A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the

Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the lands described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said lands should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereunder shall be scenic reserves under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

ALL that area in the Auckland Land District, containing by admeasurement 92 acres, more or less, being Section 30, Block VIII, Waipoua Survey District. WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the lands described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said lands should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the lands described in the Schedule hereunder shall be scenic reserves under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

Regulations under the Statute Law Amendment Act, 1917, and the Prisons Act, 1908.

[L.s.] LIVERPOOL, Governor-General.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section sixteen of the Statute Law Amendment Act, 1917, that, in addition to the powers conferred upon him by section eight of the Prisons Act, 1908, the Governor-General may by Proclamation make regulations prescribing the matters set out in the said section sixteen:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said section, and of every other power and authority enabling me in this behalf, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the regulations hereinafter set forth; and do hereby declare that the said regulations shall come into force on the tenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen.

REGULATIONS.

1. SUBJECT to the control of the Minister of Justice, the administration of the Prisons Act, 1908, shall be carried out by the Inspector of Prisons, who shall also be responsible to the Minister for the general management and government of the prisons and the safe custody of the prisoners therein.

2. The prisons or other institutions established under the Prisons Act, 1908, shall be classified as follows:—

(a.) Prisons and gaols—

Prisons of all grades, except as hereinafter provided.
Special prisons or prison camps.
Police-gaols.

(b.) Institutions—

Borstal institutions.

Reformatories for men.

Reformatories for women.

3. The prisons at Invercargill, Waikeria, and Addington shall from the date of the coming into operation of this regulation be classified as institutions, and be known by the following distinctive names, viz. :—

The Invercargill Borstal Institution.

The Waikeria Reformatory for Men.

The Addington Reformatory for Women.

4. All other prisons, special prisons or prison camps, and police-gaols shall retain the names under which they have been proclaimed as prisons or police-gaols in terms of section 4 of the Prisons Act, 1908.

5. The officers in charge of prisons or other institutions shall be known by the following titles, viz. :—

Officers in charge of prisons of the first and second grades, of Borstal institutions, and of reformatories shall bear the title "Superintendent."

Officers in charge of all other prisons, special prisons, prison camps, or police-gaols shall retain the title "Gaoler" or "Police-gaoler."

The Matrons in charge of the female divisions of prisons where prisoners of both sexes are confined shall retain the title "Matron."

6. The powers and duties of Superintendents of prisons or institutions and of Gaolers and Police-gaolers shall be those conferred upon such officers by the Prisons Act and the regulations made thereunder.

Female Superintendents shall have and exercise all the powers and duties conferred upon Gaolers by the Prisons Acts and regulations, except where such powers and duties are inapplicable to the prisons or institutions under the control of such female Superintendents.

BY virtue of the powers and authorities vested in me by the twenty-sixth section of the Public Reserves and Domains Act, 1908, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion

of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, do hereby order and declare that the reserve for recreation in the Auckland Land District described in the Schedule hereto shall be and the same is hereby brought under the operation of and declared to be subject to the provisions of Part II of the said Act; and such reserve shall hereafter be known as the Waipapakauri Domain, and be managed, administered, and dealt with as a public domain.

Amending Regulations for Examination of Locomotive and Traction Engine Drivers.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the twentieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 37, of the sixth day of the following month, regulations were made regarding the examination of engine-drivers under the Inspection of Machinery Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"):

And whereas, owing to the difficulty in getting certificated drivers on account of the war, it is desirable to alter the age at which candidates for certificates of competency for locomotive and traction engine drivers may be examined :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby delete the following words in clause fifty of the said regulations, viz. :—

"(1.) Be at least twenty-one years of age";
and doth hereby substitute the following words in lieu thereof :—

"(1.) Be at least nineteen years of age."

Regulations under the Registration of Aliens Act, 1917.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this fifth day of November, 1917.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

IN pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him in that behalf by the Registration of Aliens Act, 1917 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations under and for the purpose of the said Act; and, with the like advice and consent, doth declare that the said regulations shall come into force on the date of the gazetting thereof.

REGULATIONS.

1. EVERY application by an alien for registration under the said Act shall be in the form R.A.-1 in the Schedule hereto, and shall be made by delivering the same personally to the Registration Officer nearest to his place of abode, or, in the

case of the master or a member of the crew of a vessel, to the Registration Officer at the port where that vessel may be.

2. Every certificate of registration under the said Act shall be in the form R.A.-2 in the Schedule hereto.

3. Every Registration Officer shall keep, in the form R.A.-3 in the Schedule hereto, a record of applications for registration received and certificates of registration issued by him.

4. Every notice by an alien of the change of his place of abode shall be in the form R.A.-4 in the Schedule hereto.

5. The Register of Aliens shall be compiled and kept in accordance with the card system, the cards to be arranged in the alphabetical order of the surnames of the aliens, and to be kept in cabinets containing such number of boxes as the Government Statistician from time to time thinks necessary. The boxes shall be numbered consecutively. The cards shall consist of the duplicates of the applications by aliens for registration.

6. Every alien shall give the particulars relating to his personal description set out in the form of application for registration.

7. Every alien who is unable to write shall, in the presence of the registration officer, place an impression of his left thumb on both forms of his application for registration, and on his certificate of registration, in the space provided for that purpose.

8. Every alien leaving New Zealand shall deliver up his certificate of registration to an officer authorized to issue permits to leave New Zealand, or to a Registration Officer, who shall forward the same forthwith to the Government Statistician.

9. The following aliens are hereby exempted from the operation of the said Act and these regulations:—

(a.) All Consuls representing any foreign country, and their staffs, in so far as the staffs comprise persons who have been sent by the Government of the foreign country for employment on the staff of the consulate; provided that nothing herein contained shall serve to exempt from the operation of the said Act or these regulations any Consul of any country with which His Majesty is at any time at war, or any member of his staff:

(b.) Any person or the member of any Commission coming to New Zealand for any purpose on behalf of the Government of a foreign country, where such person or Commission is duly recommended to the good offices of the Government of New Zealand by such foreign Government:

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-third day of October, 1917.

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, George Campbell, Robert Campbell, and William Campbell, of Totara North (hereinafter called "the licensees"), have applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark of the Wairakau Stream as a site for timber-booms; and, in accordance with the one-hundred-

and-fiftieth section of the said Act, have deposited a plan in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington (marked M.D. 4842), showing the place where it is intended to construct such timber-booms, the area of foreshore and land below low-water mark intended to be occupied for such purpose, and the manner in which it is proposed to carry out the work:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas it is expedient that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the licensees on the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and by and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark which is particularly shown and delineated on the plan so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining thereon timber-booms constructed in accordance with the said plan, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark necessary for the construction of the timber-booms, as shown on plan M.D. 4842.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensees shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £2 in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall continue in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the previous written consent of the Minister first obtained.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, over, and out of the said timber-booms without payment.

6. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the licensees may be required to remove the timber-booms at their own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

7. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned timber-booms in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at their own cost, any lights that may be required by the Minister; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

8. The licensees shall at all times give not less than twenty-four hours' notice to owners of boats using the stream above the site of the timber-booms of their intention to close the booms, and shall open the booms within six days of the date of closing same.

9. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said timber-booms and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensees a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such timber-booms, requiring them, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

10. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which may be sustained by any vessel or boat in passing the timber-booms, or by contact therewith, and which may be occasioned by any default or neglect on the licensees' part.

11. In case the licensees shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said timber-booms for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions; or
- (4.) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy—

then and in any of the said cases this Order in Council, and every right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensees or other proceedings whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the rights and privileges thereby conferred, have been revoked and determined; and upon such revocation the Minister may cause the said timber-booms to be removed, and may recover the costs incurred by any such removal from the licensees.

12. The construction of the timber-booms shall be deemed to be an acceptance by the licensees of the conditions of this Order in Council.

RESOLUTION.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Cheviot Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Cheviot Racing Club's property situate in the district of Cheviot, and known as the Cheviot Racecourse, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

In pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Egmont Racing Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the racecourse reserve situate at Waihi Road, Hawera, and set apart for racing purposes, and known as the Egmont Racecourse, and hereinafter called "the said racecourse," while the same is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "race-course," "race meeting," and "racing club" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

2. The following persons shall be and hereby are excluded from the said racecourse while the same is used or occupied by the said club for racing purposes, namely:—

(a.) Bookmakers.

(b.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Racing Conference.

(c.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

(d.) Professional sweep-promoters.

The foregoing regulations of the Egmont Racing Club were made by the said club at its general meeting held on the 26th day of July, 1917, and confirmed at a special meeting held on the 27th day of September, 1917, and signed by—

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, NEAR SUMNER, CHRISTCHURCH.

UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Director: Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

FOR Deaf Children of sound intellect. The pupils are taught to understand and use ordinary speech. The full charge for board and education is £40 a year, but less is accepted from parents who cannot afford to pay this amount. In case of necessity admission is free.

By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
