And whereas it is further provided by section five of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1909, that in the case of any land so taken, purchased, or acquired for a Government work and not required for that purpose the Governor-General may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without complying with any other requirements of the aforesaid section thirty, by Proclamation declare such land to be Crown land subject to the Land Act, 1908, and thereupon the land may be administered and disposed of under that Act accordingly:

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this tenth day September, 1917.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section twenty-six, subsection one, of the Appropriation Act, 1915, it is provided that, notwithstanding any Act to the contrary, it shall not be lawful or competent for any local authority or for any Harbour Board, during the present war with Germany, to borrow or contract to borrow any money (otherwise than by way of bank overdraft within the limit of its powers, if any, in that behalf) whether from the State Advances Office or from any

other source whatever, and whether in pursuance of a special Act or under any other authority whatever, without the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas application has been made for the consent of the Governor-General in Council to enable the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto to borrow the sums set opposite the names of the said local authorities respectively, for the several purposes specified in the said Schedule, from the State Advances Office:

And whereas it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council should issue:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby consent to the borrowing from the State Advances Office of the loans hereinafter mentioned by the several local authorities set out in the Schedule hereto for the purposes specified in the said Schedule; and it is hereby declared that this Order in Council is made under the provisions in that behalf of the Appropriation Act, 1915, and shall operate accordingly as a consent of the Governor-General in Council to the raising of the loans hereby authorized.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, place, put up, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued by the Governor-General in Council under that Act:

And whereas the New Zealand Refrigerating Company (Limited) (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect electric lines in Section 5, Block V, Westmere Survey District, and Balgownie Avenue, Gonville, as defined in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter called "the said electric lines," and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive

1. THE ROUTES OF THE ELECTRIC LINES.

THAT route commencing at the engine at the dynamo-room of the New Zealand Refrigerating Company (Limited) in Section 5, Block V, Westmere Survey District, and running in a northerly direction generally to the said company's office in the said Section 5.

4. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

5. REQUIREMENTS OF THE GONVILLE TOWN BOARD.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use the said electric lines within the Gonville Town District except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, or any variation of this license or the regulations, or new regulations which may take the place of these regulations, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Gonville Town Board.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), William McCraith, of Pukehuia (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the said Act to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Pukehuia, Wairoa River, Kaipara Harbour, in order to erect and maintain a wharf thereon; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-and-fiftieth section of the said Act, has deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 4826), showing the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied, and the manner in which it is proposed to erect the said wharf:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act, for the purposes aforesaid, on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said wharf is to be erected, as shown on the plan M.D. 4826 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining the said wharf, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the erection of the said wharf, as shown on the plan marked M.D. 4826.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of 10s., in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall, at all reasonable times and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at his own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof, and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the wharf, he shall, with all convenient speed, cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Such notice

shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions herein before set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Fail to pay the sum specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
- (4.) Become bankrupt, or be in any manner brought under the operation of any law in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy,—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. The erection of the said wharf shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

Amending Regulations governing the Appointment, Promotion, and Gradation of Members of the New Zealand Expeditionary Force.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority conferred on me by the Defence Act, 1909, its amendments, and the New Zealand Expeditionary Forces Act, 1915, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby amend, in the manner and to the extent set forth in the Schedule hereto, the regulations published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the seventh day of September, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, governing the appointment, promotion, and gradation of members of the New Zealand Expeditionary Force.

SCHEDULE.

1. PARAGRAPH 23 is hereby amended by adding, after the words "The New Zealand Medical Corps," the words "The New Zealand Dental Corps."

2. After paragraph 28 add—
"28A. An officer holding the appointment of Adjutant is not eligible for the grant of temporary higher rank, under the provisions of paragraphs 15 (b) and (c), whilst performing

the duties of an officer absent through wounds, sickness, or other cause, unless and until he has not only relinquished his appointment of Adjutant, but has also performed the absent officer's duties for thirty days after such relinquishment."

All machines for grinding planing-irons or moulding-irons.

EXTRACT FROM *London Gazette*.

HIS Majesty's Minister at Rio de Janeiro reports that for the purpose of obtaining the release of cargoes on board the German vessels which originally took shelter in Brazilian ports, the owners of such cargoes should forward the documents in support of their claims thereto to their representatives in Brazil, for presentation to the Inspector of Brazilian Customs. The documents must be authenticated by a Brazilian consular officer. It is added that cargo which may be cleared in transit for other countries is subject to payment of freight and transit dues.

Any further information on the subject which may be received from His Majesty's Minister will be published in the *London Gazette*.

NOVA SCOTIA, SOUTH-EAST COAST.—EGG ISLAND APPROACH.—SUBMARINE BELL-BUOY ESTABLISHED.

Position.—At a distance of about three-quarters of a cable northward from Egg Island light and whistle buoy. Lat. 44° 35' 20" N., long. 62° 49' 37" W., on Chart No. 2439.

Description.—A buoy with lattice superstructure, fitted with a submarine bell.

Remarks.—The bell is sounded in an irregular manner by the motion of the buoy on the waves.

PANAMA.

PANAMA BAY.—TABOGA ISLAND.—MORRO ISLAND.—TIDE-GAUGE AND BENCH-MARK ESTABLISHED.

On 19th June, 1917, an automatic tide-gauge was established on Morro Island in the Bay of Panama, on the eastern side of the Pacific Steam Navigation Company's dock.

A cast-steel snubbing-post set in concrete, located 10 ft. north and 10 ft. east of the shore end of the dock, was used as the bench-mark. An X mark in the top of the post is at an elevation of 26.75 ft. above the zero of the gauge staff.

SOUTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

NEW CALEDONIA.—NOUMEA.—METEOROLOGICAL SIGNALS.

Position.—Lat. 22° 16½' S., long. 166° 27½' E.

Noumea wireless-telegraph station transmits every day, including holidays, on the wave-length of 2000 metres, two meteorological reports, one at 11 a.m. and the other at 11 p.m., Greenwich mean time, which are made up as follows:—

I.

The reports contain the date of the meteorological station of the peninsula of Point Venus, followed by a group of eight figures.

The first three figures give the atmospheric pressure in millimetres and tenths of millimetres, the figure denoting hundreds of millimetres being omitted; as a general example the figure 542 would indicate 754.2 millimetres.

The fourth and fifth figures indicate the direction of the wind (Table A).

The sixth figure gives the strength of the wind (Table B).

The seventh figure gives the state of the sky (Table C).

The eighth figure gives the state of the sea (Table D).

In cases where any of the particulars are not known each of the relative figures is replaced by the letter X.

Notice to navigators concerning alterations of light-vessels or light-buoys, the presence of derelicts, and the disappearance of light-buoys or important buoys, and any other information in regard to navigation, will be added, as occasion arises, to the report. It will be sent out in English and French.

III.

The reports will be transmitted three times in succession; the first time transmission will be made rapidly, the second and third times slowly.

IV.

A safety signal will be transmitted to ships at any hour of the day or night, repeated at short intervals ten times on full power: "Tahiti T.T.T.," followed by advice of cyclones, typhoons, or derelicts, or any sudden changes in the position or form of fixed obstructions or of land marks. The message will be repeated three times with intervals of ten minutes.

Remarks.—Vessels having a greater draught than 24 ft. are advised to round the light-buoy at a distance of about three-quarters of a cable.

The wreck of a steamer lies sunk in 32 fathoms of water in (approximately) latitude 6° 47' 30" N., longitude 79° 45' E.

HONSHU, SOUTH-EAST COAST.—KATSUURA APPROACH.—LIGHT ESTABLISHED.

Position.—On the 187 ft. summit, situated about 4¼ cables eastward from Hachiman-zaki. Lat. 35° 8¼' N., long. 140° 19¼' E.

Abridged description.—Lt. gp. fl. (2) ev. 30 secs., 231 ft., vis. 22 m.

Characteristics:

Character.—A group flashing white light showing two flashes every thirty seconds—thus, 2 flashes 8 secs., eclipse 22 secs.

Elevation.—231 ft.

Visibility.—22 miles; from 228° (S. 52° W. mag.) through west to 72° (N. 76° E. mag.).

Power.—36,000 candles.

Structure.—White octagonal concrete tower, 60 ft. in height.

Remarks.—The summit on which the lighthouse is erected is locally known as "Hiramegadai."

Variation.—4° W.

Hector Observatory Bulletin 8.—Astronomical Tables for the Year 1918.

AT APPARENT NOON.—1918.

Hector Observatory,
Wellington, N.Z., 1st September, 1917.

THE astronomical tables for the year 1918 are published for general information. They are interpolated from the British Admiralty Nautical Almanac. They give the New Zealand date, the Sun's apparent declination, the Sun's apparent right ascension, and the Greenwich mean time at apparent noon for the meridian of the Hector Observatory and the Greenwich astronomical date.

By means of the auxiliary tables* the sun's apparent right ascension and the Greenwich mean time at apparent noon for any other meridian in New Zealand may be readily obtained, and the times of sunrise and sunset for any place in New Zealand may also be approximately determined.

The adopted position of the transit instrument at the Hector Observatory is longitude 11 h. 39 m. 4.27 s. (= 174° 46' 4") east of Greenwich, latitude 41° 17' 3.8" south, height 418 ft. above 1909 mean sea-level.

New Zealand Civil mean time is for the meridian 11 h. 30 m. east of Greenwich,† and is reckoned from midnight to midnight. Midnight is 0 h. or 24 h., and noon is 12 h. Hence to determine New Zealand Civil mean time at apparent noon it is necessary to subtract 30 m. from the Greenwich mean time given in the tables.

Temperatures were well above the average, while barometric pressure was considerably below; the lowest reading for the month was on the 20th, when a pressure of 28.927 in. was recorded. Total bright sunshine 70 hours 35 minutes, and nine sunless days. Frost was recorded on the grass on six mornings. The mean earth-temperature at 1 ft. was 50°, and 51.8° at 3 ft. Mean dew-point, 46.9°; mean elastic force of vapour, 0.322 in.; and mean relative humidity, 90 per cent. of saturation.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JULY, 1917.

In the East Coast districts of the North Island, Otago, and in parts of Westland the total rainfall did not reach the average, but elsewhere a considerable excess was recorded.

Numerous atmospheric depressions were in evidence, particularly during the latter half of the month, and the barometer remained continuously below normal until the last day.

On the 20th, when a cyclone held sway, some exceedingly low barometer readings were reported, especially about Cook Strait.

Except in the districts above mentioned, very unsettled and wet weather prevailed, but nearly all parts of the Dominion experienced mild temperatures.

Owing to the neutralizing effect of the various "lows" on each other, the average velocity of the wind was less than what might have been expected in a month having so many disturbances.
