Altering Boundaries of Hawke's Bay, Wairoa, and Taupo East Counties.

LIVERPOOL, Governor-General. [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection two of section three of the Counties Amendment Act, 1913, that the boundaries of any one or more counties may be altered in accordance with a resolution proposing the alteration passed by the Council of each of such counties in which the principal Act is in force: And whereas a resolution was passed by the Hawke's Bay County Council on the thirteenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and sealed with the seal of the said county on the same day: And whereas a similar resolution was passed by the Wairoa County Council on the tenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and sealed with the seal of the said county on the same day, praying for an alteration of the boundaries of such counties by the exclusion from Wairoa County and the inclusion in Hawke's Bay County of the area described in the said resolutions and in the First Schedule hereto. And whereas a resolution was passed by the Hawke's Bay County Council on the thirteenth day of August, one thou-sand nine hundred and seventeen, and sealed with the seal of the said county on the same day, praying for the inclusion in Taupo East County of that part of Hawke's Bay County described in the said resolution and in the Second Schedule

And whereas a resolution was passed by the Wairoa County Council on the tenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and sealed with the seal of the said county on the same day, praying for the inclusion in Taupo East County of that part of Wairoa County described in the said resolution and in the Third Schedule hereto:

And whereas the Counties Act is not in force in Taupo East County:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the boundaries of the said counties in the manner described in the said resolutions and the said Schedules hereto:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred on me by the said Counties Amendment Act, 1913, as amended by the Counties Amendment Act, 1915, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the First Schedule hereto, being now part of the County of Wairoa, shall on and from the twelfth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, be added to and

form part of Hawke's Bay County, and that the area described in the Second Schedule hereto, being now part of Hawke's Bay County, shall on and from the aforesaid date be added Bay County, shall on and from the aforesaid date be added to and form part of Taupo East County, and that the area described in the Third Schedule hereto, being now part of Wairoa County, shall on and from the aforesaid date be added to and form part of Taupo East County; and, with the like power and authority, do proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the Counties of Taupo East, Wairoa, and Hawke's Bay respectively shall on and from the said twelfth day of October, one thous and nine hundred and seventeen, be those set forth under their respective headings in the Fourth Schedule hereto. FIRST SCHEDULE.

AREA ADDED TO HAWKE'S BAY COUNTY.

ALL that area bounded towards the north-west generally by a line along the middle of the Mohaka River; towards by a line along the incide of the Monaka River; towards the north-east by the north-eastern boundary of Run No. 6, in Block V, Waitara Survey District, and of Heru-a-Tueea Block, to and along the middle of the Waikare River to the sea; towards the south-east by the sea; and towards the south-west by the present north-eastern boundary of the Hawke's Bay County to the Mohaka River, the place of commencement commencement.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

AREA ADDED TO TAUPO EAST COUNTY.

ALL that area bounded towards the north-west by the present boundary of East Taupo County from the Napier-Taupo Road to the south-western corner of Whakatane County; thence towards north-east generally by a right line to a point on the Te Hoe River at the south-eastern corner of Heruiwi No. 4 Block, and along the middle of the said Te Hoe River to its confluence with the Mohaka River; towards the south-east by a line along the middle of that river; and towards the south-west by the present north-eastern boundary. towards the south-west by the present north-eastern boundary of Hawke's Bay County.

FOURTH SCHEDULE. TAUPO EAST COUNTY.

ALL that area in the Auckland, Hawke's Bay, and Welling. ton Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at a point on the north-western shore of Lake Taupo, being the mouth of the Waihora Stream; thence along a right line to Trig. Station 807 (Oraura), along a right line to Trig. Station 31 (Paeroa), and a right line to Trig. Station 76a (Tawhiwau); (Paeroa), and a right line to Trig. Station '6A (Tawhwau); thence along a right line running in the direction of Trig. Station 69 (Tatarakino) to its intersection by a right line from a point where the Napier-Taupo Road crosses the Rangitaiki River to the most northerly point of Lake Waikaremoana; thence along a right line to a point on the Te Hoe River at the south-eastern corner of Heruiwi No. 4 Block, and along the middle of that river to and along the middle of the Mohaka River to its intersection by the production of a right line running from Trig. Station 65A (Kaweka Range) to 68A; thence along the said right line to Trig. Station 65A, a right line thence to Trig. Station 26 Tayle Station 65A, a right line thence to Irig. Station 25 (Tawheketewhango), a right line to Trig. Station 27; thence along a right line to Trig. Station 28 (Manukaiapu), a right line to Ruapehu Trig. Station, a right line to Trig. Station H (Paretetaitonga), a right line thence to Trig. Station D (Ngauruhoe), a right line to Tongariro Trig. Station, and thence along a right line to the western shore of Lake Taupo at the mouth of the Waihi Stream; and along the western shore of Lake Taupo to the mouth of the Waihora Stream, the place of commencement.

WAIROA COUNTY.

All that area in the Hawke's Bay and Auckland Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at the northernmost point of Lake Waikaremoana; thence along a right line running in the direction of Puketapu Trig. Station B (Patuawahine) at the easternmost corner of Small Grazing-run 107, and along the north-eastern boundary of that run to the Mohaka River, to and along the middle of that river to its confluence with the Te Hoe River, along the middle of the Te Hoe River to the south-eastern corner of Heruiwi No. 4 Block; thence along a right line to the south-western corner Block; thence along a right line to the south-western corner of Whakatane County; and thence along a right line to the northernmost point of Lake Waikaremoana, the place of commencement: including Portland Island, and excluding the Borough of Wairoa.

HAWKE'S BAY COUNTY.

All that area in the Auckland, Hawke's Bay, and Wellington Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at a point in the middle of the Rangitikei River where it is intersected by the southern boundary of Taupo East County; thence along the southern boundary of that county, hereinbefore described, to and along the south-western boundary of Wairoa County, hereinbefore described, to the sea at the mouth of the Waikare River; thence along the seashore to the northeastern corner of Patangata County; thence along the boundary between Hawke's Bay County and Patangata, Waipawa, and Rangitikei Counties, as described in the New Zealand Gazette of the 1st September, 1904, page 2113, to and along the middle of the Rangitikei River to the southern boundary of Taupo East County, the place of commencement: excluding the Boroughs of Napier, Hastings, and the Town Districts of Havelock North and Taradale. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twenty-third day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and published in the New Zealand Gazette of the twentysixth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, the boundaries of the County of Rangitikei and Borough of Marton were altered by the exclusion of a certain area from the Borough of Marton and the inclusion of such area in the County of Rangitikei: And whereas it is desirable that the area so added to the County of Rangitikei should be included in the Porewa Riding of that county.

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section twenty-two of the Counties Act, 1908, do hereby declare that the area included as aforesaid in the County of Rangitikel shall on and from the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, be included in the Porewa Riding of the said county, and that the boundaries of that riding shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto. hereto.

- (e.) When a member leaves his place of residence and returns thereto the same day, actual and reasonable living-expenses for the period of necessary absence.

The following are the regulations referred to:--

NAPIER PARK RACING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf conpursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf toll-tained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Napier Park Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admishereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the club's property situate in the District of Hawke's Bay, and known as the Napier Park Racing Club's Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

2. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:—

or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:—
(a.) Bookmakers.

(b.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference.

(c.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

The foregoing regulations of the Napier Park Racing Club were made and passed by the said club on the third day of September, 1917, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
