WHEREAS by section one hundred and forty-four of the Land Act, 1908 (hereinafter termed "the said Act"), it is, *inter alia*, enacted that the Governor-General in Council may, by Proclamation, resume possession of any land leased under Part III of the said Act, or under any corresponding Part of the Land Act, 1892, which in his opinion is required for any public purpose:

BY-LAWS.

HAMURANA SCENIC RESERVE.

1. In these by-laws "General Manager" means the General Manager of the Department of Tourist and Health Resorts, and includes any person who may be acting for the General Manager; "Caretaker" means the person having the general charge and control (under the direction of the General Manager) of the Hamurana Scenic Reserve; and "the reserve" means the reserve described in the Schedule hereto, and includes any buildings or enclosures erected and to be erected within such reserve.

2. The hours at which the reserve shall be open to the public under these by-laws may be fixed from time to time by the General Manager.

3. No person shall pick any flower, or break or destroy any plant, shrub, or tree, growing in the reserve.

4. No person shall destroy, deface, or injure any inscription or any label attached to or connected with any tree, shrub, or other plant.

5. No person shall place, deposit, or leave any bottle or glassware (whether broken or whole), paper, straw, litter, dirt, rubbish, or any offensive or noxious matter of any kind in the reserve, or any part thereof, except in any receptacle provided for the purpose.

6. No horse, dog, or other animal shall be allowed within the reserve; and for each time any horse, dog, or other animal trespasses or is allowed to trespass in the reserve, the owner of such horse, dog, or other animal shall be liable for a breach of these by-laws. This by-law shall not, however, apply in the case of dogs which are led by a cord or chain, nor to any animal the owner of which has obtained written permission of the General Manager to graze animals within the reserve or any specified portion thereof.

7. No person shall trespass upon any portion of the reserve which may be set apart for planting.

8. No person shall light any fire except in any properly constructed fireplace provided for the use and convenience of the public.

9. No person shall, without the written permission of the General Manager, carry or use any gun, rifle, or firearm, or use any net, engine, instrument, or device, for the capture or destruction of any bird or animal, or take or attempt to take the eggs or young of any bird in the reserve.

10. No person shall without the written permission of the General Manager sell, or attempt to sell, any goods or refreshments within the reserve.

11. No person shall bathe in any stream within the reserve.

12. Any person behaving to the annoyance of any person shall, if requested by the Caretaker, immediately leave the reserve, and may be prohibited from again entering.

13. Every person using or passing through the reserve or any part thereof shall conform to and abide by these by-laws; and, if any person, while using or passing through the reserve, commits any indecency or breach of the peace, or is guilty of any disorderly conduct, such person shall be liable as for a breach of these by-laws.

14. Every person who commits a breach of any of these by-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach.

6. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, and the company may be required to remove the timber-booms at its own cost, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the company three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the company in New Zealand.

7. The company shall maintain the above-mentioned timber-booms in good order and repair; and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at its own cost, any lights that may be required by the Minister; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

8. In respect of the Waikare River the company shall at all times use all reasonable despatch in collecting the logs and rafting them into the lower booms, and shall at all times keep a passage clear through the booms for boat traffic up and down the river.

9. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensee as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensee to use and occupy that part of the foreshore, and land below the low-water mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the erection and maintenance of the said wharf and hopper, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensee upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark occupied by the said wharf and hopper as shown on plans marked M.D. 4937.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensee shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £2 in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensee being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf and hopper, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf and hopper without payment.

6. The licensee shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf and hopper in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at his own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and hopper and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at or posting to the last known address of the licensee in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf or hopper, requiring him, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, he shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensee to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensee and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensee shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensee three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the licensee in New Zealand.

12. The licensee shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf or hopper may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on his part.

13. In case the licensee shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf and hopper for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General without any notice to the licensee or other proceeding whatsoever, and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensee, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

14. The erection of the said wharf and hopper shall be sufficient evidence of the acceptance by the licensee of the terms and conditions of this Order in Council.

15. The whole or any portion of any reserve administered by the Board, and not immediately required for planting, may be let by public tender or by public auction as may be decided by the Board. Notice of the land so available for leasing, the term of the lease, and the time and place for the receipt of tenders, or the time and place at which the auction will be held shall be given by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district thirty days prior to the expiration of the time fixed for the receipt of tenders or for the auction sale, as the case may be. The purchaser of any lease offered at auction shall, immediately on the fall of the hammer, deposit an amount equal to six months' rent at the rate offered, together with £3 3s. lease fee.

16. Tenders for a lease of any of the said land offered for lease by public tender shall be addressed to the Chairman, and shall specify the land tendered for, and shall be accompanied by a deposit equal to six months' rent at the rate offered and £3 3s. lease fee. The Board shall give notice to the successful tenderer of the acceptance of his tender, and the deposit and lease fee paid by an unsuccessful tenderer shall be refunded to him by the Board immediately after the tenders have been opened and decided upon.

In order to comply with the last preceding regulation every such person shall fill up and supply to the Statistician, or to any officer authorized by him in writing, the particulars specified in the form set out in the Schedule hereto, in accordance with the instructions accompanying that form, and shall sign the form certifying to the correctness of the particulars entered therein.

That the explosive shall be used only with a detonator or electric detonator of not less strength than that known as No. 6 (i.e., the detonator or electric detonator to be used shall possess an effective detonative strength as great as, or greater than, that of one containing 15 grains of a composition consisting in every 100 parts by weight of 80 parts of fulminate of mercury and 20 parts of chlorate of potassium).
3. That the explosive has been made at the works of the Cape Explosives Works (Limited), at Somerset West, Cape Province, South Africa.
4. That the explosive is in all respects similar to the sample submitted to test at the Home Office Testing-station at Rotherham, in the County of York, England, on the 11th day of August, 1916, and at the office of the Chief Inspector of Explosives, Wellington, on the day of , 1918.
5. That, in addition to the marking on the outer package required by regulations made under the Explosives Act, 1905, and in force for the time being, such outer package shall bear the words "As defined in the List of Permitted Explosives"; and, further, each inner package shall be clearly marked with the words "Permitted Explosive. To be used only with not less than No. 6 Detonator," and also with the name of the explosive, the name of the manufacturer, the date and place of manufacture, and the nature and proportion of the ingredients.
6. That the quantity of the explosive to be used in any single shot-hole shall not exceed 18 oz.
7. That each cartridge shall be clearly marked with the words "not more than 18 oz. in any one shot-hole."
8. Provided further that, as regards the composition, quality, or character of the explosive defined in this Schedule, any article alleged to be such explosive which differs therefrom in composition, quality, or character, whether by reason of deterioration or otherwise, shall be deemed to be the explosive so defined; but an owner, agent, or manager of a mine shall not be responsible for the composition, quality, or character of an explosive if he shows that he has in good faith obtained a written certificate from the maker of the explosive that it complies with the terms of this Schedule, and that he has taken all reasonable means to prevent deterioration of the explosive while stored.
