19. (1.) EVERY contributor whose salary is temporarily stopped on the ground of ill health shall—

(a.) For the first three months of any such period contribute at the ordinary rate payable by him, and for the balance of such period at one-third of such ordinary rate, and thereafter at the ordinary rate of contribution; or

(b.) Cease to contribute to the fund while his salary is so stopped, and thereafter contribute by way of deduction from his salary an additional amount, being not less than his ordinary contribution, until the additional contributions so paid are equal in amount to the payments which would have been made had he elected to contribute under the last preceding paragraph:

Provided that in the event of the retirement or death of any contributor who has elected to come under paragraph (b) hereof the arrears (if any) of payments shall be deducted from any allowances payable out of the fund on account of the retirement or death of such contributor.

(2.) In any case where the salary of a contributor is or has been temporarily stopped as aforesaid the Board may by resolution modify or vary the terms of payment of contributions under this regulation in such manner as it thinks fit.

19A. (1.) Every contributor whose salary is temporarily stopped for any other reason than ill health, or who is for any period on leave of absence without salary or at a reduced salary, shall continue to contribute to the fund at the ordinary rate theretofore payable by him.

(2.) If any such contributor is, at his retirement or death, in arrear with the payment of his contributions, such arrears shall be deducted from any allowances payable out of the fund on account of the retirement or death of such contributor.

20. (1.) The Permanent Head of a Department shall report to the Secretary to the Board the date when the salary of a contributor employed in his Department is temporarily

stopped on the ground of ill health, and again when payment thereof is resumed. He shall also similarly report as to a contributor whose salary is temporarily stopped for any other reason than ill health, or who is for any period on leave of absence from his Department without salary or at a reduced salary.

(2.) He shall also state under which paragraph of regulation 19 a contributor whose salary is temporarily stopped on the ground of ill health has elected to contribute.

(a.) The electric lines upon which workmen are engaged shall be disconnected from the source of supply, but if a raised platform is used the electric lines need not be disconnected.

(b.) The licensee shall bear the cost of insulating and maintaining the insulation of all future Post and Telegraph wires where they cross the licensee's electric lines, and also the cost of all special work which the Minister of Telegraphs may require to carry out in consequence of the licensee's electric lines being bare.

(c.) When, in the opinion of the Minister of Telegraphs, it is considered advisable owing to the number of insulated wires that the bare electric lines at any crossing should be replaced by electric lines with vulcanized rubber of 600 megohm grade, the licensee shall insulate such bare electric lines when requested to do so by the Minister of Telegraphs.

Electric lines at high pressure shall be insulated with vulcanized rubber of at least 600 megohm grade; provided that where circumstances permit such lines may, with the previous consent of the Minister, and before the work is commenced, be bare and subject to such conditions as he may impose.

Electric lines at extra high pressure shall be bare. Earthed neutral or intermediate conductors may in all cases be bare.

Every pole or support carrying extra-high-pressure electric lines or bare high-pressure electric lines shall have attached to it a plate marked "Danger—Live Wires."

4. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 22 degrees Fahrenheit.

5. NOTICES OF EXTENSIONS, ETC.

Records of results of tests (Regulation 37), and notices *re* commencement of work (Regulation 44) and *re* extensions and alterations (Regulation 49), should be sent to the District Engineer, Public Works Office, Gisborne, and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at Auckland.

6. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 1s. per unit for lighting purposes, and 6d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

7. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force

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for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

8. REQUIREMENTS OF THE OPOTIKI COUNTY COUNCIL.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the licensee shall not be entitled to erect, maintain, or use any electric lines within the Opotiki County except subject to such conditions, not inconsistent with the provisions of this license and the regulations relating thereto, as may from time to time be agreed upon between the licensee and the Opotiki County Council.
