Altering the Middle-line of a Portion of the North Auckland Railway.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS under the provisions in that behalf of section one hundred and eighty-eight of the Public Works Act, 1908, the middle-line of a portion of the North Auckland Railway was defined by a Proclamation dated the twenty-third day of May, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 62, of the twenty-fifth day of the same month: And whereas it has been found necessary in the construction of such railway to alter a portion of such line in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the aforesaid section one hundred and eighty-eight, and of all other powers and authorities enabling me in this behalf, do hereby revoke so much of the Schedule to the said Proclamation as defines the middle-line of the said railway between the points marked 111 miles 40 chains and 112 miles 40 chains shown on plan numbered P.W.D. 38984 referred to therein; and in lieu thereof do hereby proclaim and declare that the middle-line of the said railway, commencing at the said point marked 111 miles 40 chains, and terminating at 112 miles 40 chains, shall be as defined and set forth in the Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS a further portion of the North Auckland Railway—namely, from McCarroll's Gap to the left bank of the Wairoa River, in Block VII, Maungaru Survey District (hereinafter termed "the said railway"), is a railway the construction of which is authorized by the Railways Authorization Act, 1911: And whereas it has been determined to construct and maintain the portion of the said railway described in the Schedule hereto:

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the fourth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, regulations were made under the Stock Act, 1908, for the prevention of the introduction into New Zealand of diseases affecting stock:

And whereas by the said regulations the importation into the Dominion of animal manures is permitted only from certain countries in the manner prescribed by such regulations:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the aforesaid regulations so as to safeguard animal manure while in transit to New Zealand from becoming infected with any disease affecting stock:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Stock Act, 1908, and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend the regulations hereinbefore mentioned to the extent set out in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby declare, that this Order in Council shall come into force on the date of the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

Amending Regulations under the War Funds Act, 1915.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-seventh day of February, 1918.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the eighth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, made under the War Funds Act, 1915 (hereinafter referred to as “the said Act”), and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the eleventh day of May, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, regulations (hereinafter referred to as “the said regulations”) were made for purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is desirable to amend the said regulations:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations amending the said regulations; and doth hereby declare that the same shall come into force on the publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. (1.) SUBCLAUSE (1) of clause 7 of the said regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the word “hereto,” the words “or to the like effect.”

(2.) Subclause (2) of clause 7 of the said regulations is hereby revoked.

2. Clause 8 of the said regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

“8. Every society, association, or body of persons collecting for, but not administering, a war fund shall furnish to the Minister, not later than the 15th day of April, July, October, and January respectively in each year, a statement, in the form No. 4 in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, respecting moneys received and paid out by such society, association, or body of persons during the preceding calendar quarter.”

3. Clause 29 of the said regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

PERMITS TO COLLECT OR RAISE MONEYS FOR WAR FUNDS.

“29. (1.) Every permit to solicit or receive direct contributions for a war fund shall be in the form No. 10 in the Schedule hereto; provided, however, that if any society, association, or body of persons possessing a war fund, and incorporated under the said Act, or the incorporated trustees of a war fund, desires to use any other form of permit, it may, subject to the approval of the Minister, use or authorize the use of such form in lieu of the form hereby prescribed.

“(2.) Every permit to raise moneys for Red Cross or Lady Liverpool war funds, or for the purchase of articles of comfort for soldiers, by the sale of goods through the medium of Patriotic Shops shall be in the form No. 11 in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

“(3.) Every permit to raise money by means of bazaars, socials, exhibitions, or similar means for any war fund shall be in the form No. 12 in the Schedule, or to the like effect.”

4. Clause 30 of the said regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

“30. (1.) Every such permit as aforesaid issued by a Mayor, County Chairman, or Chairman of a Town Board or Road Board shall be a lawful authority to the person named therein to solicit or receive contributions or raise moneys for a war fund only within the borough or county, town district or road district, of which the person issuing the same is Mayor or Chairman.

“(2.) Every such permit as aforesaid issued by the incorporated trustees of a war fund, or by the President or Chairman of a war fund incorporated under the Act, or by an Inspector of Police, or by a person authorized in that behalf by the Minister, may authorize the holder thereof to solicit or receive contributions or to raise money for a war fund only within an area to be specified in the permit; provided that if any person authorized by the Minister to issue permits is authorized so to issue permits for a particular district only, a permit issued by such person shall be a lawful authority to solicit or receive contributions or raise money for a war fund only within such district.”

5. The Schedule to the said regulations is hereby amended by revoking forms Nos. 3, 4, 10, and 11, and substituting therefor the following forms:—

WHEREAS by section nineteen of the Stock Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is provided that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations prohibiting or restricting the importation or introduction of stock, or of any one or more kinds of stock, into New Zealand, either generally or from such countries, colonies, or places as may appear to him necessary or expedient for the purpose of preventing the introduction into New Zealand of any disease affecting stock :

And whereas by Order in Council dated the fourth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, the importation into New Zealand of animal hair was absolutely prohibited :

And whereas it is deemed expedient to permit the importation of animal hair from the United Kingdom and from certain States of the Commonwealth of Australia :

And whereas in the opinion of the Governor-General the introduction into New Zealand of animal hair from the United Kingdom and from the States of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, and Tasmania except in the manner hereinafter provided is likely to introduce such disease into New Zealand :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby permit the introduction into New Zealand of animal hair from the countries aforesaid, subject to the provisions of the regulations under the said Act made on the fourth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen; provided that every consignment of such animal hair is accompanied by the declaration herein prescribed :

And, in further pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him as aforesaid, and acting with the like advice and consent, doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall be read together with and form part of the aforesaid regulations gazetted on the seventh day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and shall come into force on the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

REGULATIONS.

1. WHEN any consignment of animal hair is to be forwarded to New Zealand, the owner or person in charge of the works where such animal hair is prepared as hereinafter set forth must make a statutory declaration (which shall accompany such animal hair to the Dominion) in the form in the Schedule hereto, stating, *inter alia*, that the requirements specified in paragraphs (a) to (e) of this Order in Council have been faithfully complied with, viz. :—

(a.) That all hair other than "drafts" or "drawn" hair has been sterilized by being boiled in clean water before or after curling, for not less than ninety minutes; or has been placed in an enclosed vat and subjected to an ample supply of steam from a steam boiler for not less than ninety minutes.

(b.) That all "drafts" or "drawn" hair has been sterilized by immersing for not less than ninety minutes in a solution containing not less than one part of formalin (of a strength of 40 per cent. formaldehyde) to each forty parts of clean water by volume.

(c.) That the said consignment has not been in contact, after having been sterilized, with any animal hair which has not been sterilized as aforesaid, or with any other substance or matter likely to convey disease.

(d.) That during the preparation or treatment of any animal hair contained in any consignment as aforesaid such consignment and the works were at all times open to inspection by the Inspector or any duly authorized officer.

(e.) That the bags, packs, or packages in which the said consignment is contained have never previously been used for any purpose whatsoever.

2. The above-mentioned declaration shall be delivered (a) to the New Zealand Government Veterinary Inspector in London, or any other duly appointed veterinary officer in Great Britain (in the case of shipments of animal hair from the United Kingdom); (b) to the New Zealand Inspector of

Manure-sterilizing in Sydney, or to any Government Veterinarian or Inspector of Stock of that State nominated by him (in the case of shipments of animal hair from New South Wales); or (c) to a Government Veterinarian or Inspector of Stock of the State in which the works are situated (in the case of shipments of animal hair from the States of Victoria, South Australia, or Tasmania); in time to allow such officer named to satisfy himself as to its accuracy.

3. (a.) Before commencing or resuming the preparation of animal hair for export to the Dominion, three clear days' notice shall be given to the officer named in clause 2 hereof, such notice to contain particulars of the consignment it is intended to prepare.

(b.) Such officer, after having satisfied himself that the foregoing requirements of these regulations have been complied with, shall countersign the declaration, and forthwith return it to the owner or person in charge of the works, who shall forward such declaration to the Dominion with the consignment to which it relates.

Regulations for Deer-shooting in the Counties of Hutt and Featherston (Wainui), Horowhenua and Hutt (Paraparumu), Akitio, Tararua Forest Reserve, and Taihape.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Animals Protection Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor of the Dominion of New Zealand, do hereby make the following regulations prescribing the deer-shooting season in that part of the Wellington Acclimatization District described in the First Schedule hereto, and further prescribing the conditions affecting such deer-shooting, the form of license, and the fee payable in respect thereof.

REGULATIONS.

1. RED-DEER stags and hinds may be taken or killed within the district described in the First Schedule hereto from the 29th March, 1918, to the 31st May, 1918 (both days inclusive).

2. Licenses to take or kill such deer may be issued by the Chief Postmaster at Wellington, or by the Postmasters at Masterton, Carterton, Featherston, Greytown, Eketahuna, Pahiatua, Makuri, Pongaroa, Palmerston North, Paraparumu, Otaki, Taihape, Mangaweka, Lower Hutt, and Shannon, on payment by the licensee of a license fee of £2. Not more than one such license shall be issued to any one person. Every such license shall be in the form in the Second Schedule hereto.

3. No licensee under these regulations shall take or kill more than two stags, and no stag shall be taken or killed carrying antlers with less than ten points.

4. No licensee shall allow any dog to accompany either himself or any attendant while stalking in the district to which his license relates.

5. A licensee may take two hinds in the Wainui area within a line commencing at the Upper Hutt Railway-station, thence south-east to the Wairarapa Lake at the mouth of Bockett's Stream, thence along the western shore of the Wairarapa Lake and the Ruamanga River to the Onoke Lake, thence following the coast-line to Petone, thence in a northerly direction to the point of commencement at the Upper Hutt Railway-station; excluding therefrom the area described in the fourth paragraph of the excluded areas hereunder.

6. Nothing in these regulations or in any license issued thereunder shall be deemed to authorize a licensee to take or kill any stag or hind in any part of the Wellington Acclimatization District other than that part to which these regulations apply, or in any other acclimatization district.

7. Regulations as to deer "tags," per *New Zealand Gazette* No. 40, Vol. I, of 20th May, 1900, page 1408, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who in addition thereto shall return all unused "tags" to the secretary of the Wellington Acclimatization Society, Wellington, immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with a statement of the number of deer shot.

8. Nothing in these regulations shall be deemed to authorize any person to sell any deer or any part thereof.

9. Every person who commits a breach of these regulations is liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

ALL that area commencing at the Onoke Lake, thence northward along the west side of the Wairarapa Lake to Featherston, thence along the railway-line to Eketahuna, thence eastward in a direct line to the sea at Castlepoint, thence northward along the coast to the Waimata River, thence in a direct line westward to Palmerston North, thence along the railway-line to Paekakariki, thence southward to the sea at Petone, thence along the coast to the point of commencement at the Onoke Lake.

Regulations as to deer "tags," per *New Zealand Gazette* No. 40, Vol. I, of 20th May, 1909, page 1408, shall be strictly adhered to by each licensee, who, in addition thereto, shall return all unused "tags" to the secretary of the Lakes District Acclimatization Society, Queenstown, immediately he has finished stalking for the season for which such "tags" have been issued, together with a statement of the number of deer shot.
8. Any person committing a breach of any of these regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding £20.

MONUMENT TO COMMEMORATE THE INDEPENDENCE OF BRAZIL.

Edict calling for Bids.

By order of the Secretary of the Interior for the Affairs of State, in the State of S. Paulo, and in compliance with Act n. 1.324, of the 31st October, 1912, hereby be it known that public bid is now made known for the presentation of projects for the construction of a National Monument which the Government of the State of S. Paulo, with the co-operation of the Union and other States, is authorized to erect on the site of the Ypiranga Hill, for the purpose of perpetuating the date of the proclamation of the Independence of Brazil and render homage to the principal historical figures which took part in this momentous occasion; whereby the following conditions are to be duly observed:—

I.

The projects shall be accepted not only from Brazilian artists but from artists of other nationalities.

II.

Freedom is left entirely to the inspiration of bidders as to the comprehensiveness of the monument in all its details, whether from an historical point of view or whether from an artistic standpoint, once the projects not only recommend themselves for their technical value but bear evidence of the great event which it is intended to commemorate, and in a concrete form do right homage to the most illustrious personages which figured in the great event. The total cost of the work shall not exceed the sum of one thousand contos of reis, in Brazilian currency.

As a source of sure information on the subject, it is well to consult the "History of Brazil," by Rocha Pombo, Vol. vii.

III.

The monument is to be erected in the centre of an open place half-way up the Ypiranga Hill, from where it opens, in a direct line, on to a long avenue of 45 meters width.

The declivity of the land compels the laying-out of this place in two levels, one 3m.5 above the other. The lower level shall have the form of a lozenge, the greater diagonal of which will intrude into the centre of the avenue. The monument will be situated in the corresponding vertex of the upper level and at the height of same.

The avenue will continue to follow the upper level of the place until it opens on to the square opposite the building of the Ypiranga Museum, which will overlook the said avenue in its whole extension and will serve as a background for the projected monument.

The front part of the monument shall be seen from a distance of 730 meters, and the rear part from a distance of 640 meters. The frontage will overlook an easy declivity, whereas the rear part will be followed up by a slope attaining up to 6 per cent.

IV.

Granite and bronze are to be the principal materials to be employed in this work. Granite is to be found in abundance in S. Paulo, of various aspects of colour.

V.

The projects will consist of the necessary drawings—plan, elevation and cross section—on a scale of 1 : 50, and of the details of the most important sections on a scale of 1 : 10; the same shall be accompanied by the respective descriptive memorandum and by a model of the monument in plaster of Paris, on a scale of 1 : 10, and likewise by a detailed estimate, giving the principal elements of the work.

VI.

The classification of the projects will be rendered by a body of jurors elected by the Government.

VII.

The author of the project which shall be classified in first place shall receive a premium of Rs. 30,000\$000 (thirty contos of reis), in Brazilian currency, and to the author of the project classified in second place shall be allotted a premium of Rs. 15,000\$000 (fifteen contos of reis) in said currency.

VIII.

The Government reserves the right of contracting with the author or with such party offering best terms, for the execution, in whole or in part, of the project which has been classified in first place.

IX.

The term for the presentation of the projects shall extend from this date up to the 7th September, 1918, and the same will be accepted, up to the termination of the said period, at the office of the Secretary of the Interior, in S. Paulo, and likewise at the Brazilian Consulates in Buenos Aires, New York, Lisbon, Rome, and Paris.

In these said localities, drawings of the plans and longitudinal profile of the great avenue of access to the monument are to be found at the disposal of the bidders. They can also be sent to those persons who shall solicit same.

The projects organized in foreign countries shall be delivered at the places indicated above, properly folded and well packed for safe transportation to S. Paulo.

Teachers' Certificate Examinations, 1918.

Education Department,
Wellington, 23rd February, 1918.

THE following lists contain the principal results of the examinations held in January for the purposes of teachers' certificates. In the preparation of the lists consideration has been given to candidates' successes at previous examinations held by the Department and at University examinations of which notice has been received.

The first list (I) contains the names of the successful candidates for Classes A, B, C, and D. Teachers' certificates will be issued to such of these as have produced satisfactory evidence of age and good character, and have passed the special medical examination required and have fulfilled the necessary conditions as to length of service and efficiency in teaching. The list does not include the names of those who qualified for a certificate as training-college students independently of this examination.

The second list (II) gives the names of those who have passed in two or more subjects of Parts II and III of Class C, but have yet to complete the examination.

The third list (III) contains the names of those who have obtained "partial passes" in the Class D Examination, and the fourth list (IV) those who have gained passes or partial passes in one or more "groups" of Class D.

In the fifth list (V) are given the names of the candidates whose work has been deemed worthy of "special mention."

The next examination will take place in January, 1919, beginning on or about the 6th day of the month. Notice must be sent to the Director of Education so as to reach him not later than the 15th October. Candidates who have yet to complete the examination must observe this rule equally with other candidates, and must not expect to receive any further information of the date at which the notices become due.

Certificated teachers who have gained promotion at this examination may send their certificates to the Department for endorsement.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1918.

The aggregate month's rainfall was below the average in most parts of the South Island and in the extreme south and central regions of the North, while in the northern and east coast districts of the North Island it was considerably above normal.

The cause of the excess in the two latter districts was the presence of an atmospheric depression northwards of the Dominion, which persisted between the 9th and the 16th. During this period frequent electrical disturbances were reported in the north, particularly about the 12th, 15th, and 19th.

On New Year's Day boisterous and wet conditions were experienced generally, owing to the passage of the centre of a disturbance in the vicinity of Cook Strait.

Several small westerly areas of low pressure were in evidence, passing in the south on the 17th, 24th, 28th, and 30th respectively. About these dates conditions were unsettled, with rainfall in many parts.

The weather for the month as a whole may be described as dull, warm, and humid.

The south channel into Manila Bay is closed to traffic and is protected by mines; this channel extends from Caballo Island on the north to Restinga Point on the south.

The north channel between Corregidor Island and the shore of Bataan Province to the northward is closed to inward-bound traffic from sunset to sunrise, except to certain vessels engaged in public service.

Vessels are, however, permitted to leave Manila Bay by the north channel without restriction as to time.

Obedience to the above regulations will be enforced by vessels of the United States Navy and by the shore batteries.

Failure to comply with any of the above regulations may result in the destruction of the offending vessels.

Subic Bay.

Subic Bay is closed to traffic; any unauthorized vessel attempting to enter the port does so at her peril.

II. HONG KONG.

Cape Collinson light is extinguished.

Gap Rock light, Wag Lan Islet light, and Green Island lights are extinguished, but lights will be exhibited from these lighthouses when the local typhoon-signals are hoisted, and will be shown until the signals are hauled down.

III. RUSSIAN MARITIME PROVINCE.

All lights are liable to be extinguished, and aids to navigation discontinued or withdrawn on the coasts of the Russian maritime province.

IV. SANDWICH ISLANDS, HONOLULU.

All lights in Honolulu Harbour are extinguished, and the harbour is closed by night.

NOTE.—This notice is a revision of the former notice quoted above.

SMOKE-BOXES.

The Bureau of Ordnance of the Navy Department is having manufactured by the Du Pont Company smoke-boxes suitable for use by merchant vessels as a means of escape from attacking submarines. Merchant vessels desiring to procure these smoke-boxes can obtain them from the Du Pont Company. The cost will be approximately as follows:—

Smoke-funnel, each	\$125-00
Phosphorus, pound	1-75
Smoke-boxes, each	25-00

The smoke-funnel is for the production of smoke on board the vessel, and requires only the fuel for its continued use. The smoke-boxes are for throwing overboard, and once used cannot be recovered.

The Navy Department is preparing to issue smoke-boxes to all vessels carrying armed guards, and has announced as its policy that smoke-producing apparatus for the use of merchant vessels should be available for every vessel desiring to purchase same. It is urged that merchant vessels give prompt and favourable consideration to the desirableness of purchasing smoke-producing apparatus.

The War Instructions for Merchant Vessels of the United States, issued by the Navy Department, contains directions for the use of smoke-producing apparatus, and the Bureau of Ordnance of the Navy Department issues a pamphlet dealing with the particular type of smoke-producing apparatus manufactured by the Du Pont Company.

FOG WARNINGS BY RADIOPHONE.

The following was received on 19th September from the office of the Director of the U.S. Naval Communication Service:—

"The attention of all ships navigating in the vicinity of Point Judith is invited to the recent installation at Point Judith light of a radiophone fog-warning device.

"The apparatus will be of use to commanding officers in picking up the light in thick weather, as experience has shown that operators can judge to some extent the distance according to strength of signals with a known normal range. Although measurements have been taken to determine the limit of the range of this apparatus, too much reliance should not be placed in it until its worth has been proved under service conditions,

"The apparatus will be in commission beginning about 1st October, 1917, and will be in operation during fog, mist, rain, and falling snow. The warning consists of the repeating of the words 'Point Judith Light,' every five seconds, with limit of range of about 8 miles. After every third repetition of the warning, 'You are getting closer; keep off' is sent out with a limit of range of about 2 miles.

"The apparatus required for the reception of the warning signals is an ordinary radio receiver. Crystal detectors may be used. The wave-length is varied continuously between 550 and 650 meters.

"It is requested that reports be forwarded to the Light-house Inspector, Tompkinsville, N.Y., as to the range and value of this fog-signal as found by experience under service conditions."

FIRE DANGER THROUGH ELECTRIC HAND TORCH.

Mr. P. F. O'Connor, the Chairman of the Club and of the Meeting, moved, and Mr. G. McIlroy, seconded, and it was resolved, that such regulations should be adopted, and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the same in authentication thereof.

The following are the regulations referred to:—

MANAWATU TROTTING CLUB.

REGULATIONS.

(Under the Gaming Act, 1908.)

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers in that behalf contained in section 33 of the Gaming Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities it enabling in that behalf, the Manawatu Trotting Club, a racing club within the meaning of the said Act (hereinafter referred to as "the said club"), doth hereby make the following regulations controlling the admission of persons to that part of the property situate in the District of Manawatu and known as the Awapuni Race-course, while the said racecourse is used or occupied by the said club for race meetings.

1. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms by section 2 of the Gaming Act, 1908.

2. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely,—

(a.) Bookmakers.

(b.) All persons under disqualification inflicted by any racing or trotting club in the Dominion of New Zealand, the Commonwealth of Australia, or elsewhere, if affiliated to the New Zealand Trotting Conference or the New Zealand Racing Conference.

(c.) Common prostitutes, and persons who habitually consort with thieves or with persons who have no lawful visible means of support.

The foregoing regulations of the Manawatu Trotting Club were made and passed by the members of the Manawatu Trotting Club on the 6th day of February, 1918, and signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
