1. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business on the first Tuesday in each month, at half past three o'clock p.m., at the District Lands Office, Christchurch, or at such other time or place as may from time to time be fixed by the Board. The first meeting shall be held on Tuesday, the fourth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen.

2. Special meetings may be convened by the Chairman, provided that two days' notice of such meeting is given to each member, specifying the business to be transacted at such special meeting; and no other business than that so specified shall be transacted at such meeting.

3. Any four members of the Board shall form a quorum. Any meeting may be adjourned from time to time.

4. The Commissioner of Crown Lands shall be the Chairman of the Board, and may join in the discussion, and shall have an original as well as a casting vote.

5. The Board shall prepare and submit at an annual meeting to be held in the month of April in each year a report of the proceedings of the Board for the previous year ending on the thirty-first day of March, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure of the Board for such year. A copy of every such report and statement, certified by the Chairman to be correct, shall be sent to the Minister in Charge of Scenery Preservation as soon as possible after each annual meeting.

6. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the same, the members present shall choose one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.

7. If, by resignation, death, incapacity, or otherwise, the seat of any member shall be or become vacant, or if any member absents himself, without reasonable cause, from three consecutive meetings of the Board, the Governor-General shall have power to appoint any other person to be a member of the Board in his stead.

8. All questions shall be determined by the majority of votes of the members of the Board present at a meeting.

9. The Board shall control the said reserve in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the regulations made thereunder.

ordinary high-water mark of the said river, and the sea-coast by ordinary high-water mark of the Bay of Plenty, to the point of commencement. The hereinbefore-mentioned line of ordinary high-water mark shall be deemed to cross the mouths of any tributaries of the said Whakatane River. SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1917.

A common feature of October weather that has again been exemplified is the frequency of strong westerly winds, particularly in and southwards of Cook Strait. This is brought about by the number of westerly areas of "low" pressure passing in the south while "high" systems have persisted in the north.

On this account excessive rainfall was recorded in the west coast and southern districts of the South Island, and also about Cape Egmont and north of Auckland. All other parts of the Dominion experienced less than the average total rainfall. Boisterous and wet conditions prevailed about the 6th and 7th, and between the 21st and 23rd.

From the 26th to the end of the month dull, misty weather was experienced, and during this period considerable precipitation took place.

The longest period of settled weather prevailed between the 12th and 17th, when anticyclonic pressure held sway. Generally the month was a good spring one, with a mean temperature slightly above the average.

*Regulations relating to the Importation of Potatoes into the Commonwealth of Australia.—Notice No. 1904.*

Department of Agriculture, Industries, and Commerce,  
Wellington, 22nd November, 1917.

THE following particulars, taken from the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* of 18th October, 1917, of the restrictions on the importation of potatoes into the Commonwealth are published for general information:—

The regulations published in the *Commonwealth of Australia Gazette* of 29th July, 1911, are repealed, and it is now proclaimed that the importation of potatoes into any part of Australia from any country is prohibited unless—

1. They are accompanied by an official certificate, dated and signed by a responsible officer of a Government Department of the country of origin, identifying the potatoes, specifying the quantity, and certifying—

(a.) That at the date of the issue of the certificate they were free from *Phytophthora infestans* (known as Irish blight), *Synchytrium endobioticum* (known as potato-canker, black scab, warty disease, and cauliflower disease in potatoes), *Spongospora subterranea* (known as powdery scab), and all other serious diseases;

(b.) That they were grown in the country named;

(c.) That they were grown on premises known after due investigation not to be or to have been during the preceding twelve months infected with any of the said diseases;

(d.) That they were packed in the country of origin in clean, new packages:

2. The bags, crates, or other packages containing the potatoes are marked on the outside with the name of the country of origin and with other distinguishing mark or marks:

3. The potatoes, after being landed, are planted in quarantine in a quarantine station, and after having matured are, with the product of their cultivation, found on inspection to be free from disease.

Provided that no consignment of potatoes shall exceed 14 lb. in weight.

Provided further that the Minister may permit potatoes which are certified by a Quarantine Officer to be free from disease to be imported under and subject to such conditions as the Minister may think fit to impose, for use as food.

- (c.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.
