Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the Fisheries Act, 1908, and its amendments, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and

**Clause 3.**—Provided that the season for trout-fishing in Lake Waikaremoana, and the rivers or streams in the vicinity thereof which are in the County of Wairoa and that part of the County of Hawke's Bay which is within the boundaries of the Rotorua Acclimatization District, shall open on the 1st day of October and close on the 30th day of April in each year.

**Clause 9.**—Provided that in respect of Lake Waikaremoana, and the rivers or streams in the vicinity thereof which are in the County of Wairoa and that part of the County of Hawke's Bay which is within the boundaries of the Rotorua Acclimatization District, the dates 1st June and 31st October in line 3 shall be 1st May to 30th September.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by section eighty-three of the Fisheries Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following additional regulations to have force and effect within the Counties of Sounds, Marlborough, Kaikoura, Amuri, Cheviot, Ashley, Selwyn, Akaroa, Mount Herbert, Ashburton, Mackenzie, Geraldine, and Levels, and the boroughs and town districts situated therein, which compose the Acclimatization Districts of Marlborough, North Canterbury, Ashburton, and South Canterbury.

REGULATIONS.

1. CLAUSE 12 of the hereinbefore-recited regulations of the 21st day of September, 1904, is hereby amended by deleting the word "stroke-hauling."

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish with more than two flies, or one fly and one minnow, or one fly and one natural bait, or two natural baits affixed to any trace. No fly shall have more than one hook, and it shall not be lawful to use more than one lead or sinker, and such lead or sinker must be tied above all flies, minnow, or natural bait used.

3. It shall be unlawful to use any wire, either plain or twisted, or gymp trace of a greater gauge than 21 standard wire gauge. It shall be unlawful to use any wire or gymp trace of a greater length than 6 ft.

4. The penalty for breach of any of these regulations shall not be less than forty shillings or more than fifty pounds.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this tenth day of September, 1918.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 5 of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1908, it is enacted that the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council grant to any person or body corporate a license to use water from any fall, river, stream, or other source for the purpose of generating electricity for electric light, mechanical power, or other uses, and to exercise in respect of that purpose any of the powers and authorities specified in that behalf in the said section: And whereas it is further provided by the said section that any such license may confer upon the licensee a right at any time or times during the continuance of the license (but subject to such conditions and restrictions as are expressed in the license) to enter upon any road, railway, or other land, whether vested in or occupied by the Crown, or any other person or body corporate, and there to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, renew, or repair all such cables, wires, and other things as are required for the transmission of electricity between the fall, river, stream, or other source aforesaid and any place to which the licensee is authorized to transmit electricity in pursuance of the license:

And whereas Walter Kenneth McAlpine, Settler, of Craigieburn, in the Provincial District of Canterbury (hereinafter with his successors and assigns, referred to as the "licensee") has applied for a license under the said section to take and use water from a spring on Mount St. Bernard, in the Provincial District of Canterbury (hereinafter referred to as "the said stream,") for the purpose of generating electricity as aforesaid, and it is expedient to issue such license accordingly:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him as aforesaid, and of the powers conferred by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby grant to the licensee (subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto) a license to take and use from the said stream for the purposes hereinafter set forth, a stream of water (hereinafter referred to as "the said water") not exceeding one cubic foot per second at any one time; and also to erect and maintain electric lines for power, lighting, heating, or other uses along the route mentioned in clause three of the Schedule hereto, and subject to the regulations (except clause 17 thereof) published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and hereinafter referred to as "the regulations."

#### SCHEDULE.

##### 1. UTILIZATION OF THE WATER.

The said water shall be used solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be returned to Sloven's Creek at or near the power-house.

##### 2. LOCATION OF HEADWORKS.

The said water shall be taken from the said stream at the headworks, situated at a point indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 44464, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works at Wellington, in the Land District of Wellington.

##### 3. GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORKS.

The licensee is hereby authorized to construct, maintain, and use the following works for the purposes of this license, the position of the said works being indicated on the plan marked P.W.D. 44464 hereinbefore referred to:—

- (a.) Headworks consisting of a dam and necessary intake.
- (b.) Race leading from such dam to the power-house hereinafter referred to.
- (c.) A power-house with all necessary equipment, including water-turbines, generators, transformers, lightning-arresters, switchboards, switches, exciters, and other appliances for generating electricity.
- (d.) Transmission and other lines over the route in Reserve 1577 and Run 121, Grasmere Survey District, shown on the said plan marked P.W.D. 44464.

##### 4. COVERING OF OVERHEAD LINES.

Electric lines at low pressure shall be covered throughout with triple braiding, thoroughly impregnated with weather-proof compound, provided that where circumstances permit the lines may, with the previous consent of the Minister obtained, and before the work is commenced, be bare, subject to the following conditions:—

(a.) The electric lines upon which workmen are engaged shall be disconnected from the source of supply, but if a suitable raised platform is used the electric lines need not be disconnected.

(b.) The licensee shall bear the cost of insulating and maintaining the insulation of all future Post and Telegraph wires where they cross the licensee's electric lines, and also the cost and maintenance of all special work which the Minister of Telegraphs may require to carry out in consequence of the licensee's electric lines being bare.

(c.) When, in the opinion of the Minister of Telegraphs, it is considered advisable, owing to the number of insulated telegraph-wires, that the bare electric lines at any crossing should be replaced by electric lines insulated with vulcanized rubber of 600 megohm grade, the licensee shall insulate such bare electric lines when requested to do so by the Minister of Telegraphs.

(d.) When, in the opinion of the Minister, it is necessary in the interests of the public safety that the use of bare electric lines at low pressure should be discontinued, the licensee shall, upon receiving notice from the Minister, substitute therefor electric lines covered in the manner prescribed by the first part of this clause.

(e.) Bare low-pressure wires which at any portion of their length are carried on the same poles or supports as high-pressure or extra-high-pressure lines shall be deemed to be "infected" throughout their entire length by such high-pressure or extra-high-pressure lines, and shall be regarded by the Minister of Telegraphs as if they were high-pressure or extra-high-pressure lines respectively.

Electric lines at high pressure shall be insulated with vulcanized rubber of at least 600 megohm grade; provided that where circumstances permit such lines may, with the previous consent of the Minister, and before the work is commenced, be bare and subject to such conditions as he may impose.

Electric lines at extra high pressure shall be bare.

Earthed neutral or intermediate conductors may in all cases be bare.

Every pole or support carrying extra-high-pressure electric lines or bare high-pressure electric lines, the conductors of which are bare, shall have attached to it a plate marked "Danger—Live Wires."

##### 5. INSPECTION OF WORKS.

The Inspecting Engineer, both during and after the construction of the works, shall have free access to and liberty at any time to inspect the same, so as to ensure that the provisions of this license are given due effect to.

##### 6. MAINTENANCE OF WORKS.

After the said works have been completed, the licensee shall maintain the same in proper working-order during the continuance of this license.

##### 7. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determination of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license.

##### 8. RENTAL.

The licensee shall, in respect of this license, pay to the Electrical Engineer at Christchurch, or otherwise as the Minister may from time to time require, the sum of 10s. per annum, commencing from the date hereof.

##### 9. GRANTING OF OTHER WATER RIGHTS.

Nothing herein shall prevent the Governor-General in Council from granting to any person or body corporate other than the licensee a license to take water from any portion of the said stream except at the place where the licensee is by this license empowered to take it; provided that no such license shall so operate as to reduce the natural fall between the headworks and tail-water, or the volume of the water which the licensee is by this license authorized to take from the said stream.

## 10. FINES.

If the licensee fails or neglects,—

- (a.) To use or maintain the said works, after completion, so as to secure the full benefit of the undertaking; or  
 (b.) To observe any of the conditions or obligations herein imposed,

then and in every such case the licensee shall be liable to a fine of £20 for every week or part of a week during which such default or neglect continues; or the Governor-General may by Order in Council revoke this license.

## 11. SERVICE OF NOTICE.

Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause, this license shall not be revoked, and no proceedings shall be taken for the recovery of a fine in respect of a breach thereof, unless and until notice in writing of the intention so to revoke the license or to take such proceedings has been served upon the licensee, or placed upon such principal or conspicuous part of the works, and default has been made by the licensee in repairing or remedying the breach or breaches specified in the said notice for the following periods:—

- (a.) For any breach which in the opinion of the Governor-General can be met by a fine, for thirty days after the service of such notice.  
 (b.) For any breach which in the opinion of the Governor-General is of such a nature as to require the revocation of this license, for ninety days after the service of such notice.

## 12. VARIATION IN CONDITIONS OF LICENSE.

The terms and conditions of this license may at any time, or from time to time, at the request or with the consent in writing of the licensee, be altered by the Governor-General by Order in Council.

## 13. SURRENDER OF LICENSE.

The licensee may at any time, with the consent of the Minister, surrender this license, and shall thereupon, if so required by the Minister, remove from the ground all removable equipment, machinery, buildings, poles, transmission-lines, and other plant herein authorized to be installed or provided. If the licensee fails or neglects so to remove the said plant within twelve months after being required so to do, such equipment, machinery, building, poles, lines, and other plant shall without payment or compensation vest in and become the property of the Crown.

## 14. SYSTEM OF SUPPLY.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (b) of clause 2 of the regulations.  
 The generating voltage shall be approximately 500 volts between the terminals.

## 15. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purposes of calculating stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 12 degrees Fahrenheit.

## 16. NOTICES RE RESULTS OF TESTS, ETC.

Records of results of tests (Regulation 37), and notices re commencement of work (Regulation 44) and alterations (Regulation 49), should be sent to the Electrical Engineer at present stationed at Christchurch, and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at Christchurch.

WHEREAS by section two of the Public Works Amendment Act, 1911, it is provided that no person shall lay, construct, place, put up, or use any electric line except under the authority of a license issued by the Governor-General in Council under that Act :

And whereas the Petone Borough Council (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect lines within the area of supply as defined in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter called "the said electric line," and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section :

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations made under section two of the aforesaid Act and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and hereinafter referred to as "the regulations," hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes along the route described in the Schedule hereto.

## SCHEDULE.

## 1. THE ROUTE OF THE ELECTRIC LINE AUTHORIZED.

And whereas a road-bridge, known as the Brooklyn Road Bridge, has been erected by the Minister of Public Works over the Nihotapu River, and it is considered expedient to make provision under the said Act for the purposes and in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, I, Arthur William de Brito Savile, Earl of Liverpool, the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities in anywise enabling me in this behalf, do hereby direct that the bridge known as the Brooklyn Road Bridge, as described in the Schedule hereto, shall, from and after the date of the gazetting hereof, be under the exclusive care, control, and management of the Waitemata County Council; and, in further pursuance and in exercise of the aforesaid powers and authorities, I do hereby fix and determine that the cost of maintaining, repairing, improving, or reconstructing the said bridge shall be borne by the Waitemata County Council.

IN exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 23 of the Counties Act, 1908, the Patangata County Council resolves by way of special order as follows:—

1. The present division of the County of Patangata into five ridings is revoked, and in lieu thereof the said county shall be divided into seven ridings to be called respectively Eparaima Riding, Mangatarata Riding, Oero Riding, Patangata Riding, Porangahau Riding, Purerere Riding, and Tamumu Riding, which ridings are respectively described in the Schedule hereto.

2. The said Patangata County Council shall consist of ten members, who shall be elected as follows:—

(a.) The electors of the Eparaima Riding, the Oero Riding, and the Porangahau Riding shall each elect two Councillors.

(b.) The electors of the Mangatarata Riding, the Patangata Riding, the Purerere Riding, and the Tamumu Riding shall each elect one Councillor.

3. The alteration hereby made shall take effect on and after the 1st day of October, 1918.

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UNDER THE CONTROL AND SUPERVISION OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

Director: Mr. J. E. STEVENS.

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By the Education Act it is compulsory for deaf children to come under instruction at the age of six, and to continue until the age of twenty-one unless the Education Department previously grants exemption. Though a child is, as a rule, best fitted to begin the school course at the age of six, advice should be obtained as soon as any sign of deafness is observed.

The following classes of deaf children are admitted to the School for the Deaf (sound intellect being always a necessity):—

1. Children born deaf, or who have lost their hearing before learning to speak.
2. Children who can hear a little, but are too deaf to be taught in a public school.
3. Children who have lost their hearing after having learned to speak.

The Act imposes upon every parent, teacher of a school (either public or private), constable, or officer of a charitable or kindred institution who is aware of the place of residence (either temporary or permanent) of a deaf child, and the householder in whose house any such child resides, an obligation to send notification of the fact to the Minister of Education, giving the name, age, and address of the child; and any neglect or failure to comply with this provision involves liability to a fine.
