WHEREAS it is enacted by the Town Boards Act, 1908, that the Governor-General may declare that any locality outside a borough wherein there are not less than fifty householders shall be a town district:

And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor-General by the inhabitants within the area mentioned and described in the said petition, praying that such area may be constituted a town district under the Town Boards Act,

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the Town Boards Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that the area described in the Schedule hereto, being the locality defined in the said petition, shall be a town district, and the same is hereby constituted a town district, under the Town Boards Act, 1908, by the name of the Ohura Town District. And, in further pursuance and exercise of the said powers, I do hereby proclaim, declare,

and appoint that the Board of Commissioners for the said district shall consist of five members.

WHEREAS by the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), a Scenery Preservation Board is constituted, and it is enacted that such Board shall, when so directed by the Minister charged for the time being with the administration of the said Act, inspect any lands possessing scenic or historic interest, or on which there are thermal springs, and make inquiries respecting the same, and report to the Governor General; and shall from time to time recommend what lands, whether Crown or private, shall be permanently reserved as scenic, thermal, or historic reserves: And whereas the said Board was duly directed to inspect and report on the land described in the Schedule hereunder, and has recommended that the said land should be permanently reserved for scenic purposes, and it is expedient to give effect to such recommendation:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers contained in the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereunder shall be a scenic reserve under the Scenery Preservation Act, 1908, and subject to the provisions thereof.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations, if not inconsistent with the context, Territorial waters of New Zealand" means and includes all tidal waters included within the Dominion of New Zealand, and all parts of the open sea within one marine league of the coasts of that Dominion measured from low-water mark:

means inside any harbour in New Zealand or within three miles of the entrance of any such harbour which a ship is about to enter or leave:

"Wireless telegraphy" has the same meaning as in section 162 of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908:

"Telegraph" has the same meaning as in section 119 of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1908:

"Naval signalling" means signalling by means of any system of wireless telegraphy between two or more ships of His Majesty's Navy, between ships of His Majesty's Navy, between ships of His Majesty's Navy or a naval station and any other wireless-telegraph station, whether a coast station or a ship station:

"The Admiralty" means the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland:

"Coast station" means a wireless-telegraph station which is established on land or on board a ship

hast station" means a wireless-telegraph station which is established on land or on board a ship permanently moored, and which is open for the service of correspondence between the land and

ships at sea:
"Ship station" means a wireless telegraph station established on board a ship which is not perma-

nently moored.

2. These regulations shall apply only to foreign merchant ships and to British merchant ships not registered in New Zealand, while such British or foreign ships are within the

territorial waters of New Zealand, or in harbour.

3. These regulations shall not apply to the use of wireless telegraphy for the purpose of making or answering signals

Ships in Territorial Waters.

4. All apparatus for wireless telegraphy on board a merchant ship while in the territorial waters of New Zealand shall be worked in such a way as not to interfere with Naval signalling, or with the working of any wireless-telegraph station lawfully established, installed, or worked in the Dominion of New Zealand or the territorial waters thereof; and, in particular, the said apparatus shall be so worked as not to interrupt or interfere with the transmission of mesages between wireless-telegraph stations established on ships sages between wireless-telegraph stations established on ships at sea and wireless-telegraph coast stations.

5. If and whenever an emergency shall have arisen in which it is expedient in the public interest that His Majesty which it is expedient in the public interest that His Majesty's Government shall have control over the transmission of messages by the said apparatus, it shall be lawful for any officer of His Majesty's Navy or Army, or for any other person authorized in that behalf by the Admiralty, or by the Minister of Telegraphs, to take possession of or to cause the said apparatus or any part thereof to be taken possession of in the name and on behalf of His Majesty, and to be used for His Majesty's service, and, subject thereto, for such ordinary His Majesty's service, and, subject thereto, for such ordinary services as to the said officer or person may seem fit; and in that event any person authorized by the said officer or person may enter upon any ship on which such apparatus is installed and take possession of the said apparatus and use the same as aforesaid.

6. Any such officer or person may in such event as aforesaid, instead of taking possession of the said apparatus as aforesaid, direct and authorize such persons as he may think fit to assume the control of the transmission of messages by the said apparatus, either wholly or partly, and in such manner as he may direct, and such persons may enter upon any ship on which the said apparatus is installed accordingly; or the said officer or person may direct the person or persons in charge of the said apparatus to submit to him, or

persons in charge of the said apparatus to submit to him, or any person authorized by him, all messages tendered for transmission or arriving by the said apparatus, or any class or classes of such messages, to stop or delay the transmission of any messages, or deliver the same to him or his agent, and generally to obey all such directions with reference to the transmission of messages as the said officer or person may prescribe, and the said person or persons in charge of the said apparatus shall obey and conform to all such direc-

the said apparatus shall obey and conform to all such direc-

Ships in Harbour.

7. No apparatus for wireless telegraphy on board a merchant ship shall be worked or used while such ship is in harbour, except with the consent in writing of the Minister of Telegraphs.

8. When a British ship arrives in harbour, the aerial leads of its wireless-telegraph apparatus shall be disconnected from the leading-in insulators, and be made fast to and be placed in good metallic connection with the nearest metallic portion of the ship's structure in direct connection with the ship's hull. This disconnection shall continue during the whole

time the ship is in harbour. 9. Except as otherwise provided for, the wireless cabin shall be vacated and locked while the ship is in harbour, and the Customs shall seal the cabin as soon as practicable. The the Customs shall seal the cabin as soon as practicable.

the Customs shall seal the cabin as soon as practicable. The seal shall not be broken by any one other than a Customs officer until the ship is no longer in harbour. Entry shall be made in the ship's log of the time of locking the cabin and of making and breaking the seal.

10. In cases where wireless cabins include silence cabinets containing parts of the transmitting apparatus, the wireless cabin shall not be required to be locked and sealed. The transmitting apparatus in the silence cabinet shall be disconnected from the time of the ship's arrival in harbour, and the silence cabinet shall be locked. It shall be sealed by the Customs as soon thereafter as practicable. The seal shall not be broken by any person other than the Customs until the ship is outside of harbour limits. The auxiliary wireless apparatus shall at the time of the ship's arrival in harbour be rendered inoperative by the hammer-break of the coil be rendered inoperative by the hammer-break of the coil being tied back and sealed with a seal approved by the weing used back and sealed with a seal approved by the master. The Customs seal shall be applied to the auxiliary wireless apparatus when the sealing of the silence cabinet is being effected. An entry shall be made in the ship's log of the time at which the silence cabinet was locked and the seals made and broken.

11. Foreign ships, whether flying allied or neutral flags, shall be subject to the foregoing regulations numbered 9 and 10. At the time of their arrival in harbour their aerial wires shall be taken down completely, and shall be disconnected from the leading-in insulator. The aerial wires shall remain down and disconnected from the leading-in insulator until

the vessel is outside of harbour limits.

12. Notwithstanding anything contained in regulations 7 to 11 inclusive, it shall be permissible for authorized Government officers to inspect and to permit repairs to be effected to the wireless apparatus of vessels from time to time, proper precaution being taken for the locking and sealing of the wireless cabin, of the silence cabinet, and of the auxiliary apparatus.

Penalties.

13. If any breach of these regulations is committed by any person on board any ship while in the territorial waters of New Zealand or in harbour, the person so committing the same and the owner and master of the ship shall be severally liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £100.

14. Whenever the Minister of Telegraphs or the Secretary of the Post and Telegraph Department has reasonable cause to believe or suspect that any breach of these regulations has to believe or suspect that any breach of these regulations has been committed on board any ship while in the territorial waters of New Zealand or in harbour, he may give notice in writing to the Collector of Customs at any port in New Zealand to detain the ship under section 9 of the Post and Telegraph Amendment Act, 1913, until the sum of £100, or such smaller sum as may be specified in the notice, has been deposited with the Collector by or on behalf of the owner of the ship.

15. If on the receipt of that notice, or at any time within three months thereafter, the ship is found within such port, the Collector of Customs shall withhold the certificate of clearance of the ship, under section 35 of the Customs Act, 1913, until and unless the aforesaid sum is deposited with him or the aforesaid notice of detention is withdrawn.

16. My Lord,—I have the honour to transmit to Your Excelency copies of a notification dated 1st June last, issued from lency copies of a notification dated 1st June last, issued from the Central Chancery of the Orders of Knighthood, prescribing the manner in which the badge of the Third Class or Com-panions of the Orders of the Bath, the Star of India, Saint Michael and Saint George, and the Indian Empire shall in the future be worn, and of a further notification dated 10th August with regard to the manner in which the cost of the necessary alterations in the badges of Companions may be defrayed. be defrayed.

2. I have to explain that, as indicated in the first of these notices, the change is due to His Majesty's decision that henceforward the grade of Companion in these four Orders should rank as senior to that of Commander in other Orders which are later in date. The effect is to place the rank of Commander of the Royal Victorian Order lower than that of the Companionships in question. His Majesty's comof the Companionships in question. His Majesty's commands so far as they affect Companions of the Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, which may be of more particular

interest in the majority of the Oversea Dominions, have been embodied in a new statute of the Order dated 1st June,

3. I think it may be useful to explain certain points arising out of His Majesty's recent decision, for the guidance of those who hold the dignities affected by it:—

(a.) The new rule will apply to all Companions of the Orders, and a period of grace will enable Companions residing in distant parts of the Empire to have the necessary alterations of their badges made. The length of the period will not be prescribed.

(b.) The new riband to be worn will be of the breadth prescribed by the existing statutes of the Order (one inch

and a half).

(c.). (i.) The Knight Commander of an Order who is also a Companion of a senior Order will, of course, treat the badge of the Order of which he is a Knight Commander as senior

for all purposes.

(ii.) A Companion or Commander of more than one of the Orders affected will wear the badge of the senior Order just below the collar of the tunic or uniform coat, the other badges being worn one below the other, suspended on riband which emerges from between the buttons of the coat.

(iii.) With evening dress the badge of the senior Order will be worn under the white tie, the others, in miniature, on

the lapel of the coat.

(d.) When a Companion is in service dress the riband of the Order will be worn on the left breast as heretofore

ALL proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed December 10th, 1918, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the 1st of February of the same year.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified: (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute; (b) members of Parliament and members of Government of the different States, as well as members of the Interparliamentary Union; (c) members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague; (d) members of the Commission of the Permanent International Peace Bureau; (e) members and associates of the Institute of International Law; (f) university professors of political science and of law, of history, and of philosophy; and (g) persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.

According to the Code of Statutes, § 8, the grounds upon which any proposal is made must be stated, and handed in along with such papers and other documents as may therein be referred to.

Commencing with January, 1917, a new system of collection of monthly vital statistics was inaugurated. Metropolitan areas have been created at each of the four chief centres, and suburban areas at nine of the more important secondary centres. Each area includes, in addition to the central boroughs, a considerable non-municipalized area adjacent to and contingent on the centre.

An objection to the old system of publishing statistics for municipal areas only was that these were constantly being extended or otherwise altered, and no proper comparison could be made between one period and another, and no satisfactory record kept of the social condition and progress of the community. The creation of fairly extensive areas fixed for a long period will remove these disabilities. There was also the consideration that the populations of the various boroughs used in the old system were too small to give any satisfactory periodic comparison, especially when the period treated was only one month. The new system considers only the central borough of the metropolitan or suburban area, the remainder of that area, and the total.

By the inclusion of the suburban portions the birth-rate is raised in the case of three of the metropolitan areas—the Christchurch rate being lowered. Excluding these suburban portions, it will be observed that Wellington has the highest rate, Christchurch next highest, Auckland and Dunedin following.

Arrivals and Departures in 1917.

Census and Statistics Office, Wellington, 26th January, 1918.

ABLES showing the numbers of arrivals in and departures from New Zealand during the year 1917, with totals for the previous nine years by way of comparison, are published for general information.

The total number of persons who arrived in the Dominion during 1917 was 15,649, and the departures during the year numbered 13,869, the excess of arrivals over departures for the year being 1,780.

According to returns furnished by the Immigration officers, 2,931 persons arrived from the United Kingdom, and 1,501 persons departed therefor during the year. From the Commonwealth of Australia the arrivals are returned as numbering 10,146 persons, and the departures thereto as 10,449 persons. Arrivals and departures from and to other countries were 2,572 and 1,869 persons respectively.

Of the 15,649 persons who came to New Zealand last year, 1,732, or 11.06 per cent. of the total, were children—i.e., under twelve years of age; and of the 13,869 departures the children numbered 1,301, or 9.38 per cent.

The arrivals and departures shown do not include members of the Expeditionary Forces.

15. The present two small cottages shall remain the property of the Crown until completion of the accommodation-house, and thereupon shall be removed at the option of the Crown or disposed of to the lessee at an assessment then to be determined.

16. On or before the 1st October, 1919, the lessee shall erect a bath-house upon a site to be approved by the Minister, of twelve cubicles, six for male and six for female bathers.

17. An area of 80 acres or thereabouts, as shown on the plan, is set aside as a camping-ground for the public under regulations to be hereafter provided in that respect.

18. One-third of the flow of the water from the springs is reserved by the Crown for the use of such of the public as shall be permitted the use of the same, but so as not to interfere with the proper working of the bath-house hereinbefore referred to or the bath-house to be erected in its stead.
