WHEREAS by section twenty-six, subsection one, of the Appropriation Act, 1915, it is provided that, notwithstanding any Act to the contrary, it shall not be lawful or competent for any local authority or for any Harbour Board, during the present war with Germany, to borrow or contract to borrow any money (otherwise than by way of bank overdraft within the limit of its powers, if any, in that behalf), whether from the State Advances Office or from any other source whatever, and whether in pursuance of a special Act or under any other authority whatever, without the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council:

And whereas application has been made for the consent of the Governor-General in Council to enable the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto to borrow the sums set opposite the names of the said local authorities respectively, for the several purposes specified in the said Schedule, from the State Advances Office:

And whereas it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council should issue:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby consent to the borrowing from the State Advances Office of the loans hereinafter mentioned by the several local authorities set out in the Schedule hereto for the purposes specified in the said Schedule. And it is hereby declared that this Order in Council is made under the provisions in that behalf of the Appropriation Act, 1915, and shall operate accordingly as a consent of the Governor-General in Council to the raising of the loans hereby authorized.

And whereas application has been made for the consent of the Governor-General in Council to enable the several local authorities mentioned in the Schedule hereto to borrow the loans set out in column B therein:

And whereas it is expedient that the precedent consent of the Governor-General in Council should issue:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby consent to the raising of the loans hereinafter mentioned by the several local authorities set out in the Schedule hereto, provided that the rate of interest at which the loans or any of them are to be raised shall in no case produce to the lender a return exceeding five and one-quarter pounds per centum per annum; and it is hereby declared that this Order in Council is made under the provisions in that behalf of the Appropriation Act, 1915, and shall operate accordingly as a consent of the Governor-General in Council to the raising of the loans hereby authorized.

WHEREAS by section twenty-seven of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1916, it is enacted that the Governor-General in Council is authorized, by Order in Council under section ninety-six of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, to vest the land known as Waingarara Block, being Section 10, Motatau No. 2 Block, comprising 453 acres, more or less, in the Native owners thereof without the provisions of subsection two or subsection three of the said section ninety-six having been complied with: And, further, it is enacted that no Order in Council shall be issued as aforesaid unless and until there has been first discharged such proportion of all existing liabilities charged upon the whole area of Motatau No. 2 Block, in respect of expenses connected with the survey, roadings, and administration of that block, as the Tokerau Maori Land

Board deems to be a proper proportion to be borne by the Native owners of the said Section 10:

And whereas the Tokerau Maori Land Board has notified that it is satisfied that all liabilities due by the said Section 10, in respect of survey, roadings, and administration, have been discharged, and recommends that the said land be reverted in the Native owners thereof:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section ninety-six of the Native Land Amendment Act, 1913, and by section twenty-seven of the Native Land Amendment and Native Land Claims Adjustment Act, 1916, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby declare that the land known as Waingarara Block, being Section 10, Motatau No. 2 Block, comprising 453 acres, more or less, shall no longer be subject to Part XV of the Native Land Act, 1909, and shall be reverted in the Native owners thereof.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this second day of July, 1918.

THE HONOURABLE SIR JAMES ALLEN, K.C.B., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the third section of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, a majority of the ratepayers in the area of land described in the Schedule hereto, situated in the County of Piako, have presented a petition to His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, praying that the said area be constituted a drainage district under the provisions of the said Act :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in the third section of the Land Drainage Act, 1908, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby constitute and declare the area of land described in the Schedule hereto to be a district for the purposes of Part I of the said Act, and to be called by the name of the "Norfolk Downs Drainage District"; and also, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority contained in the fourth section of the said Act, doth hereby declare that the Board of Trustees of the said district shall consist of five persons to be elected as members of the said Board and under and in accordance with the said Act.

THE HONOURABLE SIR JAMES ALLEN, K.C.B., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by subsection one of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, it is, *inter alia*, provided that the said section shall not apply in any case where the local authority having control of a road or street by resolution declares that the provisions thereof shall not apply to any specified road or street, or any specified part thereof, and such resolution is approved by the Governor-General in Council :

And whereas by subsection two of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, and clause (b) of subsection one of section thirteen of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that such approval may be either absolute or subject to such conditions with respect to the building-line as the Governor-General by Order in Council thinks fit to impose, and may refer to one or both sides of the road or street :

And whereas the West Harbour Borough Council, the local authority having control of the portion of street described in the Schedule hereto, has passed the following resolution—viz., "That this Council declares that the provisions of section one hundred and seventeen of the Public Works Act, 1908, shall not apply to Hill Street (being a street within this borough over which this Council as local authority has control) from Bishop's Street to Athol Place, both streets within this borough" :

And whereas it is deemed expedient that such resolution should be approved in so far as it refers to the northern side of the said portion of street, subject to the condition herein-after mentioned :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the above-in-part-recited Acts, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the said resolution to the extent hereinbefore mentioned, subject to the condition that no building, or part of a building, shall be erected at any time on the northern side of the said portion of street within a distance of thirty-three feet of the centre-line of the said portion of street.

*Amending Regulations under Part I of the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Amendment Act, 1908, and its Amendments.—Teachers' Superannuation Fund Moneys.*

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by Part I of the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Amendment Act, 1908, and its amendments, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke clause fifty-nine (relating to the investment of moneys of the Teachers' Superannuation Fund by the Public Trustee) of the regulations made under the authority of the said Act by Order in Council dated the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and in lieu thereof doth make the following regulation; and, with the like advice and consent, doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen.

REGULATION.

59. (1.) (a.) All moneys belonging to the Teachers' Superannuation Fund shall be specially invested by the Public Trustee as hereinafter provided.

(b.) As from the first day of the month following the receipt of any such moneys, the Public Trustee shall allocate to the amount of such moneys then in hand securities held by him on behalf of the common fund of the Public Trust Office, at the rate of interest prevailing at that time in respect of common-fund investments.

(c.) Where the moneys of the common fund have during that financial year been invested in different classes of securities bearing varying rates of interest, the allocation for the purpose of paragraph (b) hereof shall be *pro rata* among such securities.

(d.) For his services in and about the collection of interest or otherwise in respect of such securities so allocated the Public Trustee shall be entitled to charge and deduct from such interest a fee of £2 10s. per centum per annum.

(2.) In respect of the moneys of the Teachers' Superannuation Fund invested prior to the 1st day of July, 1918, the following provisions shall apply:—

(a.) On that date the Public Trustee shall allocate from the existing investments of the common fund of the Public Trust Office such securities as may be mutually agreed on by the Teachers' Superannuation Board and the Public Trustee, and the securities so allocated shall on and after that date be deemed to be held in respect of investments of moneys belonging to the Teachers' Superannuation Fund, and all moneys thereafter payable by way of interest on such securities or for the redemption thereof, or otherwise in respect thereof, shall form part of the Teachers' Superannuation Fund, and shall be dealt with by the Public Trustee as prescribed in subclause (1) hereof.

(b.) The securities so to be taken over shall be selected so that a due proportion of the investments at each separate rate of interest in the common fund of the Public Trust Office shall be taken over.

(c.) The Public Trustee's remuneration for his services in respect of these investments shall be regulated by paragraph (d) of subclause (1) hereof.

(3.) In the event of any dispute between the Teachers' Superannuation Board and the Public Trustee in respect of any matter arising out of this regulation, the matter shall be submitted to the Controller and Auditor-General, and his decision shall be final and conclusive.

*Regulations imposing Export Duty on Copra and Pearl Shell  
exported from the Cook Islands.*

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this twenty-fourth day of June, 1918.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by sections fifty-three, fifty-five, and fifty-six of the Cook Islands Act, 1915, the Governor-General in Council is empowered to make all such regulations as he thinks necessary for the peace, order, and good government of the Cook Islands, and that such regulations may relate to the imposition of tolls, rates, dues, fees, taxes, and other charges, and may prescribe penalties for the breach of such regulations: And whereas it is expedient to make regulations prescribing a duty to be paid on all copra or pearl shell exported from the Cook Islands:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations accordingly; and doth hereby declare that these regulations shall come into force in those Islands on the first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen.

REGULATIONS.

1. THERE shall be levied and payable on all copra and pearl shell exported from the Cook Islands the following export duties, that is to say:—

Upon copra a duty of £1 per ton.

Upon pearl shell a duty of £4 per ton.

2. These duties shall constitute a debt due to the Crown by the exporter of copra or pearl shell.

3. No copra or pearl shell shall be laden on board any ship for export on that ship from the Cook Islands until the amount of duty payable under clause 1 hereof has been paid to the Collector of Customs.

4. Any person lading or concerned in lading copra or pearl shell on which duty has not been paid shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable upon conviction to a fine not exceeding £50, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months.

*Notifying the Proposed Exchange of Crown Land in the  
Auckland Land District for other Land.*

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF MAY, 1918.

During the first half of May anticyclonic pressure ruled, with fair weather generally. From the 16th until the 29th an intense and extensive westerly area of low pressure held sway. The latter accounted for unsettled conditions, and between the 20th and 26th high and boisterous north-west winds were experienced, with rain in most parts of the Dominion.

On the 23rd and 24th thunderstorms occurred in the neighbourhood of Cook Strait, and this time heavy rain fell in the Wairarapa district, causing floods in some of the low-lying country, especially about Masterton.

During the 28th and 29th a depression passing off East Cape accounted for strong south-east winds and heavy showers along the east coast of the North Island.

In nearly all parts of the Dominion the total rainfall for the month was considerably less than the average.
