along the coast to the point of commencement at the Onoke Lake.

Also all that area within a line commencing at the mouth of the Kawhatau River, thence westward along the river to its source at the summit of the Ruahine Ranges, thence northward to Motopuha, thence westward to Te Rotoiti, thence southward to Moawhango, thence to the point of commencement at the mouth of the Kawhatau River.

REGULATIONS.

1. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in the regulations made under the Animals Protection Act, 1908, the secretary of the Wellington Acclimatization Society at Wellington, or any person or persons duly authorized in writing by such secretary, may, during the period hereinafter mentioned, kill within the said areas red-deer of either sex and of any age which in the opinion of the said secretary or of the said authorized persons should be destroyed either by reason of age, deformity, or other physical imperfection.

2. Such deer may be destroyed as aforesaid during a period of two months from the date hereof.

3. A return shall be furnished to the Minister of Internal Affairs by the said secretary within one calendar month after the expiry of the aforesaid period, and such return shall state the number and sexes of all red-deer so destroyed as aforesaid, the dates, and name of the person by whom and the locality in which the deer were destroyed, together with a statement of the money received from the sale of such deer.

4. The bodies of such deer may be sold either by auction or otherwise and the proceeds devoted to the "Red Cross Fund."

5. Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

EXAMINATION OF MASTERS AND MATES.—NOTICE TO CANDIDATES.

Marine Department,
Wellington, N.Z., 11th July, 1917.

IT has been decided to introduce certain changes into the examination of candidates for certificates of competency as master or mate. References are to the current 1910 edition of the Regulations relating to the Examination of Masters and Mates (Exn. 1).

I. The following changes will take effect on 1st September, 1917:—

1. *Signalling.*—Candidates for all foreign-going and home-trade certificates will be required to attain a minimum speed of eight words a minute in semaphore and five words a minute in Morse flashing and flag-waving.

2. *Chart-work.*—Candidates for all foreign-going and home-trade certificates will be required to work satisfactorily all the chart problems indicated in Appendix G of Regulations for Examination of Masters and Mates.

3. *Definitions.*—The separate paper on definitions (Appendix C) will be discontinued; and instead, candidates will be required to give a figure and explanation for each problem worked.

II. The following changes will take effect on 1st January, 1918:—

4. *Navigation.*—The whole of the examination in navigation will be brought under the marks system. A specified

time will be allotted for each paper (see paragraph 11 of this notice), and papers will not be returned to candidates for correction. Candidates will be required to obtain 85 per cent. of the total marks in order to pass.

5. *Second Mate.*—Candidates for certificates as second mate will be required to answer questions on plane trigonometry and elementary *viva voce* questions on the main parts of a ship's construction; and, in place of the present dictation paper, to write a short essay on some simple subject.

6. *First Mate.*—Candidates for certificates as first or only mate will be required, in addition to the work for the second mate's certificate, to answer questions on right-angled spherical trigonometry and more advanced questions on the main parts of a ship's construction and their general use.

Law of Storms (paragraph 37 (m), Appendix H).—The paper on the law of storms in the examination for certificates as first mate or master will be replaced by a paper on meteorology.

7. *Master.*—Candidates for certificates as master (foreign-going) will be required, in addition to the work for the first mate's certificate, to answer questions on ship construction and naval architecture, and a few elementary questions on stability (for standard text-book see Appendix Q, to which might be added “Know Your Own Ship,” by Thomas Walton, published by Charles Griffin and Company, Exeter Street, Strand, London), and to write a short essay on some suitable subject. The questions on the deviation of the compass (Appendix I) will be remodelled.

8. *Extra Master.*—Candidates for certificates as extra master will be required, in addition to the work for the master's

certificate, to answer more advanced questions on naval architecture, including ship construction and stability; questions on magnetism as relating to the compass; and a paper on general knowledge, including shipping business, imports and exports, astronomy, and general elementary science (except chemistry).

Signalling.—Candidates for the extra master's certificate and for the voluntary examination in signalling will be required to attain a minimum speed of twelve words a minute in semaphore and ten words a minute in Morse flashing; the minimum speed for Morse flag-waving remaining at six words a minute.

9. **Home-trade Mate.**—The examination will include all the chart-work and the use and adjustments of the sextant.

10. **Home-trade Master.**—Candidates will be required to find compass corrections by amplitude of the sun and by time azimuth of a star, by the aid of Blackburne's Star Azimuth and Reduction Tables; also the position of ship by two stars at twilight, or by one star combined with the bearing of a distant mountain, headland, or sounding, by the aid of the previously mentioned tables.

11. **Time allowed.**—The time allowed for the written and worked portions of the examinations for foreign-going and home-trade certificates will be arranged as follows:—

A regular luncheon interval will be given each day between 1 p.m. and 2 p.m., the *viva voce* and practical parts of the examinations being taken at such times as may be convenient.

Second Mate.—Paper on navigation and nautical astronomy, 3 hours; nautical astronomy and trigonometry, 2 hours; chart-work, 3 hours; essay, 1 hour.

First or Only Mate.—Paper on navigation and nautical astronomy, 3 hours; nautical astronomy and trigonometry, 2 hours; chart-work, 3 hours; Sumner problem and meteorology paper, 2 hours.

Master.—Paper on navigation and nautical astronomy, 3 hours; nautical astronomy and trigonometry, 2 hours; chart-work, 3 hours; Sumner problem and meteorology paper, 2 hours; compass-deviation, 1½ hours; naval architecture, 1½ hours; essay, 2 hours.

Extra Master.—Paper on navigation and nautical astronomy, 3 hours; nautical astronomy and trigonometry, 2 hours; chart-construction, 3 hours; chart-work, 2 hours; naval architecture and stability, 3 hours; magnetism, 2 hours; general knowledge, 3 hours; essay on meteorology or other subject as may be selected, 2 hours.

Home-trade Mate.—Arithmetic paper, 2 hours; chart-work and navigational papers, 3½ hours.

Home-trade Master.—Arithmetic paper, 2 hours; chart-work, 3 hours; nautical astronomy and deviation questions, 4 hours.

TOKOMARU BAY.—ANCHORAGE BEACONS AND LIGHTS.

Marine Department,
Wellington, 17th July, 1917.

THE Tokomaru Harbour Board have notified that it is intended to erect lighted beacons to be used in conjunction with the present leading beacons and lights to mark the best anchorage position in Tokomaru Bay. The front beacon will consist of the Tokomaru Freezing-works iron chimney, which is painted with red oxide, and the back beacon a wooden triangle painted white. At night these beacons will be lighted by electricity. The front chimney beacon will show a *green fixed* light and the back beacon a *white fixed* light. These lights will be of small candle-power, so as to reduce the distance of visibility to the requirements of anchorage beacons. The lights will be visible from seaward all round the horizon except where they are obscured by land. The beacons in line with one another bear 356½° (N. 18½° W. magnetic). Ships may enter the bay with present leading-beacons in line, and anchor when they get the proposed new beacons in line.

Height of front beacon green light about 120 ft., and of the back beacon white light about 225 ft. Distance from H.W. mark: Front beacon, 198 ft.; back beacon, 891 ft. These lights will be shown on and after 1st September, 1917.
