2. The warrants shall be in the form set forth in Schedule A

3. An application for a warrant to make cigarettes under subsection (1) (b) of the aforesaid section 28 shall be accompanied by a declaration to be made by the applicant in the form set forth in Schedule B hereto.

4. All warrants under the subsection aforesaid shall terminate on 31st December following the date of issue. All warrants under subsection (a) of aforesaid section 28 shall

remain in force until cancelled.

the necessary depth of water and current required in the use of set-nets. The height of such bank shall not be more than 16 in. above the bottom of the river at the point where such bank is constructed. Such banks may be constructed
