Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred by the Harbours Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby prescribe that the dues set forth in the Schedule hereto shall be taken and received by the licensees for the use of the said wharf.

SHIPPING WHARFAGE.

EVERY person who shall use the said wharf with any vessel shall pay for the use thereof as follows, that is to say:—

For every vessel a sum of 1d. per ton on the gross tonnage of such vessel per day for each day or part of a day a vessel shall occupy a berth alongside any vessel laying at the said wharf, or shall lay at the said wharf undergoing repairs or fitting out only, or shall lay off the said wharf with a line attached thereto.

GOODS WHARFAGE.

Every person who shall use the said wharf for landing or shipping any goods shall, before using same, pay dues as follows, that is to say:—

1. For all goods landed on the said wharf, a rate of 2s. 6d. per ton weight or measurement, at the option of the licensees.
2. For every head of cattle or horses landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, 2s. 6d. per head.
3. For every yearling or calf so landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, the sum of 1s. per head.
4. For every head of sheep or small cattle so landed upon or shipped from the said wharf, the sum of 6d. per head.
5. If any ship shall use the said wharf for the discharge of any goods or cargo after the usual working-hours or on wharf holidays, such ship shall pay to the licensees for the use of the said wharf a charge at the rate of 1s. per ton on all goods or cargo so discharged from such ship.

This charge will only be made when, in the opinion of the wharfinger, it is necessary to employ labour to stack or remove cargo in sheds in consequence of the discharge of such goods or cargo as aforesaid.

Regulations as to Health Patrols under the Social Hygiene Act, 1917.

WHEREAS by section twelve of the Social Hygiene Act, 1917, provision is made for the appointment by the Minister of Public Health of Health Patrols for the protection of the health and morality of young persons:

And whereas by section fifteen of the said Act it is enacted that the Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council gazetted, make regulations, *inter alia*, for regulating and prescribing the appointment and duties of persons appointed as Health Patrols under the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of that Dominion, doth hereby, in pursuance of the power conferred on him as aforesaid, make the following regulations under that Act accordingly.

REGULATIONS.

HEALTH PATROLS.

1. (1.) APPLICATIONS for appointment as a Health Patrol may be made in writing to the Chief Health Officer at Wellington.

(2.) Every such application shall be accompanied by not less than two recommendations or testimonials as to character and fitness for the duties of a Health Patrol, of which at least one shall be by a minister of religion, or by some society established for or engaged in social work (whether in New Zealand or elsewhere).

(3.) No person under the age of forty years shall be appointed as a Health Patrol.

2. Every person appointed as a Health Patrol shall, subject to the general authority of the Minister, be under the supervision and direction of a District Health Officer under the Public Health Act, 1908, and shall from time to time, as required, furnish reports as to their duties to the District Health Officer.

3. Every person appointed as a Health Patrol under these regulations shall hold office during the pleasure of the Minister.

4. No person appointed as a Health Patrol shall in his or her official capacity commence any proceedings in any Court with respect to any offence committed against the Social Hygiene Act, 1917, or any other Act.

5. In particular, but without limiting the generality of the provisions in that behalf of the Social Hygiene Act, it shall be the duty of Health Patrols, so far as in their discretion they think fit—

- (a.) To advise and warn young persons who may during the evening or night be found in any street, domain, park, or other public place, or frequenting any place of public entertainment, without adequate supervision and protection;
- (b.) To advise the parents and guardians of such young persons of the dangers incident to allowing them to frequent such places as aforesaid without adequate supervision and protection; and
- (c.) To make inquiry and to report as to cases where children are alleged to be living in houses of ill fame, or in any other place or under conditions in which they may be reasonably believed to be liable to contract any venereal disease.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities vested in him by the Education Act, 1914 (hereinafter referred to as the Act), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke clauses forty-nine to fifty-two inclusive of the regulations made under the Manual and Technical Instruction Act, 1900, on the fourteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and two, as amended from time to time thereafter (including clause fifty (a)), as set out in the regulations under the last-mentioned Act of the seventeenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and five, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the regulations set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth prescribe that this Order shall come into force on the date of the first publication thereof in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT OF MANAGERS OF TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.

Technical Schools (not being Schools mentioned in Part II or Part III of Eleventh Schedule to Education Act).

1. SUBJECT to the provisions of the Act and of these regulations, the Minister shall from time to time determine the number of managers to be elected or appointed, pursuant to paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of section 113 of the Act, by the controlling authority and by the public associations and local authorities (if any) joining in the establishment and maintenance of any technical school.

2. (1.) The managers appointed or elected to represent (a) the controlling authority, (b) the committee of the urban school district (if any), and (c) the public associations and local authorities (if any) joining in the establishment and maintenance of a technical school, pursuant to the provisions in that behalf of paragraphs (a), (b), and (d) respectively of subsection (4) of section 113 of the Act, shall be appointed or elected by the bodies concerned in the month of July, August, or September in each year, as the controlling authority may in each case determine.

(2.) The controlling authority shall in the month of June in each year give to the electing or appointing body notice of the number of members to be elected or appointed by it pursuant to the Act and these regulations, together with notice of the month when such election or appointment is required to be held or made.

Election of Managers by Parents of Pupils attending a Technical School.

3. The election of managers by the parents of pupils attending a technical high school, pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection (4) of section 113 of the Act, shall be conducted in accordance with the following provisions, that is to say:—

(1.) Every such election shall be held during the month of July, August, or September of each year, on a date to be fixed by the controlling authority.

(2.) The Secretary of the Board of Managers shall be the Returning Officer.

(3.) For the purposes of each election the Returning Officer shall prepare a roll, and shall enter therein the name, occupation, and address of every person qualified to be enrolled as a parent of a pupil of the school. The roll shall be closed at 5 o'clock on the fourteenth day next before the day on which any election is to be held, and shall continue to be closed until the election is completed.

(4.) The Returning Officer shall, by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the district, publicly notify not less than fourteen days before such election:—

(a.) The day and hour for the closing of nominations;

(b.) The number of representatives to be elected;

(c.) The day and hour for the closing of the election.

(5.) Every candidate shall be nominated in writing by one or more parents entitled to vote for his election. Each such parent may nominate any number of candidates not exceeding the number to be elected.

(6.) Every nomination-paper shall be in the form or to the effect following:—

I, [Name and address], being a parent duly entered on the roll, do hereby nominate [Name and address] as a candidate for election to the Managers of the [Name] Technical School at the election to be held on the day of , 19 .
Dated this day of , 19 .

(7.) If the nomination-paper does not bear the written consent of the candidate nominated, such consent may be given by him to the Returning Officer before the nominations are closed, and every nomination-paper shall be void in so far as concerns any candidate whose written consent is not duly given as aforesaid.

(8.) Nominations shall close at noon on the tenth day before the day of the election.

(9.) If the number of nominations received does not exceed the number of vacancies to be filled, the Returning Officer shall forthwith declare the candidate or candidates so nominated to be duly elected. In all other cases he shall, as soon as the nominations are closed, prepare and post to each elector at his address as appearing on the roll a voting-paper containing in alphabetical order of surnames a list of all the duly nominated candidates, and such voting-paper shall be in the form or to the effect following:—

of members of the Board of Managers of the Technical School.

(10.) The poll shall close at 5 o'clock on the afternoon of the day of election, but all voting-papers shall be included and counted which are not informal and are received by the Returning Officer in due course of post before the close of the sixth day after the day of the election.

(11.) A voting-paper shall be informal in any of the following cases, that is to say:—

(a.) If it is not duly signed by the parent; or

(b.) If the number of candidates whose names are not crossed out exceeds the total number of candidates for whom the person is entitled to vote, or if in any other way the paper fails to indicate clearly for whom the vote is intended to be given; or

(c.) If, being delivered to the Returning Officer, the sealed envelope containing the voting-paper is not delivered at his office before the close of the poll; or

(d.) If, having been forwarded by post, the sealed envelope containing the voting-paper is not received at the office of the Returning Officer before the close of the sixth day after the day of election; or if, from the postmark on the envelope or otherwise, the Returning Officer is satisfied that it was not posted until after the day of the election.

(12.) On the seventh day after the day of election the Returning Officer shall open and examine all voting-papers duly delivered to him, or received by him through the post as aforesaid, and, after rejecting all informal voting-papers, shall ascertain the candidates (not exceeding the total number to be elected) who have received the greatest number of votes, and shall declare such candidates to be elected.

(13.) If, by reason of an equality of votes given for two or more candidates, the election is not complete, the Returning Officer shall decide by lot, in the presence of two members of the Board of Managers, which candidate or candidates shall be elected, and thereby complete the election.

(14.) Forthwith after the completion of the election the Returning Officer shall notify to the controlling authority the names of the persons elected.

(15.) If any dispute or question arises touching the regularity of any election, such dispute or question shall be determined by the Minister of Education, whose decision shall be final.

Elam School of Art and Masterton Technical School (being the Schools mentioned in Part II of the Eleventh Schedule to the Act).

4. (1.) For each of the technical schools specified in Part II of the Eleventh Schedule to the Act, there shall be five managers in addition to the managers appointed to represent the Education Board of the district and the committee of the urban school district, pursuant to section 113 of the Act.

(2.) In the case of the Masterton Technical School, the additional members aforesaid shall be elected annually by the persons who were subscribers to the school during the twelve months preceding the election.

(3.) In the case of the Elam School of Art, the additional members aforesaid shall be elected annually by the Elam Trustees and the subscribers (if any) during the twelve months preceding the election.

5. (1.) The election of managers under the last preceding regulation shall be held in the month of January or the month of February in each year as the managers in office may determine.

(2.) Notice of the time and place of such election shall be given to the electors by or on behalf of the managers.

General.

6. (1.) For the purposes of the election of managers under these regulations the controlling authority shall, on or before the 1st day of June in each year, furnish to the Minister a statement showing with respect to each technical school under its control—

(a.) The name and description of every public association, local authority, or person who has contributed towards the establishment or maintenance of the school during the twelve months ended on the preceding 31st day of March;

(b.) The amount or value of the contribution by each such contributor.

(2.) In the statement of the amounts contributed as aforesaid there shall be included all contributions in money received during the said period, together with all rents and other moneys derived for the benefit of the school from lands, buildings, or other endowments.

(3.) Where any lands or buildings are granted, or the use of any such lands or buildings is given, for the special purpose of encouraging the promotion or increasing the efficiency of a technical school, and no rents or other moneys are derived therefrom by that school, the grantor shall be deemed to contribute a sum equal to the annual value of the property comprised in the grant. Such value shall be determined according to the assessment (if any) of the property for local rates, or, if there is no such assessment, shall be determined by the Minister.

7. For the purposes of the election or appointment of managers under these regulations the Minister may, if he thinks fit, classify contributors in groups according to the amount of their contributions respectively, and the voting-power of the contributors comprised in each such group shall be determined by the amount contributed by each of them severally.

8. Within fourteen days after the election or appointment of a manager of a technical school under these regulations the controlling authority shall forward to the Minister a notification of the name and description of such manager.

9. Every manager of a technical school elected or appointed under these regulations shall come into office on the date of his election or appointment, and shall continue in office until the election or appointment of his successor.

10. In any case in which an election or an appointment of managers as hereinbefore provided has not been held, the Minister, if he is satisfied that the failure to elect or appoint is not due to any default on the part of the controlling authority or of any contributing body, may fix a time and place for the election or the appointment of managers, and the foregoing provisions of these regulations shall thereupon be observed so far as applicable as if the time and place for such election or appointment had been fixed as therein provided. Pending such election or appointment the managers previously elected or appointed shall continue to hold office.

11. If a manager dies, or (by letter to the controlling authority) tenders his resignation, or becomes bankrupt or of unsound mind, or for a period of three consecutive months fails to attend any meeting of the managers without obtaining leave of absence, or is absent from New Zealand for a period of six consecutive months, he shall cease to be a manager, and the vacancy thereby occurring shall be deemed to be a casual vacancy. Every casual vacancy shall be filled within twenty-one days after the occurring thereof, and the manager filling the same shall hold office only for the residue of the term of the vacating manager. Every vacancy shall be filled by the same electing or appointing body as in the case of the vacating manager. The name of the manager elected or appointed shall be forthwith forwarded to the Minister by the controlling authority.

SUMMARY FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE, 1918.

Anticyclonic pressure prevailed from the 1st to the 10th, and accounted for fair and mild weather generally during this period.

From the latter date until the end of the month westerly depressions were extremely persistent, and the weather proved very unsettled, with considerable rainfall.

A notable meteorological feature was a remarkable tendency for the development of secondary "lows," and in consequence electrical disturbances frequently occurred in different parts of the country, more especially over the North Island.

On the last day of the month a shallow depression was centred westward of Cook Strait, and was responsible for a serious snowstorm in the North Canterbury district.

Except in the East Coast districts of the North Island and the west coast of the South, the total rainfall for the month was everywhere above the average.
