"10. (1.) In the case of lands acquired pursuant to section 3 of the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Amendment Act, 1917, the annual rent shall be an amount equal to 5 per centum of the capital value thereof, and in all other cases the annual

the capital value thereof, and in all other cases the annual rent shall be an amount not exceeding $4\frac{1}{2}$ per centum of the capital value."

3. Clause 14 of the said regulations is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:—

(c.) No application for an advance for any of the purposes mentioned in the said paragraphs (a) or (b) shall be considered unless accompanied by an option to purchase the fee-simple or lease or license, as the case may be given by the apparent the lesses to the case may be, given by the owner or the lessee to the applicant. Such option shall be in the form No. 2 in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

(d.) The amount of advance to any one person shall in no case exceed the sum of £2,500; provided that in the case of applications for an advance to purchase a dwelling and appurtenances on other than rural land the amount of advance shall not exceed the sum of £1,000. Where two or more discharged soldiers hold or propose to acquire any land, whether freehold or leasehold, as tenants in common in equal shares advances may be made to them jointly to shares, advances may be made to them jointly to the aggregate amount that they would have been

the aggregate amount that they would have been entitled to obtain individually.

(e.) All advances shall be secured by first mortgage over the land or the applicant's interest in the lease or license thereof, in the form No. 3 in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect, except in such cases as another form is specifically provided for; and the Minister may as collateral security require that a mortgage of stock be executed over stock of the applicant depasturing on the land, and a bill of sale be given over such chattels belonging to the applicant as he may decide.

may decide.

(f.) Save as herein otherwise specially provided, all moneys advanced under this clause, together with interest thereon at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum, shall be repayable by half-yearly instalments over a period of 36½ years. Every half-yearly instalment shall consist partly of interest and partly of principal, and shall be calculated according to Table A of the Second Schedule to the State Advan es Act, 1913. All moneys received in payment of such half-yearly instalments shall be applied towards payment of interest and principal in the proportions set out respecting the appropriate payments in the said Table A. In such cases as the Minister may approve, advances may be made on flat mortgage for any period not exceeding ten years. Advances made on flat mortgage shall be secured by first mortgage in the form of mortgage set out in the First Schedule to the regulations made under the First Schedule to the regulations made under the provisions of the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915, by Order in Council on the 7th March, 1916, and gazetted on the 16th March, 1916, or to the like effect. (g.) In the case of any advance made in respect of leasehold land the following provisions shall apply

(i.) The mortgage shall be deemed not only to cover the mortgagor's interest in the lease, but to extend to and include his interest in any further lease issued to him in lieu of such first-mentioned lease, whether by way of renewal or otherwise.

(ii.) The term of the mortgage (which shall in no case exceed 361 years) shall, unless the lessee receives in lieu of his lease a title in fee-simple, expire on the due date of the prescribed half-yearly instalment next preceding the date of the expiration of the lease (which term shall be deemed to include any lease issued in lieu thereof whether by way of renewal or otherwise), and such instalment shall include the balance of principal then owing under the mortgage.

(iii.) No surrender of any lease on the security of which money has been advanced shall, so long as any portion of the moneys advanced remains unpaid, be accepted, nor shall any such lease be declared forfeited by a Land Board without the consent of the Minister. the Minister.

(iv.) For the purposes of section 74 of the Land Act, 1908, any moneys owing by a lessee on account of an advance made pursuant to these regulations, together with interest due thereon, if any, shall be deemed to be moneys due in respect of the land, and such moneys shall constitute a first charge on moneys received by the Receiver of Land Revenue pursuant to that section

to that section.
(v.) The terms "lease" and "lessee" include license and licensee.

(h.) In the case of applications for an advance to purchase a dwelling and appurtenances on other than rural land, the provisions of clause 3 (b) shall apply in lieu of clause 1 (f) hereof.

In order to comply with the last preceding regulation every such person shall fill up and supply to the Statistician, or to any officer authorized by him in writing, the particulars specified in the form set out in the Schedule hereto, in accordance with the instructions accompanying that form, and shall sign the form certifying to the correctness of the particulars entered therein.

Amendments to the Regulations under the Public Service Act, 1912.

IN pursuance and exercise of the authority conferred on him by the Public Service Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), the Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor-General in Council, doth hereby, in respect of the regulations made under the said Act on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and the amendments thereof, amend the regulations now in force in the manner and to the extent set forth in the Schedule hereto Such regulations and amendments shall have effect from and after the date of publication thereof in the New Zealand Gazette.

Amendment to Regulation 181, gazetted the 8th April, 1914, is hereby further amended by adding the following:-

(22.) Woodwork.—Drawing.—How to test the accuracy of drawing-instruments, and rectify errors; construction of plain scales; drawing to scale from dimensioned sketches or from models or articles made in the workshop; hand sketching; elevations, sections (easy cases only), and oblique projections of geometrical solids the surfaces of which are bounded by straight lines, and of articles made in the workshop.

Tools and Timbers.—The classification, description (illustrated by hand sketches), proper uses, and correct handling of tools; care of tools; hardening, grinding, and sharpening; the functions of their several parts; the mechanical principles underlying their construction and manipulation.

A knowledge of the geographical distribution, appearance, and general characters (including structure of trunk and limbs) of trees from which the timbers in common use in New Zealand are obtained; the countries and ports from which New Zealand receives its supplies of foreign timbers; the forms in which timber is brought into the market; the growth, felling, conversion, seasoning, storage, and preservation of timber; measurement of timber; selection of timber for particular purposes; methods of

working hard and soft woods; appearance, characteristic properties (including specific gravity), and defects of timbers. Candidates may be required to identify specimens of timbers in common use.

Bench-work.—Measuring and setting out work; dressing a piece of timber truly; principles to be observed in designing joints and fastenings; the construction of useful or ornamental articles providing opportunities for practice in the following processes, fastening-devices, and joints: Processes—sawing, planing, paring, grooving and trenching, slotting, gouging, cutting curves, shaping and filing, chamfering; fastening-devices—nails, screws, glue, dowels, pins, cleats, keys, and wedges; joints—the ordinary joints, including haunched mortise and tenon, bridle, mitre, common dovetail.

The examination in woodwork will consist of a written examination and a practical test.

(23.) Metalwork.—Drawing.—Use of T square and set-squares, compasses, dividers, and protractors. How to test accuracy of drawing-instruments, and how to rectify errors. The use of the foot rule, metric rule, and callipers; calculations based on measurements taken by these; candidates will be expected to measure with approximate accuracy to one-hundredth of an inch. Making approximately accurate hand sketches of simple geometrical solids and of objects such as tools, simple machine parts, &c.; the use of squared paper for hand sketching. Construction of plain scales; plans, elevations, sections, and oblique projections of geometrical solids the surfaces of which are bounded by straight lines, and of simple objects based thereon. Drawing to scale from actual parts, dimensioned photographs, or partially completed dimensioned sketches, such tools and simple machines or machine parts, instruments, &c., as pupils who have taken a two-years course in metalwork or in elementary mechanical engineering should be familiar with.

Instruments, Tools, Materials, &c.—The description, use, and care of the various measuring and testing instruments, hand tools, and simple machines used in metalwork or elementary engineering. The description of simple mechanical operations. Methods of setting out work from drawings, and the various operations involved in the completion of a simple piece of metalwork. Characteristic properties of the commoner metals used in metalwork, such as iron, steel, copper, brass, zinc, and sheet tin, and their preparation for workshop requirements.

Bench and Forge Work.—Exercises requiring the use of the hammer, chisel, file, and scraper; easy exercises involving the cutting, bending, and joining of cold sheet metal; various methods of fastening metals, such as riveting, screwing, soldering, and brazing; very elementary forge work, such as bending, drawing-down, upsetting (but not welding), hardening, and tempering a cutting-tool, such as chisel, cross-cut, flat, drill, or lathe tool.

The examination in Metalwork will consist of a written examination and a practical test.
