WHEREAS, there being no Harbour Board empowered to grant the license hereinafter mentioned, under the Harbours Act, 1908 (hereinafter called "the said Act"), Alexander Dugal Clemett and Richard Theophilus Wrathall, of Mangonui, Auckland (hereinafter called "the licensees"), have applied to the Governor-General in Council for a license under the said Act to use and occupy a part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark at Merita Bay, North Auckland, as shown on plan marked M.D. 4957, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, in order to erect and maintain a wharf thereon :

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor-General in Council that the said wharf will not be or tend to the injury of navigation, and the said plan marked M.D. 4957 has, prior to the making of this Order in Council, been approved by the Governor-General in Council :

And whereas it is desirable that a license under the said Act, for the purpose aforesaid, should be granted and issued to the licensees for the term and subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in him by the said Act, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby approve of the purpose or object for which the said license is required by the licensees as aforesaid; and, in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, and with the like advice and consent as aforesaid, doth hereby license and permit the licensees to use and occupy that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark adjacent thereto, necessary for the erection and maintenance of the said wharf, such license to be held and enjoyed by the licensees upon and subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

1. In these conditions the term "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act, 1908, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to that part of the foreshore and land below low-water mark occupied by the said wharf as shown on plan marked M.D. 4957.

3. In consideration of the concessions and privileges granted by this Order in Council the licensees shall pay to the Minister the sum of £2 10s., and thereafter an annual sum of £1 in advance, dating from the date hereof, the first of such annual payments to be made on the licensees being supplied with a copy of this Order in Council.

4. All persons shall at all reasonable times, and upon payment of the proper dues, have free and full liberty to use the said wharf, and all rights of ingress and egress thereon and therefrom.

5. His Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, through, and out of the said wharf without payment.

6. The licensees shall maintain the above-mentioned wharf in good order and repair, and shall at all times exhibit therefrom, and maintain at their own cost, suitable and necessary lights for the guidance of vessels; provided that no light shall be exhibited until after it has been approved of by the Minister.

7. Any person authorized by the Minister may at all reasonable times enter upon the said wharf and view the state of repair thereof; and upon such Minister leaving at

or posting to the last-known address of the licensees in New Zealand a notice in writing of any defect or want of repair in such wharf, requiring them, within a reasonable time to be therein prescribed, to repair the same, they shall with all convenient speed cause such defect to be removed or such repairs to be made.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorize the licensees to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provisions of the Harbours Act, 1908, or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are now or may hereafter be in force.

9. The ballast of all vessels loading at the said wharf shall be taken away by the licensees and deposited above high-water mark, or at such place as may be approved of by the Minister, or by any person appointed by the Minister for that purpose.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for fourteen years from the date hereof, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority; and the licensees shall not assign, charge, or part with any such right, power, or privilege without the written consent of the Minister first obtained.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the licensees three calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the licensees in New Zealand.

12. The licensees shall be liable for any injury which the said wharf may cause any vessel or boat to sustain through any default or neglect on their part.

13. In case the licensees shall—

- (1.) Commit or suffer a breach of the conditions hereinbefore set forth, or any of them;
- (2.) Cease to use or occupy the said wharf for a period of thirty days;
- (3.) Become bankrupt, or be brought under the operation of any law for the time being in force relating to bankruptcy; or
- (4.) Fail to pay the sums specified in clause 3 of these conditions,—

then and in either of the said cases this Order in Council, and every license, right, power, or privilege, may be revoked and determined by the Governor-General without any notice to the licensees or other proceeding whatsoever, and publication in the *New Zealand Gazette* of an Order in Council containing such revocation shall be sufficient notice to the licensees, and to all persons concerned or interested, that this Order in Council, and the license, rights, and privileges thereby granted and conferred, have been revoked and determined.

Additional Regulations under the Tobacco Act, 1908.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is expedient to revoke the following regulations made under the Tobacco Act Amendment Act, 1896, the Tobacco Act, 1908, and the Finance Act, 1917, namely,—

The regulations made on the eleventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven;

The regulations made on the fourth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the fourteenth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen;

and to make new regulations in lieu thereof :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Tobacco Act, 1908, as amended by the Finance Act, 1917, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby revoke the aforesaid regulations, and doth make the following regulations in lieu thereof; and doth hereby direct that this Order shall have effect on and from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen.

REGULATIONS.

1. APPLICATIONS for warrants under section 28 of the Tobacco Act, 1908, shall be made to a Collector of Customs appointed by the Minister of Customs in that behalf, and shall contain a precise description of the premises in which the applicant proposes to keep and use a cutting machine, or (as the case may be) to make cigarettes by hand from duty-paid manufactured tobacco.

2. The warrants shall be in the form set forth in Schedule A hereto.

3. An application for a warrant to make cigarettes under subsection (1) (b) of the aforesaid section 28 shall be accompanied by a declaration to be made by the applicant in the form set forth in Schedule B hereto.

4. All warrants under the subsection aforesaid shall terminate on 31st December following the date of issue. All warrants under subsection (a) of aforesaid section 28 shall remain in force until cancelled.

Any warrant under subsections 1 (a) or 1 (b) of said section 28 may be cancelled by a Collector of Customs if the warrant holder commits a breach of the provisions of the said Act or these regulations.

5. The scale of fees payable under subsection (3) of section 28 of the Tobacco Act, 1908, as amended by section 51 of the Finance Act, 1917, shall be as follows :—

For an annual warrant to make cigarettes, where the number of cigarettes intended to be made as specified in the declaration of the manufacturer, made in accordance with Schedule B hereto, does not exceed 50,000 : £10.

Where the number of cigarettes to be made exceeds 50,000, for every 5,000 cigarettes or fraction thereof intended to be made in excess of 50,000 : £1.

6. (a.) Every holder of a warrant to manufacture cigarettes by hand from duty-paid manufactured tobacco shall keep a book, in the form set forth in Schedule C hereto, showing the particulars indicated in that Schedule.

(b.) Every warrant-holder referred to in subclause (a) of this regulation shall enter in the book aforesaid, day by day and every day upon which manufacture takes place, the names of the persons actually employed in making cigarettes and the number of cigarettes made by each; also any other particulars indicated in the said book.

(c.) The book aforesaid shall be open at all times to the inspection of any Officer of Customs, who may take extracts therefrom.

(d.) Every warrant-holder referred to in subclause (a) of this regulation shall, on or before the tenth day of each month, render to the Collector of Customs a correct transcript from the book aforesaid, setting forth in full the particulars for the preceding month as entered in the aforesaid book.

(e.) The transcript rendered to the Collector of Customs shall be verified by declaration before the Collector of Customs or an Officer of Customs, a Customs Agent, a Postmaster, or a Solicitor, as follows :—

I, _____, do hereby declare that the particulars contained herein are true and correctly stated in every respect.

7. Every holder of a warrant to manufacture cigarettes by hand from duty-paid manufactured tobacco shall, if so required, produce to the Collector of Customs, or to any officer authorized by him, all books, invoices, or papers kept by him in the pursuance of his business, showing the amount of tobacco of every kind brought on to his premises, and also showing how the same has been disposed of.

8. The Collector of Customs may examine on oath every holder of a warrant to manufacture cigarettes from duty-paid manufactured tobacco concerning the quantity of tobacco brought on to his premises, or disposed of, whether by manufacture or otherwise, during any period or at any time in his possession.

9. In the event of any warrant being lost the Collector of Customs may issue a duplicate thereof to the person to whom it was issued, on being satisfied by a statutory declaration, or such other further evidence as he may require, that the original has been lost and cannot, after full search, be found. There shall be payable for each duplicate the fee of 2s. 6d.

10. Every person who commits a breach of these regulations is liable to a fine of not less than £5 or more than £50 for each offence.

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Order in Council dated the sixth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and eight, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the eighth day of the same month, certain regulations were made providing for the taking of whitebait :

And whereas it is desirable to amend such regulations, and also to made additional regulations to apply to the rivers, estuaries, and streams in the Counties of Ashburton Geraldine, Levels, and Waimate :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority conferred upon him by the fifth section of the Fisheries Act, 1908, and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in that behalf, and acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following amending and additional regulations, which shall have force and effect within the Counties of Ashburton, Geraldine, Levels, and Waimate.

REGULATIONS.

1. SET-NETS and hand-nets having an opening of not more than nine square feet may be used for taking whitebait in the rivers, estuaries, and streams in the Counties of Ashburton, Geraldine, Levels, and Waimate.

2. Banks constructed of river shingle may be used to get the necessary depth of water and current required in the use of set-nets. The height of such bank shall not be more than 16 in. above the bottom of the river at the point where such bank is constructed. Such banks may be constructed

as required from high-water to low-water mark ; provided that it shall be illegal to construct any groyne of any other material than is provided for in this regulation.

3. No person shall use more than one set-net or use a hand-net and set-net at the same time, or place a set-net within a distance of one chain from another set-net, or use or place a hand-net within 4 ft. of another hand-net.
