WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, Henry Cornwell Christian, of Te Rawa, Pelorus Sound (hereinafter called "the licensee"), has applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), to occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Te Rawa, Pelorus Sound, in order to erect thereon a wharf in accordance with plan marked M.D. 4853, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the proposed work will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and it is desirable that a license should be granted and issued to the licensee under the said Act for the purpose aforesaid, and that dues and rates to be taken and charged for the use of the said wharf should be prescribed:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license

is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark on which the said wharf is to be erected, as shown on plan marked M.D. 4853 so deposited as aforesaid, for the purpose of maintaining the said structure thereon; such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the First Schedule hereto; and doth hereby prescribe that the dues and rates set forth in the Second Schedule hereto shall be taken for the use of the said wharf on and after the date of its completion.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

1. IN these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.
2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark occupied by the said wharf, as shown on plan marked M.D. 4853.
3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall, on being supplied with a copy thereof, pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1, in advance, dating from the date of this Order in Council, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.
4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.
5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.
6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom and maintain at his own cost suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.
7. Any person authorized by the Minister may, at all reasonable times, enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring him, within a reasonable time, to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.
8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.
9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.
10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.
11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known registered office of the licensee in New Zealand.
12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.
13. In case the licensee shall—
 - (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
 - (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
 - (3.) Become bankrupt or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
 - (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—
 then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council,

and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General in Council without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever; and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

WHEREAS by section five of the Scaffolding Inspection Act, 1908, it was provided that the Governor might from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations relating to scaffolding and gear used in connection therewith: And whereas regulations were made under that Act on the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and on the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and such regulations were published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twelfth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and the twenty-eighth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eight, respectively: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said recited regulations and make other provision in lieu thereof under the powers conferred by section five of the Scaffolding Inspection Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"):

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the recited regulations of the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and the eighteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eight, respectively, and in lieu thereof doth hereby, for the purposes of the said Act, make the following regulations; and doth hereby declare that the said regulations shall come into force on the first day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations,—

"Gear" includes ladder, plank, rope, fastening, hoist, block, pulley, hanger, sling, brace, and other movable contrivance of a like kind:

"Scaffolding" means any structure or framework used or intended to be used for the support of workmen in erecting, demolishing, altering, repairing, cleaning, painting, or carrying on any other kind of work in connection with any building, structure, ship, or boat, and includes any swinging stage used or intended to be used for any of the purposes aforesaid:

"The said Act" means the Scaffolding Inspection Act, 1908, and its amendments.

2. The notice to the Inspector of intention to erect scaffolding (under section 4) shall be in the Form Sc. 1 in the Schedule to these Regulations.

The directions of the Inspector to the owner or person in charge of or employed on scaffolding or gear under section 6, (1) and (2), shall be in the Forms Sc. 2 and 3 in the Schedule hereto, with such modification as may be necessary to meet the circumstances of each case.

3. All scaffolding, and all gear used in connection therewith, in any district for which an Inspector has been ap-

pointed under the said Act shall be of the description indicated in these regulations under the respective headings, and shall be set up, built, maintained, and used in accordance with such regulations: Provided that it shall be lawful for any Inspector to authorize the use of any other description of scaffolding or gear in any case where he has personally inspected the same, and certified in writing that in his opinion such scaffolding or gear may safely be used for the purpose intended.

4. Any scaffolding or gear that is, in the opinion of the Inspector, unsuitable for use may be condemned by the Inspector for being used as or in connection with any scaffolding or gear, and may be branded by him with a distinctive mark. Such condemnation may be for all purposes or for any specific purpose only as may be stated by the Inspector and where condemned for all purposes the Inspector may order that such scaffolding or gear shall not be again used as part of or in connection with any other scaffolding or gear. The Inspector shall also notify such persons as he may think fit of the condemnation of such scaffolding or gear. No person shall deface the Inspector's mark branded upon any scaffolding or gear.

Swinging Stage.

5. Every swinging stage used or intended to be used in connection with any scaffolding as above defined shall be so constructed or built as to bear three times the maximum weight ordinarily required.

Blocks shall be of iron or wood not less than 4 in. in diameter of sheaf, consisting of double and single block. All rope shall be manila, not less than 2½ in. circumference.

Platform shall not be less than 18 in. in width. Each swinging stage 18 ft. in length shall have two hangers, to be wrought iron or mild steel of not less than 1 in. diameter, or 4 in. manila rope, or 1½ in. steel wire rope, fitted to the satisfaction of the Inspector. The distance between the hangers shall be not more than 12 ft. Where the stage exceeds 18 ft. in length, and the distance between the hangers exceeds 12 ft., the planking shall be stiffened with an approved truss underneath, and other parts shall be of stronger construction, as may be directed by the Inspector.

Guard-rail shall be of 3 in. manila rope, 1 in. pipe, or 3 in. by 2 in. timber securely fastened not less than 2 ft. 6 in. from floor; also fender-board not less than 4 in. by 1 in. on outside and both ends.

Tripod Gantries.

6. Gantry not exceeding 100 ft. high for a steam or other crane to lift a weight of 5 tons and not exceeding 10 tons shall be constructed as follows: Tripod gantry towers to be not less than 6 ft. by 6 ft., and to be constructed with 7 in. by 7 in. corner-posts extending the full height of the gantry, properly fish-plated and bolted at junctions; corner-posts to be firmly tied together by 9 in. by 3 in. horizontal ties at 10 ft. centres, and each side of the tower to be properly braced with 7 in. by 3 in. diagonal braces, firmly bolted to the corner-posts; each tower to have a centre-post 8 in. by 8 in., these posts to extend the full height, and to be firmly fish-plated at junctions, and to be stiffened at intervals with 5 in. by 3 in. stays to the corner-posts of each tower. The towers to be constructed by means of horizontal braces, 9 in. by 3 in., spaced not less than 20 ft. apart. Each side of the gantry to be braced with diagonal braces of 9 in. by 3 in. firmly bolted to the timbers of the towers and at intersections; the towers to rest on 9 in. by 9 in. sleeper-plates, and to be tied together at top by 9 in. by 9 in. kerb; all bolts for gantries to be not less than ¾ in. diameter. The back stays of the crane to be tied to the 8 in. by 8 in. centre-post by means of two 4 in. by 1 in. wrought-iron straps extending over the back stay of the crane and down each side of the centre-post. The length of the strap to be 9 ft. and to be firmly bolted to the centre-post and to the timbers of the crane by 1 in. bolts. The ends of the straps to be also turned and mortised into centre-post 1½ in. Each centre under the back stays of the crane shall have a platform at the bottom formed of 9 in. by 3 in. timber firmly bolted to the centre-post and to the sides of the tower, and each tower shall be loaded with a weight equal to three times the weight the crane has to lift.

The construction of a tripod gantry not exceeding 100 ft. high for a crane to lift from 10 tons to 15 tons shall be similar in all respects to the foregoing, with the exception that the corner-posts of the towers shall be 8 in. by 8 in.

Where circumstances necessitate a gantry exceeding 100 ft. in height, it shall be constructed to the approval of the Inspector.

Other styles of gantries may be erected as approved by the Inspector.

Hand-cranes, Derricks, &c.

7. All hand-cranes, derricks, or any such similar gear used in connection with any scaffolding shall, after erection

and before being put into commission, be tested with a load of 25 per cent. more than that which the crane or derrick is designed to lift. Such test shall be made in the presence of the Inspector.

Each back stay of any crane shall be loaded with a weight equal to at least three times that which the crane has to lift.

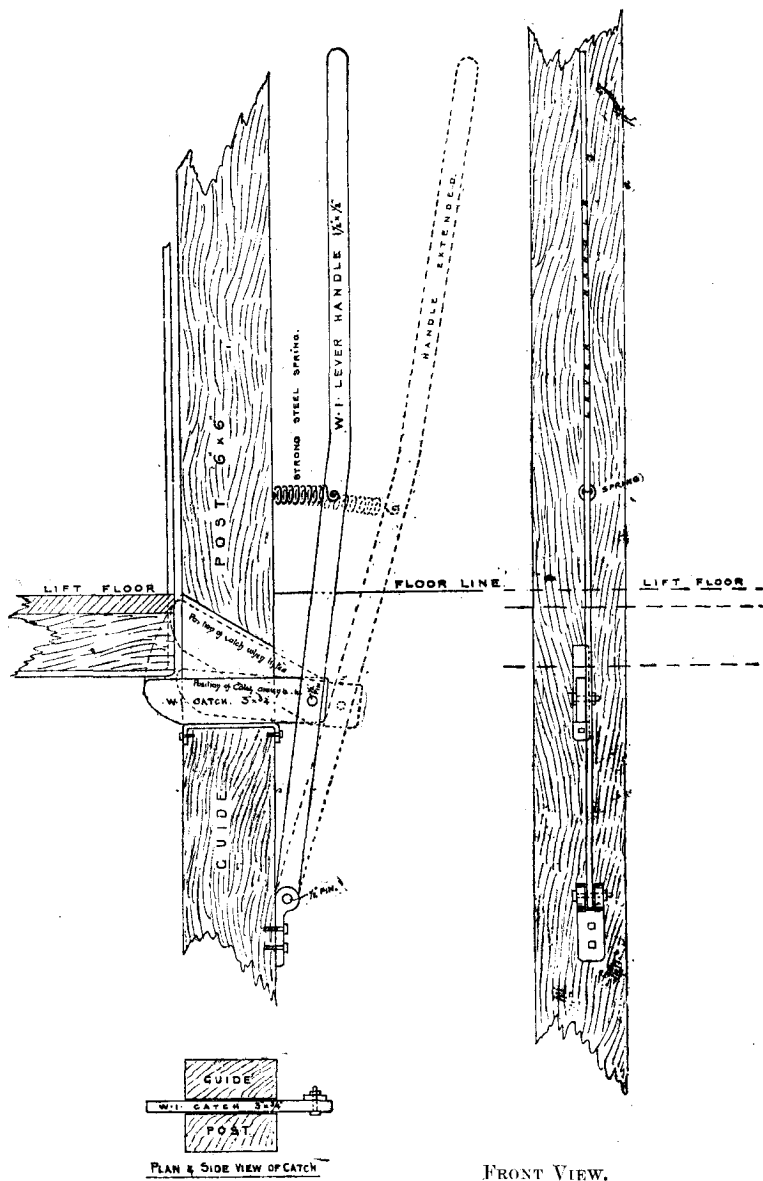
Every hand-crane shall have marked in a prominent position the maximum load which the crane is designed to lift.

Lifts must be fitted with an automatic catch of the design attached, or with such other appliance as may be approved by the Minister.

finished with, or hoop-iron ties secured to wall and every other ledger every 10 ft. may be used.

Scaffold-boards shall be of sound timber, and not less than 8 in. wide and 1½ in. thick, laid butting or lapping, but where lapped the laps shall be not less than 9 in. Scaffolds shall have fender-boards not less than 9 in. high and 1 in. thick on all working-stages secured to standards, also guard-rail not less than 3 ft. high of scaffold-poles or timber, not less than 3 in. by 2 in., lashed or bolted to standards. Openings through guard-rail and fender-board will be allowed alongside landings only.

External Scaffold for Bricklayers and Plasterers.

8. Every external scaffolding for bricklayers or plasterers shall be erected according to the following specification, namely: Standards shall be not more than 9 ft. apart, and to be not less than 5 in. by 3 in. Where poles are used, the same shall be not less than 4 in. diameter at butt and 2½ in. at tip. Standards, where practicable, shall be embedded 12 in. in ground; and where necessary, shall be stood on a solid sole-piece. Ledgers shall be not less than 6 in. by 2 in. or 4 in. by 3 in., or, if approved poles are used, shall be not less than 3½ in. in diameter, and shall be tied or bolted to standards at spaces of not more than 6 ft. apart. First ledger may be fixed at not more than 10 ft. from the ground where circumstances require it.

Putlogs shall be of approved timber. Where the span does not exceed 5 ft. in the clear the size shall not be less than 3 in. by 3 in., spaced not more than 6 ft. apart, and shall have not less than 4½ in. bearing in wall. All putlogs, where practicable, shall be securely wedged in position at wall, and securely fastened to ledger. Only alternate putlogs may be removed from the lower stages until scaffolding is

Bracing shall be not less than 4 in. by 2 in. Poles or other approved timber may be used and placed to the Inspector's satisfaction.

Scaffolds shall be secured by manila rope not less than 1½ in. in circumference and 15 ft. long, or bolts not less than ½ in. diameter, fitted with washers. All lashings shall be kept properly wedged, and bolts properly tightened up.

Where an external scaffold is to be used for plasterers' work only, the standards may be spaced not more than 10 ft. apart, ledgers to be not less than 4 in. diameter butt and 2½ in. taper end, or 4 in. by 3 in., and spaced to suit the particular class of work, such spacing to be to the satisfaction of the Inspector. Bracing to be not less than 3 in. by 2 in.

Internal Scaffold for Bricklayers and Concrete-workers.

9. Internal scaffolds for bricklayers and concrete-workers shall be constructed in a similar manner to the external scaffolds, and with timber of similar sizes. Trestles approved by the Inspector may be used in place of standards.

The standards may be omitted when the internal or division walls form sufficient bearing for ledgers. The distance between such bearing shall not exceed 8 ft.

Internal Scaffold for Plasterers, Concrete-workers, Painters, and Others.

10. Where the height of the scaffolding intended for the use of plasterers, concrete-workers, painters, and others exceeds 16 ft. it shall be constructed of standards of not less than 4 in. diameter at the butt end, 2½ in. at taper end, or 4 in. by 3 in. if other approved timber, to be placed not more than 9 ft. apart; ledgers to carry the platform of scaffolding to be 5 in. by 2 in. if sawn timber, if of round timber to be of similar size to the standards, bolted to standards with ½ in. bolts, or properly secured with 1½ in. manila rope. Scaffolds under a height of 16 ft. shall be erected with standards or trestles to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

Scaffolds for Carpenters and other Workers on Timber-framed Buildings.

11. All scaffolding for carpenters and other workers on timber-framed buildings shall be erected according to the following specifications, namely: Standards up to 20 ft. in height to consist of not less than 4 in. by 2 in.; beyond this height not less than 4 in. by 3 in. for the first 15 ft., thereafter 4 in. by 2 in. Standards shall be not more than 9 ft. apart. Bearers and cleats shall be not less than 8 in. by 1 in., well nailed to walls and standards. All scaffolds shall be well braced with not less than 6 in. by 1 in. braces, well nailed. Approved wooden or iron brackets may be used, placed at not more than 9 ft. apart. Such brackets shall be so constructed as to bear three times the maximum weight ordinarily required. Iron brackets where used on wooden buildings must be securely fastened, and, where practicable, through the stud and bolted, with a washer and nut on the inside of the stud. Humphrey brackets where used must be constructed of wrought iron.

Ladders.

12. All ladders must extend at least 5 ft. above the highest level served.

All ladders shall be of clean oregon or kauri, but for ladders under 14 ft. in length red or white pine may be used. Where square timber is used, ladders shall be constructed of 3 in. by 2 in. stiles, and 3 in. by 1 in. battens partly sunk into stiles, and firmly nailed or screwed. Batten ladders exceeding 14 ft. in length shall be of heavier material, and constructed to the satisfaction of the Inspector. All ladders must be secured to the scaffolding or building with 1½ in. manila rope.

General.

13. (a.) When any building is in the course of erection, repair, or structural alteration, it shall be the duty of the person having the control or management of such operations to make provision to the satisfaction of the Inspector for the protection of workmen and others within such building or in the vicinity thereof by boarding over the joists of such building, and keeping them so boarded over so long as any risk of accident would be incurred by the removal of such protection.

(b.) All "runs," gangways, or similar means of communication between different portions of a scaffold or building shall not be less than 18 in. wide. If composed of two or more boards they shall be fastened together in such a manner as to prevent unequal sagging.

(c.) Scaffold-boards forming part of a working-platform shall be supported at each end by a putlog, and shall not project more than 6 in. beyond it, unless lapped by another board, which shall rest partly on or over the same putlog and partly upon putlogs other than those upon which the supported board rests. Scaffold-boards shall be of sound timber and not less than 8 in. wide and 1½ in. thick, and must be securely fastened to the putlogs or bearers.

(d.) All supports to centring shall be carried from a solid foundation.

(e.) All working-platforms above the height of 10 ft. shall be at least 18 in. wide, and, where practicable, shall have guard-rail not less than 2 ft. 6 in. from platform. Such guard-rail shall be of timber not less than 4 in. by 1½ in.

(f.) All well-holes and openings in floors shall be guarded.

(g.) Ladder-brackets approved by the Inspector shall be used only where attached to rung ladders constructed of clean oregon or kauri.

14. In every case where there occurs in connection with the erection, repair, or structural alteration of any building any accident causing death or serious bodily injury to any person, the person having the control or management of such operation shall forthwith serve upon the Inspector of the district within which such accident has occurred written notice specifying the nature of the accident, the name and residence of the person killed or injured, and the place, if any, to which such person has been removed.

For the purposes of this section the expression "serious bodily injury" means an injury which is likely to incapacitate the sufferer from work for at least forty-eight hours.

Notice of the accident shall be in the Form Sc. 4 in the Schedule hereto, and report of same by the Inspector to the Minister shall be in the Form Sc. 5 of such Schedule.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on him by the Sale of Food and Drugs Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Act"), His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby amend, in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto, the regulations made under the said Act on the fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and published in the *Gazette* of the sixth day of the same month; and doth hereby declare that this Order in Council shall come into force on the eighteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen.

SCHEDULE.

1. PARAGRAPH 49 of Part II of the regulations aforesaid (relating to the standard strength of spirits) is hereby revoked, and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

"49. STANDARD OF STRENGTH OF SPIRITS.

"The standard of strength of spirits which, whether before or after the coming into operation of this regulation, have been imported into New Zealand shall be as follows:—

"(a.) Brandy, whisky, or rum imported into New Zealand in bottles or jars in cases shall not be of a less strength than 25 degrees under proof.

"(b.) Brandy, whisky, or rum imported into New Zealand otherwise than in bottles or jars in cases shall not be of a less strength than 35 degrees under proof.

"(c.) Gin shall not be of a less strength than 35 degrees under proof."

2. Nothing in this Order in Council shall affect the provisions of an Order in Council dated the same day prohibiting the importation into New Zealand of any brandy, whisky, or rum of a less strength than 25 degrees under proof.

WAIHI FIRE BOARD.

BY-LAWS.

By virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it in that behalf by section 43 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, the Waihi Fire Board hereby makes the following by-laws:—

Interpretation Clauses.

In these by-laws, except where inconsistent with the context or when otherwise expressly provided,—

- “Board” means the Waihi Fire Board elected and appointed under the provisions of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908:
- “Brigade” means the Waihi Fire Brigade established and enrolled under the provisions of these by-laws:
- “District” means the Waihi Fire District as defined in the *New Zealand Gazette* No. 98, of the 14th day of June, 1917:
- “Secretary” means the Secretary appointed by the Waihi Fire Board:
- “Superintendent” and “Deputy Superintendent” mean respectively the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent of the Waihi Fire Brigade appointed by the Waihi Fire Board:
- “Street” means any public or private street, and includes public places:
- “The Act” means the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, and any amendment thereof:
- “Petroleum” means petroleum as defined by the Explosive and Dangerous Goods Act, 1908:
- “Inspector” means the Inspector of the Waihi Board who shall from time to time be appointed:
- “Inflammable material” shall mean and include empty crates, cases, and other packages, shavings, hay, straw, and any other inflammable substances.

Establishment.

1. The brigade shall consist of a Superintendent, Deputy Superintendent, with such other officers as the Board may from time to time determine, and not more than sixteen firemen, with such number of auxiliaries as the Board may from time to time determine.

Enrolment.

2. Candidates for enrolment as members of the brigade must be physically strong men, free from any defect in limb, hearing, or sight. They must not be less than eighteen years of age nor more than forty-four years of age, unless they have previously and recently been engaged as active and efficient firemen or are otherwise thoroughly competent. They may be required to produce testimonials as to character and ability. They may be required to undergo a medical examination by such duly qualified medical practitioner as the Board may appoint. Members of the brigade acting in that capacity on the coming into force of this by-law shall be exempted from these requirements.

Application for Enrolment.

3. Applications for enrolment must be made on the form set out and printed by the Board, and applicants shall only be enrolled as members of the brigade on their application being approved by the Board.

Probation.

4. Candidates when approved will be accepted as members of the brigade on probation only, the term of which shall be three months. If at the end of that term the probationer shall have given satisfaction to the Superintendent, and shall at a meeting of the brigade receive an affirmative vote of not less than three-fifths of the members there present, his acceptance as an enrolled member shall be confirmed by the Board.

5. Members of the brigade are, subject to the provisions of clause 4 hereof, enrolled for service from year to year, subject to one month's notice on either side, except as hereinafter provided.

Appointment and Promotion of Officers.

6. The appointment of Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent shall be made by the Board as provided

by section 30 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1908, due consideration being given in each case to the claim of men already in the service of the Board. Such appointments may be terminated by one month's notice on either side.

Retiring-age.

7. The age at which members of the brigade must retire from the brigade shall be as follows: Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent, sixty-five years; firemen, fifty-five years; but the Board may, if it thinks fit in any special case, extend these limits.

Care of Uniform and Equipment.

8. Uniforms and equipment of a pattern and design approved by the Board shall be issued to members of the brigade on enrolment, but shall remain the property of the Board.

9. On discharge from the Board's service either by resignation or dismissal each member must return to the Secretary, in good order and condition (fair wear-and-tear excepted), every article of clothing for equipment the property of the Board which may be on issue to him; in the event of his failing to do so the cost of any article of clothing not returned, or returned in a damaged condition, shall be charged to such member and deducted from any pay or money that may be due to such member, or recovered by process of law.

Plant not to be removed without Permission.

10. Except for the purposes of answering any alarm of fire or false alarm, or for *bona fide* brigade practices ordered by the Superintendent, no plant or appliance of any kind shall be removed from the brigade premises unless such person removing same shall have first received the permission of the Superintendent so to do. Any person removing any plant or appliance without such permission as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

The Superintendent.

11. The duties and powers of the Superintendent, in addition to those conferred on him by the Act, shall be as follows:—

- (1.) He shall be responsible to the Board for the efficiency of the members of the brigade and all gear used in its service.
- (2.) He shall have power to suspend any member for breach of discipline or misconduct of any description at any time, but must at once report such suspension to the Board. The member so suspended may appeal to the Board, which may hold an inquiry into the alleged breach of discipline or misconduct. At such inquiry the suspended member may be present and have the right to speak in his defence, and, if he so desires, to bring witnesses in support of such defence.
- (3.) He shall keep an order-book, in which from time to time all orders affecting the working of the brigade shall be entered. Such order-book or a copy of the orders therein shall be available for inspection by members of the brigade at all times.
- (4.) He shall allot such duties to the members of the brigade as he may deem necessary for ensuring the efficiency thereof, and may withdraw any member from any special duty and allot him fresh duties at his (the Superintendent's) discretion.
- (5.) He shall keep a service-record book containing the names, occupations, places of birth, dates of birth, dates of joining and discharge from the brigade, with awards and punishment by the Board, in a proper manner.
- (6.) He shall perform any other duty in connection with his position which the Board may from time to time assign to him.

Firemen to take charge in Officers' Absence.

12. In the event of the absence of all of the Board's officers at any fire or false alarm of fire, the senior fireman there present shall take charge of the brigade.

Discipline.

13. A member of the brigade guilty of any of the following offences whilst on duty in the Board's service shall be liable to suspension from duty by the Superintendent:—

- (a.) Being in an intoxicated condition.
- (b.) Disobeying any lawful order of his superior officer.
- (c.) Using abusive or insubordinate language to his superior officer.
- (d.) Striking his superior officer.
- (e.) Using obscene language.

14. A member of the brigade committing either of the following offences shall be suspended, and reported to the Board by the Superintendent:—

- (a.) Wilfully damaging any portion of the brigade premises or other the property of the Board.

(b.) Absenting himself without sufficient excuse from any drill or practice ordered by the Superintendent, or from any false alarm of fire.

15. No member of the brigade shall under any circumstances write any letters or furnish any information to the Press on matters connected with the Board or brigade, save that in the event of no superior officer being present the senior fireman on duty may give particulars regarding any fire which has been attended by the brigade.

Leave of Absence.

16. Leave of absence for any period not exceeding fourteen days may, on the application of a member of the brigade, be granted by the Superintendent, who shall record the same in his occurrence-book. Any member of the brigade desiring leave of absence for a longer period than fourteen days shall apply in writing addressed to the Superintendent, who shall forward such application to the Secretary of the Board, with such recommendation as he may think fit, and leave of absence for such longer period shall only be granted by the Board.

Brigade may make Rules.

17. Subject to the approval of the Board, and provided they in no way conflict with these by-laws, the brigade may make rules and regulations for its own government.

Gratuities for Volunteer and other Services.

18. For the performance of any volunteer or special services rendered by any person, whether a member of the brigade or not, in respect of any fire, there may be paid out of the funds of the Board such sum as the Board or any Committee authorized by the Board may direct.

Electric Fire-alarm Circuits.

19. The Board may establish, or contract with any person or corporation for the establishment of an electric fire-alarm circuit, and may from time to time extend such circuit and provide for the connection therewith of street alarms and public and private buildings or premises. All connections of alarms installed in public or private buildings or premises, or any alterations to same, shall be carried out to the approval of the Board at the cost of the owner of the property to be connected, and the cost of maintenance and of the periodical examination and testing of such connections shall be borne by the owner of the property connected, and all such connections shall be efficiently maintained to the satisfaction of the Board or the officer appointed by the Board for that purpose. With the consent of the owner, such cost may be commuted to the payment of such annual sum as may be agreed on between the Board and such owner.

Donations in Recognition of the Brigade's Services.

20. Donations by the public in recognition of the brigade's services shall be the property of the brigade, and shall be used in providing for the comfort and recreation of the members thereof, or otherwise for the benefit of the members of the brigade.

Maintenance of Discipline and Good Conduct on the Part of Officers and Men of the Brigade.

21. No person shall interfere with or in any way obstruct any officer or member of the brigade while such officer or member of the brigade is in the execution of his duty.

22. No person shall interfere with or obstruct any volunteer described in section 18 of these by-laws while such volunteer is in the execution of his duty.

23. No person shall aid, abet, or encourage any member of the brigade in any act of disobedience of orders, or insubordination, or in the use of abusive or obscene language while such member is on duty.

24. No person shall supply any intoxicating liquor to any officer or member of the brigade while such member or officer shall be on duty, unless he shall first have received from the officer in charge of the brigade at the time permission so to do.

25. No person other than a member of the Board, or its Secretary, or members of the brigade shall enter any fire-station controlled by the Board unless such person shall first have received permission to do so from the officer in charge of the station or a member of the brigade, and no person shall, after having been requested by the officer in charge of the station to leave any such station, remain in any such station or on or about the station premises.

26. No person other than an officer of the brigade, or a member thereof, or the wife or child of such officer or member, shall sleep in or on any station, or in any of the Board's premises, without first having received the written permission of the Superintendent to do so.

Prevention of Fire.

27. No person other than a person licensed by the Waihi Borough Council to keep petroleum for sale shall keep in stock within the Waihi Fire District more than 16 gallons of petroleum except in a magazine or such other structure as may be approved by the Inspector. Such magazine or either structure shall, unless constructed of brick or other similar material, be placed not less than 20 ft. from any other building.

28. No person licensed by the Waihi Borough Council to store petroleum for sale shall store petroleum within the Waihi Fire District except in a magazine or such other structure as may be approved by the Inspector.

29. No such magazine or other structure mentioned in sections 27 and 28 hereof shall be used for the storage of petroleum until the person occupying such magazine or other structure shall have received a certificate in writing from the Inspector that such magazine or other structure is suitable for the storage of petroleum, and any person using any such magazine or other structure for the storage of petroleum without having first received a certificate as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

30. All buildings used for the storage of petroleum shall be kept securely locked, and any person having the control of any such building, and failing to securely lock such building, shall be guilty of an offence.

31. Any person, whether licensed by the Waihi Borough Council or not, who shall store petroleum within the Waihi Fire District, shall deposit with the Secretary of the Waihi Fire Board a plan of the building or buildings wherein such petroleum is stored, showing on such plan the exact position in such building or buildings where such petroleum shall be deposited.

32. Any person leaving any inflammable material on any part of such person's premises, and who shall, after having been requested by the Inspector to remove such inflammable material fail to remove such inflammable material within forty-eight hours from the receipt of such notice, shall be guilty of an offence.

In respect of Fires outside the Waihi Fire District.

33. If any brigade or portion of a brigade established and maintained by the Board within the Waihi Fire District attends or performs any service at a fire on any premises outside the Fire District of Waihi at the request of the owner or occupier of such premises, then such owner or occupier shall pay to the Board for such attendance and service at the undermentioned rates:—

Finance Committee.

34. A committee shall be appointed from time to time by the Board, which shall exercise supervision in all matters relating to the finances of the Board. This committee shall be known as the Finance Committee, and shall pay all accounts included in the then current year's estimate of expenditure, and in an emergency shall be empowered to authorize payment of any amount not exceeding £20 not included in such estimate.

Payment of Accounts.

35. All payments shall be made by cheques upon the Board's bankers, signed by the Chairman and Secretary of the Board. In the absence of the Chairman, such cheques may be signed by any member of the Finance Committee and the Secretary.

Common Seal.

36. The common seal of the Board shall be in the custody of the Secretary, and shall not be affixed to any document except by order of the Board as recorded in the minute-book, and shall only be affixed in the presence of at least two members of the Board, and every document bearing such seal shall be signed by two members of the Board and its Secretary.

Notices of Motion.

37. Any member of the Board may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be numbered and dated and given in writing to the Secretary at least seven clear days previous to the meeting at which such notice of motion is to be considered.

Penalty Clause.

38. Every person guilty of an offence against, or committing any breach of, or failing to perform any duty imposed upon any such person by any of the provisions of

these by-laws shall be liable for such offence, breach, or failure to such fine not exceeding twenty pounds (£20) as the Court inflicting the same shall in its discretion think fit.

The foregoing by-laws were made by the Waihi Fire Board at a duly constituted meeting of the said Board held on 5th December, 1917.

And whereas the Nelson City Council has certified that the signatures to such requisition represent a majority of the occupiers of all the chemists and druggists' shops within the City of Nelson:

Amending the Regulations under the Surveyors' Institute and Board of Examiners Act, 1908.

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by section 17 of the Surveyors' Institute and Board of Examiners Act, 1908, the Surveyors' Board do hereby amend the regulations dated the 30th day of July, 1913, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the 7th day of August, 1913,—

(1.) By deleting from regulation 14 the words after the third line as follows:—

“(1.) *Mathematics.*

“Plane and spherical trigonometry, geometry, algebra, as far as these subjects are applicable to surveying.”

(2.) By deleting the whole of regulation No. 15, with its heading.

(3.) By deleting from regulation 16 (1) the fourth line thereof as follows: “2. Elementary mathematics, 75.”

(4.) By the consequential reduction of the total 625 in the said regulation 16 (1) to 550.

And the Surveyors' Board do hereby declare that such amendments shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1919.
