The use of shellfish, koura, or the houhou or matai grub, or of earth worms shall be a breach of the regulations.

Provided that no bait other than artificial fly shall be used for taking fish in that portion of the Puniu River above Kihikihi, or in that portion of the Waipa River for seven miles above and seven miles below the township of Otoro-

Provided further that no bait other than natural and artificial fly shall be used for taking fish in the South Wairoa River, the Maungatawhiri River, Hay's Creek (otherwise known as Hunua Gorge Creek), Ararimu Creek, the Ongaruhe River, the Waimiha River, and the Pokaiwhenua River.

The fine for every breach of this regulation shall not be less than £2 or more than £50.

under the authority of a license issued by the Governor-General in Council under that Act:

And whereas the Rangiora County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the licensee") desires to erect lines within the area of supply as defined in the Schedule hereto, and hereinafter called "the area of supply," and it is expedient accordingly to issue a license in respect thereof under the said section:

Now, therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said section, and of all other powers in anywise enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth, subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to the regulations (except clause seventeen thereof, which is replaced by clause three of the Schedule hereto, to which references in the regulations to clause seventeen shall apply) made under section two of the aforesaid Act, and published in the New Zealand Gazette dated the twenty-ninth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and hereinafter referred to as "the regulations," hereby authorize the licensee to erect and maintain electric lines for lighting, power, and heating purposes within the area of supply hereinafter described.

#### SCHEDULE.

#### 1. AREA OF SUPPLY.

THE area of supply comprises the County of Rangiora as at present constituted as shown coloured red on the plan marked P.W.D. 44475. denosited in the office of the Minister of Park. P.W.D. 44475, deposited in the office of the Minister of Public Works, Wellington, in the Land District of Wellington.

#### 2. System of Supply.

The system of supply shall be as described in paragraph (e) of clause 2 of the regulations.

The electrical energy shall be received from the Lake Coleridge supply at a pressure not exceeding 11,000 volts between phases, and transformed down for distribution on the threephase system at a pressure not exceeding 3,300 volts between

#### 3. COVERING OF OVERHEAD LINES.

Electric lines at low pressure shall be covered throughout with triple braiding, thoroughly impregnated with weather-proof compound; provided that where circumstances permit the lines may, with the previous consent of the Minister obtained, and before the work is commenced, be bare Electric lines at high pressure shall be insulated with vulcanized rubber of at least 600 megohm grade; provided that where circumstances permit the lines may, with the previous consent of the Minister obtained and before the work is commenced, be bare.

Electric lines at extra high pressure shall be bare. Earthed neutral or intermediate conductors may in all cases be bare.

Every pole or support carrying extra-high-pressure lines or high-pressure lines, the conductors of which are bare, shall have attached to it a plate marked "Danger—Live Wires."

Bare low-pressure and bare high-pressure lines erected with the consent of the Minister shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(a.) The electric lines upon which workmen are engaged thall be discovered from the source of supply but if a

shall be disconnected from the source of supply, but if a suitable raised platform is used the electric lines need not be

suitable raised platform is used the electric lines need not be so disconnected.

(b.) Where telegraph-lines cross the licensee's bare electric lines the licensee shall bear the cost of insulating, protecting, and maintaining the insulation and protection of all telegraph-lines, whether erected before or after the bare electric lines, and also the cost of all special work and the maintenance thereof which the Minister of Telegraphs deems it necessary to carry out in consequence of the licensee's electric lines being bare

(c.) When, in the opinion of the Minister of Telegraphs, it is considered necessary owing to special circumstances that such bare electric lines at any crossing should be replaced by electric lines insulated in the manner prescribed in the first part of this clause, the licensee shall insulate such bare electric

lines when requested to do so by the Minister of Telegraphs.

(d.) When, in the opinion of the Minister, it is necessary in the interests of the public safety that the use of bare electric lines should be discontinued, the licensee shall, upon receiving notice from the Minister, substitute therefor electric lines covered in the manner prescribed by the first part of this

(e.) Bare low-pressure wires which at any portion of their length are carried bare on the same poles or supports as high-pressure lines or extra-high-pressure lines shall be deemed to be "infected" throughout their entire length by such high-

pressure or extra-high-pressure lines, and shall be subject to pressure or extra-high-pressure lines, and shan be subject to the regulations governing high-pressure and extra-high-pres-sure lines respectively.

#### 4. DATUM TEMPERATURE.

For the purpose of calculating the stresses as provided in clause 12 of the regulations, the datum temperature shall be taken as 12 degrees Fahrenheit.

#### 5. Notices re Extensions, etc.

Records of results of tests (Regulation 37), and notices re commencement of work (Regulation 44) and re extensions and alterations (Regulation 49), should be sent to the Electrical Engineer at present stationed at Christchurch, and to the Telegraph Engineer of the district, or his deputy, at present stationed at Christchurch.

#### 6. CHARGES FOR ELECTRIC ENERGY.

The charge for electrical energy shall not exceed 6d. per unit for lighting purposes, and 3d. per unit for motor-power, heating, or cooking purposes; provided that "lighting purposes" shall include the operation of motor generators for lighting purposes.

#### 7. Wiring Consumers' Premises.—Monopoly forbidden.

The licensee shall not grant or agree to grant any company, firm, or person the sole right to supply or erect the electric wiring on any consumer's premises; nor shall any consumer be required to purchase from the licensee or his assigns any material or apparatus for installing the electric wiring on such premises, or to have the work carried out by the licensee or his assigns, as a condition precedent to a supply of electrical energy being given by the licensee to the consumer.

#### 8. DURATION OF LICENSE.

This license shall, unless sooner determined in accordance with the provisions hereinafter expressed, continue in force for a period of forty-two years from the date hereof. Upon tor a period of forty-two years from the date hereor. Upon the expiry of the said term, or upon the sooner determina-tion of this license by revocation or otherwise, all rights hereby granted to the licensee shall thereupon cease and determine; but such expiration or determination shall not relieve the licensee of any liability theretofore incurred under this license. this license.

AMENDMENTS AND ADDITIONS TO RULES.

Commission.

Rule 66 amended to read as follows:

On mining transactions both buyer and seller pay stamp

duty.

A special charge in excess of the above rates may be made according to the circumstances of the case for the negotiation of new flotations and of issues of new or reserve shares, in which case the vendor or issuing company alone is to be charged, or of shares or securities not on the official list, or of New Zealand Government land-purchase bonds.

A double selling and a single buying commission shall be charged on sales of shares of all New Zealand companies not listed on any New Zealand Exchange.

Rule 82 amended to read as follows:-

Rule 82 amended to read as follows:—
82. The list of quotations of prices and of purchases and sales effected and reported at the daily meetings of the Exchange shall be the official list of the Exchange. The Exchange shall also issue a monthly share-list, of which each member is entitled to twenty-five copies free of charge. No member of this Exchange shall be permitted to issue a "Share List," "List of Sales," "Prices Current," "Trade Circular" (in reference to shares) or "General Report."

#### NEW RULE.

66A. That no lower rates other than those fixed in these rules shall be charged, and it shall not be allowable under any circumstances whatever to pay agents or other persons not members of an affiliated Exchange a remuneration of any kind for introducing business except in respect of applications for shares in new companies or for increase in capital in existing companies.
