

is expected to give place after the expiry of the first five minutes.

The instructions posted up in the cabinet directing users as to the procedure to be adopted to obtain connection must be precisely observed, otherwise the connection will not be made even if an assurance is given that the coin has been deposited.

At the type of machine in which the coin is deposited before the exchange is called, the wanted line will be tested, and if the line is found to be engaged, or if no answer can be

got from the called subscriber, the coin will be returned by means of the "reject" apparatus. ** At the type of machine where the exchange is first called and the coin is afterwards deposited at the request of the attendant, the wanted line will first be tested and the sub-scriber's attention assured before the request is made to

The examination paper on this subject, as stated in circular 1574, will include questions on shipping business, imports and exports, astronomy, and general elementary science, and will be set with the object of ascertaining whether candidates for the Extra Master's Certificate have been advancing themselves generally in matters relating to their profession. It is not proposed to set any stereotyped ques-tions. tions.

be on any subject of general scientific, philosophic, or topical interest. It is set solely in order to enable the Examiner to judge the candidate's spelling, composition, and know-ledge of the English language; and the candidate's view upon the subject set should not be taken into account as a basis for more the account of conditions of conditions of upon the subject set should not be taken into account as a basis for marking. In the case, however, of candidates for masters' certificates the essay will be on some general subject relating to the candidate's profession, and will be set not only to test his knowledge of the English language, but also to test his knowledge of the subject. A fresh subject should be given at every examination in order to prevent candidates from attempting to prepare stereotyped answers beforehand. In the Board's opinion the choice of subjects for essays for the examinations, both for second-mates' and for masters' certificates may be left to the Examiner.
